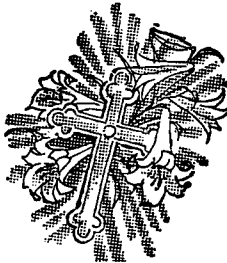

THE WISCONSIN CONFERENCE

BY-LAWS

SECTION I. Name.

The name of this Conference is The Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

SECTION II. Object.

The object of this Conference is stated in the Articles of Religion, General Rules and Elementary Principles of THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION III. Members.

The membership of this Conference shall be as stated in the Constitution, Article V, as it appears in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION IV. Officers.

A. President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. The first ballot for Conference President shall be a nominating ballot.
3. He shall perform such duties as outlined in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.
4. The principal office of the Conference shall be located in the City of Eau Claire, Eau Claire County, Wisconsin.
5. The Conference shall pay the moving expense of a newly elected President from the Conference Administrative Fund.

B. Vice-President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. He shall fill the office of the President in the event that it becomes vacant by death, resignation or otherwise.

C. Secretary.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Secretary; his term of office shall be one year.
2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.
3. The Conference Secretary shall be the Credentials Committee, and each pastor shall instruct his church clerk to send the delegates' credentials to him immediately after they are elected.

D. Treasurer.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Treasurer; his term of office shall be one year.
2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.

E. Other Officers.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect other officers as directed by and in

such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.

F. Time of Election.

1. The time for election of the Conference Officers shall be at 10:00 a.m. the second day of Conference.

SECTION V. Meetings.

A. Annual Conference Sessions.

1. The Annual Session of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America shall convene on the first Thursday after the third Tuesday of July at 9:00 a.m. in the tabernacle of the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp located seven miles west of Hillsboro, Wisconsin, on Highway 33.
2. The time of Conference sessions shall be from 9:00-12:00 noon and from 1:00-5:00 p.m.
3. The Bar of Conference shall be the first ten rows of seats in the center section and the rostrum of the main tabernacle.
4. The Conference President shall bring a "State of the Conference" message at the opening session of the Annual Conference.
5. The Conference fiscal year shall close June 30 of each year and that of the local church on May 31. All money to be applied toward payment of budget shall be remitted undivided monthly by the local church treasurer to the Conference Treasurer. All money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15. Each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer, prior to the close of the Conference year, his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; the Conference Treasurer, upon completion of the budget section, shall forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary—said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference session. Any pastor not complying with the above ruling will fail to have his character passed by the Character Committee.
6. Each pastor shall attend the Conference and camps and each institute and convention sponsored by the Conference, unless excused by the Conference President and Advisory Board, and the responsibility of the enforcement of this rule shall be in the hands of the Character Committee.
7. Pastors' reports shall be read and the statistical reports shall be posted on a bulletin board at the Annual Conference session.
8. All conference treasurers' books shall be closed and ready for auditing and placed in the hands of the Auditing Committee at the first session of the Conference.

B. Special Sessions.

1. Special sessions may be called according to the procedure outlined in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION VI. Committees.

A. Board of Trustees.

1. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of four elders and three laymen elected in the manner prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.
2. The Board of Trustees (or the President and Secretary of the Conference when authorized as hereinafter set forth) of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America is authorized to buy, sell, lease, and mortgage real and personal property of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America and to borrow money for and on behalf of said Conference and to execute the necessary deeds, contracts, notes and mortgages and other necessary documents to effectuate the purposes of this section; the President and the Secretary of the said Conference are given full power to act for and on behalf of said Conference when authorized by said Trustees by motion duly passed by said Trustees and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Board of Trustees.
3. The Conference Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the bonding of the Conference Treasurer.

B. Camp Meeting Board.

1. Camp Meetings of the Conference shall be supervised and conducted by a Camp Meeting Board of the Conference to be known as "Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Meeting Board of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America."

(a) Said Board shall consist of the following members: Conference President, Conference Secretary, Conference Treasurer, Maintenance Superintendent, and five members elected by the Conference. All members of said Board shall have equal vote and voice. At least three of the members of the Board shall be laymen. All members of the Board shall be members of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(b) President: The Conference President, by virtue of his office, shall be the President of the said Board. He shall act as Chairman of the Board and have general oversight of the Camp Meeting, and of all the business pertaining thereto. He may appoint someone to act as temporary chairman in his discretion.

