Journal of Daily Proceedings

The Iowa Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its sixty-fifth annual session in the Albaton Wesleyan Methodist Church, Tuesday, August 20, 1918, at 10:30 A. M.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. W. R. Emerson. After singing "Jesus Is My All In All," prayer was offered by Rev. C. S. Weigel. Scripture reading from Isaiah 40.

In the absence of the Secretary, Rev. R. Wesley Mack, John W. Yancey was elected to fill the vacancy.

The President appointed D. F. Smith and C. P. Carkuff as a Committee on Credentials.

The Chair named the first three rows of seats as the Bar of Conference.

Committee on Credentials read a partial report, as follows: John W. Yancey, Charles City and Howardville charge; J. D. Williams, Jr., and Mrs. Lucy Williams, of Fairview charge, as delegates.

The following were elected as a Committee on Nominations: C. S. Weigel, D. F. Smith, J. D. Williams, Jr., John W. Yancey.

Adjourned by motion.

Rev. D. F. Smith pronounced the benediction.

First Day-Afternoon Session-August 20th.

Devotional exercises were conducted by Rev. C. P. Carkuff, who read John 21: 1-6 and offered prayer.

Roll call was answered by three elders, one licentiate and three delegates.

The Nominating Committee made a partial report, as follows: Committee on Pastoral Relations, W. R. Emerson, C. S. Weigel, D. F. Smith, J. D. Williams, Jr., John W. Ellis.

The Committee on Credentials made a partial report, naming Raymond Hanson as delegate from Albaton charge.

Special Order-that immediately following the election of Con-

ference officers, Thursday afternoon, Rev. C. B. Harvey be given the time to present our Missionary interests, also that he be given the Wednesday evening service.

The President made a partial report. Items 2, 3, and 6 adopted.

Passed the character of George Fry, R. W. Mack, C. M. Howe, F. A. Butterfield, W. H. Riley, Ira E. Bradley, and L. W. Easton.

The Secretary was instructed to write a letter of greeting to Rev. L. W. Easton and wife.

The names of Rev. Geo. J. Cameron, Rev. J. T. Platt and Miss Miriam Day were ordered placed on the Roll of Honored Dead.

Second Day-Morning Session-August 21st.

After singing "Sunshine In My Soul," Rev. D. F. Smith read the twenty-sixth Psalm and led in fervent prayer.

Roll call-five elders, five licentiates and five delegates.

Minutes read, corrected and approved.

The Credential Committee submitted a partial report, naming duly elected delegates as follows: William Cretsinger, Guthrie Center; Bertha Williams, Pleasant Hill; Glenwood Hite, Little Pine, Minn.; Mrs. Lizzie Lortschor, South Troy, Minn.; Grant Ayers, Bennezette.

The President was authorized to procure a book of blanks for drawing orders on the Treasurer, the same to be paid for from the Conference Fund.

An invitation was extended to the Conference from the Fairview Church by C. S. Weigel to hold our next Annual Conference and Camp Meeting at that place.

The President submitted his annual report, which was adopted.

A motion was made to reimburse the Conference President the sum of \$50.00 for stationery expenses during tha last six years. It was carried.

A motion was made and carried that the salary of the President be increased \$100.00 per year.

Second Day-Afternoon Session-August 21st.

Devotional exercises were led by Rev. Edwin Ellis, who after singing "Feasting With My Lord," read the second chapter of First Peter and led in prayer.

Roll call-six delegates, four licentiates, nine delegates.

The minutes were read, corrected and approved.

G. Edwin Ellis and W. D. Eastham were elected to fill vacancies of absent members of the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders.

Mrs. Lucy Williams and Mrs. Bertha Williams were appointed by the President as lay members on the Committee of Itinerancy and Orders.

Communications from the following ministerial brethren were read by the President: R. Weśley Pryor, Geo. S. Fry, A. W. Curry, Frank Betzer, L. W. Easton. The President called the conference to prayer in behalf of these brethren.

Motion prevailed that Frank Betzer be reimbursed \$1.00 from the Conference Fund for Questions on the Course of Study used by the Committee on Itinerancy and Orders, and that this \$1.00 be returned to the Conference Fund upon his request.

Rev. B. J. Hoover extended an invitation from the church at South Troy, Minn., to hold the next Annual Conference and Camp Meeting on that charge.

The President appointed C. S. Weigel as a Committee on Courtesies.

