

#### In Memoriam

Rev. Oliver G. Wilson, D. D. (July 21, 1891 — June 28, 1959)

The Rev. Oliver G. Wilson rendered a long and distinguished service to the Wesleyan Methodist Church. He served as a pastor and later as Conference president in the Oklahoma Conference. Following this service, he gave 14 years as an instructor in the Theological Department at Miltonvale Wesleyan College. His official life in the General Church began in 1943 when he was called to the office of Sunday School Secretary and Editor. He served one quadrennium in this position and was then called in 1947 to the Editorship of THE WESLEYAN METHODIST where he gave himself until elected the first General Superintendent of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in 1959. God took him just a few minutes before his installation. Dr. Wilson also served under Board appointment for four Quadrenniums as advisor of the General Youth Council.



#### In Memoriam

Reverend David C. Stone

(April 2, 1902 - June 2, 1959)

The Reverend David C. Stone entered the North Carolina Conference in 1930. For twenty-nine years he gave himself, in the work of a pastor, at Hickory Chapel, Neighbor's Grove, Concord, Ennis Street in North Carolina; and Altavista, Radford, Farmville and Welcome in Virginia. He served faithfully on many of the Conference committees, with an exceptionally long and outstanding record as a member of the Shady Grove Camp Meeting Board. Although his health was failing for the past three years, he was still giving himself at the time of his death, as pastor of the Welcome Church, Arvonia, Virginia.

### Resolutions

#### NO. 1

Resolved, That the Trustees of the North Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of said conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the North Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage property indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the loan is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees and President of said North Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said Trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of at least four (4) members of his Advisory Board; and it is understood that this resolution empowers the said Trustees to act in the interim of the sessions of the Annual Conference.

#### NO. 2

Resolved, That this conference requires all deeds to houses of worship and parsonages built or purchased to be made to the North Carolina Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. All property held by said Conference is to be used by our ministry and membership, according to our Book of Discipline.

#### NO. 3

Resolved, That the President and his Advisory Board be made a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference, and that as soon a deed is made before it is recorded, it be sent to this Committee for its approval and for the insertion of such disciplinary clauses and/ or other clauses that may be needed to make it safe for our Denomination.

#### NO. 4

Resolved, That all persons under conference appointment be required to subscribe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST.

#### NO. 5

Resolved, That our pastors and churches prohibit any and all preachers from occupying our pulpits, if said preachers cannot show proper license or credentials from some Church organization, which credentials must be satisfactory to the pastor, that the said preacher is in harmony with our Church doctrines.

#### NO. 6

Resolved, That in the event a circuit or pastoral charge is divided, the former pastor of said charge report to the conference Statistical Committee the actual membership of each church which constituted said

charge and that said report be made to the Committee by Wednesday of Conference Week.

#### NO. 7

Resolved, That in order to properly safeguard the welfare and interests of the local churches and Conference, no pastor hold more than two revival meetings off his charge during any one conference year, without permission from his church; a two-third majority vote of those members present and voting on such a request from the pastor shall constitute permission from his church.

#### NO. 8

That the duties of the Annual Conference Treasurer be defined as follows:

First: He shall receive all funds paid in for the use of the said Annual Conference at its regular Annual Session. He shall keep the accounts in a substantial book, in proper form, indicating who paid the money and for what purpose it was paid, and shall turn over the books, together with all money and other values on hand belonging to the Conference, to his successors in office. All money must be paid to the Treasurer and by him paid to the sub-treasurers where there are such, with the following exceptions: If the pastors pay budget money to the sub-treasurers, the annual conference treasurer shall receive all such receipts and give the pastor credit on such items as are indicated on the receipts issued by the sub-treasurers.

Second: All money received by the treasurer or sub-treasurers shall be paid out as the conference shall order and in accordance with our book of discipline.

Third: On the first day of each month, or as near thereto as possible, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall disburse all monies on hand designated for General-Budget items except funds used quadrennially; such disbursement to be made to the proper denominational departments.

Fourth: He shall pay out all conference funds as directed by the Missionary Board of the Conference and/or upon the receipt of proper warrants.

Fifth: All money coming into his hands by wills or estates, gifts, or other donations, shall be held in trust by him for the North Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, until the next session of the Annual Conference; and when such gifts, wills, donations, or estates shall be cash, the Treasurer shall deposit this money in a National Bank in his name as Treasurer of the North Carolina Annual Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

Sixth: The Treasurer's books shall be submitted to the Auditing Committee of the Annual Conference at each annual session.