(c) Secretary: The Conference Secretary, by virtue of his office, shall be the Secretary of the said Board. He shall keep all records and care for all correspondence relative to the business of the said Board.

(d) Treasurer: The Conference Treasurer, by virtue of his office, shall be the Treasurer of said Board. He shall receive all funds and disburse the same at the direction of the Camp Meeting Board or the Executive Committee of the said Board, as the case may be.

(e) Maintenance Superintendent: The Maintenance Superintendent shall be elected annually by the Conference from a list of two names submitted by the nominating committee. His duties shall be: The oversight of the building and grounds at the Camp Meeting grounds; he shall have charge of all repairs and maintenance and of the upkeep of buildings and grounds under the direction of the Conference or of said Board as the case may be. He shall be foreman of all building projects.

(f) Duties and Powers of the Camp Meeting Board: Said Board shall secure the workers for Camp Meetings, i.e., Evangelists, singers, children's workers and all other help necessary for the carrying on of Camp Meetings. The Board shall also take care of all business of the Camp Meeting between meetings of the Annual Conference. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to borrow money for Camp Meeting purposes and to bind the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America therefor and to execute the necessary agreements and promissory notes to effect such borrowing. However, the Camp Meeting Board shall not have authority to mortgage or encumber any of the property, real or personal, of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to rent Camp Meeting property out for such periods of time as will not interfere with the use of the camp grounds by the State Conference and its auxiliary organizations. The Board shall have the authority to enter into agreements with private individuals who have or may in the future construct cottages or other buildings on said camp grounds regarding construction, use and removal of such buildings but shall have no authority to convey a fee interest in, or deed any such land. The Camp Meeting Board shall submit a summary report and accounting each year at the annual meeting of the Conference. Said Camp Meeting Board shall at times be subject to directions and limitations placed on it by the Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall prepare and print the rates and regulations of the camp and post them in each room, and cottage, and in prominent places on the camp ground, and mail a copy to the pastors.

(g) Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of said Board shall consist of of the Conference President, the Conference Secretary, and the Maintenance Superintendent, and shall have full authority to act for and on behalf of said Board when authorized by said Board by motion duly passed by the Board and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Camp Meeting Board.

C. Nominating Committee.

1. There shall be a Nominating Committee composed of four elders

elected by ballot, and the President ex-officio, and two lay delegates rotated on an alphabetical basis according to churches.

2. No elective member shall serve on the Nominating Committee two years in succession.
 3. They shall meet and bring their report of session committee nominations at the first session of the ensuing Annual Conference.
 4. The Nominating Committee shall submit to the Conference floor, to be voted on by ballot, two names for each office, except the office of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and a list of names consisting of one more than the required number for each Standing Committee, where it does not conflict with the requirements of THE DISCIPLINE. They shall submit, as prescribed above, names for the chairman of the Resolutions and the Finance Committees, one year in advance.
- D. Board of Church Extension and Evangelism.
1. The members of the Board of Trustees shall be the Conference Board of Church Extension and Evangelism. The President of the Conference shall be ex-officio member and president. The duties of this board shall be as outlined in THE DISCIPLINE.
- E. Other Committees.
1. The Annual Conference shall elect other committees as directed by and in such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.

SECTION VII. Seal.

This Corporation shall have no official corporate seal and all documents signed on behalf of the corporation may designate that the corporation has no seal.

SECTION VIII. Conference Extension Endowment Fund.

The Conference Extension Endowment Fund is a revolving fund created and used for the express purpose of aiding in the purchase of land for the establishing of new churches throughout the Conference; and for the construction of new church buildings, through interest-bearing loans to same, and:

1. That this fund be further augmented by gifts, grants, bequests, annuities and other special contributions, and that loans be made secure by promissory notes.
2. That the amount of interest and condition of repayment, and the amount of loans from this fund shall be determined by the Board of Trustees of the Wisconsin Conference.

SECTION IX. Amendments.

The By-Laws may be amended at any regularly called session of the Annual Conference by a two-thirds vote of those present at said session and entitled to vote.

Standing Rules

I. Pertaining to Annual Conference.

1. A time of fasting and prayer for the Conference and Camp Meeting shall be observed during the week preceding the Conference and Camp Meeting by each local church, and an announcement shall be made in The Wesleyan Methodist with the announcement of the Camp Meeting, and the Conference Secretary shall notify each pastor preceding this date.