Rev. H. W. McDowell, President of the Miltonvale College, was introduced to the Conference and spoke words of greeting which were edifying.

Rev. and Mrs. C. B. Harvey, Missionaries to India, were introduced. Mrs. Harvey brought greetings from the India Conference. Rev. Harvey brought to us the message, "Standard Bearers." He emphasized the importance of holding up Christ as our standard.

On motion, Professor McDowell was given the hour of 2:30 Friday afternoon to present Connectional interests.

A request was made by J. W. Yancey that the church property at Masonville, Ia., and \$700.00 from the Building Fund be appropriated toward a church building at Charles City, Ia.

Adjourned by motion. Benediction by Rev. C. B. Harvey.

Third Day-Morning Session-August 22nd.

Devotional exercises opened by singing "Jesus Is My All In All," followed by Scripture reading and prayer by Rev. W. E. Reeve.

Roll call.

Minutes read, corrected and approved.

Rev. W. W. Rolf, of Falconer, N. Y., our Camp Meeting evangelist, was introduced to the Conference and spoke words of cheer and encouragement.

The Committee on Nominations made final report, which was

adopted. See report.

On motion, the following Committee was created for examining pastors' reports: C. P. Carkuff, J. D. Williams, Jr.

W. E. Reeve and W. R. Emerson were elected a Committee on

Boundaries.

Committee on Revision of Standing Rule read report. Report adopted. See report.

Motion prevailed to change special order, giving C. B. Harvey the evening service on Thursday in place of the afternoon service.

On motion, the President appointed Mrs. W. D. Eastham as Conference Postmistress.

Rev. Aaron Cameron asked for \$150.00 from the Building Fund to build a barn on the parsonage lot on the Albaton charge.

Motion prevailed to rescind the Standing Rule referring to the

fixing of time for holding the Annual Conference.

Motion prevailed that the Conference fix the time and place for the next Conference and Camp Meeting before the close of this Conference.

Moved that the President of the Conference and Camp Meeting Committee select evangelists for the next Conference and Camp

Meeting as soon as possible.

Motion carried to hear an address from Professor McDowell Thursday afternoon immediately following the election of Conference officers and General Conference delegates.

On motion, Saturday afternoon, at 2 P. M., was made the hour

for Memorial Services.

G. Edwin Ellis was elected to fill a vacancy on the Auditing Committee made vacant by the absence of J. F. Hiner.

Communications were read by the President from H. G. Bone-brake, of Diagonal, relative to the future prospects of the work at that place.

Ulis Hekel in the chair, the Missionary Board report was made by W. R. Emerson. The report was adopted. See report.

Conference adjourned by motion.

Moved that the Minutes be published by our Publishing House, and an order drawn on the Treasurer for same. Carried.

Motion prevailed for each pastor to take an offering during the year from each class on his charge to pay for the publication of the Conference Minutes.

Motion prevailed that 175 copies of the Minutes be printed. Adjourned by motion.

W. E. Reeve asked for \$100.00 from the Building Fund toward the church building in Emily, Minn.; \$50.00 for the church at Little Pine, Minn., and \$50.00 toward a church building at White Elk, Minn.

This request was referred to the Building Fund Committee.

Fifth Day-Morning Session-August 24th.

After singing, devotional services were led by Prof. H. W. Mc-Dowell, who read Ephesians 1.

Minutes were read, corrected and approved.

The Committee on Disbursement of Building Fund made a report. Item 2, concerning appropriations for Charles City, adopted. Report as a whole adopted.

Committee on Boundaries made a report, which was adopted. See report.

Committee on Sabbath Schools read a report. Report adopted. See report.

Committee on Resolutions read a report, which was adopted. See report.

Committee on Moral Reform presented their report, which was adopted. See report.

The report of the Committee on Thanks was received and adopted. See report.

Committee on Pastoral Relations gave the first reading of their report.

The report of the Treasurer was read and referred to the Auditing Committee.

Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. Albert Johnson.

Fifth Day-Afternoon Session-August 24th.

The President called the Conference to order and they engaged in a season of prayer.

The roll was called.

The Minutes were read, corrected and approved.

The report of the Auditing Committee was received and adotped. See report.

Committee on Apportionment of Budget made its report, which

was adopted. See report.

Communications were read from R. Wesley Mack and J. F. Hiner.

On motion the Conference reimbursed C. S. Weigel \$15.00 for the services of himself and automobile as Chairman of the Camp Meeting Committee, the same to be paid from the Camp Meeting Fund.