Seventh: The Treasurer of the Conference shall be required to keep the funds of the Conference deposited in a bank that insures the deposits of its patrons.

#### NO. 9

Resolved, That no church property within the bounds of the Conference, be encumbered to pay Pastor's salary, current expenses, or budget claims, either General or Conference.

#### NO. 10

First: Resolved, that during the annual session of conference each district have a caucus consisting of the official members of the Conference session and that they elect two elders and alternates from their respective districts to be confirmed by the annual conference in session to be members of the nominating committee for the next session. And that two laymen and two alternate laymen from the each district be appointed by the president and his Advisory Board to be members of the nominating committee for the next session.

Second: The members of this committee shall be rotated each year so that no member will serve on it more than once in three (3) years and that consideration also be given to having as many churches represented on the Committee as possible.

Third: The president shall call this committee together one day preceeding the opening of the annual conference session to nominate all conference

committees.

# NO. 11

Resolved, That all persons receiving Conference appointment be required to practice storehouse tithing and that the license of those who do not comply with this requirement be not renewed.

#### NO. 12

Resolved, That every Pastor, Church, or Building Committee contemplating making any repairs, erecting new buildings, for either Church or Parsonage Buildings or investments for either, first consult the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings in the District before starting any work upon either of these. That all Churches, Building Committees, and Pastors be directed to comply with the directions of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings and that the Conference Trustees be directed to withhold the signing of papers for loans until the Trustees are satisfied by a written report of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings that their instructions have been complied with. It is recommended that the Church so calling on the aforesaid Committee in its District pay the expenses of the Committeee.

This resolution permits repairs to be made to church property, to restore the same to original condition, free of debt, without contacting the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings. Authorization must be granted by the proper Committee for any repairs which incur debt or any alterations of any kind in landscaping and structures of building and property.

#### NO. 13

Resolved, That when a charge or charges are placed in the hands of the Judiciary Committee against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher, and the matter is brought to trial, that in the event such charges against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher are sustained that the Conference bear such expenses that may be incurred by the Judiciary Committee in the carrying on of the trial; and in the event such charges are not sustained after the trial of the case, that the party or parties making such charges bear the expenses of the Judiciary Committee.

#### NO. 14

Resolved, That each pastor settle with the Conference Treasurer by the 10th of July annually.

#### NO. 15

Whereas, Many times appeals are received by pastors and churches for financial assistance on building churches or parsonages when said pastors and churches do not know whether or not the property is deeded properly, or is in a suitable location or whether the prospects are favorable for a permanent location:

Be It Resolved, That, in order that pastors and churches may know when it is safe to make contributions when appeals are made, that said appeals bear the signature of at least one member of the Board on Church and Parsonage Building in the district from which the appeal is made, and one member of the Board of Conference Trustees.

#### NO. 16

Be It Resolved that the following Standing Committees serve from the rise of the Conference following their election and qualification through the next session of the Annual Conference:

- 1. Committee on Pastoral Instructions
- 2. Character and Checking Committee
- 3. Committee on Statistics
- 4. Committee on Apportionment
- 5. Committee on Memorials
- 6. Committee on Credentials
- 7. Committee on Post Office Addresses

Be It Further Resolved: That all other Standing Committees serve from their election and qualification, until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

Be It Further Resolved: That all Sessions Committees shall serve from the time of their election and qualification until adjournment Sine Die of that same session.

#### NO. 17

Resolved, That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference Missionary Board be required to report monthly to the Chairman of the Missionary Board of their District, and that this report be read to the Church or Mission before it is sent as above directed, and that the Pastor and the Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

Be It Futher Resolved: That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board be required to report monthly to the Conference President and his Advisory Board, and that this report be read to the Church or Mission before it is sent in, and that the Pastor and the Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

#### NO. 18

Resolved, That all churches earnestly endeavor to hold their annual business meeting, for the purpose of revising the church roll and the election of church officers, between the first and the fifteenth of June.

#### NO. 19

Resolved, That the conference fiscal year end June 30th.

#### NO. 20

Resolved, That the Conference and Camp Meeting be combined into one session with the Conference beginning on Tuesday after the fourth Sunday in July, and the Camp Meeting beginning on Saturday of the same week and continuing over the two following Sundays, the Missionary Board being empowered to adjust the date as needed. The conference year and the relation of pastors to the churches begins on the Sunday following the close of Camp Meeting.

