CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not later than the second day.
2. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after Conference.
3. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required for budget before overreaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised, and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount assigned to his charge.
4. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference. The Committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give employment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule, without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.
5. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference, who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said conference and it shall take a vote of conference to pass his character.
6. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the annual conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the annual conference.
7. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attendance of delegates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election of any person as delegate to annual conference who does not intend to attend the entire session. Information of the delegate's intentions shall be incorporated in their credentials.
8. Any member leaving conference must present his excuse to conference.
9. We recommend that each church pay two dollars toward the board of each delegate and pastor at conference, said amount to be sent in with the delegate's credentials. Also that each church pay the pastor's and delegate's traveling expenses to and from conference.
10. The Secretary shall prepare blanks for delegate's credentials, including the statement required by the last resolution. Said blanks are to be mailed to the pastors shortly before conference, and when filled out by them, to be sent to the chairman of a standing committee on credentials, if possible, in order that they may be able to report immediately after the opening of conference. Said Committee shall be composed of two members appointed by the President.
11. The secretary shall send a statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the conference secretary.
12. For the future the conference shall observe the disciplinary rule requiring each pastor to read his statistical report on the floor of the conference.
13. Friday preceding conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the conference.
14. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of this body.
15. Wednesday afternoon and evening of conference week shall be designated as Young People's Day.
16. Thursday evening of conference shall be set apart for the public missionary service.
17. We authorize the closing of the Treasurer's books one week before conference.
18. We recommend that pastors, Sunday Schools, W. H. & F. M. societies and Y. M. W. Bands remit all funds raised, quarterly.
19. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.
20. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and efforts made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.
21. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all sessions of the camp meeting unless providentially hindered.
22. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expenses, the amount being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.
23. We order that no money be paid from the conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.
24. Each year there shall be incorporated in the minutes a list of those who have died in the various churches during the year, the pastors being asked to provide the Secretary with the necessary information.
25. The conference treasurer, with all persons introduced to the conference, shall be honorary members of the conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the conference bar.

26. Each occupant of the dormitory during conference is to furnish his own bed linen and towels.
27. The new churches shall be assessed 25% budget the first year; 50% the second year; and full budget the third year.

The 28th Annual Session of the Ohio Conference convened at Victory Camp, near Galena, Ohio, Tuesday, July 30th at 9:00 A.M. K. M. Lewis led the song service. Leslie Wilcox read Romans 12 and offered prayer.

Com. on Credentials reported. Report Adopted. Conf. bar fixed to include the first five seats and the rostrum. The following were elected a Nominating Com. Leslie Wilcox, L. A. Smothers, G. W. Calhoon, A. D. Osborn and L. L. Folger. John Murdock elected to care for the mail. C. L. Wright and W. C. Roberts elected Com. on Courtesy. Roll Call. The Pres. gave a verbal report from W. C. Graves and Nellie Hamilton and a letter from Miss Hamilton was read by the Sec. Com. on Nominations reported. Report adopted as amended.

Ordered that the Conference Sec. send a letter of greeting to Brother Whitehead. Ordered that 11:00 A.M. Wed. be given to L. L. Folger to present a Tithing message. Ordered that the young people who are delegates be excused from 10:00 to 11:00 on Wed. to attend Y. P. service. Ordered that Thurs. at 10:00 A.M. election of officers be the Order of the Day. Roll call of Elders for reports. The following reported. G. W. Calhoon, A. L. Fillmore, Mary Folger, K. M. Lewis, G. W. Morse, Della Osborn, W. C. Roberts, Monna Rogers, Leroy Wilcox, C. L. Wright, Helen Minkler, E. W. Cole, John Murdock and Anna Burgett. West Dayton Delegate reported for Loran Irby.

A gracious service with a sermon by W. C. Roberts on "Channels of Blessing".

Wednesday, 9:30 A.M.

Service opened with the singing of "Love Divine". Prayer offered by Mildred Stratton.

Roll call and reading of the Minutes. Ordered that John Snedden be seated as delegate from Baker Chapel, and name of Mrs. Ora Roe added to list of Delegates.

Com. on Examination of Character reported the following passed; Anna Burgett, Mildred Stratton and Robert Stratton. Report adopted as amended. Character of W. B. Whitehead passed by vote of Conference. Resolution offered concerning a Traveling President. After discussion action was postponed until after election of officers. Missionary Board report read and adopted. See Report No. 2. Com. on Courtesy presented Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Sizer of the West Dayton church, and Mr. and Mrs. D. E. Howard of the Fairview church. The Vice Pres. was called to the Chair and the Conf. Pres. gave his report. Report adopted. See Report No. 1. J. M. Williams read Statistical Report. The young people joined the Conf. group and the Order of the Day, a Tithing message was presented by L. L. Folger and C. L. Wright.

The Vice Pres. was called to the Chair and the Conf. President stated that he did not wish to continue as President and urged that the office be given to another.

A letter from W. C. Graves was read by the Sec. The Roll of Elders was read.

The election of officers followed with the result as given in the Official Directory. Adjourned.

Ballinger, Earl Good and Mrs. Freeland were excused. The Auditing Com. reported. Report adopted. See Report No. 3. Com. on Pastoral Relations read a partial report. Friday be the hour for the ordination of Dwight Ferguson. E. W. Cole and Fred Fields excused. Recessed for five minutes.