2. The pastor shall send the name, age, and number of members of his family and of his delegates and families, if any, to the person in charge of rooms before Conference convenes.

3. The Camp offerings of the services of the first Friday through the first Sunday shall be designated for the Conference Administrative Fund.

4. The Social Security assessment on the Conference President's salary shall be paid by the Conference.

II. Pertaining to Local Churches.

1. Each shall permit its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over two Sundays.

2. The pastoral vote shall be taken on each charge within the first ten days of the month of May unless permission is received from the Conference President and his Advisory Board to do otherwise.

3. Each outgoing pastor shall be responsible for the services of his church until the closing of Camp Meeting, and he shall begin receiving salary from his new charge after the close of Camp Meeting.

4. Each charge shall pay the moving expense of the incoming pastor within the bounds of the Conference.

5. The local church's Board of Trustees and the pastor shall annually review and set the evaluation of the parsonage rent, and the pastor shall include this amount in all his annual reports.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

The ninety-sixth annual session of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened on July 18th, 1963, at 9:10 a.m. in the main tabernacle on the Burr Wesleyan Camp Grounds.

Frank Underwood led the congregation in singing "I Know Whom I Have Believed" and "Trust and Obey." Mrs. Dwight Stuve served as pianist.

The Conference President brought the opening message, reading Psalm 133 and using it as a basis for his message. He spoke of the advances and growth in some areas and also of the problems that we face. In closing he turned our attention to the future which we must face.

Conference President's official report read.

Prayer was offered by the President.

Roll Call — Ministers, 22.

Credentials Committee Report — read and adopted.

President's Report — adopted with the Secretary presiding.

Nominating Committee Partial Report — read and adopted.

Proposed Partial Agenda — read and adopted.

Courtesy Committee — introduced the Denominational Representative, Dr. R. D. Riesdorph, and the Rev. Aubrey Carnell, Australian Conference President. They brought words of greeting to the Conference.

Motion — carried to give Dr. Riesdorph and Rev. Carnell honorary seats in the bar of Conference.

Motion — carried to hear the Interim Finance Committee report.

Interim Finance Committee Report — read.

Motion — carried to refer this report to the Finance Committee.

Rereading of committee assignments.

Recess — to the call of the chair.

THURSDAY P.M.

Singing was led by Ard Blomberg with Mrs. Dawn as pianist. Prayer was offered by Dr. Riesdorph.

Roll Call — Ministers, 22; lawmen, 24.

Courtesy Committee — introduced Jerry Rott and he gave his testimony.

Motion — carried that Jerry Rott be given an honorary seat in the bar of Conference.

Dr. Riesdorph was called to preside.

Committee on Conference Administration Report — read.

Motion — carried that we declare ourselves a committee as a whole to consider the report.

Motion — that the committee report be tabled; lost.

Motion — that Item 3 be given consideration and a committee set up to study this and present a plan to this Conference. Motion lost.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

We, the Committee on Finance, recommend the following:

1. That the camp offerings of the services of the first Friday through the first Sunday be designated for the Conference Administrative Fund, and that this resolution be included in the Standing Rules, replacing Standing Rule No. 18 on page 8.
2. That each elder and pastor on the Conference Roll be responsible for paying, at least quarterly, 5% of his cash income into the Conference Administrative Fund, or that the church pay an equal amount for its pastor; this is non-budget.

3. That the Conference President's salary be \$75.00 per week and that he receive in addition \$1,000 travel expense, \$200 toward utilities, and that he be paid on the 1st and 15th of the month from funds available; and we recommend that the Conference President continue to pay 10% of his salary into the Conference Parsonage Fund.

4. That the Social Security assessment on the Conference President's salary be paid and that this item be included in the Standing Rules.

5. That \$400 be paid into the Conference Parsonage Fund from the Conference Administrative Fund.

6. That fees of \$65.00 be paid the Conference Secretary and \$100.00 the Conference Treasurer from the Conference Administrative Fund;

7. That the Conference Treasurer pay the Superannuate Pension Plan assessment in full each year from General Budget funds available.