#### NO. 21

Resolve that all new churches, for a period of two years, be exempt from the paying of 50 per cent of conference Budget. This to be effective beginning with the Conference of 1960.

# Reports

#### REPORT NO. 1-A

#### REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT

To the Eightieth Annual Session of the North Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America: Greetings in the name of our Lord.

Through the providences of God, we are permitted to bring you another annual report of our activities and a bird's-eye view of the state of the Conference. In submitting this report, we would express thanks for the privilege of serving you in this capacity for another year. This accounting must be recognized as man's appraisal, because we are fully aware that the true records are on High, and that we earnestly strive for final approval in that gathering on High.

It appears that I would be most ungrateful if I did not first of all publicly give thanks to God for the assistance which He has granted during these past twelve months. There has been consciousness of His undergirding and sustaining grace. Permit me to testify to His saving and sanctifying power. Even the most humble tasks of life are hallowed when done in His name

and when He is pleased to grant the consciousness of His presence.

It would be a joy to speak at length of all those who have rendered such fine service in so many ways during the year. While the limitations of this report does not permit such indulgence, please be assured that I am no less grateful. For whatever success may have been obtained, a large share of the credit must go to our churches, our pastors, and the auxiliary organizations of the Conference. To all of these who have many times served far beyond the call of duty, I am deeply indebted.

The Rev. C. Wesley Lovin, Conference Vice-President, has again rendered the Conference great service by giving full time to the duties of his office. He has carried a heavy load of the work, and I would like to personally go on record in expressing my appreciation for his ministry of help-

fulness.

#### The State of The Work

We are aware of the fact that the church is facing problems which become more complex with the passing days. We are not of the world, but we are in the world, and we are doing our work amid circumstances and environments that may not be to our liking. The church must not succumb to this spirit of the world, but must do what it can to change that spirit.

Spiritual—We believe the reports will show that this has been a good year in the North Carolina Conference. There have been many good revivals and some very fine victories. The recent Youth Camp was one of the best ever conducted. Yet we strongly feel that we have not arrived at that peak of Divine outpouring which God would be pleased to give us. With proper deference to size and financial strength, our Conference must never be satisfied to be known as anything less than a spiritual Conference.

Numerical—In many places there is a gratifying gain in church membership. Some problems exist in this area, but our people are realistically facing up to them. We should have reached the place where a steady growth is the norm. Two new church organizations have been received; one at Greenwood Hills in High Point and the other at Galax, Virginia. The Rain Hill Church, which for several years has not functioned as an organized church, was re-activated with a good membership. To all intents and purposes, this gives us three new organized churches during the Conference year. This brings our total to 117. Regular services are being held in at least five other places by Wesleyan ministers. Four of these congregations are meeting in our own properties, and two of the groups should be ready for organization in the near future.

Financial—The total picture for budget askings received along with other financial income seems to represent a stable condition. Some churches continue to have difficulty meeting their obligations to the general church and the conference. Some thought has been given to plans which could more equitably distribute the financial obligations of our churches, but no final decisions have been reached. The continuing rise of costs is making it imperative that certain budget askings be increased on both the general and local level. It will take careful planning and action on the part of our churches to prevent our falling behind in our proportionate giving.

Material—No less than twenty church properties have been purchased, built, or extensively remodeled during the past Conference year. We now have 118 church properties. In addition, there are at least two buildings being leased, and approximately 25 auxiliary Sunday School and youth buildings. The Conference now owns 82 parsonages. As a whole, our churches are manifesting good judgment in keeping the percentage of indebtedness at a low figure.

Special Items—This has been a significant year for Wesleyan Methodism particularly because of the actions of the recent General Conference.

The voting down of merger with the Pilgrim Holiness Church brought disappointment to many of us. However, for the present, we continue to operate as separate denominations. It will be our purpose to cultivate that spirit of good will and fellowship which exists between us and then look to God for further leadership.

The reorganization plan for our denomination represents a great change for us. The unanimity with which the General Conference accepted this, the proposed constitution, and other major legislation, indicates the desire for progress on the part of our people. It is believed that the steps taken will go a long way toward giving our church the proper organizational balance.