Missionary Board requested the Conference to pay Miss Lottie Buttermore \$25.00 for her services as Missionary in Northern Minnesota.

Committee on Examination of Pastors' Statistical Reports was

read and adopted. See report.

The passage of character was then taken up. The following names were called and characters passed: W. R. Emerson, J. F. Hiner, F. J. Wilson.

Orders of the Day were called for and the Conference proceeded

to the Memorial Services.

The Rev. Albert Johnson and Rev. W. R. Emerson spoke concerning the life of Rev. J. T. Platt.

Miss Delia Howlett, Rev. Ulis Hekel and Prof. H. W. Mc-Dowell spoke concerning the life and work of Miss Miriam Day.

Rev. W. R. Emerson, Rev. C. S. Weigel and Rev. Ulis Hekel

spoke concerning Rev. George Cameron.

Motion prevailed that a Committee be created to see about a permanent camp ground. W. R. Emerson and C. S. Weigel were made the Committee.

Adjourned to meet at the call of the Chair.

The Chair called the Conference to order.

Report of Committee on Pastoral Relations was received and adopted. See report.

Motion prevailed that W. R. Emerson attend to the matter of arranging for the sewerage in connection with the parsonage at Guthrie Center, Ia. The expenses of the same to be paid from the Building Fund.

Minutes of the afternoon session were read and approved.

On motion the Conference adjourned sine die.

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

By an act of Conference, the Conference Secretary was instructed to include in the published Minutes all the Standing Rules and Resolutions of this Conference.

On page 3 of Vol. 3 of the Conference Records the following is found: "On motion of Rev. S. A. Gilley, all resolutions of this Conference in annual session so far as adopted at previous meetings are hereby repealed."

Page 138, Vol. 3: "Ordered that until further notice Annual Conference shall convene on Tuesday, not Wednesday as heretofore."

Page 272, Vol. 3: "Resolved, (1) That the President of the Conference be constituted permanent Chairman of the Committee of Religious Services; (2) That the pastor and first delegate from the charge at which the next Conference is to be held be constituted the remaining members of the committee for that session."

Page 274, Vol. 3: "Resolved, That all Sunday Schools under the pastoral oversight of Wesleyan Methodist pastors may be included in the statistical report of the pastor having such school in charge."

Adopted, 1906: "Resolved, That the Conference tents be in charge of the Conference President, who shall see that they have proper care and storage. He may rent the same, when not in use, to outside parties as opportunity affords and his judgment directs, or on such terms as he and the desiring parties may agree upon."

Adopted 1911: "Resolved, That all papers and documents be referred to their respective committees."

Adopted 1911: "The Missionary Board is hereby authorized to pay out all moneys to be paid from the Conference Fund,"

Adotped 1912: "Resolved, That all reports of committees be made in writing, complete and ready for the printer and handed to the Secretary at the earliest possible date after such report is made."

Adopted 1912: "Resolved, That Conference officers be not seated until the close of the Conference session at which they are elected."

Adopted 1914: "Resolved, That the President be authorized to grant letters to members of disbanded classes."

Adopted 1913: "Resolved, That all interests and rents upon Conference property to be paid from the Conference Treasury be paid from the Conference Fund."

Adopted 1913: "Resolved, The Committee on Itinerancy and Orders be ordered to furnish a list of Conference preachers and licentiates entitled to vote at each Annual Conference as provided by the Discipline."

Adopted 1913: "Resolved, That an elder on the stationed list holding Church and Conference membership in this Conference and residing without its bounds, the local church to which he belongs is entitled to a delegate for that elder."

Adopted 1912: "Resolved, (1) That the Conference President be required, authorized and appointed to travel the Conference as President, having general supervision of the spiritual interests and benevolences thereof, holding at least one service at each of the churches during the year, under such dates as he may announce in advance; (2) He shall raise funds to meet the demands of the Conference work, and receive contributions for missions, education, superannuated ministers where there are no pastors, and assist the pastors in raising where desired; (3) He shall have general supervision of the church property within the bounds of the Conference, and shall 'inquire into the titles of the same to see that no property is loosely held, and shall look after the rental of Conference property, and see that the rent is placed in the Conference Treasury; and shall investigate the possibility and the feasibility of the sale of Conference property not in use, and report his findings at the next session of Conference; (4) He shall devote as much time as possible and as occasion may afford in quarterly and other meetings; (5) He shall be paid from the Conference Fund the sum of eight hundred dollars (\$800.00), also expense of travel and correspondence per year for his services, the same to be paid quarterly.

