## Standing Rules

1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts, and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.

2. The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.

3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the board of administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Campmeeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two Sundays.

4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30. The Conference treasurer shall close his books July 10.

5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank to the Conference treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. 8, "Disbursed for budget," forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference.

6. Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their report.

7. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodist, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School Attendance; number of church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VI Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item VIII complete; Total Benevolence; and the Contributed totals.

8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.

9. The Conference Secretary and Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury.

10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.

11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Minutes from year to year.

12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Plan Committee.

13. The Campmeeting Board shall consist of seven members: The President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S. President, Wesleyan Youth President, and Campmeeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that

the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference officers.

14. The Conference Wesleyan Youth President and the Conference Treasurer will be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their offices.

15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediately following the official election of said delegate or delegates.

16. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.

17. The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.

18. The time of meeting for the conference sessions shall be as follows: mornings 9:00 a.m. to adjourn at 11:30 a.m. Afternoons 1:30 p.m. to adjourn by motion.

19. The time for the election of conference officers shall be set for 9:00 a.m. the first Wednesday of Conference.

20. There shall be a nominating committee whose duties shall be to present nominations for all the regular session committees of the conference. This committee shall consist of the Conference President as chairman, and three Elders elected annually by the conference. The conference shall, each year, designate two churches whose delegates shall also be a part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior to the opening of each annual conference at a time and place designated by the president. It shall nominate session committees and may serve to nominate special committees as the conference may request.

21. Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and a gasoline allowance. When these are paid they shall be reported in Item VI of the Pastor's Statistical Report on separate lines. When the parsonage is used for Sunday School and other church activities, the pastor and board of stewards shall agree on the proportion of the total utilities to be reckoned as used by the pastor.

22. There shall be an Annual Ministerial Institute. The time, place, program, and entertainment to be arranged by a committee of two Elders elected annually.

23. It shall be the duty of the conference president and secretary to arrange for the printing of the conference minutes.

24. The publication of a conference paper shall be placed in the hands of a committee consisting of the Conference President and two persons elected by the conference. This committee shall select an Editor and Publisher and arrange for the financing of said paper.

25. The Conference President's report shall include a statement of all official acts and a financial statement listing travel and office expense.

### **Wednesday, 1:30 p.m.**

special committee was considered. Motion that Item I be referred back to the committee was considered. Motion that Item I be referred back to the committee to present a Memorial to General Conference was lost. The report was adopted.

Paul J. Lippold and Dennis Brenner were elected the committee to investigate Group Hospital and Medical Insurance, as provided in Item II in the above report.

Special Nominating Committee presented the names of Donald H. Cline and Lorin P. Miller as representative and alternate, respectively, to the Board of Trustees, Miltonvale Wesleyan College. They were elected.

A. G. Yates gave his pastor's report.

Committee on Itineracy and Orders reported. Report was adopted.

Lorin P. Miller gave his pastor's report.

Committee on Courtesy presented Warren Woolsey, Missionary to Africa. He brought greetings and shared his testimony.

The following pastors reported: Archie Stephens, Atwood J. Cool, James Bisel, H. B. Aarhus.

Motion carried that the printing of the Conference Minutes be placed in the hands of the conference president. He appointed Lorin P. Miller, Ira C. Gross, and Henry B. Aarhus as a committee to prepare and print the Minutes.

Adjourned on motion.

### **Thursday, July 31, 9:00 a.m.**

Conference was called to order by Rev. R. D. Reisdorph.

The roll was called. H. B. Aarhus led the singing. D. H. Cline read from I Cor. 15. Clifford Watt led in prayer.

The minutes of the previous session were read and approved by vote.

Pastoral Relations Committee gave its report. It was adopted.

Committee on Resolutions gave its report. A change in Standing Rule 16 was recommended, and the addition of five new standing rules was proposed. A Memorial to General Conference was also presented, pertaining to Items V and VI of the Statistical Blank as follows: That the line now reading, "Cash or other values on hand," be changed to read, Cash on hand (church treasury and building fund); and Money invested in church parsonage lot or building materials . . . ; further, that two additional lines be included in Item VI, as follows: Pastor's Utilities . . . ; Car Expense . . . ; and that the Notes on the back of the Statistical Report be made to correspond to these changes. By vote the proposed change regarding "Cash or other values on hand" was deleted. By vote a proposed standing rule regarding the duties of the Conference President was also deleted. The amended report was then adopted. (See Standing Rules, p. 1)

Committee on Courtesy presented Dr. and Mrs. E. F. McCarty. They responded with words of greeting.

Sunday School Board presented the name of

Lois Mitsch as their nominee for the office of Child Evangelism Director. She was elected.

Pastors Reporting—Ira C. Gross, Frank Wing, Herman Smith, and Clifford Watt gave their reports.

Committee on Statistics gave its report. It was adopted.

Confirmation of WY Officers—The following WY officers, previously elected at the annual youth conference, were confirmed by vote: Tom Porter, president; Lyle Guenther, vice-president; Sharon Overby, secretary; John Ehr, treasurer.

Communications were read from Rev. Frank Betzer and Kathleen C. Edwards. The secretary was instructed to write letters of greetings to them, and to convey to Sister Edwards the appreciation of the Conference for her 15 years of service as Conference Secretary. Letters of appreciation were also to be sent to the Collins and Irwin Music Co., Portland, for the use of the organ, and to Mrs. Winetta Cline for the use of her piano.

Dr. Reisdorph gave information and suggestions relative to contributions to International Headquarters Building.

Apportionment—The Committee gave its report; it was adopted.

Lay Delegates-elect from St. Johns and Emmanuel were elected to serve on next year's Nominating Committee.