There has been an unusual amount of serious illness among our ministers during this past year. The heavy strain under which they are operating may be a contributing factor. Let us pray that God may give our people, ministers and laymen, a physical touch for the responsibilities which they bear.

The sudden passing of our beloved Dr. Oliver G. Wilson was a shock to our Conference, as well as to the entire denomination. In the midst of such experiences, we can only bow to the will of God. The promotion of our own Brother D. C. Stone to higher service leaves a vacancy in our Conference ranks. Others of our faithful laymen have also answered the summons. May God raise up replacements for those who now serve above.

Virginia Conference-If plans are consummated, there will be a Vir-

ginia Conference organized during this Annual Session. North Carolina can be justly proud that she is making this contribution to the denominational family. Of necessity, some of our brethren will become members of this new organization. Whether or not this is their first choice, it is being done in the interest of God's Kingdom and the Wesleyan Methodist Church. Let us pledge to them and to the new conference our interest, love and cooperation as they launch out into this new venture.

A Personal Word-Please grant me the privilege of a personal word at the conclusion of this portion of my report. The action of the recent General Conference indicates a change in our sphere of service to the church. For twenty-seven years the North Carolina Conference has included my name on the list of Appointments. Nineteen of these have been as pastor, two as general evangelist and six as Conference President. You have borne with my short-comings, forgiven my errors and honored me far more than I ever deserved. You are, and always shall be, my people. Wherever it may please God and the church for me to serve, please grant me the honor of simply being one of you. Mrs. Phaup and Gary heartily join in this sincere request.

When God did not indicate otherwise, for more than a quarter of a century I have accepted the call of the Conference and church as God's call for my life. The assignment upon which we are about to enter was not my desire nor my choice. I can only accept it as the will of God. The responsibilities will be tremendous. It will help much to be continually assured

of your love, loyalty and prayers.

#### Recommendations

- 1. I recommend that the North Carolina Conference heartily endorse and enter upon Operation Outreach, about which you will be hearing more from the general church.
- 2. I recommend the adoption of the following goals by the Conference, and that copies of these be prepared and sent to the churches for posting.

(1) A revival in each church.

(2) Payment of full budget by each church.

(3) A 5% increase in church membership.
(4) A 5% increase in Sunday School attendance.

(5) Three new churches organized during the year.

# Report No. 3

# REPORT OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE TO STUDY THE PROPOSED VIRGINIA CONFERENCE TO THE ORGANIZATIONAL CONFERENCE JULY 22, 1959

During the Annual Conference of the 1958 North Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, the Virginia District Missionary Board and a Committee elected by the District Caucus, were designated to study all matters concerning the organization of a Virginia Conference. These two Committees met in joint session at 10:00 a.m., Nov. 18 at the Lynchburg Wesleyan Methodist Church. The call of this meeting was at the suggestion of the Rev. Frank B. Dennard, Chairman of the Virginia District Missionary Board. This meeting was called to order by Brother Dennard and a discussion as to procedure followed. The Rev. C. Wesley Lovin, Vice-President of the North Carolina Conference, was asked to serve as temporary Chairman. The two committees were organized as a "Joint Committee," and the Rev. Earl T. Gentry was elected Chairman. The Rev. W. Lee Cockerill was elected secretary.

The "Joint Committee" voted to send copies of all deliberations and actions to the Rev. B. H. Phaup, President of North Carolina Conference and Dr. H. K. Sheets, Secretary of Home Missions and Church Extension of our Church.

The "Joint Committee" has met five times during the year. The time and places are recorded in the minutes to be found in the file.

Dr. H. K. Sheets was able to meet with us in one session and has advised us by correspondence. Conference President B. H. Phaup has met with us in three sessions and Conference Vice-president, C. Wesley Lovin, has met with us in all five sessions. Both have advised us by mail and orally. Correspondence with Members of the Board of Administration are in the files for reference.

Under date line July 1, 1958 Dr. H. K. Sheets advised us as follows: "The recommendation as it appears below was approved by the Board of Administration: "That definite plans be made for the Virginia Conference organization to become effective in 1959 following the rise of the North Carolina Conference. It is pointed out to the Board that the time schedule above—

a. Would not interrupt North Carolina statistics for the Quadrennium.

b. Would give pastors in Virginia who would not wish to reside permanently in that state opportunity to make adjustments with at least a year's notice.

c. Would give the Virginia Brethren time to plan ahead without feeling

"undue haste."

