STANDING RULES

- 1. The treasurer shall be paid \$25.00 and the Secretary\$15.00 p/yr. for their services.
- 2. Nominating Committee- There shall be four elected members and the President, who is to be chairman. Two elected members to be elders and two lay delegates, to be designated by the selection of local churches whose delegates are to serve. It is understood that members of this committee are not to be from the same church.
- 3. Each pastor shall have a two weeks vacation with pay, or if he desires to hold a two weeks meeting, this will be considered in lieu of his vacation.
- 4. The President and his advisory board are designated a Deed Examining Committee. This committee shall inspect each deed for church or conference property before it is registered and see that it contains the necessary disciplinary provisions to secure the property to the conference. It shall be the duty of each person charged with the responsibility of negotiating for or handling any deed for the church or conference properties to submit such a deed to the deed examining committee for inspection and approval before offering it for registration.
- 5. Any work or worker using the name "Wesleyan Methodist" within the boundaries of this annual Conference must have the approval of the Annual Conference or the President and his Advisory Board.
- 6. No new work shall be organized until all involved property is duly deeded to the Annual Conference and local trustees, or such steps are being taken and has the approval of the conference trustees.

- 7. The date for beginning the Annual Conference and Campmeeting shall be the fourth Tuesday in June.
- 8. Fiscal year- the closing date of the fiscal year shall be May 31. The conference treasurer's books close June 7, and no money or receipts shall be honored after that date. The treasurer shall forward the statistical blanks to the statistical chairman.
- 9. The introduction of all new business of such nature as to require an election, must be presented not later than noon of the third day of conference.
- 10. The Campmeeting and Campground Committee shall also be the permanent Orders of the Day Committee. They shall prepare the Conference and Campmeeting program in advance for publication.
- 11. Inasmuch as the pastor and delegates are actually representatives of the local church at the Annual Conference, we recommend the local church pay the expenses, in advance, of their pastor and delegates. This is to include transportation, meals, and lodging.
- 12. That each of our churches release their pastor, if on call and under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board, to hold one evangelistic meeting on a new field or in one of the weaker charges, and that the local church continue to pay his salary during his absence.
- 13. The election of Conference Officers shall be in the morning meeting of the third day of Conference.
- 14. The Conference Wesleyan Youth Pres. shall be a member of the Campmeeting Committee.

- each Quarterly Conference for the Conference President's traveling expense. This is not to apply on Budget credit but is to be receipted to Conference Work Fund.
- 16. The Conference President shall be reimbursed for his traveling expense at \$.05 per mile. This is to be paid from the Conference Work Fund.
- 17. The Conference President is to visit the local churches as he sees the need.
- 18. Quarterly Conference business meetings shall be held as follows:
 First Quarter -Immediately after August 31
 Second Quarter-Immediately after November 30
 Third Quarter-Immediately after February 28
 Fourth Quarter-Immediately after May 31
- 19. All pastors are to read these standing rules to their local churches at least one month before Annual Conference. Furthermore, each pastor should pay special attention to notes on the statistical blanks and to the first paragraph in particular.
- 20. Pastors are to fill their pulpits through the conference session.
- 21. The Conference President shall be Chairman ex officio of Campmeeting Committee.
- 22. The Woman's Missionary Society President shall be a member ex officio of the Campmeeting Committee.

Report No. 1 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Part I

TO the members of the Eighth Annual Conference of Florida:

We have many things for which to thank our Heavenly Father. Many times this year we wondered if we were getting much accomplished. We see so much that needs to be done and seemingly so few to get it done.

The greatest instruments in the work of the Lord and in winning souls are unity and the spirit of oneness. Often it is said that we are in need of workers who have a clear through experience with the Lord and that will work with the church and conference. I wish to remind the conference that any worker who is in love with God and works rightly by his church will automatically be working for the Conference.

