The fifty-ninth annual session of the Kansas Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, assembled in the auditorium at Miltonvale, Kans., at 1:30 P. M., Monday, August 12, 1929, with the President, Prof. F. C. Hill, in the chair.

The opening devotions were led by Prof. T. J. Pomeroy, who read Ephesians 3:14-21, with appropriate and helpful comments. He then offered prayer, petitioning the blessing of God and guidance of the Holy Spirit upon and throughout the session.

The Sunday School is the institution that has been established and maintained for these great purposes. In fact, the three great needs for

forming and establishing Christian character are met in the Sunday School, namely: teaching the Word of God and the plan of salvation to the unsaved, instructing believers in the ways of salvation, and furnishing the point of contact between the Christian and the sinner. From this view point the Sunday School becomes the strong department of the Church; it furnishes opportunity for service for all people who may be used in any capacity, distributes responsibility, enlists co-operation, and makes the Church "workers together with him" in the work of evangelism. In consideration of the above we recommend to our Pastors and Churches that they through their local Sunday School Boards endeavor to build up a strong body of workers in each local Church by choosing efficient and Spirit-filled men and women for these places of contact and service. We suggest that once each month the prayer meeting be devoted to the Sunday School. Under the direction of the Superintendent it may be used for the study of methods and lesson material; attention may be called to delinquent scholars and school problems, and made a subject of definite prayer. We recommend the use of our Sunday School literature. Let the slogan of each Sunday School be: Every member of the Church in Sunday School; every member of the Sunday School in Church.

BOOKS AND PERIODICALS

Much reading is being done today. There are many reasons why people read. Some read for entertainment, some to please others, and some for mere past-time. But the reading which is the most profitable is that reading which provokes thought and excites to noble action. Thinking leads to character formation. The Bible declares that, "as he (man) thinketh in his heart, so is he." Therefore it is very important that the material which we read should be of sufficient merit that the reader will be benefitted rather than debased by reading it. There may be some forms of literature which would have no particular effect upon the reader, but there is much which no one can read without being the worse for it, and there is that which is highly beneficial. It is our duty to encourage a desire for this latter class, and do all that we can to prevent and discourage the reading of the baser sort. We consider as decidedly unprofitable that kind of literature which possesses no moral uplift but is read for mere past-time. Books and Magazines which contain stories or statements reflecting on the sacredness of love,

marriage and religion should have no place in the homes of Holiness people. We consider as decidedly poisonous the modernistic teaching of the present day.

There is too much good reading to waste time on any of the above mentioned kinds of literature. There is much reading matter which we can most heartily recommend. The Bible should have first place in every home. Every Wesleyan Methodist should take our Church paper, and our own Sunday School literature should be used in our Sunday Schools. Our Publishing House handles a line of books which will be very profitable for our people to read. Let us as Holiness people select only the very best literature for our children to read, and so instruct them that they will not desire that which is less profitable. If we seek the will of God in these matters we will be safely guided in the selection of our reading matter.

MORAL REFORM

Ever since the fall of man there has been an increasing tendency of the human race toward the attractions and allurements of the Evil One, so affecting the moral standards and spiritual tide of the Church Militant of today, that we as a Conference are compelled to petition the Church for a Moral Reform by which the standards and requirements of Holy Writ shall be maintained, and the Christ exalted to His rightful position through the godly examples and holy living of the men and women, boys and girls of the Kansas Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. To the accomplishments of this given end we submit the following reforms as imperative:

That the rules and requirements of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline as founded on the Bible, be repeatedly brought to the attention of the people, and prayerfully, carefully and fully followed.

That we as a Church demand of prominent political office seekers their position on the Eighteenth Amendment, the cigarette, the licensing of houses of ill-fame, or any other outstanding evil that we as a Conference may, through a more intelligent use of our franchise, be able to safeguard our youth from the increasing and oncoming peril of the present day.

That we maintain our disciplinary requirements in regard to the secret and oath-bound societies, at the same time through the expounding of the Word of God, prayerfully seeking to deliver any or all from that which the wise man has said is "Vanity of vanities, All is vanity."

That any apparel, dress or costume worn by our womanhood and girlhood, which does not sufficiently cover her, but what the attention, consideration and passions of the opposite sex are appealed to, is a breach of the standards and requirements of the entire contents of God's Word, and that after prayerful counseling and consideration they will not refrain, we recommend (in order that the welfare of our youth be protected), that as far as possible, the expulsion of such person from the social function of our young people be executed, considering it a justifiable action.

