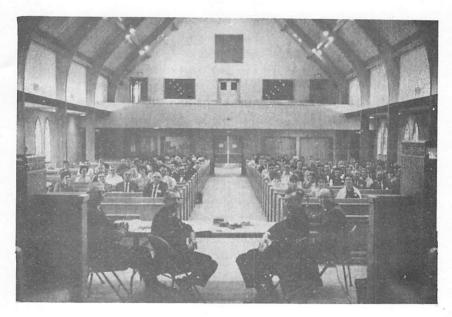

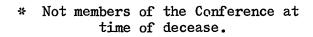

STANDING RULES

SECTION I - ANNUAL CONFERENCE

- A. The quorum of this Conference shall be thirty-five percent (35%) of its possible enrollment. Ministerial or lay members of the Conference must not leave the bar of Conference without consent of the chair, nor withdraw from the Conference Session permanently without consent of the Conference.
- B. The Nominating Committee shall consist of three elders and three laymen together with the Conference President, who shall be chairman, and the Conference Vice-President, who shall be a member ex-officio. The elders shall be elected at the time of the election of officers. At the same time the Conference shall name three churches whose delegate, elected to the next session of Conference, shall serve on this committee. Delegates shall send their credentials to this committee not later than five days before Conference. The committee shall then make nominations for Secretaries, Sessions and Standing Committees to be presented to the Conference at the proper time.

The Nominating Committee shall also act as Credentials and Ministerial Character Committee. This Committee shall compile the roll of delegates for Conference. Ministers shall send their Character Report to this committee at least five days before Conference.

- C. All officers, boards and standing committees shall take office as soon as elected except the Statistical Committee, whose term of office shall be from the rise of the Conference in which it is elected until the rise of the following Conference.
- D. The Conference shall elect annually two members to serve on the Board of Trustees of Azusa College.
- E. A copy of the Statistical blank of each church shall be posted by the Statistical Committee at the opening of the Conference Session.
- F. All chairmen of Conference Boards and Committees shall have submitted, and all Secretaries of the Conference shall submit their reports to the Conference

in writing, and a copy of the same given to the Secretary immediately after the report is adopted.

- G. Reports of the Board of Trustees and Conference Board of Administration submitted to the Conference shall contain only a summary of actions taken during the year for ratification, provided that a full copy of the minutes of all meetings held during the year appear in the Conference Annual Journal
- H. The Agenda Committee for the Conference shall be composed of the President, the Vice-President, the Secretary, the President of the Woman's Missionary Society, the President of Wesleyan Youth, the Conference Sunday School Secretary, and the Conference W o r 1 d Missions Secretary.

This committee shall arrange for the place of meeting and entertainment of the Annual Conference Session, and shall be responsible for the arrangements in connection with all religious services as well as the program of the Conference Sessions.

- I. The Conference Paper, "The Launch", shall be published in ten issues per year. The Conference President is to be designated Editor, and the heads of the Conference auxiliary organizations be responsible as contributing editors; said paper is to be financed from the Conference Work Fund and supplemented by special offerings from the churches.
- J. The Memorials Committee shall consist of 5 members.
- K. The Conference Historian Committee shall consist of two members.
- L. The Conference Sunday School Board shall consist of the Conference Sunday School Secretary, who shall be chairman, and four other members, each elected for a term of two years. The Conference Director of Christian Youth Crusaders shall be a member ex-officio of this Board.
- M. There shall be a Standing Committee known as the "Commission on Social Action", consisting of five members, three elders and two laymen.

SECTION II - CONFERENCE PRESIDENT

- A. The Conference President shall fulfill his duties as outlined in the Discipline, paragraph 230-236 inclusive.
- B. As chief administrative officer of the Conference he shall have general supervision of the spiritual and business interests of the churches of the Conference, and shall hold two services in each church during the year under such date as he shall announce in advance, one of which shall be at the time of the monthly or quarterly business meeting.
- C. The Conference President shall meet with the stewards of each church annually regarding their finances and particularly with regard to pastor's salary.
- D. The Conference President shall announce the date of the Annual Conference Session in sufficient time before opening, in conformity with the Denominational Board (Paragraph 351 of the Discipline) and the Annual Conference shall convene at the call of the chair.
- E. The Conference President shall be granted at least two weeks vacation with pay each year. It is recommended that an additional week's salary be paid as vacation expense.
- F. The Conference President shall be a member ex-of-ficio of the Finance Committee.

SECTION III - BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION

- A. The Conference Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be known as the Conference Board of Administration. This Board shall be the official body of the Conference during the interim of Conference Sessions and its actions shall be binding until ratified or nullified by the succeeding Annual Conference Session.
- B. The Conference Board of Administration shall be composed of the Conference President, the Conference

Vice-President, the Conference Secretary, the Conference Treasurer, the Conference Board of Trustees, the President of the Woman's Missionary Society, the President of Wesleyan Youth, the Conference Sunday School Secretary, the Conference Attorney, & one other member.

- C. Until a local congregation is organized and received into the Conference, it shall be known as a Church Extension Project, and both the pastor and congregation shall be under the supervision of the Conference President and the Conference Board of Administration as to location, planning, policy and promotion.
- D. Whenever an organized church finds it necessary to receive financial aid from the Conference for its operational expenses, it shall be under the supervision of the Conference President and the Board of Administration with regard to decisions on finance, pastoral relations and other major decisions of operation until it becomes self-supporting.

SECTION IV - BOARD OF TRUSTEES

- A. The Board of Trustees is designated as a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference. When deeds to Conference, Church, or Parsonage Properties are received, before being recorded, they shall be submitted to this committee for examination and the insertion of such disciplinary clauses as necessary to make the property safe for the local church and the Conference (Paragraph 149-151 of the Discipline).
- B. Plans for all major alterations and additions to present buildings and new buildings on all church properties are to be first passed by the Board of Trustees.
- C. All legal papers pertaining to the holding of property, insurance, tax receipts, liabilities, etc. shall be held in a fire resistant, locked file in the Conference Office with the provision that local trustees may have copies of said papers provided at their expense. It shall be the duty of local pastors and trustees to submit such papers to the Conference President and Board of Trustees upon demand.

