

- L. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of his church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay rent on space.
- 2. The President and his advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.
- 3. That each pastor is to bring his statistical report in full ready to be read the first day of Conference.
- 4. All pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their report.
- 5. Our members are solicited to faithfulness in tithing and our churches are to consider the storehouse plan.
- 6. The Campmeeting and Conference are to be held together with the date of Conference to be set by the Board of Administration. If possible, it shall be incorporated at the beginning or at the close of the campmeeting.
- 7. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor; Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Missionary, Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; Present Membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School Attendance; No. church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VI Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item VIII complete; Total Benevolence; Contributed totals.

- 8. That each local church be responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- 9. Conference Secretary and Treasurer to be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer's books be closed three weeks before the opening session of the Annual Conference.
- 11. No Treasurer be allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.
- 12. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included on the Conference Minutes from year to year.
- 13. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.
- 14. The Campmeeting Board shall consist of seven members: The President of the Annual Conference, President of the i. M. S., and President of the Wesleyan Youth be members by virtue of their office and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference Officers.
- 15. The Conference Wesleyan Youth President and the Conference Treasurer be members of the Lissionary Board by virtue of their office.
- 16. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.
- 17. There shall be a Nominating Committee whose duty shall be to present nominations for all the regular

Session committees of the Conference. This Nominating Committee shall be elected as follows: Before the close of each Annual Session three elders of the Conference shall be elected as ministerial members by nominations made from the floor. From the lis of delegates—clect supplied by the pastors to the Conference President as provided in Standing Rule 16 above, the Conference President and his Advisory Board shall appoint two lay members thus completing the Nominating Committee. This Nominating Committee shall meet prior to the opening of each Annual Session at a time and place designated by the President, who may sit with the Committee in an advisory capacity if he deems it wise.

It is understood that the Nominating Committee shall make nominations only for Session Comittees which nominations shall be ready for presenting to the next Annual Session of the Conference.

This Committee shall be continued until the rise of Annual Conference for whose Session Committees it made nominations, and may serve to nominate special committees as the Conference may request during its Annual Session.

18. All who are taking. the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people to plan for this important preparation for service.

REPORT NO. 1 CONFERENCE PRESIDENT

To the members of the Sixty-second Session of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America,

Dear Fellow workers in the Gospel Vineyard:

I find a real sense of pleasure in bringing greetings to you after another year of labor in the work of the Lord.

While no new churches have been organized during the year, it is a pleasure to report to you the development of our camp ground project. I recognize that you are already familiar with this wonderful achievement, but I report it here as a matter of record for future generations.

At the Session of Conference last year, the Women's Missionary Society came forward with the proposal that the matter of a Conference-owned Camp Ground be given consideration. The need was pressing, because so long as we used rented grounds for our annual gatherings, we had little choice as to the time but were subject to the open dates available after others had selected the time they desired.

This situation was a handicap. We were unable to a stablish a fixed time for our annual meetings, consequently our people did not know when to request vacation periods in order to attend. Our workers for the camp could not be engaged until we knew our dates and this was a hindrance in obtaining the help of the type of evangelists we desired, and a handicap to the evangelists who wished to help us.

After the proposition was presented last year, we

began action immediately. The Committee, and various members of it, made a number of trips to consider various possible sites. Following the rise of Conference, the Committee kept at the task, and finally located the site where we are now located about one mile north of the village of Aurora. The wooded plot, consisting of about ten acres, was purchased and plans effected for the plotting of the ground and the erection of needed buildings.

By vote of the Committee, the Rev. Don Cline was made Superintendent of Grounds, and on him was laid the responsibility for supervision of developing the grounds and erecting the buildings. I wish to pay personal and official tribute to Brother Cline for the magnificent manner in which he has served and for the tremendous

accomplishments achieved in the past few months. We are grateful to the Lord for thus using His servant.

However, what has been done would have been impossible if it had not been for the splendid co-operation of the members of the Conference whose sacrificial labors and constant, unwavering devotion to their tasks are noted in heaven, where impartial records are being kept. It would appear that special mention should be made to our good Field Superintendent, the Rev. Ira C. Gross, and of the Rev. A. G. Yates. It is not our purpose to overlook anyone, and since there would be so many names to mention, I shall refrain from attempting to enumerate the complete list.