Reconvened. "Faith of our Fathers", was sung and prayer was offered by W. C. Roberts.

Resolution concerning Traveling President read. Discussion followed. Ordered that this question be committed to a committee of three elders and three lay-men to prayerfully consider during the year, and report to the next Annual Conference. The following committee was elected; G. W. Morse, C. L. Wright, W. C. Roberts, E. R. McMillan, Curtis Knight and J. S. Dunn. Ordered that 2:00 P.M. Friday be given to E. F. McCarty to present the Connectional interests. Curtis Knight read the Statistical Report of E. C. Kenney. Ordered that 10:30 A.M. Friday be the Order of the Day to hear Pres. McConn. Ordered that the duties of Conf. President and Vice Pres. be the same as last year. Letter read from H. W. Thompson. Ordered that the Secretary send a letter of sympathy and Christian fellowship to Brother Thompson. A Resolution concerning Temperance offered by Curtis Knight. Ordered that the Resolution be referred to a Com. of three. Leslie Wilcox, K. M. Lewis and Curtis Knight elected Com. Ordered that L. L. Folger express the appreciation of the Conference to Brother Williams, our retiring President. This was done in simple, sincere words, to which Brother Williams made reply and all joined in singing "Blest be the Tie that Binds". Adjourned.

McMillan be a committee to interview the Buckeye Terminex Co. in regard to inspection of buildings for termites. Com. on Temperance Resolution reported. Report adopted. See Report No. 6. Ordered that the Conf. Treas. be instructed to pay \$2.50 annually from the General Conference Fund for the General Conf. President's salary. Resolutions Nos. 7 and 9 rescinded. Ordered that in Resolution 22 the words be struck out from "possible" to "in order".

Order of the Day called and Pres. McComm spoke of the work and the financial problem of Marion College. Recessed to the call of the Chair.

Reconvened for the ordination service. Prof. and Mrs. Csehy played "The Sweet Bye and Bye". Prayer was offered by J. M. Williams. Leslie Wilcox brought a fitting exhortation from the text "That good thing which was committed unto thee, keep by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us". J. M. Williams, A. D. Osborn and L. L. Folger assisted in the ordination of Dwight Ferguson.

The personal testimonies of Brother and Sister Ferguson encouraged and blessed, and the prayers of the Conference are for the success of Brother Ferguson and his party. "I Need Thee Every Hour" was played and L. L. Folger offered the closing prayer.

Friday, 2:00 P.M.

Song, and Roll call. Earl Van Houghton and Charles Bechtol excused.

Com. on Pastoral Relations read Report. Order of the Day called. W. C. Roberts led in prayer and E. F. McCarty presented the Connectional Interests. John Hunter spoke briefly on the Educational Plan. Recessed to the call of the Chair.

Reconvened. Singing led by K. M. Lewis.

Ordered that the Sec. have the Minutes mimeographed in manuscript form. Ordered that the Sec. be authorized to buy a new Record book. The Board of Trustees and Camp Ground Com. read a partial report. Report adopted. Ordered that the date of the 1936 Conf. and Camp be continued the same as this year because the evangelist is already engaged. Ordered that after 1936 we return to the old date of Conf. and Camp, the third Tuesday in August. Recessed to the call of the Chair.

Reconvened at 6:45 P.M.

Ordered that the Roll of Honored Dead be omitted from the Minutes until such time as the Conf. desires it included. Ordered that the Conf. Sec. charge fifteen cents per copy for the Minutes. Com. on Pastoral Relations gave third reading of Report. Report adopted. See Report No. 4. Minutes read and adopted.

Report No. 1

Report of the Conference President.

We are glad to make a brief report of the work and conditions of our Conference at the close of the best year we have known in its history. Three new churches have been organized and a number of gracious revivals have come to our people, resulting in an increase of devotion, of members and finance for which we give God all the glory.

May 13th by letter of recommendation and transfer, we received the Rev. Walter C. Graves, and appointed him to Conf. evangelistic work. At present he is holding a meeting for our new church at Fairview. This church was organized June 21st with D. E. Howard appointed pastor.

Dec. 12th E. R. Bressler was appointed pastor of Marion Mission church, but resigned Mar. 9th. Later the Marion Church was turned over to the Rev. Porter, pastor of the Emmanuel Baptist church of Marion, he to pay rent for the same after Aug. 1st, or buy the building from the Conf. Trustees.

May 14th E. R. McMillan and myself visited Cincinnati and organized a very promising church at the corner of Beekman and Sutter Sts., to be known as the Fairmount Church. The Rev. Thomas Bailey was received from the Kentucky Conf. and appointed pastor of this church.

July 19th at the request of Clyde Sedgwick, I visited and organized a church at Sugar Grove, near Athens, appointing Brother Sedgwick as pastor.

During the year the Rev. John Omerod and the Rev. Harry Stanley have been granted letters of standing and transfer from our Conf., they being desirous of working in fields outside our Conf.

May 1st John Woodhouse was appointed pastor of the Northridge Church, Dayton, which is looking to the Wesleyan Conference for a home in the near future.

God is placing before us "an open door", will we enter before it closes?