D. The Board of Trustees shall be the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

SECTION V - COMMITTEE ON ITINERACY AND ELDERS' ORDERS

- A. All recommendations to study or to travel under the direction of the Conference must be reviewed by the Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders before the name of the candidate is placed on the Conference Roll. All ministers being received into the Conference must have their credentials examined by the Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders before he is received into the membership of the Conference.
- B. The Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders shall provide for a Service of Ordination with the Conference Agenda Committee in advance whenever it has candidates to recommend for Elders' Orders.
- C. The Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders, in conjunction with the Conference President, shall plan a Ministerial Retreat to be held from the third Tuesday evening to the following Thursday noon of February of each year, the place and plan of meeting to be announced.
- D. Conference preachers and supplies who have not been examined in the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline shall pass this course early in the first year of Conference appointment. Failure to comply with this directive will be considered grounds for discontinuing said conference appointment.

SECTION VI - FINANCE

- A. The fiscal year of the Conference shall close May 31. All monies are to be in the mail and postmarked no later than midnight, June 3; and the Conference Treasurer's books are to be ready for auditing on June 10.
- B. The Conference Secretary and Treasurer shall each be reimbursed to the amount of \$50.00 for each year's labor.

C. All Budget monies shall be directed through the various treasurers in the Conference, i.e., W. M. S., Y. M. W. B., W. Y., and local church treasurers, and that duplicate receipts be mailed to the Conference Treasurer for recording, immediately on their issuance. The Conference Treasurer shall receive and record all budget monies either by cash or vouchers.

SECTION VII - MINISTERS AND LOCAL CHURCHES

- A. New pastors shall assume their duties the second Sunday following the rise of Annual Conference. Any arrangement contrary to this rule shall be cleared with the Conference President and his Advisory Board.
- B. All charges shall pay the moving expenses of the incoming pastor within the bounds of the Conference.
- C. In case of the absence of a pastor from his church for more than two weeks, he shall advise the Conference President of his absence and the arrangements made for pulpit supply.
- D. Each pastor is to be granted at least two weeks of vacation with pay each year. It is recommended that an additional week's salary be paid as vacation expense.
- E. Each pastor shall report to the Conference President monthly on forms prepared for that purpose, showing the condition of his church.
- F. It is the responsibility of each local church to pay taxes on its properties prior to their becoming delinquent; receipts for said payments shall be mailed to the Conference President's Office immediately.
- G. It shall be the duty of the pastor to see that all property held on his charge is insured in compliance with the following:

Public Liability

- A. Premises and operations
- B. Non-owned automobiles

Bodily Injury - \$100,000.00 each person

\$300,000.00 each occurrence

Property Damage \$50,000.00 each occurrence

Real and Personal Property

- A. Fire
- B. Extended Coverage
- C. Vandalism and Malicious Mischief

The amount(s) of insurance to be on a replacement cost form and adequate to comply with any average or distribution clause.

Boiler and Machinery (if applicable)

All policies shall be written in the name of the local church and the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America and copies provided for the Conference President.

- H. Each church shall pay its budget in ten monthly payments, the first payment on or before August 1.
- I. The meeting for the election of local church offices shall be held the first Wednesday in May and the elected officers shall take office June 1 following.
- J. All local treasurers shall close their books at the end of the fiscal year (May 31).
- K. Each pastor shall forward two copies of his statistical report, one of which shall be returned to him after Conference, to the Conference Treasurer two weeks before Annual Conference, who in turn shall forward the same to the Statistical Committee for recording at least five days before the opening of the Conference Session.
- L. The use of the titles "pastor" or "minister" shall be limited to those persons given appointment by the Annual Conference.
- M. Each pastor shall see that the local Wesleyan Youth Treasurer's report is in the hands of the Conference Wesleyan Youth Treasurer at least five days before the Annual Session. He shall instruct his local Wesleyan Youth Treasurer to close his books on May 31 and have all monies into the Conference Wesleyan Youth Treasurer before June 10. Also that the statistical report be mailed in at least one week before the Annual Session.

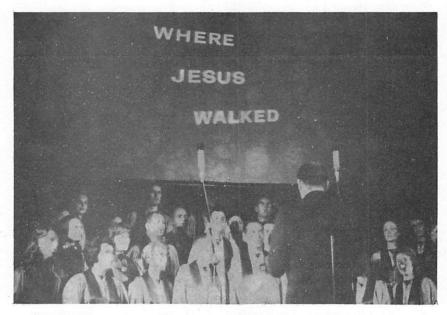

RELIGIOUS SERVICES

Sunday night, June 28, "Lay Evangelism" was stressed. The Laymen's Choir sang two numbers, "Send the Light" and "The Lord's Prayer". Two laymen, Roy Chapman of the La Puente Church, and Don Berksted of the Skyline Church, gave their testimony.

The speaker of the evening was Dr. Hollis Stevenson, Denominational Director of Wesleyan Men. He brought greetings from Wesleyan Men and stated that their goals are Fellowship, Stewardship, Service and Soul-winning. He also stated "Soul-winning is not easy but it is rewarding"; "It is fine to live for Christ but it is better to go out and invite"; "We are ambassadors for Christ"; "We should be like Andrew."

The theme for the Monday night service was "All Fronts Evangelism." Rev. Eugene Welliver, representing the Sunday School, spoke of the importance of reaching children. Dr. V. A. Mitchell gave a message based on Acts 1:4-9. The Early Church evangelized the world through intercessory prayer, using the Scriptures, giving proper place to the sermon, utilizing lay leadership, personal witnessing, establishing churches, saving their youth and guiding them into the ministry. Their resource was the power they received after the Holy Spirit came upon them.

JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

OPENING: The California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America met for its Fortieth Annual Session in the Whittier Wesleyan Methodist Church, Whittier, California, June 29, 1964. The devotional period was led by the Conference President. Rev. Archy Mudgett. He based his meditation on Deut. 19:14 and compared the traditions of the church to landmarks. Some of his thoughts were "Because of the removal of a landmark a traveler lost his way." "Landmarks are usually set up by others than those who benefit from them." "The purpose of landmarks is to set up a line of demarcation." Some landmarks are: the Word of God, the book of Discipline, the Historic Doctrine and Polity of our church, such as, conversion, a Spirit filled life, separation from the world and the equality of clergy and laity in conducting the business of the church.

CALL TO ORDER: The business meeting was called to order at 9:45 A.M.

THE CREDENTIALS COMMITTEE read its report. I t was adopted on motion. See Report No. 1.

ROLL CALL slips were signed and returned. There were $\overline{25}$ elders, 1 Conference Preacher and 31 delegates present.

THE BAR of Conference was set as the front eight rows of seats and the platform.

HONORARY SEAT: A motion carried that the President's secretary, Joyce Mudgett, be seated within the bar.

CO-CHAIRMEN: Rev. V. A. Mitchell, the Denominational Representative, and Rev. Orval Butcher, Conference Vice-President, were invited to the platform.

THE AGENDA COMMITTEE read its report. A motion carried to adopt the report. See Report No. 2.

COURTESY: Dr. Hollis Stevenson, Denominational

Director of Wesleyan Men, was introduced to the Conference, who responded with a word of testimony.

THE MINISTERIAL CHARACTER COMMITTEE read a partial report. A motion carried to adopt this report. See Report No. 3.

THE CONFERENCE PRESIDENT, Archy Mudgett, read his report. The entire report was adopted by a rising vote of appreciation for the work of the President. See Report No. 4.

EXCUSED: Derric Johnson was excused to attend a Youth Conference committee meeting.

THE VACANCIES COMMITTEE read its report. It was adopted by motion. See Report No. 5.

THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE read a partial report. It was moved and supported to adopt the report. A motion carried to amend the motion to elect only Session Committees at this time. The motion as amended carried. See Report No. 6.

ITINERACY AND ELDERS' ORDERS: The President appointed John C. Jones, George K. Wilch and Nelson Brown as members of the Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders.

RECESSED until 10:00 A.M.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The report of the Conference Board of Trustees was read. A motion carried to accept the report and to ratify the actions of the Board of Trustees. See Report No. 7.

<u>CREDENTIALS:</u> A motion carried that Ruth Henley be seated as the delegate from the Carlsbad Church.

BOARD OF ADMINISTRATION: The report of the Conference Board of Administration was read. A motion carried to adopt the report. See Report No. 8.

THE EDUCATIONAL SECRETARY read his report. A motion carried to accept the report. See Report No. 9. The secretary read some statistics relative to the

fields of labor of graduates of Miltonvale College. A motion carried that a letter containing the part concerning the California Conference be sent to the churches.

ADJOURNED.

SECOND MEETING, MONDAY P.M.

THE MEETING was called to order.

PRAYER: Clinton Jones 1ed in prayer.

ROLL CALL slips were signed and collected. Present were 26 elders, 1 Conference Preacher and 30 delegates.

THE CARD CALL SECRETARY read his report. A motion carried to adopt the report. See Report No. 10.

SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY: The report of the Sunday School Secretary was read. It was adopted. See Report No. 11.

THE TITHING SECRETARY read his report. It was adopted on motion. See Report No. 12.

<u>CAMP COMMISSION</u>: The chairman of the Camp Commission read his report. It was accepted. See Report No. 13.

GENERAL CONFERENCE REPORT: James Judy and Archy Mudgett, ministerial delegates, and George Wilch and Jack Martin, lay delegates to the 1963 General Conference, gave reports telling of the spiritual blessing and refreshing of the Conference. Others also expressed their appreciation of the General Conference.

LETTER: A motion carried that the secretary send a letter of appreciation to the General Superintendents.

RECOMMENDATION: A motion carried to recommend to the Finance Committee that stress be placed on raising the budget for Church Administration.

COURTESY: Mr. Paul Williams of Meyer and Associates was introduced.

CREDENTIAL: The Credential Committee read a letter from the La Puente Church. Rotha Stewart was seated as a delegate from that church.

THE CHARACTER COMMITTEE reported that blanks for Edward Eddy, Martin Cox, Fred VanTatenhove, Ronald Heavilin, Alice Mae Heavilin, Lee Hoge, Charles Spisak, and John Wilkens had been received or completed and their character passed. The report was accepted. A motion carried to wait until the last business meeting to have the final report of the Character Committee.

THE ITINERACY AND ELDERS' ORDERS COMMITTEE read a partial report. It was adopted. Included as Item 6 in the full report of the committee, Report No. 20.

AZUSA COLLEGE: The report of the Trustee of Azusa College was given by Martin Cox. It was accepted. See Report No. 14.

MILTONVALE WESLEYAN COLLEGE: The report of the Trustee of Miltonvale Wesleyan College was read by Archy Mudgett. It was adopted. See Report No. 15.

THE MINISTERIAL CHARACTER COMMITTEE reported the character blank of Gary Swenson had been received and his character passed. The report was adopted.

COURTESY: Jerry Lindsay, Youth Director of the La Puente Church, and Mr. Eugene Bisbee, Conference Auditor, were introduced. Dr. Robert J. Cox, Fraternal Delegate from the Arizona and Southern California Conference of the Free Methodist Church was introduced and brought greetings to the Conference.

CHARACTER REPORT: A motion carried to place the name of Richard Rossow on the original list of Stationed Elders whose character had been passed by the Ministerial Character Committee.

ADJOURNED by motion.

THIRD MEETING, TUESDAY A.M.