I would have all of us join in lifting our praises to the Lord for what "He hath wrought". It seems about incredible that in the brief time that has elapsed since the purchase of this property on last February 26, 1955 that today there stands the following buildings; two Workers Cabins of two rooms each; one office building of two rooms; one Dining Hall and Kitchen; one Dormitory of fourteen units; one Tabernacle 40 feet by 70 feet; one Well-House with complete Water-System, water coming from a well 120 feet deep; one Sanitary and Laundry Building complete with septic tank and tile-field.

I should like to pause in my report at this point and ask us all to stand while a special prayer of Thanksgiving is made to our Heavenly Father for what He has done.

The work in the various Churches of the Conference has been marked with revival efforts and the help of the Lord. The major interest promoted as a Conference project having been the Camp Grounds, Church projects have been somewaht limited. However, there has been a building project at Holgate under the leadership of Brother Yates. Russellville has continued its building program and has almost completed the task. This expansion is a credit to our Conference and to our Denomination. Aumsville has begun an addition to their Church but an account of this effort will probably belong to next year's report.

The spirit of harmony and fellowship which has prevailed during the year is one of the most heartening things of the Conference, it encourages us to expect great things in the days to come.

As the Lord has blessed us in the past, so we expect

His blessing in the future.

PLAN OF WORK

We recommend:

1. The observance of Red Letter Days:

(a) Harvest Home Day; October - Budget

(b) World Day of Prayer; February or March

(c) Denominational Home Missions: March - Budget

(d) Self Denial; April

- (e) Magazine Campaign; January
- 2. That each local Society contribute \$5.00 or more annually for the support of the Hephzibah Orphanage, the same to apply on Budge.

3. That a letter be written three times a year by each Society to Viola Gjesdal at Brainerd Indian School.

4. Sending cut quilt blocks, bandages, Sunday School charts, cards and flannelgraph material to our Missionary Home, 32 Bergen Avenue, Jersey City, New Jersey 5. The continuence of the Mile of Dimes project,

monies from such to be allocated for Mission Field Equipment.

6. That each Society contribute \$3.00 or more to the

Medical Student Fund, not to apply on Budget.
7. The promotion of the honorary enrollment plan for Miltonvale College.

- 8. The revitalizing of our Societies with interesting program material such as maps, news items, guest speakers, Wesleyan Missionary, the reading course, and the study book.
- 9. The reading of the plan of work and efficiency standard quarterly and putting grade of efficiency on annual report.
- 10. That the President encourage weekly prayer fellowship based on
- (a) Matt. 18:19 and the observance of the monthly prayer and fast day.
- (b) That each member be urged to avail herself of the prayer and fast convention held throughout the Conference.
- (c) That arrangements be made with the pastor for one Missionary Prayer Meeting each month.
- 11. That we secure each woman in the church and Sunday School as a member of the Society or bring a 10% gain in total active membership.
- 12. That all members make calls and visit the sick, the same to be reported at each monthly meeting.
- 13. Election of Officers and delegate one month preceding the Annual Conference (as per Discipline) and delegate's name be sent to the Conference W. M. S. President immediately after election.
- 14. (a) That dues of \$1.00 per member be sent quarterly direct to the Conference W. M. S. Treasurer. (fifty cents of which shall be designated as Denominational Foreign Missions and to apply to the Budget.)
- (b) That each Society pay annually an amount of twenty-five cents per active member to be used as a General Administrative Fund. Not to apply on budget
- (c) That a Contingent Fund of ten cents per member per month be continued for the increase of W.M.S. Operative Fund.
- 15. That the President, Treasurer, and the delegate make out the yearly report.
- 16. That each District Chairman supervise one District Convention and with the W.M.S. Conference President plan at least one Joint Convention during the year.

- 17. Be responsible for camp supplies and produce, same to be listed as items of interest on yearly report.
- 18. The Conference W.M.S. Treasurer's books to be closed three weeks prior to the date of the annual Conference.
- 19. That all statistical reports be checked with the Conference W.M.S. Treasurer on budget items before they are turned over to the Statistical Committee.