8. That auxiliary organizations employing the pages of the Conference Minutes pay a page proportionate expense in their printing and that the price of the minutes be \$1.25 per copy, and that each church be sent at least one-fourth as many minutes as church members.

9. That the churches be assessed 25¢ per person on the subscription list of the Wisconsin Wesleyan.

10. That each church pay \$5.00 per delegate to conference regardless of attendance, and \$5.00 for pastor and family, payable before the end of the conference year to the Conference Treasurer. Any minister attending conference whose assessment is not paid by a church shall be personally responsible.

REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, recommend the following:

1. That each church hold at least one evangelistic campaign during the conference year and that Section VIII, Par. 168 of the DISCIPLINE be adhered to in securing evangelistic help, and that this include all auxiliaries of the annual conference, such as camps and conventions;

2. That each pastor strongly urge his church people, by voice and example, to attend the annual camp, especially on Sundays;

3. That the churches of the Conference be better advertised by proper signs and by adequate information in the yellow pages of the telephone book;

4. That the following "Resolution on the Recognition of God In Our Public Institutions" be adopted:

WHEREAS the historic attitude of the United States Government toward the worship of God has been one of friendliness, as may be substantiated by any number of evidences, and

WHEREAS the American citizenry today, of whatever creed, is overwhelmingly characterized by faith in God and a recognition of our national and personal dependence upon Him, and

WHEREAS the intent of our founding fathers in forbidding the establishment of religion in the First and Fourteenth Amendments of our Constitution

was manifestly not to remove all vestiges of our theistic faith from government-sponsored premises and activities, and

WHEREAS in recent years there has been a determined effort by an atheistic minority, having every personal privilege of disbelief, to secure judicial decisions purportedly based upon the Constitution to shield themselves from reminder of their minority status by the banishment of all theistic traces from publicly sponsored activities and premises, notably from our public schools which, because of compulsory attendance requirements, affect the lives of the vast majority of our children, thus undermining the historic foundation of our moral and ethical value system, and

WHEREAS successive actions of the Supreme Court, occasioned by the persistent appeals of atheists and agnostics, seem to indicate a growing inclination to ban from public life all worship of God, in however broad terms, and all recognition of Him,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that this Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, assembled in its 96th Annual Conference on the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Grounds, Hillsboro, Wisconsin, respectfully petitions our legislative leaders to discover for us and for the great God-fearing majority of our people some adequate lawful redress from the above-described disability. We presume that such may require a Constitutional Amendment recognizing the sovereignty of Almighty God for our nation (while granting freedom of conviction and propagation to those who choose not to recognize Him), reaffirming the doctrine that units of the Government are to avoid acts and policies involving the support or establishment of organized religion, but declaring the principle that it is not deemed a contravention of this doctrine that the name of God be honored in state and civic life and that men be encouraged to read the Bible in its various versions and to worship God in accordance with the dictates of their own conscience, not excluding the incidental occurrence of such activities even from premises built or financed in whole or in part by public moneys, that this nation may indeed be a nation under God.

BE IT RESOLVED FURTHER that we urge our people to circulate petitions after this tenor, these as well as individual communications to be sent to the national legislators from our various areas of residence, endeavoring thus to show the concern of God-fearing peoples in Wisconsin that the public recognition of God the Creator of all men, who is revealed fully in His Son, Jesus Christ, be not destroyed from among us.

BE IT MOVED that this resolution be approved by the 96th Annual session of the Wisconsin Conference of Wesleyan Methodist Churches in America and be made available to each local church in the bounds of this conference for their approval, urging the members of each local church to circulate petitions

among God-fearing people and to precipitate communications to their national legislators to uphold these beliefs.

5. That the Conference elect a committee of three to arrange for a ministers' retreat;

6. That the following "Proposed Revision of By-laws and Standing Rules" be adopted:

PROPOSED REVISION OF BY-LAWS AND STANDING RULES

****Note:** This is an effort to combine and condense these two sections of our Annual Minutes, making them conform with ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER and the WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

BY-LAWS

SECTION I. Name.

The name of this Conference is The Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

SECTION II. Object.

The object of this Conference is stated in the Articles of Religion, General Rules and Elementary Principles of THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION III. Members.

The membership of this Conference shall be as stated in the Constitution, Article V, as it appears in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION IV. Officers.