<u>DEVOTIONS</u>: Dr. V. A. Mitchell led the devotions referring to Acts 3 and 4 calling attention especially to verse 31. He gave four reasons why the disciples needed a fresh filling with the Holy Spirit, ie, to retain the benefits of grace previously received, because they were enjoying unusual blessings from God, because they encountered difficulties and because they were engaged in busy activities.

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order.

ROLL CALL slips were signed and returned by 28 elders, 3 Conference Preachers and 33 delegates.

THE MINUTES were corrected and approved.

DELEGATE: Fred C. Honeycutt was seated as the delegate from the Lawndale Church.

AUDITOR'S REPORT: The report of the Auditor was read and adopted by motion. See Report No. 16.

TREASURER'S REPORT: The Courtesy Committee in-troduced Mr. Theodore Stewart, the Conference Treasurer, who then read his report. The report was adopted by a rising vote of thanks. See Report No. 17.

AUDITOR'S REPORT: The report of the audit of the Pension Plan Treasurer was read. It was adopted. See Report No. 18.

PENSION PLAN TREASURER'S REPORT: The report of the Pension Plan Treasurer was read. It was adopted by motion. See Report No. 19.

TELLERS: The President appointed Gary Swenson and Paul Landrey as distributing tellers and Richard Grizzell and Robert Bynum as receiving tellers.

COURTESY: The Courtesy Committee introduced Rev. Harold North, pastor at La Puente, and Rev. Gary Swenson, pastor at Winslow.

RECESS

THE ELECTION OF OFFICERS was taken up. A nominative ballot was cast for Conference President and the tellers retired to canvas the ballots. James Judy was named secretary for the tellers.

PROPOSAL A: Consideration of the amendment to the Constitution as passed by the General Conference of 1963 and directed to be submitted to the Conferences was taken up. A motion was made and seconded to approve Proposal A which will make the following a new Article of Religion to be known as Article XIX and to be placed before the present XIX:

THE CHURCH

"The Christian Church is the entire body of believers in Jesus Christ. The Founder and only Head of the Church is Christ.

"A local church is a body of believers formally organized on gospel principles, meeting regularly for purposes of worship, edification, and evangelism.

"The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America is a denomination consisting of those members within annual conferences and local churches who hold the faith set forth in these Articles and acknowledge the ecclesiastical authority of its governing bodies."

The Proposal was approved by a vote of 59 in favor and none against.

BALLOT: The report of the nominating ballot for Conference President was given and elective ballots cast for Conference President.

PROPOSAL B of the amendments to the Constitution was taken up. A motion was made and supported to insert "(as modified by VIII 5 below)" after "bounds" in Paragraph 60 (1) on Line 2 to make the paragraph read as follows:

Par. 60. The constitutional rights of each annual conference shall include the following:

(1) The right to take charge of all ministers and churches within its bounds (as modified by VIII 5 below) except such of the general officers... (The remainder is unchanged.)

The amendment was approved by a vote of 60 in favor and none against.

ELECTION - PRESIDENT: The result of the ballot for Conference President was given. Archy Mudgett received a majority of votes cast and was declared elected.

BALLOT: A nominating ballot for Vice -- President was cast.

PROPOSAL C: Consideration of Proposal C of the amendments was taken up. A motion was made and supported to delete the second paragraph in Par. 30 making the Article "The Rites and Ceremonies of Churches" to read:

"It is not necessary that rites and ceremonies should in all places be the same or exactly alike, for they have always been different and may be changed according to the diversities of countries, times, and men's manners, so that nothing be ordained against God's Word."

The motion carried by a vote of 60 in favor and none against.

LOCAL CHURCH VOTE: A motion carried that the local churches vote on these proposals on or by August 30, 1964.

BALLOT: The results of the nominating ballot for Vice-President was given and elective ballots cast.

STANDING RULE: It was moved and seconded to amend Standing Rule III B to read "one elder and two laymen" instead of "one other member." The motion lost.

ELECTION - VICE-PRESIDENT: The result of the elective ballot for Vice-President was read. Orval Butcher received a majority of votes cast and was

declared elected.

BALLOT: A nominating ballot for Secretary was cast.

CONFERENCE ATTORNEY: Jack Martin was elected Conference Attorney.

BALLOT: The tellers reported the result of the nominating ballot for Secretary. Elective ballots were cast for Secretary.

CONFERENCE AUDITOR: A motion carried that the Conference Auditor be appointed by the Board of Administration.

<u>ELECTION - SECRETARIES:</u> A motion carried that the following Secretaries be elected:

ELECTION - SECRETARY: The results of the elective ballot for Conference Secretary were given. John Henley received a majority of ballots cast and was declared elected.

ADJOURNED.

REPORT NO. 4

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT

Greetings in the name of our Saviour and Lord to the members and friends of the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church met in its Fortieth Annual Session this twenty-ninth day of June, 1964, at Whittier, California.

By the will and mercy of God, we are met in this Conference session today to begin the last decade of a half century of service to God and the people of our communities and generation. Praise rises from our hearts as we pause to recognize that "hither to hath the Lord helped us." With the same vision of the need and confidence in God which our founders possessed, we press on to carry out what has been begun.

The theme of this quadrenium as adopted by the General Conference last summer holds both a challenge and a hope. We must accept the challenge of evangelization or we will be a dying movement. Our hope for existance as a church, as well as growth, lies in the recruiting program of the church which is bringing men to a saving knowledge of Christ as their Saviour.

We are faced with a generation of people which knows what it ought to do, but does not want to do it. To move men out of this condition, we must have preaching that will produce conviction of the need of a

Saviour while love is shown for the sinner. We must also have fires re-kindled upon our altars which will empower the church to be a living witness in this cold, cold age. In short, we must adknowledge that we need a revival which will reach the heart of every leader and member of the various churches and conference. Dare we be satisfied with less?