The "Joint Committee" requested the North Carolina Conference President and his Conference Missionary Board, in preparing the 1959 Annual Conference schedule, to arrange for time and place for the organization of a Virginia Conference in conjunction with our 1959 Annual Conference.

The "Joint Committee" agreed that Paragraph 155 of the Discipline should govern the exchange of pastors between the North Carolina and Vir-

ginia Conferences.

As a basis of representation to the organizing Virginia Conference, it was suggested that the duly elected delegates to the North Carolina Annual Conference of 1959 from the Virginia District Churches be seated. A ruling upon this from Dr. R. S. Nicholson, President of the Board of Administration, was to this effect, viz., each Church in the territory to become the Virginia Conference should elect their delegate(s) to the North Carolina Annual Conference in the usual manner. The Churches should again cast a ballot for a delegate(s) to the organizing Virginia Conference. These could be the same persons elected delegates to the N. C. Conference. The "Joint Committee" requested our Conference President, The Rev. B. H. Phaup, to instruct the Churches in this procedure and to provide the delegates to the organizing Virginia Conference with proper credentials.

Further, it was suggested that the ministerial representation consist of ministers who accept calls to churches in the Virginia District and any other ministers who request in writing their desire to transfer to the Virginia Con-

ference.

The boundary of the Virginia Conference has been set by the 1959 General Conference to be the present Virginia Conference of the North Carolina Conference.

After seeking legal counsel it is recommended that we do not incorporate

the Virginia Conference in the State of Virginia at this time.

By action of the "Joint Committee" the Rev. C. Wesley Lovin, General President of Wesleyan Youth, was requested to organize the Wesleyan Youth of Virginia at the North Carolina Youth Convention in July, 1959. Due to illness of Brother Lovin this did not take place. It is our understanding that the Rev. D. Clifton Wood, Southern Area President of Wesleyan Youth,

plans to call a convention in the early Fall of all the Virginia Churches for the

purpose of election of Virginia Wesleyan Youth officers.

Mrs. R. D. Reisdorph was contacted with regard to organizing a Virginia Woman's Missionary Society. Correspondence from her is to the effect that she will direct the organization of the Virginia W.M.S. The North Carolina W.M.S. President, Mrs. Gipsie Miller has been requested to arrange a time during the Annual W.M.S. session for this organization.

Sustained efforts have been made to "sell the Virginia Conference" to our ministers and laity. A pastor's meeting was held May 25th. Laity were invited. Printed and mimeographed information has been circulated. News has been sent to "The Wesleyan Methodist," Marion, Indiana, for publication. "Virginia Conference Sunday" was observed in each Virginia Church on June 7, 1959 with an appeal for a special offering to match a \$1,000 gift from Department of Home Missions and Church Extension. Final figures for this offering will be contained in the report of the Treasurer of the Virginia Missionary Board, The Rev. C. A. Phaup.

Parsonage sites, estimates and descriptions have been investigated and reported to the "Joint Committee." These have been in the area of Lynch-

burg and Roanoke.

A proposed budget was studied and published and circulated in all the Churches of Virginia. The organizing Virginia Conference will pass upon the budget in this session.

An area which has caused no small amount of concern has been the providing for retired and disabled ministers. We have consulted with the North Carolina Conference Superannuated Board, The Rev. 3. Vernacular Radio Ministry. This project was presented by Rev. Marion Birch at the time of the public service last year and in a few church contacts he made while in this area. The amount of \$1437 was paid on

the Vernacular Radio ministry in Sierra Leone, West Africa.

4. Jennings Furniture. This was not an official conference project. The need was simply stated in the Leader's Guide and 22 societies re-

sponded to the amount of \$1,062.96.

A. On the basis of \$1.00 per member, that the conference pledges for 1959-60 be appropriated for Camp ground improvement and the Conference Working Fund.

B. Leader's Guide-Scale of offerings for Leader's Guide:

1 - 25 members \$3.00 26 - 50 members 6.00 51 - 75 members 9.00 76 - 100 or more 12.00

- Promoting "A Community Missionary of the Year" recognition.

  1. Aim: To encourage active Christian Community service among lay women.
  - Requirements: It must be service beyond the ordinary, includinga. Visitation in at least one home a week (other than personal friends) with prayer and personal witness most of the time.

b. Speaking to at least 25 people about their souls during the year and leading at least one person to Christ.