A. President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. The first ballot for Conference President shall be a nominating ballot.
3. He shall perform such duties as outlined in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.
4. The principal office of the Conference shall be located in the City of Eau Claire, Eau Claire County, Wisconsin.
5. The Conference shall pay the moving expense of a newly elected President from the Conference Administrative Fund.

B. Vice-President.

1. He shall be elected by ballot from among the elders on the Annual Conference roll; his term of office shall be one year.
2. He shall fill the office of the President in the event that it becomes vacant by death, resignation or otherwise.

C. Secretary.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Secretary; his term of office shall be one year.
2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.

3. The Conference Secretary shall be the Credentials Committee, and each pastor shall instruct his church clerk to send the delegates' credentials to him immediately after they are elected.
- D. Treasurer.
1. The Annual Conference shall elect by ballot either a layman or a minister as Treasurer; his term of office shall be one year.
 2. His duties shall be as described in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE and as may be assigned by the Annual Conference.
- E. Other Officers.
1. The Annual Conference shall elect other officers as directed by and in such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.
- F. Time of Election.
1. The time for election of the Conference Officers shall be at 10:00 a.m. the second day of Conference.

SECTION V. Meetings.

- A. Annual Conference Sessions.
1. The Annual Session of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America shall convene on the first Thursday after the third Tuesday of July at 9:00 a.m. in the tabernacle of the Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp located seven miles west of Hillsboro, Wisconsin, on Highway 33.
 2. The time of Conference sessions shall be from 9:00-12:00 noon and from 1:00-5:00 p.m.
 3. The Bar of Conference shall be the first ten rows of seats in the center section and the rostrum of the main tabernacle.
 4. The Conference President shall bring a "State of the Conference" message at the opening session of the Annual Conference.
 5. The Conference fiscal year shall close June 30 of each year and that of the local church on May 31. All money to be applied toward payment of budget shall be remitted undivided monthly by the local church treasurer to the Conference Treasurer. All money for which credit is to be given must be postmarked not later than June 15. Each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer, prior to the close of the Conference year, his statistical blank completed, except for the budget section; the Conference Treasurer, upon completion of the budget section, shall forward the statistical forms to the Statistical Secretary—said form not to be returned to the pastors until the Conference session. Any pastor not complying with the above ruling will fail to have his character passed by the Character Committee.

6. Each pastor shall attend the Conference and camps and each institute and convention sponsored by the Conference, unless excused by the Conference President and Advisory Board, and the responsibility of the enforcement of this rule shall be in the hands of the Character Committee.
7. Pastors' reports shall be read and the statistical reports shall be posted on a bulletin board at the Annual Conference session.
8. All conference treasurers' books shall be closed and ready for auditing and placed in the hands of the Auditing Committee at the first session of the Conference.

B. Special Sessions.

1. Special sessions may be called according to the procedure outlined in THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.

SECTION VI. Committees.

A. Board of Trustees.

1. The Board of Trustees shall be composed of four elders and three laymen elected in the manner prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE.
2. The Board of Trustees (or the President and Secretary of the Conference when authorized as hereinafter set forth) of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America is authorized to buy, sell, lease, and mortgage real and personal property of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America and to borrow money for and on behalf of said Conference and to execute the necessary deeds, contracts, notes and mortgages and other necessary documents to effectuate the purposes of this section; the President and the Secretary of the said Conference are given full power to act for and on behalf of said Conference when authorized by said Trustees by motion duly passed by said Trustees and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Board of Trustees.
3. The Conference Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the bonding of the Conference Treasurer.

B. Camp Meeting Board.

1. Camp Meetings of the Conference shall be supervised and conducted by a Camp Meeting Board of the Conference to be known as "Burr Wesleyan Methodist Camp Meeting Board of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America."
 - (a) Said Board shall consist of the following members: Conference President, Conference Secretary, Conference Treasurer, Maintenance Superintendent, and five members elected by the Conference. All members of said Board shall have equal vote and voice. At least three of the members of the

Board shall be laymen. All members of the Board shall be members of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

(b) President: The Conference President, by virtue of his office, shall be the President of the said Board. He shall act as Chairman of the Board and have general oversight of the Camp Meeting, and of all the business pertaining thereto. He may appoint someone to act as temporary chairman in his discretion.