This has been an encouraging year in several respects. Progress has been made in a number of areas. Work has been strengthened in others.

We are grateful for the good cooperation which our churches in the Los Angeles, Phoenix and San Diego Areas have given the Billy Graham Evangelistic Campaigns in those cities. New visions and encouragement have been received through these efforts.

Financially, some good gains have been made in both budget and monies received for all purposes, as will be shown in the Treasurer's Report. Without doubt this has been the best year of our history in giving. Commendation is due every pastor and member who has made this possible.

A definite step of advancement has been made in the acquiring of property for a Conference Headquarters. In January of this year the Conference Trustees took action to purchase $1\frac{1}{2}$ acres located at 3200 East Virginia Avenue, West Covina. This property consisting of a dwelling for the Conference President, another dwelling which is rented, and an additional building which houses offices, work room, a conference room and two guest rooms is surrounded by natural trees and shrubs which gives a rustic setting.

Since escrow closed on March 13, much of our time has been given to the task of preparing the buildings for occupancy. Much deserving thanks is hereby tendered to those who have given so freely of their time and strength to bring this project nearer completion. It is regretted that all the work is not done; however, for the benefit of our people from a distance, we want you to see your Conference Headquarters before leaving the area. For the first time since its organization, the Conference operation is centered in its own "home."

It is recognized that some functions of the Conference Office have been affected by the apparent need for the President to give time and labor to this worthy project. Your patience and understanding in these matters is sincerely appreciated.

Your prayers are coveted for the Conference that new areas shall be entered and new churches established for the honor of our Christ.

Any above designated officer is also authorized to direct the disposition of the proceeds of any such obligation, and to accept or direct delivery from said Bank of any property of this corporation at any time held by said Bank.

The authority given herunder shall be deemed retroactive and any and all acts authorized hereunder performed prior to the passage of this resolution are hereby approved and ratified. The authority herein conferred shall continue in full force and effect until written notice of its revocation shall be received by said Bank at its office at Norwalk, California."

The above resolution is to be adopted with the understanding that the loan of \$10,000.00 from the Norwalk Branch of the California Bank is to be at 6% interest per annum for a term of 8 years, secured by the Norwalk Church property, for the purpose of paying off the existing loan and the balance credited to the account of the Norwalk Wesleyan Methodist Church for the planned improvements. WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, First Party is the owner of real property, herein called the "Property", situate in the County of Sacramento, which Property is described in Item (f) of Exhibit I of this Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Property is now zoned as specified in Item (b) of Exhibit I; and

WHEREAS, First Party has applied for a reclassification of zoning of the Property pursuant to which application the Property is being relassified from its present classification to the classification or classifications specified in Item (c) of Exhibit I; and

WHEREAS, public hearings have been held upon said application before the Board of Supervisors of the County of Sacramento, State of California, and after having considered the matter presented, it has been determined that certain conditions to the zoning reclassification of said real property must be imposed so as not to create any problems inimical to the health, safety and the general welfare of the County of Sacramento;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS MUTUALLY UNDERSTOOD AND AGREED that inasmuch as the reclassification specified in Item (c) of Exhibit I is being granted, the said reclassification shall be subject to the conditions specified in the following paragraphs:

Any subsequest titleholder of the Property shall receive notice of such a violation to a person and at an address other than as specified in Item (d) Exhibit I by filing with the Clerk of Board of Supervisors of Second Party a certified copy of his deed, the address to which the notice is to be sent, and reference this Agreement and the Resolution authorizing its execution. The determination of the Board of Supervisors of Second Party that any of the conditions of this Agreement have been violated shall be final and conclusive.

REPORT NO.13

CAMP COMMISSION

The meetings of the Commission involved detailing further policies for the operation of our three camps: Junior, Junior High, Senior High, and the College-Age Retreast. The following reports on 1963 summer camps were presented.

The Senior High campers met at Alpine July 29 - Aug. 3, 1963. Rev. Bob Girard, at that time director of public relations at Miltonvale College, was the speaker. Rev. James Judy and Rev. Derric Johnson conducted the camp. 77 full-time campers and 2 part-time contributed \$2154. Cost for 92 full-time campers, including staff, was \$2178. Other costs, including \$150 for the speaker, amounted to \$230. Deficit was \$254.33.

The first Junior High Camp was held at Oak Glen Pines, the Free Methodist camp, July 24 - 29, 1963.

Director was Paul A. McCoy. Assistant Director: Emerson Smith; Speaker: Jimmy Johnson. 51 full-t i m e campers contributed in fees and offerings \$1,336.24. Disbursements totalled \$1,291.20. Balance was \$45.04. Most of the profits have been used for further development and promotion of Junior High Camp.

The following dates for 1964 summer camps were established: Junior - June 21-27 at Alpine. This camp to be directed by Willis Kleinsasser and Ashby Smith. Junior High Camp at Oak Glen Pines, Aug. 2-8 with Paul McCoy as director and Emerson Smith as assistant. Senior High Camp at Alpine - July 26 - Aug. 1; Jimmy Johnson as director and James Judy as dean.

After much discussion during the year further expansion of camps was felt advisable. At the March meeting the commission agreed to encourage the Northern District to establish a Junior Camp in summer 1965. Ashby Smith was authorized to negotiate for a date at Alpine for a 2nd Junior Camp for the Central and Southern Districts.

* Family Camp dates, programming, directors were discussed but never finalized because of lack of time in promotion. The commission anticipates the crystalizing of the plans for summer 1965 in a combination conference and family camp.

The College-age youth met Dec. 1 at Oak Glen Pines for Friday evening and Saturday Retreat. Martin Cox, the director, led the group in several profitable discussion and sharing times. 37 campers attended. This was a stimulating and refreshing time.

Basic policies regarding camps were augmented in the following 3 decisions:

- 1. Junior campers shall be limited to church related juniors.
- 2. One counselor for every seven campers is to be provided by the local church. This applies to Junior, Junior High and Senior High Campers.
- 3. Camp directors shall be appointed by the commission and should act as an advisor on the commission.