REPORT OF CAMP MEETING COMMITTEE.

It was a time of refreshing when God's people were encouraged, sinners saved and freed from sinful habits, and believers cleansed from the spirit of Satan. For this precious time we thank our Heavenly Father and take great courage. Some failed to remain at the camp, which followed the Conference session, and they missed a time of spiritual uplifting.

Rev. W. W. Rolf, of Falconer, N. Y., was the evangelist in charge. Brother Rolf is a man given up to God's service. He labored untiringly for the salvation of his fellowmen. He brought forth messages with power and a tender spirit.

REPORT OF THE MISSIONARY BOARD.

We are pleased to report favorable progress in the Conference Missionary work. The field embracing Little Pine, Emily, and Bain, Minnesota, is still growing. Another appointment has been added by Brother W. E. Reeve, known as the White Elk School House appointment. This field was visited by the Conference President in November, also in May, and arrangements were made for the purchasing of a team for Brother W. E. Reeve with which to make his missionary rounds. A special summer campaign was planned and later arranged for. In June Prof. Jno. W. Leedy, W. E. Reeve and Sister Bush of the Little Pine Church began a tent meeting in Emily, Minn. Much good was accomplished and a church of seven members (with more to come in soon) was organized, and about \$115.00 subscribed towards a lot and a church building.

The tent was then pitched on the White Elk appointment and some were saved, others sanctified, and a church organization of twelve members was effected. The good accomplished is due largely to the faithful labors of Brother Reeve in sowing and watering the seed of the Word.

There are other open fields, and there is need, great need, for another man and wife for this work.

Farther north, near Williams, Minn., there is an open door for Gospel work. The Conference President has been on this field twice during the year. In May Sister Lottie Buttermore, of the South Troy Church, under the direction of the Missionary Board, began labors as a Home Missionary. She has organized a Sunday School of about twenty-five scholars, preaches to them, calls among them, nurses among them when needed, and has general charge of the field.

Other calls for meetings are coming in from various sources, and the fields are needy and ripe. We praise God for His favor, and for entrusting this field to our care as a Conference. The great need is men and means. Who is ready to go? Who is ready to give? The receipts for the Church Extension Fund for the year have exceeded previous offerings, and we are still expecting the coming year to surpass all previous receipts.

10. Sold an acre of ground at Wayne to Mr. Elmer Hooper for \$100.00 on March 1st, receiving ten dollars down, which was turned into the treasury, the remainder to be paid upon the execution of deed and abstract.

11. Sold church building at Wayne on March 4th, through Olson & Nelson real estate dealers, for the sum of \$150.00. Paid commission of \$15.00 for sale, and turned balance of \$135.00 into

the treasury.

12. Shipped seats and stove from the Wayne church to the Dundee church, the Dundee church to use these and dispose of their seats, and turn the amount received for them into the Conference treasury. The transaction is not yet completed.

13. June 19th issued certificate authorizing Rev. W. E. Reeve to administer the Sacraments, he having completed the disciplinary

requirements for the same.

14. May 20th purchased tent top 21 x 35, from the Fisher Tent & Awning Co., of Waterloo, to be used as a dining tent for Conference, also for field use in special meetings. Paid the purchase price of same, \$90.00, from the Camp Meeting Fund.

. 15. July 24th arranged with H. G. Bonebrake to build a sidewalk across the lot in front of the church at Diagonal, the Conference to pay for the material and three dollars (\$3.00) per day

for his labor. Completed August 13, at a cost of \$27.50.

16. June 4th accepted the resignation of Rev. Henry Weigel as pastor of the Guthrie Circuit charge.

17. The general collections for the year have amounted to \$619.12. Salary received, \$700.00; traveling expenses, \$160.98.

May 25—Camp Meeting Fund, for tent top.. \$90.00 Aug. 13—Building Fund, Diagonal sidewalk. 27.50

19. Rents from Church property:

\$9.00; turned the balance, \$27.00, into the treasury.

20. It affords us much satisfaction to report the organization of three new church organizations during the year. Two in Minnesota under the labors of Rev. W. E. Reeve, and one in Nebraska under the labors of Rev. Albert Johnson.

We therefore present to the Conference the Emily church organization of seven members (7), the White Elk Church organization of twelve members (12), and the Hoover Church organization of thirteen members (13).