Publication Board—Lorin Miller and Henry Aarhus were elected to serve with the Conference President to arrange for printing a conference newspaper.

Herman A. Smith and Ira C. Gross were elected to serve as Ministerial Institute Chairmen.

The Committee on Thanks gave its report. It was adopted.

The Missionary Board gave its projected budget for the coming year.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

### *Thursday, 1:00 p.m.*

Conference was called to order by Dr. Reisdorph. The roll was called.

The Missionary Board presented an additional item regarding the work of the conference president: "That the conference president hold the first and fourth quarterly meetings." The amendment was adopted. An additional amendment was offered by the Missionary Board: "That Thomas Porter be assigned duties of Sunday School and Youth Promotion, consisting of

- (1) Conference Sunday School Secretary's work as defined in the Discipline;
- (2) Arranging Sunday School Workshops, Rallies, and Conventions;
- (3) Arranging Youth Camps, Rallies, and Conventions;

(4) Any other feasible means deemed advisable. The amendment was adopted. The amended report was adopted.

Motion carried that any unfinished business be

referred to the President and Advisory Board, with power to act.

The Minutes were read and approved.

Motion carried that the conference be adjourned.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Lord:

Greetings in the Name of our Precious Savior. We thank Him for His every blessing and help throughout the year.

This past year our churches have gone forward Spiritually, numerically, and financially. The Lebanon and Chehalis pioneer works have made splendid progress and prospects at each of these works are most promising.

God has helped us to obtain the option to purchase approximately seven additional acres of Camp site. This greatly increases the value of our Conference grounds. The New Church at Holgate is practically completed, for which we thank the Lord. Considerable improvement has been made on the camp grounds and five new cottages have been built.

A Conference office and shop building has been constructed on the Conference parsonage grounds. This is a much needed addition and we thank the Lord for making it possible. I have held the first and fourth quarterly meetings in all the churches and as many of the Second and Third meetings as time permitted. In January I attended the Board meeting at Miltonvale, Kansas. ## Report No. 7

### Conference Board Of Trustees

The following items were considered by the Board of Trustees:

1. The request of the Salem church to purchase the property at 19th and Mill Streets, in Salem, Oregon, was considered by the Board, and permission is hereby given to make said purchase.

2. May 5, 1958—Board Meeting:

The Chairman read a letter from the Home Mission Department which asked confirmation of Notes owed to the Home Mission Department by the Oregon Annual Conference.

The Chairman reported the receipt of \$6,000.00 loan on Holgate property from Pension Fund and by adding this figure to the present unpaid balance it leaves a total indebtedness of \$13,433.00. Pension Fund requested that insurance on Holgate Property be increased to \$14,000.00. Motion was made and seconded to this effect. Motion was carried.

Chairman read correspondence from Rev. Archie Stephens, pastor of the Seattle Church, stating that they were offered the purchase of house and lot adjoining the present church property at Seattle. This property was offered to the Conference for \$7,500.00 with no down payment but that the \$7,500.00 would be added to the present unpaid balance of \$8,113.76 on the Church contract. It was reported that the Seattle Church people favored this purchase and finance method which would result in a total monthly payment of \$111.57. The people of the Seattle Church felt they could pay the \$11.57, which would result in \$100.00 per month to be paid by the Conference, the present conference payment.

A motion was made and seconded that the Seattle house and lot adjoining the Seattle church be purchased for \$7,500.00 and financing of same be as described above, also that the President of the Conference be given power of attorney to negotiate and execute the transaction. Motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that Clarence Stetson be authorized to collect the insurance money for the Chehalis church in settlement of the claim arising out of the furnace explosion.

4. The continuance of the Mile of Dimes project. Monies from such to be allocated for Mission Field Equipment. (Trucks, Press Equipment, P.A. System, etc.)

5. That each Society contribute \$3.00 or more to the Medical Student Fund, not to apply on Budget.

6. (a) That dues of \$1.00 (one dollar) per member be sent quarterly direct to the Conference W.M.S. treasurer. (Fifty cents of which shall be designated as Denominational Home Missions and to apply on Budget.)

(b) That each Society pay annually an amount of twenty-five cents per active member to be used as a General Administrative Fund. Not to apply on Budget.

(c) That a Contingent Fund of five cents per member per month be continued for the increase of the Conference W.M.S. Operative Fund.

7. (a) That a World Wide Fellowship Day of Prayer be observed each Tuesday by each member.

(b) That arrangements be made with the Pastor for one Missionary Prayer Meeting each month.

8. That we secure each woman in the Church and Sunday School as a member of the Society or bring a 10% gain in total membership.

9. That all members make calls and visit the sick, the same to be reported at each monthly meeting.

10. Election of Officers and Delegates one month preceeding the Annual Conference (as per Discipline) and Delegates name be sent to the Conference W.M.S. President immediately after election.

11. That each District Chairman supervise one District Convention and with the Conference W.M.S. President plan at least one Joint Convention during the year and voucher receipts be divided equally among societies participating.

13. That we be responsible for bedding, kitchen supplies, and produce such as vegetables, fruits, jellies, pickles, and meats requested by the Chairman of the Work Committee.

14. That the Conference W.M.S. Treasurer's books be closed three weeks prior to the date of the Annual Conference.

15. That all Statistical Reports be sent to the W.M.S. Treasurer by July 2, who in turn forwards them to the Statistical Committee.

16. That each Society inquire into the needs of the Home Mission Stations and Orphanage before sending used clothing and that no monetary value be placed on same; that such boxes of new merchandise be reported as to monetary value and the society to evaluate the same, the voucher evaluation signed by the missionary to be forwarded to the Conference W.M.S.