That we strive earnestly to and strictly "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy," at the same time exercising every power, wielding every influence, to the gaining of this end in the community in which we live.

The masses that are sweeping into the divorce courts today are appalling. The home as an institution is being alarmingly undermined by this evil. The great economic changes of the day, the weakening of moral responsibility, and the demand for freedom from the marriage vow are factors working against the home. We recommend that we as a Church do all in our power to check this growing evil, by crying out against it, and by instructing our children and young people in the principles and doctrines of righteousness and godliness, to the end that the home, the church and the nation may be perpetuated in the earth.

Allow me to bring this brief message at the close of another Conference year, and begin with the prayer as taught us by our Lord Jesus, "Our Father who art in Heaven, Hallowed be thy name, Thy kingdom come, **Thy will** be done, in earth, as it is in Heaven." (Placing emphasis on "**Thy will**.")

Our best word to the faithful workers in the missionary societies would be to express the desire (if possible in word) for the fulfillment of our Lord's **will** (namely the establishment of His kingdom on earth).

PLAN OF WORK

We, the Committee on Plan of the Work, hereby recommend the following:

Division I

1. That the last Friday in October be observed as Harvest Home Day. That each local Society wishing to send cash or making donations to the Dormitory, report the same to the Harvest Home Committee in order to receive credit on the Educational Budget.

2. That by recommendation of the General Conference Society, all local dues be sent to our Conference Treasurer, and be divided equally between the General and Conference Treasuries.

3. That each Society contribute 10 cents per member to pay General Conference Delegate's expenses. And that the first week in June be "Dues Paying" time.

4. That each Society have a Magazine Committee of one, the same to be a permanent officer, whose duty shall be to secure new subscriptions and renewals to the Wesleyan Missionary.

5. That we contribute at least \$6 per Society for Home Missions.

6. That the Statistical Report of the W. H. & F. M. Society be in the hands of the Committee on Statistics two weeks before Conference, and that the names of the outgoing President and Secretary appear in the regular report and the names of the newly elected President and Secretary appear at the bottom of the report blank.

7. That the President of each local Society be made responsible to arrange with the Pastor for one evening of the third week of each month to pray especially for the Mission work, the same to be preceded by a day of fasting. We also recommend that a Thank Offering be taken at the monthly prayer service for a building on the African field to be used as a rest house for the Missionaries and as a school for the Missionaries' children.

8. That each Missionary Society have a basket to be filled with such articles as can be sent with outgoing Missionaries or in home work.

9. That the study book "From Jerusalem to Jerusalem," by Helen Barret Montgomery, be used. Said book may be obtained from the Wesleyan Publishing House, 330 E. Onondaga St., Syracuse, N. Y.

10. That our women of the W. H. & F. M. Societies be modest examples in their dress and encourage others to do likewise.

11. That this Plan of Work and the Efficiency Standard be read quarterly in each local Society.

12. That our Societies make bandages and send them to Rev. E. F. McCarty, 222 S. Clemens Ave., Lansing, Mich., and receive credit of 50 cents per pound for the same.

13. That our Societies contribute to the support of the Hephzibah Orphanage.

14. That each local President appoint a Committee of two, whose duty shall be to visit the sick and to work in harmony with the Pastor in rendering any assistance that will help in reaching souls and building up the kingdom of God.

15. That all money be disbursed through our local and Conference Treasurers and that each local Treasurer use the Treasurer's book prepared by the General Conference Society and that the Treasurer's book be sent to Conference with the Delegate.

16. That the Quadrennial report, properly balanced, be sent to Conference with the Delegate.

Division II

17. That our Conference Organizer and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent and the District Leaders arrange two programs for the coming year; the first to be on Home Missions, to be given in December, and the second on Foreign Missions at Convention time.

18. That the President and District Leaders arrange the time and recommend the worker for the Conventions. Also that they prepare the schedule for the visitation of our worker and report before the close of Conference.

19. That each District be supervised by the District Leader, under direction of the Conference President. She shall be Prayer Secretary and Magazine Committee of her District and shall report the condition of her district to the President quarterly.

20. That the Secretary be instructed to supply each local President with a copy of the Efficiency Standard. And that a grade of 7% be given on each item. To be graded by the Committee on Apportionment. A grade of 80% be given honorable mention, and a Society making a grade of 90% or above to be placed on the Honor Roll.

21. That the Gleaners observe the monthly prayer hour. That each member secure at least three subscriptions to the Missionary Magazine, furnish ten pounds of bandages and write at least once to each of the Mission Fields.