- c. Rendering at least 10 hours of social service to families or individuals outside the church, including migrant workers, delinguents, alcoholics, etc.
- d. The title will be given to a lay woman-not a parsonage lady.
- Nominations
  - 1. Local groups in consultation with the pastor and a W. M. S. officer shall make nominations to the district executive committee,

who shall choose the most qualified one as the district nominee. All local nominations shall be submitted to the district chairman by April 15th

by April 15th.

 The district nominee shall be chosen prior to and announced at the May district meeting. District nominations shall be submitted to the conference W.M.S. Executive Board by July 1st.

 Announcement and recognition of the "Community Missionary of the Year" shall be a feature of the Annual Conference of 1960.

### II. DISTRICT GOALS: Stewardship of Talents.

"Lord, thou deliverest unto me five talents: behold, I have gained be-

side them five talents more." Matt. 25: 20

We recommend that the districts lend their efforts toward a leadership program aimed at the training of God-given talents to a higher degree of usefulness, and that such training be:

A. A technical training for the keeping of records, the handling of funds, and the making of reports.

B. An administrative training for the filling of executive offices.

C. A social service training for those who work in community missions. We further recommend that the details of promotion be left with the District Board.

### III. LOCAL GOALS: Stewardship of Time.

"So teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom." Ps. 90: 12.

We recommend that each local society advance a great personal service movement among its members by the "Tithe of Time" method. A five day week includes 40 hours work, 40 hours sleep and 40 hours optional time. We recommend that the optional time be the period tithed, making 4 hours each week to be used for God's service.

#### COLFAX, NORTH CAROLINA

**JULY 22, 1959** 

#### DECLARATION OF PURPOSE

WHEREAS the Wesleyan Methodist Churches in Virginia have given favorable expression to the organizing of a Virginia Conference through due process of petition, and

WHEREAS the Board of Administration has approved a recommenda-

tion for the organizing of said conference, and

WHEREAS the North Carolina Conference being the parent conference has by their voice of approval and by concurrent action set the time and

place for the organizing of said Virginia Conference,

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the ministers and lay delegates assembled at Colfax, North Carolina this 22nd day of July, 1959 being the duly qualified representatives of the Wesleyan Methodist Churches of Virginia do now proceed immediately to the organization of the Virginia Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

#### Report No. 7

#### REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

The Resolutions Committee met and made the following resolutions which they recommend to the conference.

#### No. 1

Resolved, that the board of trustees of each church be composed of three members elected by ballot by the church and three members elected

by the Virginia Conference.

Further, that the trustees of the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches together with the president of said conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the Virginia Wesleyan Methodist Churches needing funds to liquidate conference, church, or parsonage property indebtedness, provided that the party of parties requesting such action shall set forth the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested and that the trustees and the President are satisfied that the object for which the loan or loans is sought is both necessary, legal, and desirable.

Further, that the Virginia Conference require all deeds to buildings for worship, parsonages and all other buildings, built or purchased, be deeded to the above described board of Trustees, and that all other buildings for conference use be deeded to the three (3) Trustees elected by the Virginia Conference. All property held by the Board of Trustees is to be used by our ministry and membership according to our book of discipline.

#### No. 2

Resolved, that the President and his Advisory Board be made a deed examining committee for the Board of Trustees and that as soon as a deed is made, before it is recorded, it be sent to this committee for its approval and for the insertion of such disciplinary clauses and or other clauses to make it safe for our denomination.

#### No. 3

Resolved, That all persons under conference appointment be requested to subscribe to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST.

#### No. 4

Resolved, That our pastors and churches prohibit any and all preachers from occupying our pulpits, if said preachers cannot show proper license or credentials from some Church organization, which credentials must be satisfactory to the pastor, that the said preacher is in harmony with our church doctrines.

#### No. 5

Resolved, That in order to properly safeguard the welfare and interests of the local churches and conference, no pastor hold more than two (2) revival meetings away from his appointment during any one conference year, without permission from his church; a two-thirds majority vote of those members present and voting on such a request from the pastor shall constitute permission from his church.