(c) Secretary: The Conference Secretary, by virtue of his office, shall be the Secretary of the said Board. He shall keep all records and care for all correspondence relative to the business of the said Board.

(d) Treasurer: The Conference Treasurer, by virtue of his office, shall be the Treasurer of said Board. He shall receive all funds and disburse the same at the direction of the Camp Meeting Board or the Executive Committee of the said Board, as the case may be.

(e) Maintenance Superintendent: The Maintenance Superintendent shall be elected annually by the Conference from a list of two names submitted by the nominating committee. His duties shall be: The oversight of the building and grounds at the Camp Meeting grounds; he shall have charge of all repairs and maintenance and of the upkeep of buildings and grounds under the direction of the Conference or of said Board as the case may be. He shall be foreman of all building projects.

(f) Duties and Powers of the Camp Meeting Board: Said Board shall secure the workers for Camp Meetings, i.e., Evangelists, singers, children's workers and all other help necessary for the carrying on of Camp Meetings. The Board shall also take care of all business of the Camp Meeting between meetings of the Annual Conference. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to borrow money for Camp Meeting purposes and to bind the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America therefor and to execute the necessary agreements and promissory notes to effect such borrowing. However, the Camp Meeting Board shall not have authority to mortgage or encumber any of the property, real or personal, of the Wisconsin Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall have authority to rent Camp Meeting property out for such periods of time as will not interfere with the use of the camp grounds by the State Conference and its auxiliary organizations. The Board shall have the authority to enter into agreements with private individuals who have or may in the future construct cottages or other buildings on said camp grounds regarding construction, use and removal of such buildings but shall have no authority to convey a fee interest in, or deed any such land. The Camp Meeting Board shall submit a summary report and accounting each year at the annual meeting of the Conference. Said Camp Meeting Board shall at times be subject to directions and limitations placed on it by the Annual Conference of the Wisconsin Conference

of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America. The Camp Meeting Board shall prepare and print the rates and regulations of the camp and post them in each room, and cottage, and in prominent places on the camp ground, and mail a copy to the pastors.

(g) Executive Committee: The Executive Committee of said Board shall consist of of the Conference President, the Conference Secretary, and the Maintenance Superintendent, and shall have full authority to act for and on behalf of said Board when authorized by said Board by motion duly passed by the Board and certified to in writing by the Secretary of said Camp Meeting Board.

C. Nominating Committee.

1. There shall be a Nominating Committee composed of four elders elected by ballot, and the President ex-officio, and two lay delegates rotated on an alphabetical basis according to churches.
2. No elective member shall serve on the Nominating Committee two years in succession.
3. They shall meet and bring their report of session committee nominations at the first session of the ensuing Annual Conference.
4. The Nominating Committee shall submit to the Conference floor, to be voted on by ballot, two names for each office, except the office of President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer, and a list of names consisting of one more than the required number for each Standing Committee, where it does not conflict with the requirements of THE DISCIPLINE. They shall submit, as prescribed above, names for the chairman of the Resolutions and the Finance Committees, one year in advance.

D. Board of Church Extension and Evangelism.

1. The members of the Board of Trustees shall be the Conference Board of Church Extension and Evangelism. The President of the Conference shall be ex-officio member and president. The duties of this board shall be as outlined in THE DISCIPLINE.

E. Other Committees.

1. The Annual Conference shall elect other committees as directed by and in such manner as prescribed by THE WESLEYAN METHODIST DISCIPLINE or by the members of the Annual Conference. Their duties and terms of office shall be in accord with THE DISCIPLINE and as assigned by the Annual Conference.

SECTION VII. Seal.

This Corporation shall have no official corporate seal and all documents signed on behalf of the corporation may designate that the corporation has no seal.

SECTION VIII. Amendments.

The By-Laws may be amended at any regularly called session of the Annual

Conference by a two-thirds vote of those present at said session and entitled to vote.

Standing Rules

I. Pertaining to Annual Conference.

1. A time of fasting and prayer for the Conference and Camp Meeting shall be observed during the week preceding the Conference and Camp Meeting by each local church, and an announcement shall be made in The Wesleyan Methodist with the announcement of the Camp Meeting, and the Conference Secretary shall notify each pastor preceding this date.

2. The pastors shall send the name, age and number of members of his family and of his delegate's families, if any, to the person in charge of rooms before Conference convenes.

