

CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

I. The Resolutions of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.

II. All visiting members of our own, or other Churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.

III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.

IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.

V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.

VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.

VII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.

VIII. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

IX. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

X. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday-school offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

XI. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.

XII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIII. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.

XIV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

XV. The Committee on Credentials shall secure the necessary credentials as provided by our Discipline, from each delegate, with the post office address of the same.

XVI. The closing Sunday of the Conference year shall be the Sunday following the beginning of the Annual Conference. The pastors' salary on this closing Sunday shall be paid by the church of which he is pastor; and for the first Sunday of the new Conference year it shall be paid by the charge to which he is going.

XVII. Newly elected Conference Officers shall take office after the close of Conference Sunday.

XVIII. The Conference President shall include in the Orders of the Day a special period to consider Camp Meeting business.

DAILY JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday Evening Meeting

The first service of the 99th (or 1941) session of the Champlain Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church was held on Tuesday evening, July 1st. A fine group of pastors and delegates and friends were present, and joined in the song service led by Rev. Stopp. The President of the Conference, Rev. Mattoon, called on Brothers Jock and Finch to offer prayer. Following the announcements, Brother Edward Mein read the Scripture Lesson, and brought the opening messages on the theme "Divine Leadership." Closing song, "Trusting Jesus." Rev. McCarty closed with prayer.

Wednesday a. m.

Devotional service was in charge of Rev. Jock. Prayer by Brother F. Taylor and Sister Shippee. Scripture Lesson read: Col. 3:1-17.

Business: Roll call. It was voted to adopt the roll of delegates as read, with other names to be added as reported.

Conference bar voted to be first five rows of seats.

The time for daily proceedings was voted to be: a. m., open at 8:30, close at 11:30; p. m., open at 1:30, close by vote.

The Conference President read his annual report. Voted to be accepted, with special acts to be referred to proper committees. See Report No.1.

The Conference Treasurer read his report which was voted to be adopted as given. See Report No. 2.

The following were introduced to the Conference: Miss Alleine Curry, Mr. Herbert Seaman, Mr. Elton Seaman, Mr. Alvin Davison and Rev. E. F. McCarty.

The following were elected as Committee on Pastoral Relations: Elders, G. D. Jock, W. F. Lewis, H. Chapman. Laymen, Frank Mattoon, Robert Gunsalus, Harry Hall.

Voted to accept the resignation of Rev. Lewis and Harry Hall from this committee, and Rev. Northrup and Mrs. Rose Rorguites were elected to fill the vacancies.

Rev. Charles Dayton and Mr. Charles Elliott were elected Committee on Passage of Character.

Rev. Northrup gave a partial verbal report on the matter of the Conference Centennial History Publication. Report accepted. The matter was discussed.

It was voted to hold the meeting of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association at once. See Report No. 3.

Following this the Conference adjourned.

Wednesday p. m.

Devotions were led by Rev. Frank Taylor. Prayer by F. H. Wright. The Scripture Lesson was Col. 1:9-23.

Business: Opened with roll call. Reading of minutes was approved, with suggestion that the reason for the second 99th annual session be explained in the minutes.

Those introduced to the Conference were: Rev. F. H. Wright; Dr. Stephen Paine, President of Houghton College; Rev. and Mrs. F. Tyler, Margene Bennett, and Kenneth Smith.

The following characters were passed: Floyd Banker, Howard Chapman, E. D. Carpenter, J. J. Davison, C. A. Dayton, O. M. Finch and C. L. Hill.

Preaching Service: Following singing and prayer, Rev. Reginald Hewitt read Matt. 17:1-8, and preached the Conference sermon on the theme "Climbing with Christ," based upon the lesson read.

It was voted to adjourn for Committee work. Dismissal by Brother J. J. Davison.

Evening Service

Rev. Crowe led the singing. Prayer by Brother McCarty. A duet was sung by Pauline Chapman and Mrs. F. Tyler. Following the offering, Rev. and Mrs. Crowe also sang a duet. The message, preached by Brother Crowe, was based upon the texts at Matt. 3:3 and Luke 3:5. It was timely truth presented in an interesting manner.

Devotions: Elton Seaman, leader. Scripture read was John 15. Brother Dayton offered prayer.

Business: Roll call. Reading of minutes was approved. Introduced to the body, Arthur Osgood.

Brother Northrup was voted a temporary leave of absence from Conference session.

Verbal reports were given by the Chairmen of the Conference Young People's Districts.

It was recommended that the Fall Missionary and Sunday-school Convention be discontinued, and in its place the Friday of Camp Meeting week be designated as Young People's Day, with speakers and program suitable to the occasion. Resolution was adopted.

Chairmen of the Young People's Districts were elected as follows: Northern District, A. Northrup; Central District, S. Moon; Southern District, H. Chapman.

The afternoon message was given by Rev. F. H. Wright. It was in the form of a study of the Book of Romans. Adjourned by vote.

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL MESSAGE

To the members of the 99th Annual Session of the Champlain Conference now convened at West Chazy, N. Y., greeting!

