DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Conference convened June 7, 1932, at 8:00 P. M.

Conference Sermon—The Conference sermon was preached by Rev. J. F. Simpson on Tuesday evening, June 7, from the thirty-third chapter of Exodus, verse eighteen: "Show me thy glory." A very fitting message was given to the ministers, delegates and friends who had gathered in the tabernacle on the camp grounds at Aberdeen, South Dakota, for the first service. A gracious altar service followed. The Lord's blessing rested upon the preaching of the Word and the people.

Business Session—The business session opened Wednesday morning at 9 o'clock. Rev. H. H. Turner led the devotionals, reading and commenting on the 24th Psalm. Another time of refreshing from the presence of the Lord was manifest at this time.

Business-The meeting was called to order by Vice-President Rev. J. C. McGovern.

Courtesy—Rev. T. P. Baker, Home Missionary Secretary and Connectional Representative, was introduced and addressed the Conference briefly.

Roll Call—The roll was called, to which most of the active pastors responded. Also the delegates were practically all present in the first session and answered to the roll call.

Business—Election of a Nominating Committee. A Nominating Committee consisting of J. F. Simpson, R. J. Eling, J. E. Spry, ministers, and Mrs. R. H. Peterson and Frank Martin, delegates, was elected. They were excused by the President for committee work.

Time of Sessions—The time was fixed from 8 A. M. to 11 A. M., and from 1: 30 P. M. until adjournment.

Bar of Conference—The Conference Bar was designated by using the first nine rows of seats in the middle of the tabernacle.

Passage of Character—The following names of absent elders and preachers were called and their characters passed: Otto Jensen, Mrs. Otto Jensen, missionaries for Sunday School Union; Minnie Knecht, missionary in Kentucky Mountains; C. K. Thompson, A. J. Tiffany, Hazel Carter, Missionary to Africa; Chester Reed and L. L. Knapp, American Sunday School Union Missionaries. Mrs. F. J. Traver being sick and unable to attend Conference, special prayer by the Conference was made for her, as her character was passed; A. M. Wiley, Principal of the Jamestown Holiness Academy.

O. E. McCracken, Superintendent of Union Gospel Mission, Fargo, was called upon, and in his address to Conference requested that he be given a letter of standing. Brother McCracken has been a great blessing to the Conference during his membership with us. On motion his request was granted.

On motion the name of Frank Strong was referred to the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

Appointment—President appointed Mrs. R. H. Peterson and Conrad De Jong as lay members to the Itineracy and Orders Committee.

Reports—The Nominating Committee read its report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 1.)

The President's report was read by the Secretary, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 2.)

Vice-President's report was read and adopted. (See Report No. 3.)

Publishing Committee—It was decided that the minutes be published and a committee be elected to condense material to save expense.

Adjournment-Adjourned by limitation of time. Rev. Bailie closed with prayer.

Wednesday Afternoon

Opening—Meeting was called to order. Roll called and minutes read, corrected and approved. Mrs. Thomas Bailie resigned from the O. K. Committee, and Mrs. W. C. Brannon was elected to fill the vacancy.

Appointment—A committee was appointed to formulate plans for a Ministerial Bible Conference to be held in the interests of Conference: W. D. Shelor, H. H. Turner and W. C. Brannon.

Recess—President declared a recess to hear Rev. F. Lincicome, who had been invited to preach for us at 2 o'clock. His subject was prayer. A very gracious message was given and graciously received.

Recess continued for committee work.

Thursday Morning

Opening—Devotionals were conducted by Rev. J. E. Spry, reading from I Chron. 16.

Roll call.

Minutes read and approved.

Report—Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day read its report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

Report—Committee on Publishing Minutes read its report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

The Secretary was instructed to write the Publishing House for prices on this change of printing.

On motion pastors were to be charged 15 cents each for minutes.

The Secretary was permitted to hire a typewriter to write up the minutes.

Adjournment-Adjourned for committee work.

Orders of the Day-Tithing service at 10 A. M.

Thursday Afternoon

Opening-Prayer by Brother Arthur Calhoun.

Roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Question of moving church up for discussion. On motion permission was granted for the Crandon Church to be moved to Redfield. Motion prevailed that members of the Conference donate all the help possible in the moving project.

Orders of the Day-Orders of the Day were called for which was to hear Rev. T. P. Baker on Connectional interests.

Called to order.

Report—Camp Meeting Treasurer's report was read and adopted. (See Report No. 6.)

Ministerial Relief Fund Secretary gave his report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 7.)

Treasurer's report was read and adopted. (See Report No. 8.)

Adjournment-Adjourned for committee work.

Friday Morning

Opening—Devotionals led by A. M. Wiley. He read from the 18th Psalm.

Roli Call.

Minutes were read and adopted.

Reports—Auditing Committee read their report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 9.)

Nominating Committee read their report, and it was voted to defer action until after election of officers.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read their report, and it was adopted. (See Report No. 10.)

Credentials—Motion prevailed that elders holding credentials and having been received from other denominations be given credentials in keeping with those held.

Motion—Motion was made to have the constitution of the Ministers' Relief Fund printed in the minutes. It was so ordered

Recommendation—It was recommended that in election of delegates to Conference, pastors and churches endeavor to avoid electing the same delegate to serve both the church and the Missionary Society.

Orders of the Day-Orders of the Day were called which was for the election of officers.

Motion—Motion prevailed that, except for President, first ballot be elective if there was a majority.

Motion prevailed that Sunday School Secretary, Railroad Secretary and Field Secretary be elected by acclamation.

Time—The time having elapsed, it was ordered that the ladies of the Missionary Society be excused and time extended for the election of standing committees.

Election of Committees and Boards-The Nominating Committee again presented their report, and it was adopted as read. (See Report No. 1.)

A Sunday School Board was elected, consisting of W. C. Brannon, Rufus Reisdorph and W. D. Shelor having been elected as Sunday School Secretary.

On motion it was decided that we have a Sunday School Rally during our next Conference, the program to be in the hands of the Sunday School Board.

Adjournment-Session adjourned by vote.

Saturday Forenoon

Motion prevailed that the name of Ronan be eliminated from our reports.

On motion Conference adjourned to the call of the Chair.

The meeting was called to order and minutes were read and approved. Motion prevailed to reconsider the Report on Pastoral Relations. Motion prevailed to refer the report back to the committee.

Adjournment—Adjourned to meet after the afternoon preaching service.

VICE-PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Members of the Dakota Annual Conference:

We are glad to bring to you a brief account of our stewardship, as acting President of the Conference, during the last nine months.

I wish my service had been more efficient and more fruitful, but I am exceedingly thankful that God has been pleased to own our humble service, and make it a measure of blessing to many. I have visited all of our churches, except Buffalo, spending at least one Sabbath with each, and I wish to voice the gratitude of my heart to the pastors and all the members of our churches for their loyal support and kind consideration I have received at their hands. The past year has been a period when our people, pastors and laity, have been facing hard problems, from a financial standpoint, but it has been inspiring to note the trusting and uncomplaining spirit in which they have met these testing times. Over

and over, as I went from them, I thanked God that in His good providence it had been my lot to be in church fellowship with such a self-sacrificing and consecrated body of people.

There have been two churches organized during the year. Our President, Rufus Reisdorph, and his wife, conducted a series of meetings at Buffalo, Wyoming, following our last Conference session, and at the close of the meeting organized a Wesleyan Methodist Church and appointed Rev. Wayne Cretsinger as pastor, who gives a good report as to the prospect of our work at Buffalo.

On November 15, we organized a Wesleyan Methodist Church at Ipswich, South Dakota, which was largely made possible by the sacrificing efforts of our Aberdeen pastor, Rev. Brannon, who has given much of his service in the interest of this work, and has continued to shepherd the flock throughout the year.

I have visited the Ipswich Church three different times, and believe we shall have a strong church there in time. We also have an appointment at the Pool Schoolhouse, which gives promise of a good appointment to join with the Ipswich work.

On May 16, 1932, I issued a certificate to Rev. Fred Hunt, authorizing him to administer the sacrament and to solemnize matrimony.