Further directives for pastors:

- 1. Each camp director will select the staff, with the aid of his camp committee.
- 2. Pastors not invited to serve as staff are always welcome at the camps.
- 3. Charges to pastors will be made when they are not

a part of the staff.

4. All checks for camp should be made out to the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church in order to receive tax deduction.

* A Central District Youth Retreat in January is planned for 1965.

REPORT NO. 14

TRUSTEE OF AZUSA COLLEGE

It is becoming increasingly evident, I believe, that God has raised up Azusa College in our area to fill a great need to provide a Christ-centered, Bible-oriented education for many of our young people. A year ago our Annual Conference reaffirmed the relationship which had been established with the college six years before. This makes it possible for our conference to enjoy the benefits of a growing, developing educational program. With our own church schools so far away, we are blessed to have such an opportunity for those of our youth who cannot attend our own schools.

Some statistics may be helpful at this point:

STUDENTS - there is an enrollment of $204\frac{1}{2}$ full time equivalent, coming from twenty states, ten foreign countries; eleven are Wesleyans. An enrollment of 300 is expected next year.

FACULTY and STAFF - a total of fifty faculty and staff members.

FINANCE - Total Disbursed to April 30- \$326,283.22 Property and Fund Balances-\$1,413,142.28 Dinner Rally Pledges, Cash- \$119,000.00

ACCREDITATION - In January of this year, full accreditation was granted by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges for a three year period (This will actually be for at least four years). Azusa College is now the only school in the United States accredited as a Bible college and a liberal arts college in a four year program.

NEW BUILDINGS - The library is nearly completed and is valued at about \$200,000. A new dormitory is being built to accommodate 80 single students, and is appraised at \$100,000.

It is a privilege to join two other members of our conference on this board - Archy Mudgett and Orval Butcher. It is an exhiliarating experience to serve for this school in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

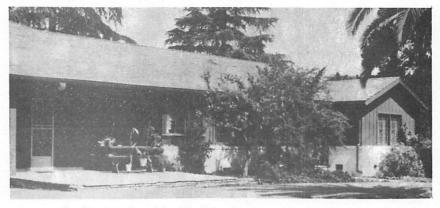

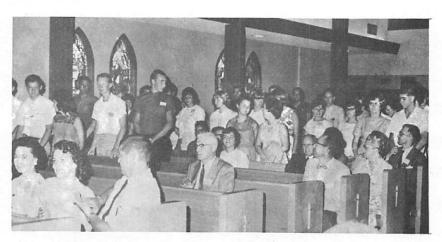

General Dues of the sum of \$2.00 will stand unchanged. Conference Expenses of the sum of \$1.50 will be divided into both Conference Expenses, which will amount to the sum of \$.75, and the sum of \$.75 to Youth Camp, because of lack of funds for camp last year.

Thus we have divided the membership dues (per member) of \$3.50 into three parts:

SUGGESTIONS OF ENCOURAGEMENT FOR PAYMENT OF DUES

STANDING RULES COMMITTEE

Section I

- A. The quorum of this Conference shall be 2/3 of the registered delegates.
- B. A delegate must be present at all Conference sessions in order to be eligible to vote. In order to be considered present at a Conference session, the delegate must be present at the time of the roll call.
- C. The Nominating Committee shall consist of one pastoral representative, one representative from the Northern District, one representative from the Eastern District, one representative from the

Southern District, and two representatives from the Central District as elected by a quorum of the Conference, together with the Conference President, who shall be chairman.

Section II

A. The WY Conference President shall be responsible for seeing that each local president provides each each Wesleyan Youth officer of his local church organization with a copy of the Wesleyan Youth Constitution.

Section III

- A. 1. The fiscal year of the Conference shall close May 31 each year and the Conference Youth Treasurer's books are to close June 10. The local treasurers shall close their books at the end of the fiscal year (May 31) and have their statistical reports made out and in the hands of the Conference Treasurer at least 5 days before Conference.
- A. 2. The Conference Youth Treasurer shall be an exofficio member of the Finance and Plan of Work Committee.
- B. 1. All monies raised by the local society for denominational or conference purposes shall be directed through the Wesleyan Youth Conference Treasurer.
- B. 2. Each local society shall pay its dues in quarterly payments -- the first payment to be on or before August 31.

Section IV

- A. A collegian senate shall be comprised of one college-age representative from each local church in the conference. This senate is to meet and discuss the collegian program and elect its own slate of officers. This slate of officers shall be approved annually by the Wesleyan Youth Conference. This group shall be amenable to the Conference Wesleyan Youth organization.
- B. The Collegian Senate President shall be an ex-of-ficio member of Wesleyan Youth Executive Council.

Section V

- A. The Conference Communications Chairman shall keep all members of the Conference informed of recent new and useful ideas by means of a quarterly newsletter, financed through the Youth Conference. The Conference Communications Chairman shall also be responsible for seeing that each Conference youth is notified of any All-Conference event.
- B. The office of District Communications shall be established within each of the four Conference Districts. The duties of the District Communications Chairman shall be to gather new ideas by communicating with each local church within the district and to edit these ideas for merit before passing them on to the Conference Communications Chairman.

One of the Rally highlights this year was the coming of the Chapel Choir of Skyline with Pastor Jimmy Johnson as speaker. The workshops at the April Rally were helpful and inspiring. Thanks is expressed to each leader: John Thill and Dale Kephart, Harold North, Derric Johnson, James Judy, Jimmy Johnson.

The messages of pastors: Jimmy Johnson, Russell Schumacher, Martin Cox, James Judy, Harold North were greatly appreciated. The response at the altar each rally was gratifying to all concerned. The labors of Mrs. Spradley of Covina at the piano were an inspiration. The dramatic readings by Dale Stark linger on in our hearts and memory. The ministry of violin playing by Larry Smith added to our collection of wonderful memories of 1963-64 rallies in Central District.