#### No. 6

That the duties of the Virginia Annual Conference Treasurer be defined as follows:

First: He shall receive all funds paid in for use of the said Annual Conference at its regular Annual Session. He shall keep the accounts in a substantial book, in proper form, indicating who paid the money and for what purpose it was paid, and shall turn over the books, together with all money and other values on hand belonging to the Conference, to his successors in office. All money must be paid to the Treasurer and be paid by him to the sub-treasurers where there is such, with the following exceptions: If the pastors pay budget money to the sub-treasurers, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall receive all such receipts and give the pastor credit on such items as are indicated on the receipts issued by the sub-treasurers.

Second: All money received by the treasurer or sub-treasurers shall be paid out as the conference shall order and in accordance with our book of discipline.

Third: On the first day of each month, or as near thereto as possible, the Annual Conference Treasurer shall disburse all monies on hand designated for General Budget items; except such disbursement to be made to the proper denominational departments.

Fourth: He shall pay out all conference funds as directed by the Missionary Board of the Conference and/or upon the receipt of proper warrants.

Fifth: All money coming into his hands by wills or estates, gifts, or other donations, shall be held in trust by him for the Virginia Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, until the next session of the Annual Conference; and when such gifts, wills, donations, or estates shall be cash, the Treasurer shall deposit this money in a National Bank in his name as Treasurer of the Virginia Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

Sixth: The Treasurer's books shall be submitted to the auditing com-

mittee of the Annual Conference at each session.

Seventh: The Treasurer of the Conference shall be required to keep the funds of the conference deposited in a bank that insures the deposits of its patrons.

#### No. 7

Resolved, That no church property within the bounds of the Conference, be encumbered to pay Pastor's salary, current expenses, or 'budget claims, either General or Conference.

#### No. 8

Resolved, That the President and his Advisory Board appoint a Nominating Committee composed of three (3) elders and three (3) laymen, and

that sufficient alternates be appointed.

Second: The members of this committee shall be rotated each year so that no member will serve on it more than once in three (3) years and that consideration also be given to having as many churches represented on the committee as possible.

Third: The President shall call this committee together one day preceding the opening of the Annual Conference session to nominate all con-

ference committees.

#### No. 9

Resolved, That all persons receiving Conference appointment be required to practice storehouse tithing and that the license of those who do not comply with this request be not renewed.

#### No. 10

Resolved, That every pastor, church, or building committee contemplating making any repairs, erecting new buildings, for either church or investments for buildings, first consult the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings and that the Trustees be directed to withhold the signing of papers for loans until the Trustees are satisfied by a written report of the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings that their instructions have been complied with. It is recommended that the church so calling on the aforesaid committee pay the expenses of the committee.

This resolution permits repairs to be made to church property, to restore the same to original condition, free of debt, without contacting the Committee on Church and Parsonage Buildings. Authorization must be granted by the proper committee for any repairs which incur debt or any alterations of any kind in landscaping and structures of building and property.

#### No. 11

Resolved, That when a charge or charges are placed in the hands of the Judiciary Committee against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher, and the matter is brought to trial, that in the event such charges against a Church, Elder, or Conference Preacher are sustained that the conference bear such expenses that may be incurred by the Judiciary Committee in the carrying on the trial and in the event such charges are not sustained after the trial of the case, that the party or parties making such charges bear the expenses of the Judiciary Committee.

#### No. 12

Resolved, That each pastor settle with the Conference Treasurer by the 15th of July annually.

#### No. 13

Whereas, Many times appeals are received by pastors and churches for financial assistance on building projects when said pastors and churches do not know whether or not the property is deeded properly, or is in a suitable location or whether the prospects are favorable for a permanent location;

Be it Resolved, That in order that pastors and churches may know when it is safe to make contributions when appeals are made, that said appeals bear the signature of at least one member of the Board on Church and Parsonage Building, and one member of the Board of Trustees.

#### No. 14

Resolved, That all churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference Missionary Board be required to report monthly to the Chairman of the Missionary Board and that this report be read to the church or Mission before it is sent as above directed, and that the Pastor and the Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

Be it further resolved: That all Churches, Missions, and Ministers working under the direction of the Conference President and his Advisory Board be requried to report monthly to the Conference President and his Advisory Board, and that this report be read to the Church or Mission before it is sent in, and that the pastor and Church Clerk or Secretary sign the above report.

#### No. 15

Resolved, That the Conference fiscal year be July 1 through June 30.

#### No. 16

Resolved, That all new churches, for a period of two years, be exempt from the paying of 50 percent of conference Budget. This to be effective beginning with the Conference of 1960.
