STANDING RULES:

STANDING RULES

1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.
2. The President and Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make such property secure to the Conference.
3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the board of administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Camp meeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two Sundays.
4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30th. Pastors shall report membership as of this date. All conference treasurer's books shall be closed July 10th. The pastoral year shall end with the closing of Camp Meeting.
5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference Secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank to the Conference Treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. IX "Disbursed for Budget", forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference. The secretary shall forward his statistical report to the statistical committee chairman at least 10 days prior to the convening of Conference.
6. Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their report.
7. The following items on the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor; Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodists, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School attendance; number of Church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VII Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item IX Complete; Total Benevolence; and the Contributed totals.
8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
9. The Conference Secretary and Conference Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars (\$10) annually from the Conference Treasury.
10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.
11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Minutes from year to year.
12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Fund Committee.
13. The Camp Meeting Board shall consist of seven members; the President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S. President, W. Y. President, and Camp Meeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference Officers.
14. The Conference W. Y. President and the Conference Treasurer and the Conference W.M.S. President will be members of the Conference Board of Church Extension and Evangelism, by virtue of their offices.
15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.
16. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.

Meeting #1 - July 28, 1964 - 9:00 a.m.

Rev. Thomas G. Porter led in singing, "Draw Me Nearer".

The Conference President, Rev. D. H. Cline, called the 71st session of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America to order.

Pastors were instructed to verify the reading of church delegates. Roll was called. Twenty-three were present.

The members of the conference were instructed to take their place within the conference bar.

Rev. Ira Gross submitted the report of the Nominating Committee. (Report #1) The motion was made and supported that the Nominating Committee report be adopted. Motion carried.

The Courtesy Committee presented Rev. C. Wesley Lovin, Executive Secretary of the Department of Church Extension and Evangelism of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. Rev. Lovin brought personal greetings and greetings from Wesleyan World Headquarters.

The Courtesy Committee presented Mrs. Margaret McCarty, missionary to Sierra Leone, West Africa. Mrs. McCarty brought personal greetings and gave her testimony in recognition of the mercies of the Lord as extended to her.

Motion made and supported to give Rev. C. Wesley Lovin an honorary seat within the Conference Bar. Motion carried.

Motion made and supported to permit the camp meeting manager to appoint an assistant to help him with camp administration.

Rev. Gross appointed Mrs. Walter Stamm as an assistant to help with camp administration.

The Conference President reported that the Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism recommended that Conference adjourn temporarily to meet again Wednesday, July 29, 1964 at 9:00 a.m. to allow the auxiliary organizations time to meet for business.

The report of the committee to study and report next annual conference concerning the practice of securing the Nominating Committee was read. (Report #2) Motion carried to adopt this report. Considerable discussion ensued. Motion carried to refer to a committee for further study.

By common consent the chair set three as the number on the committee. Rev. Ira C. Gross, Rev. A. G. Yates and Rev. William Gale were elected to this committee.

Motion carried to adjourn. Mr. Fred Arnold led in prayer.

Motion carried that we hear reports of officers before the election.

The orders of the day were announced.

The Sunday School Secretary nominated William Gale (new member) and David Overby (to take Rev. Dunn's place) to Conference Sunday School Board. They were elected.

Rev. Ira C. Gross read his pastoral report - St. Johns.

A motion passed to move on to committee reports and election of Conference Treasurer.

Rev. Lester Bennett read Resolutions Committee report. It was adopted by motion. (Report #8)

Rev. Gale read Pastoral Relations Committee report relative to conference assignments. Adopted by motion. (Report #9)

Rev. Gale read a second report from the Pastoral Relations Committee. Adopted by motion. (Report #10)

Mrs. Lillian Stone read report from Committee on Religious Services. Adopted by motion. (Report #11)

Rev. Douglas Bacheller read C.Y.C. Director's report. Adopted by motion. (Report #12)

A motion passed to receive report from Rev. Cline relative to Nominating Committee's nomination for Conference Treasurer. The name of Gordon Bennett was submitted.

Gordon Bennett was elected Conference Treasurer by ballot vote.
Pastor's reports given: Rev. A. G. Yates - Russellville and Rev. Russell Dunn - Vancouver.

Rev. Russell Dunn read report from Conference Prayer Fellowship. Adopted by motion. (Report #13)

Rev. Dunn read Prayer Fellowship Treasurer's report. Adopted by motion. (Report #14)

A motion carried to proceed with election of Nominating Committee.

A motion carried to table the election of the Nominating Committee.

Pastor's reports given: Rev. Herman Smith - Seattle, Rev. William Gale - Emmanuel, Rev. D. O. Bacheller - Salem, Rev. Lester Bennett - Aumsville.

A motion made and supported that the Thanks Committee be abolished. Motion lost.

A motion passed to adjourn.

David Gale gave an oral report relative to Wesleyan Youth elections.

A motion passed to have the Memorial Service immediately. Those honored were Grace Brooks, Mary Schutz, Edward Luthy, Rev. Frank Ackerman, Otto Freson, Sena Porter.

The conference recessed to call of the chair.

Meeting called to order by chair at 4:35.

The CCE & E Committee report was presented by Mrs. Leona Bennett. (Report #21)

A motion to amend the report to read "the Conference President by part time" was supported. Amendment lost. The main motion carried.

17. The bar of Conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.
18. The annual Conference shall meet for business and organization on the opening day from 9:00-10:00 A.M. and then recess for committee work to allow the W.M.S. and WY Conferences to convene and transact business.
19. The time for hearing the Conference President's and Treasurer's reports be set for 9:00 A.M. the first Wednesday of Conference and the election of conference officers to immediately follow these reports.
20. There shall be a Nominating Committee whose duties shall be to present nominations for all the regular session committees of the Conference. This committee shall consist of the Conference President as chairman, and three Elders elected annually by the Conference. The Conference shall, each year, designate two churches whose delegates shall also be a part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior to the opening of each annual Conference at a time and place designated by the President. It shall nominate session committees and may serve to nominate special committees as the Conference may request.
21. Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and a gasoline allowance. When these are paid they shall be reported in Item VII of the pastor's Statistical report on separate lines. When the parsonage is used for Sunday School and other church activities, the pastor and board of stewards shall agree on the proportion of the total utilities to be reckoned as used by the pastor.
22. There shall be an Annual Ministerial Institute. The time, place, program and entertainment to be arranged by a committee of two Elders elected annually.
23. It shall be the duty of the Conference President and Secretary to arrange for the printing of the Conference Minutes.
24. The publication of a Conference Paper shall be placed in the hands of a committee consisting of the Conference President and two persons elected by the Conference. This committee shall select an Editor and Publisher and arrange for the financing of said paper.
25. The Conference President's report shall include a statement of all official acts, a summary of church business meetings held, personal and phone consultations, and a financial statement listing gifts, marriage and funeral fees received, and travel and office expense.
26. The C.C.E. & E. Committee shall be designated as a Board of Managers.
27. The President and Secretary of the Annual Conference, upon proper authorization by the Conference Board of Trustees of the Oregon Annual Conference in session, shall be empowered to sign any notes, mortgages, and any instruments of acquisitions or conveyances of property of and for the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