The "behind the scenes" help of Becky Eddy and Dennis Harter as elected District leaders, was appreciated greatly by the director. The songleading of Bob Hauck so often was an asset to our rallies this year.

The new feature of the year was the addition of an annual district winter retreat at Oak Glen Pines in January. Over 100 in attendance heard Pastor Jimmy Johnson speak this year. The 10" snow added plenty to the fun, freezing and frolic. The camp commission of our conference has reserved Oak Glen for January 1965 for our 2nd annual district winter retreat.

Our offerings totaled \$149.67 for the seven rallies; an average of \$21.38. Our expenditures totaled \$109.31. The balance July 18, 1963 was \$11.54. Our balance in the treasury June 1, 1964 was \$51.90.

It has been a challenging and rewarding experience for me to serve as District rally director this year. May God add his blessing to all the efforts of love expended during this conference year 1963-64.

WESLEYAN YOUTH DELEGATE TO GENERAL CONFERENCE

Sessions began in a very similar manner as our Annual Conference Sessions do with the exception that each of the Conferences, General, Missionary and Youth held their own devotions. Each morning there was a different speaker who brought "Youth & Heart Challenging" messages.

The first morning after our devotions, the Youth Conference and Missionary Conference joined the General Session in a Communion service before any business was conducted. This brought a united spirit among Wesleyan Methodists from all parts of the United States, plus Canada, Africa and Australia. Through this "united spirit" we were able to do business in a business-like and Christ-like manner.

We heard reports from our Executive Secretary, Robert McIntyre, our General President, James Harris, and our area chairmen. Considering that these reports covered a period of four years, they were quite lengthy, but very interesting.

From time to time the courtesy committee would introduce various guests and denominational officials who had stopped by to visit the Wesleyan Youth sessions.

In the afternoons, as a rule, we had "how to do it" sessions. We were given time in which to meet for committee work. Rev. Derric Johnson had been nominated to the "Wesleyan Youth" committee dealing with editorial and content. As his alternate, I served on this committee and as a group we gave some recommendations that the majority of delegates readily accepted. Executive Secretary McIntyre said that these recommendations would be considered carefully as the Wesleyan Youth was being written.

There is a part on our Statistical Blanks as to what kind of Efficiency Rating each society has. A

Each of our denominational colleges had a representative group to the General Conference and we of the Wesleyan Youth Conference heard from all of them. - 3. That the Conference President's support be as follows:
 - a. Salary be \$120.00 per week
 - b. \$.10 per mile be allowed for travel, and other expenses concurrent with travel.
- 4. That the Conference Headquarters Office Expense and Secretarial assistance be determined by the Board of Administration and reviewed quarterly.

REPORT NO. 24 - FINANCE COMMITTEE (Cont.)

- 5. That members of official conference committees be paid for travel to official meetings of the committees, at the rate of \$.10 per mile, from the Conference Work Fund.
- 6. That the Conference Auditor be asked to establish a new accounting system for the conference, and that the Board of Administration select a person, through election or appointment, as bookkeeper. The committee takes note of its desire to relieve the Conference Treasurer of the bookkeeping aspects of his position, and feels that this program will enable the Treasurer to cope with the expanding responsibilities of the Treasurer's office.
- 7. That the Board of Administration require at least two signatures on Conference checks, of which one shall be either the Conference Treasurer, or in his absence or incapacity the Conference President.
- 8. That this Committee and the Annual Conference go on record as strongly urging our churches to raise the General Administration Budget, and that a regular communication be sent from our Conference Office on this matter.
- 9. Recommendations to Local Churches:
 - A. That the Churches of the Conference make provision for a travel Expense allowance for their pastors.
 - B. That the churches of the Conference be urged to pay any additional expenses of pastor and delegates incurred in connection with the Annual Conference.
 - C. That a statement be sent by the Conference Treasurer to each church for the copies of the Conference Minutes ordered by the local church at \$1.00 per copy.
 - D. That local churches assist their pastors with health insurance and retirement programs.
- 10. That the Board of Administration give consideration to group plans of medical insurance for the Conference Elders.
- 11. For the purpose of travel for Pastor and Delegates

REPORT NO. 24 - FINANCE COMMITTEE (Cont.)

to the Annual Conference we recommend:

That churches with a membership from one to fifty pay \$15.00; and churches with membership from fifty-one to one hundred pay \$25.00; and church membership of one hundred-one plus pay \$35.00 (based on reported full membership of last annual Conference.) That this amount be billed by the Conference Treasurer by April 1st to be paid by local church no later than May 1st-that Conference Treasurer pay each church by May 31st amount pro-rated on the basis of \$.05 per mile two ways for one total round trip mileage.

The Finance Committee recommends the adoption of the following Resolution as representative of the policy of the California Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church:

- 1. That geographically, economically and spiritually the area within the California Conference represents a field "white unto harvest" for the Kingdom of God.
- 2. That the great commission of our church is the declaration of the Gospel, largely through the establishment and development of new churches within this Conference.
- 3. That although we can look with pride upon the accomplishments of past years in terms of church expansion, we have fallen short as a body in the measure of progress which our Lord has a right to expect of us.
- 4. That it is incumbent upon us to establish a specific program for the development of new churches. To further this goal, the Board of Administration should seek to establish a minimum of two new churches per year for the next five years.

The Finance Committee further recommends the inclusion in the Resolution of the following items, which are deemed necessary to translate the policy expressed here into reality:

- 1. The completion of a new accounting system, in order that the actual financial condition of our Conference might more readily and effectively be established.
- 2. Investigation into the various avenues of financing and investment available to the Conference, in order that, where economically feasible.

REPORT NO. 24 - FINANCE COMMITTEE (Cont.)

the Conference might be in a position to initiate the purchase of new properties and establish new churches.

