Standing Rules

No. 1 The Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books two weeks before the opening date of Conference, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hand by that time if credit on the Statistical Report is desired.

No. 2 The President, after his fourth round of Quarterly Conferences, shall mail the delegates credentials to the Conference Secretary who shall be the Committee on Credentials. It shall be his duty to prepare the roll before conference begins.

No. 3 All persons introduced to the Conference shall be given honorary seats with the right to speak on all questions, but not to vote.

No. 4 The office expense of the President and the Secretary and the Treasurer shall be paid by the Conference. Also all Conference supplies shall be purchased by the Conference.

No. 5 The Secretary and the Treasurer shall be paid twenty-five dollars per year for their services.

No. 6 The Conference Treasurer shall be bonded each year.

No. 7 An abbreviated form of the Pastor's Statistical Report shall be used for conference reading.

No. 8 The Annual Conference shall elect a Nominating Committee of three to meet prior to the next Annual Conference and nominate the working committees for the session.

No. 9 The Conference President and the Board of Trustees shall constitute a Committee for the Building and Location of Churches and Parsonages.

No. 10 Each pastor shall be allowed time out from his duties as pastor to hold two revivals each year if he so desires. The church he serves as pastor shall not withhold his salary while he is absent on such authorized revivals. In case any extra expense is involved in filling the pulpit while the pastor is engaged in such said revival such extra expense shall be paid by the church whose pastor is absent holding the revival.

No. 11 All church records shall close the last day of the month preceding the opening date of Conference.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

The fifty-eighth annual session of the South Georgia Conference convened at Hortense, Ga. on the Campgrounds on August 10, 1953 at eight o'clock, with the president, W. T. Brinson, presiding. The song service was led by H. L. McCall. God's presence was felt in a real way in this first service. Brother R. C. Mullinax brought a wonderful message on "The glorious church," from Matthew 16:18.

Tuesday Morning, August 11

The song service was led by E. C. Hord. The Lord's Supper was observed.

The business meeting was called to order by the president, W. T. Brinson. Prayer was led by F. H. Harris.

The roll of Elders and conference preachers was called.

The report of the committee on credentials was given and adopted. The roll of lay delegates was called.

The conference bar was set to include the first three seats across the tabernacle, except the left side, and the three right side seats.

Mrs. Nellie Long was seated as alternate delegate from the Wayne Charge in the absence of C. C. Harris.

The report of the Nomination Committee was given by F. H. Harris and adopted. (See Reports)

F. H. Harris was elected to the committee on Moral Reform.

Mrs. C. M. Payne was elected to the committee on apportionment.

A letter from A. C. Legg was read by the secretary.

W. L. Snellgrove was elected to the committee on courtesy.

Mack Thompson resigned from the apportionment committee. His resignation was accepted.

The committee on Courtesy reported and Brother Lonnie Strickland of the Savannah Nazarene Church, Dr. R. C. Mullinax, President of Central College, were introduced to the conference.

The time for the election of officers was set as the first business in the afternoon meeting.

The report of the Committee on Conference Entertainment was given and adopted. (See Reports.)

The Committee on Apportionment gave a report which was adopted. (See Reports.) A motion prevailed that one dollar per member for improvements on Ashburn Campgrounds be added to this Report.

Brother Wigglesworth gave his report for evangelistic work.

A motion prevailed that the character of J. A. Cowart be passed.

A motion prevailed that three hundred copies of the minutes be printed.

A motion was carried that the secretary be authorized to edit the minutes with the assistance of others as needed.

A motion, that any unfinished business be left in the hands of the president and his advisory Board, was carried.

A motion to recess was carried.

The Chairman called the conference to order.

An ordination service was held, with Dennis Carter, Neal Palmer, and G. C. Gilliard ordained as elders. Rev. R. C. Mullinax brought the message. W. T. Brinson, W. W. Wigglesworth, C. M. Payne, E. C. Hord, W. M. Phillippe assisted in the service.

A motion prevailed to recess to the call of the chair.

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the fifty-eighth session of the South Georgia Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Greetings!

It is with a spirit of deep humility that I submit the following report:

This has been a year filled with trials and problems, but the Lord's grace has proven sufficient for all of them. Even though we have not accomplished all that we desired, our motto should be "Onward and upward." We are in a fierce battle against sin—which is abounding everywhere. We are faced with a battle that only holy men can win. Brethren, let us live holy lives, always giving the Holy Ghost pre-eminence in all that we do. God only knows what the children of God will have to face in the future, but it is an encouragement to know that God has provided an armour for us. Let's keep on the breast plate of righteousness, don't fail to wield the sword of the Spirit, stay shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace, use the mighty bow that drives home the truth, shoot the arrow of conviction that will pierce the conscience and prick the hearts of men and women until they are made to cry out, what shall we do to be saved? Millions are hungering for spiritual food that will satisfy. Let us keep the table spread for them. Let's do all we can to win children for the Sunday Schools, young people into the W.Y.P.S., and all into fellowship of the church. Let's promote a greater missionary spirit among our people. There is much to be done, but we have the help of the blessed Holy Ghost who never fails.

I would like for us to resolve that we observe simultaneously a week of fasting and prayer in each church in the conference next year. Also that two whole nights of prayer be held at different intervals in each church. Prayer will move the hand of God, quicker than anything we can do. We also advocate two revival efforts in each church during the year.

We thank God for His unmerited favors and blessings upon us. We have not had a death, or serious illness in the ministry. Neither has there been any resignations of any pastors.

A new roof has been put on the Tifton church, also a coat of paint on the inside. The Sylvester church has been painted inside. Brother Palmer and his people have worked and sacrificed to make this possible.

Running Water, a bath room and other improvements have been made on the parsonage at Hortense. The pastor and people are due commendation.

The interior of the Cordele church has been redecorated and painted. Brother Hord and faithful few at Cordele have done exploits.

Many improvements have been made on the Ashburn Campground, and the last camp meeting was the best we have had in years. The Camp Meeting Committee is due much commendation.

A new cement block church has been erected at Coffee on the Mt. Pleasant charge. The pastor, members and the community are to be commended.

A beautiful new brick church is near completion at Liberty on the Wayne charge. This is going to be the best building in the conference, when completed. We do want to speak words of commendation to the pastor, and the people, especially C. C. Harris, who have all labored hard and contributed generously in this project.

The block church at Little Rock is near completion.

I have held all four quarterly conferences on each charge, along with the many other things that came up.