II. Pertaining to Local Churches.

1. Each shall permit its pastor a two weeks vacation with pay, to be absent on vacation over two Sundays.

2. The pastoral vote shall be taken on each charge within the first ten days of the month of May unless permission is received from the Conference President and his Advisory Board to do otherwise.

3. Each outgoing pastor shall be responsible for the services of his church until the closing of Camp Meeting, and he shall begin receiving salary from his new charge after the close of Camp Meeting.

4. Each charge shall pay the moving expense of the incoming pastor within the Conference bounds.

5. The local church's Board of Trustees and the pastor shall annually review and set the evaluation of the parsonage rent, and the pastor shall include this amount in all his annual reports.

7. We further recommend that Sections 3, 7, and 12 of the present By-Laws be omitted.

TRUSTEES REPORT FOR 1963

We, the Board of Trustees of the Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, wish to submit the following report of our activities for the Conference year. We had five meetings during the year.

1. We authorized the sale of a 40-acre tract of land in Washburn County to Donald Boone for the sum of \$165.00.

2. We approved the building of the Rice Lake Church and Parsonage.

3. We authorized a loan for the Rice Lake Church for their building project for the amount of \$35,000.00.

4. We authorized the sale of the Rice Lake property at 35 W. Marshall St.

5. We authorized the Janesville church to re-finance their loan with the Merchants & Savings Bank of Janesville.

6. We cancelled a note held by the Conference against the Gull Lake church for \$169.47.

7. We authorized the building of an additional bedroom in the basement of the Conference parsonage at Eau Claire at a cost of \$223.49.

8. We authorized the Milwaukee church to re-finance their loan to the amount of \$40,000.00 to improve their ability to meet the monthly payments.

9. We set a salary for Rev. Richard Franklin, the new pastor at Hales Corners at \$60.00 per week until the close of Camp meeting.

10. We authorized the purchase of a large lot in the Second Addition to Rolling Meadows Subdivision at Madison, from one Mrs. Harold Brown.

11. We also accepted a gift of additional lots adjoining the lot purchased, this gift coming from Mrs. Harold Brown, and to be used for church purposes.

12. We accepted a loan to the Conference from Mr. Ernest Friebe Sr., for \$5,000.00 for Conference work.

13. We authorized the building of a parsonage at Eastman, Wis.

14. We authorized a loan for Eastman parsonage building program to the amount of \$13,000.00 from the Rural Mutual Security Insurance Co. of Madison.

15. Pursuant to Resolution No. 11 of the Finance Committee Report of the 1962 Session of Conference, the following was adopted by the Board of Trustees and is hereby offered and recommended to this Conference Session to become a part of the By-Laws:

The Conference Endowment Fund is a revolving Fund created and used for the express purpose of aiding in the purchase of land for the establishing of new churches throughout the Conference; and for the construction of new church buildings, through interest-bearing loans to same, be it resolved—

1. That this Fund be further augmented by gifts, grants, bequests, annuities and other special contributions, and that loans be made secure by promissory notes.

2. That the amount of interest and condition of repayment, and the amount of loans from this Fund shall be determined by the Board of Trustees of the Wisconsin Conference."

We, the Board of Trustees, recommend to you the following program for advancement of church extension in our Conference.

Goal #1. Plan and prepare toward the opening of a new Wesleyan Methodist Church on Madison east side lots in the Fall of 1964, as follows—

1. Have a church extension emphasis in the Missionary Conventions in our conference in the Fall of 1963, with one of the speakers representing this phase of missions—this speaker to be Rev. Virgil Mitchel if possible.

2. Spring of 1964.

Have District planning conference meetings, Dinner meetings with lay-leaders of our local churches.

Introduce a plan of monthly contributions for Conference Extension with a goal of 300 members pledging \$1.00 per month; 50 members pledging \$5.00; 100 members pledging \$10.00 per month. This money raised to be divided equally between the Conference Extension and the Conference Extension Endowment Fund.

3. Summer of 1964—Construct church buildings on Madison East side lots.

4. Conference 1964—Appoint pastor to Madison East side and begin services as soon as possible.

Goal #2. To keep a similar plan of raising Funds for church extension in operation so that we may be able to launch pioneer projects even more frequently in the future.