We are aware of the fact that this is a busy, greedy, money-mad age. It seems easier to get people to give their money than to give their time and service to the work of the Lord. Let us remember that God wants our time, devotion, and love.

Most of our pastors have to work at least some, if not full time, to supplement their salary. I trust that none will get so busy obtaining a livelihood that they will lose the concern and burden for souls and our church. I hope the day is near when no pastor will have to work at secular work but can put all his time in building up the church. I am sure the need of this hour is for us to pray, wait, and believe God for a real Heaven-sent revival that

will move the hearts of people toward God. That is what will build up our churches.

This year has been a turning point in our conference. First, because several new workers have felt the call of God to come to our conference to begin pioneer work. Second, the conference has launched the new campground project that will mean more for the conference than we can realize at this time. Third, some of the churches are getting over the hump of indebtedness and are able to launch new programs.

We feel if the conference is to make the progress that it should, some definite decisions must be made. We are trusting the Lord to help us make these and go forward for Him.

We took a group of men to Apalachicola for a week and plastered, painted, and finished the church there. We are glad to report this work is growing and coming along nicely.

Also, with a group of men, we spent nearly a week finishing and getting the West Tampa Church building ready for services. We are happy to report that this work is coming along so good that it could use some new Sunday School rooms. Under the leadership of Rev. Leonard Catron, in less than a year we can see that the church there can be a strong one.

We are seeking steps to start a new church in Sarasota and also in Marianna, Florida. We believe we can have a good church in each of these growing towns.

At the first of this year I took my family and spent six weeks in a northern part of the state doing my best to strengthen the work

in this section of the State. I have contacted some men who we feel could be a great blessing to our conference. We are expecting some of these to take work in our conference this year.

we are aware of the fact that we have had to do some things that some could not understand, but I assure you, God being my helper, that we did nothing to hinder His work. My desire is to see His work go forward.

REPORT No. TEN

Campmeeting Committee

According to orders, the campmeeting committee undertook to promote a winter campmeeting at Intercession City, Florida. We experienced many difficulties. Because we heard of plans for a sister denomination to take over the facilities there it seemed wise not to attempt another such operation in that area.

We were agreed that the unity of the conference in purpose, doctrine, and standards was essential if the conference was to experience the growth we believe God expects. We further believed that this unity of purpose could best be accomplished by an annual campmeeting which would be within the financial reach of the families of the conference. The city of Brooksville was selected for this site because it was nearly equal distance from the extreme possible limits of the conference.

For the purpose of locating and selecting such a site the committee met in Brooksville on January 12, 1957. Some preliminary searching had been done and a plot of 28.95 acres located by Rev. Cecil W. Shaffer. This seemed to the entire committee to fulfill all the requirements for a campground. A binder of \$100.00 was left with real estate broker Ed Cook, with instructions to draw up a contract.

On January 16, 1957, the combined campmeeting committee and conference trustees met in
Brooksville. The trustees approved the choice
and signed the contract. We were to pay a
total of 6780.00 for the tract, with \$2780.00
as a down payment. On this same date \$900.00
was given as binder until final papers could
be drawn up.

On January 22, 1957, the trustees signed mortgage papers for \$4000.00, and \$1380.00 more was paid on the down payment, the balance of \$400.00 to be paid within 30 days. This amount was paid in March. The mortgage was to bear 5% interest. Fifty dollars (\$50.00) plus interest was to be paid each month.

The campmeeting committee met with the trustees on January 27, 1957, to decide on a plan to finance this venture. It was agreed to sell forty-five lots, 60x90 at \$300.00 each and to lease sixty lots, 30 x 50, at \$150.00 each. The said lease is to run for the life time of the lessee. These lots are available to any Wesleyan Methodist. This will provide over \$20,000.00 from which sym

the cost of the land will be paid, streets cut and graded, a water system installed, and sanitary facilities provided for campground property which will include lease lots. The remainder will be used as far as it will go to erect camp buildings.
