#### Report No. 16

#### BY-LAWS OF MINISTERIAL RELIEF FUND

In case of serious sickness or prolonged illness or death of any of our active preachers or members of their families, money may be paid to them from this fund.

In case of serious sickness or death of any of our non-active preachers (not their families) are entitled to receive money from this fund.

In case the Secretary is in doubt as to the worthiness of a case, he may advise with the President and his Advisory Board.

The Secretary shall, on receipt of the worthiness of a case, pay out said fund.

Each minister is to pay his dues in advance so that there shall be funds in treasury when needed.

Each minister on the Conference Roll is assessed to pay one dollar on due notice from the secretary, excepting both husband and wife are preachers. In such case only one is assessed.

An active member is one who is engaged in definite Conference work: also those who are disabled through Conference, come under this provision.

When any one of the ministers fail to pay two consecutive payments, he has forfeited his right to receive any benefit until all back assessments are paid.

, Each church that has a pastor is asked to contribute to this fund each time the pastor is assessed the amount of one dollar.

This is not to be understood as each charge but for each church.

Let each pastor present this matter to his church at his first business meeting, that the Treasurer may be authorized to pay at any time needed.

All expense as to postage to be paid out of the Conference Treasury.

Superintendent spoke to local superintendents and offered plan of work: First six months that each band take a certain mission field and help evangelize with pennies. Last six months, circle the globe with pennies, using one penny to one-hundred miles. This is to be a contest closing next Conference time. It was also voted on Saturday to give Miltonvale fifteen dollars.

### PLAN OF WORK COMMITTEE

We the Plan of Work Committee respectfully submit the following report:

1. We recommend that this plan of work and the efficiency standard be read quarterly in each local society.

2. That we observe the "Red Letter Days:" (a) "Harvest Home Day," for educational work. (b) Easter programs, gifts and offerings for Home Missions. (c) World Day of Prayer. (d) "May Day." To be known as gift day, bandages and such gifts as can be sent with out-going missionaries or used in our home field.

3. That October (the third Sunday), be observed as Harvest Home Day. We would urge each local society to send cash or make donations to the Miltonvale College dormitory.

4. That by recommendation of the General Conference Society all local dues be sent our Conference Treasurer and be divided as follows: 25 cents to be forwarded to the Treasurer of the General Conference for the General Fund, 25 cents to be retained in the Conference treasury, and the remaining 50 cents to be used for missionary work and be applied on local budget. Please designate specifically where credit is desired.

5. That each Society elect a Solicitor for the Wesleyan Missionary Magazine, the same to be a permanent officer. Her duties shall be to secure at least two new subscriptions and renewals to the Wesleyan Missionary.

6. We recommend the envelope system for the collection of dues, the Treasurer to help record the amounts paid in. That all money be in the hands of the Treasurer at least one week before Conference.

7. That each Society contribute 10 cents per member to pay General Conference Delegate's expenses.

8. That each Society contribute at least \$6.00 for the Home Missions connectionally supported.

9. That each Society contribute at least \$5.00 to the Hephzibah Orphanage. Such contributions to be applied on the budget.

10. That each local Treasurer send all monies to the Conference Treasurer at least one week before Conference convenes.

11. We recommend the use of the program printed in the Wesleyan Missionary.

12. That all bandages be sent to Rev. E. F. McCarty, 222 S. Clemens Ave., Lansing, Mich., the Society receiving credit of 50 cents per pound.

13. That all money be disbursed through our local and Conference Treasurers, that money or receipts applied on budget be sent from the local Woman's Home and Foreign Missionary Society Treasurer to the Conference Treasurer. That each local Society use the treasurer's book prepared by the General Conference Society, the same to be audited by a committee of two before the report be adopted.

14. That each local president appoint a committee of two whose duties it shall be to visit the sick and to work in harmony with the pastor in rendering assistance that will help in reaching souls and building up the Kingdom of God.

15. That each Society grade themselves by the Efficiency Standard. A grade of ten per cent will be given on any of each ten points chosen. Societies making a grade of 90 per cent will receive honorable mention and those making a grade of 100 per cent will be placed on the Honor Roll.

16. We advise districting the Conference into three districts, each district to be supervised by a District Organizer. She to keep in touch with each Society in her district and report the condition of her district to the Conference President quarterly. Signed,