- 3. Implementation of a survey within the Conference, in order that the Board of Administration might better foresee the need for churches in new areas, as well as the establishment of guidelines which might thereafter be followed in making such a move.
- 4. Commencement of a new and concerted effort to establish and maintain a separate fund, to be used for church expansion. This should include:
 - a. Emphasis on full payment of budget assessments.
 - b. A direct call upon Pastors and Laymen to develop a program of giving toward such a fund, with the emphasis to be placed on real sacrificial giving.
 - c. Solicitation of contributions from business and professional men. Consideration should be given by the Board of Administration to various means of accomplishing this, and possibly the appointment of an individual for assuming this responsibility.
- 5. The regular and faithful examination by the Board of Administration of any and all steps which might facilitate the success of this program.
- 6. The continued substantive and prayerful support of each Pastor and Layman in this effort to evangelize this part of the world. This support is enlisted in the knowledge and appreciation of the selfless leadership we have enjoyed in the past and which we expect to enjoy in the future.

DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Theme: "Feed the Multitudes, LIVING BREAD" John 6. Theme Song: "Break Thou the Bread of Life"

MONDAY, June 29

The ladies of the California Conference of the Woman's Missionary Society of the Wesleyan Methodist Church met at 8:30 a.m. with the members of the Church Annual Conference Body in a united devotional service held in the sanctuary of the Wesleyan Methodist Church at Whittier, California.

The service was opened with the song, "I Know Whom I Have Believed" led by Rev. James Judy, accompanied by Grace Todd at the organ and Rev. Paul McCoy at the piano. Rev. Mudgett, Conference President was introduced. He brought the opening message of conference, lifting his thoughts from Deut. 19:14. We were urged not to remove our landmarks in this day when the traditional and the conventional are so readily broken away, for in so doing travellers may lose their way.

A letter of greetings from our Conference President, Archy Mudgett, was read.

The Courtesy Committee presented three pastor's

wives who are with us for the first time: Lois North, Marcia Swenson, and June Anderson.

Mrs. Florence Taylor closed our meeting with prayer, whereupon meeting was adjourned for committee work.

TUESDAY, June 30 (8:30 a.m.)

In the United Service in the Sanctuary, Pastor Richard Rossow 1ed us in singing, "O For A Faith That Will Not Shrink", thus beginning the second day of conference business.

Pres. Mudgett introduced Dr. Virgil Mitchell, General Superintendent, who lifted from Acts 4:18-31, the phrase, "...they were all filled with the Holy Spirit". The reasons he gave for needing this filling were that they might retain the benefits of blessings already received, because of the mounting victories, because they were facing trials and opposition, and because they were engaged in busy activities. Our reeds being as theirs, our great need today is to be filled with the Holy Spirit.

The ladies being excused to go into the Chapel, heard the roll called, the minutes of the last meeting read and approved.

Edna Judy, President, noted that on this Tuesday, our women's "day of prayer", the devotional was most appropriate and inspirational. Testimonies were given of the blessings received from being active in WWF, these reports coming from El Cajon, Chester, and Lincoln Oaks. El Monte has experienced the joy of having prayer requests phoned in to the hostess of WWF.

The book, <u>Prayer</u>, <u>Conversing with God</u>, by Rosalind Rinker, was highly recommended to us.

Lois North read the report of the balloting. (See Report No. 9)

Otta Mae Eddy presented the need of giving to support our missions program. A large poster was shown. This revealed there was \$80,000.00 less given this year than was given last year.

Our president presented pledge cards. These were distributed. The need for supporting General World Missions and Church Extension was stressed.

The total pledges was \$1,409.50. This amount will be added to the amount pledged in the evening service.

Meeting was dismissed in prayer by Mrs. Merville Thomas.

Following this session our president met with the Executive Board along with the newly elected officers.

WEDNESDAY, July 1 (8:30 a.m.)

The singing of the song, "Blessed Assurance" was sung by all to begin the third day of conference. Dr. Mitchell's devotional directed us in the route to follow to receive the Holy Spirit. The apostles recognized their need, reminded God of their need, remembered the Word, and resorted to prayer. We were urged to follow this pattern.

Our Bro. Scott spoke briefly. He was presented a plaque as an expression of our love. Richard and Leola Rossow were requested to sing, "Only Glory By and By". The glory of Heaven was very real.

The Youth Conference was presented to the conference body.

WEDNESDAY, 2:00 p.m.

Organ music by Grace Todd, playing "Break Thou

the Bread of Life", kept us united in spirit as we went to the chapel for business.

Minutes were read and approved.

Sacramento, Sunland, Sunnymead, Whittier and Winslow societies gave their reports.

A beautiful poster from the El Monte First Church was given special recognition. This poster bears the theme of the quadrennium, "Prepare the King's Highway."

The Skyline ladies presented a little contest by drafting two "volunteer contestants", Edna Judy and Arelene Eddy. The winner was presented an award that is to be hung on the wall to be a year-around prayer reminder.

A skit, "Four Types of Sub (scription) Soil" was put on by these enthusiastic ladies. Each of us could find ourselves in one of the four types of subscribers. At the close of the skit Faye Bartlett sang an appropriate song.

Dr. Leo G. Cox was introduced to us. Rev. Cox is chairman of the Department of Religion of Marion College. He is also a former missionary to Australia. Mrs. Cox was also introduced. Their words of greeting were a delight.

The singing of the song, "The Breaking of the Bread" by Phyllis McCoy was used of the Lord to challenge us to "feed the multitudes, LIVING BREAD, as we realize so many have not yet had this bread given to them.

Ronald Heavilin spoke of how they felt during the days of revolt. Praises are due to the Lord that to date there are no restrictions to missionary activities.

Alice Mae witnessed that in the midst of the dark conditions of revolt they felt no fear, and together the Heavilins sang the chorus of the song "I Know Who Holds Tomorrow".

The adjournment of W.M.S. Conference was brought about as we prayed a benediction together.