In the providence of God we are once more permitted to gather for our annual assembly. God has been very gracious to us as a Conference in that He has seen fit to spare the lives of all our pastors. We are, however, called upon to mourn the loss of one from our midst, who was much beloved by all, Sister Rose Miller. She will be much missed. A fitting memorial service will be arranged for at a proper time during the session. The work in general is in very good condition. Several good revivals have been held through the Conference, with very good results, and should mean a substantial gain for the Conference. We are confronted with some problems that demand our careful attention; and we shall need much wisdom from Him who said, "If ye lack wisdom, ask of Me, and it shall be given." While all about us in the world there is confusion and unrest, we as the people of God should be calm, and confident in Him who said, "I will never leave you, nor forsake you." This is no time for division or schism in our ranks. "United we stand, divided we fall." God has entrusted us with a great gospel, and has said, "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to all people." This is our greatest task. And only as we keep committed to this task can we claim the blessing and favor of God. While God has not seen fit to give us any new churches this Conference year, I believe He is opening doors of opportunity to us, which are a real challenge to our faith. I trust that we shall have the vision and what else we shall need to meet the challenge. We believe that God very definitely opened the way for us to secure a house in Ticonderoga for a parsonage. Soon after Conference, we together with the Advisory Board, went to Ticonderoga for the purpose of securing such a property. We were able by the help of the Lord to locate a house which we thought suitable, and later closed the deal by paying a down payment, the sum of two hundred dollars, thereby securing possession of the property, and by contract agreed to pay the balance, six hundred dollars, as rent, at \$15 per month. I understand that this rent has been paid in full to date.

There is what I consider a good opportunity to open up a permanent work at Colton, N. Y. Rev. Reginald Hewitt has been interested in this work for more than a year, going to the place for prayermeeting each week through the Conference year. I would suggest that the Conference provide for an evangelistic campaign, in the form of a tent meeting, as soon after

Conference as may be, and to provide means to finance such a meeting, as may be necessary. I believe that God has opened this door. If this is true, we should enter it.

I have enjoyed the good fellowship of the brethren of the Conference through the year, and feel that I have received much spiritual strength and uplift from the same. We also trust that God has used us, in a small way at least, for the inspiration and blessing of some.

STANDING RULES

1. The Standing Rules of the Conference Missionary Society shall be printed in the Conference minutes each year.
2. In making her report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close her books one week before the Conference session.
3. One of the two statistical blanks sent to each society, after being carefully filled out, is to be given to the Statistical Committee at the beginning of the Conference, the other is to be retained by the delegate and later read to the local society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before being placed in the hands of the Statistical Committee.
4. All money raised by the society shall be used for missionary work, and no money shall be paid out without a vote of the society.
5. The Conference President shall receive annually \$5.00, the Treasurer \$3.00, and Secretary \$2.00 to defray expense of postage and writing material.
6. The voting body shall be composed of the Conference officers, Presidents of local societies, one delegate from each local society, Y. M. W. B. Superintendents, pastor's wives and lady pastors.

REPORTS

Report No. 1

PLAN OF WORK

The Committee Recommends:

1. That each local society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting to broaden our vision and inspire us to pray definitely for our work and workers. Aids to this are the Missionary Magazine, a Study book, and planned monthly correspondence with our missionaries.
2. That each society shall have at least one public, well advertised meeting, in which missionary needs shall be emphasized.

3. That we observe special days such as Harvest Day, "Wesleyan Missionary" Day and World Day of Prayer.

4. That each society elect a solicitor for the "Wesleyan Missionary" to keep the Magazine in circulation.

5. That the President, the Secretary and the Treasurer be subscribers to the "Wesleyan Missionary" and the "Wesleyan Methodist," and that fifty per cent of the membership be subscribers to the "Wesleyan Missionary."

6. That each local society continue sending \$6.00 to Southern Mountain Work, and \$5.00 to Hephzibah Orphanage. This should be sent through the Conference Treasurer, and applies on Budget.

7. That each society send \$1.00 per member to the Conference Treasurer, twenty-five cents of each dollar to be forwarded to the General Conference Treasurer for the General Fund. Also that twenty-five cents be retained in the Conference treasury and the remaining fifty cents be used directly for missionary work and be applied on local church budget.

8. That we continue sending supplies to the various mission fields as requested by the workers in charge.

9. That instead of buying clothing for the children at Hephzibah as in the past, we send an additional cash offering which may be used as most needed on arrival.

10. That we make special effort to can things for the Camp Meeting dining hall, and to make and send as many as possible of the following: pillows and quilts for the dormitories, sheets for cots, spreads for workers' beds, mirrors for rooms, furnishings for workers' rooms and mattresses for cots, large vegetable dishes and milk pitchers, etc. for the dining room, beds and linoleum for the dormitories.

11. That we have a missionary travel the Conference, visiting each charge, and that we procure the services of this missionary as early in the Conference year as possible.

12. That each delegate report to her society at the first meeting after Conference the proceedings of the Conference Society and spread the information gained concerning the work.

13. That each local secretary report annually on their statistical blanks to the Conference Society as to their rating according to the efficiency standard.

14. That the Plan of Work be read quarterly to our local societies in order to keep us stirred and enthused in our work.
