It was moved that this Conference authorize a loan to be made from the Conference Mission Arm of the Conference to the Conference Claim Arm to cover the deficit of W. L. Thompson's salary, and that the Board of Trustees issue a note to the Conference Treasurer to cover the loan and that this note be paid when the Shambaugh farm account is liquidated. The motion carried.

The final reading of the Pastoral Relations Committee was given. Upon motion the report was adopted. See Report No. 12.

The Committee on Elder's Orders gave their final report. On motion the report was adopted. See Report No. 2.

The Secretary of the Conference Board of Trustees read the report of the actions of the Board of Trustees in the interim of Conference. The actions of the Board of Trustees as revealed in the reading of the minutes were approved.

The Treasurer of the Board of Trustees made his report. On motion the report was adopted. See Report No. 13.

The Conference body gave a rising vote of thanks to Rev. Loren VanMatre for his sacrificial service in connection with the Shambaugh Estate.

A motion prevailed that Rev. Howard Crim be elected to preach the opening sermon next year. Brother Thomas Ballard was elected as alternate.

A motion prevailed that the next Conference convene on Tuesday August 18, 1936.

A motion was made and carried that when we adjourn, we adjourn to meet at the call of the Chair.

It was moved by the Conference Treasurer that it shall be a standing rule of this Conference, until revoked that the Board of Trustees shall authorize all disbursements not otherwise provided for. Motion carried.

A motion prevailed that the Board of Trustees take out a bond of \$2,000 for the Conference Treasurer.

The following motion was made and carried: That the President of the Conference be authorized in the interim of Conference to grant to Conference Preachers the right to officiate at weddings and administer the sacrament of the Lord's Supper upon receiving from the Secretary of the Committee on Elder's Orders the information that they have met the disciplinary requirements necessary for this authorization.

A motion was made and carried that the Conference Treasurer be authorized to purchase an adding machine for his use, the price to be apportioned amongst the various funds.

The following resolution was presented:

Let it be a standing rule of this Conference that each pastor whose total pastor's receipts exceed \$1,000 a year shall seek to organize a new class or give his services in a revival meeting to one of the weaker churches, whose total pastor's receipts are \$500 or less—to help establish it. And that the church which he pastors grant him such privileges without censure and full remuneration of salary while in such meeting.

Upon motion the resolution was adopted. The minutes were read and approved. Adjourned by vote. Benediction by C. S. Smith.

# RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

- 1. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be open to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments. And waiving of the above resolution by a contract or lease of building must be obtained through the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Conference.
- 2. Be it resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders shall require all those desiring to unite with us from any other denomination or Annual Conference to present credits equivalent to our Conference Course of Study, regardless of their standing in the body of which they have been a member, and if they cannot do this they shall be required to meet the same conditions as our local preachers before ordination.
- 3. That any candidate for Elder's Orders or traveling under the direction of the Conference, who fails to attend the Institutes and the examinations of the Committee, without sufficient cause, shall be deemed unworthy of the trust and care of souls, and refused a place among us as a minister of the Gospel, and when they shall fail to attend the Institute for two successive years they shall be dropped from the roll.
- 4. The Committee on Elder's Orders is hereby to transfer all persons to the study list who may have been recommended to travel and may not have been given work.
- 5. All charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall in addition to the regular stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.
- 6. Be it resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Pastors to look after the insurance of our church and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the Pastor shall be a censurable offense. If the church fails to insure their property upon reasonable effort of the pastor to secure the same, then said failure shall be reported to the President of the Conference who shall then have the property insured. In

such case all insurance monies received from losses by fire, lightning, hail, and tornado shall be used in Church Extension work as the Conference Board of Trustees deems best.

- 7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the Pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said Pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with the previous arrangements between Pastors and charges. That where the Conference demands the services of any one, that it shall bear the moving expenses, if any expense shall thus be incurred.
- 8. Each Pastor shall file a duplicate statistical report with the Committee before the close of the fifth day of August with the exception of Pastor's salary and Membership. These items to be reported the first day of Conference, said report to be kept on file one year, and hereafter the full reports shall not be read in open Conference. The official character of any Pastor shall not be passed until he shall have submitted a satisfactory report, including statistics.
- 9. All unaccounted for members appearing in the statistics in the membership list shall be referred to the discontinued list. All members in excess of the number reported shall be reported received. The roll of all the classes upon the charges shall be put in the hands of the Pastors and they shall have charge of the same and make all entries therein.
- 10. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the President shall receive \$35.00, the Secretary \$50.00, the Treasurer \$100.00, the Assistant Secretary \$25.00, each member of the Auditing Committee \$10.00, Assistant to the Treasurer \$10.00, the same to be apportioned pro-rata among the various funds of the Conference. The Conference Sunday School Secretary shall receive \$50.00 and each of the other members of the Conference Sunday School Board shall receive \$25.00, the same to be paid out of the Sunday School Treasury.
- 11. It shall be a standing rule until revoked by this body that the President shall nominate his Advisory Board and the Conference shall elect his nominations.
- 12. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference that in the examination of character the Conference officials shall be called first.
- 13. The Conference shall elect three members of the Camp Meeting Committee, one to be elected each year for a term of three years.
- 14. The Pastor shall bring a report to each Quarterly Meeting and send a duplicate to the Conference President quarterly on blanks furnished by the Conference.

15. Whereas, our people are being deceived by the erroneous teaching that Divine healing of the body through faith in the Atonement is the same as for sin, therefore:

Be it resolved, That we record our belief that the healing of the body is among the gifts of the Spirit according to 1 Cor. 12:7-11, hence not for all Christians at all times as it is not always the will of God to heal the body.

- 16. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked, that no charge shall call any one as Pastor, or to supply the work, from without the bounds of the Conference as long as there are ministers in the Conference qualified and available to take the work.
- 17. Resolved, That the Treasurers shall submit their reports to the Auditing Committee who shall audit the same and in their report to this body they shall show they have audited the same.
- 18. Inasmuch as the Pastor's statistics reveal the true condition of the work as much as anything that might be said, therefore be it resolved, That the Pastors beginning next year report in open Conference the amount of Pastor's salary received, the amount of budget raised and the loss or gain in membership, also the number of Wesleyan Methodist papers and Wesleyan Missionary magazines taken.
- 19. It shall be the standing rule of this Conference until revoked, that the term of office of the President of our Conference shall not exceed six consecutive years.
- 20. It shall be a standing rule of the Conference until revoked that the Board of Trustees shall authorize all disbursements not otherwise provided for.
- 21. Let it be the standing rule of this Conference that each Pastor whose total pastor's receipts exceed \$1000.00 a year shall seek to organize a new class or give his services in a revival meeting to one of the weaker churches—whose total pastor's receipts are \$500.00 or less—to help establish it. And that the church which he pastors grant him such privileges without censure and with full remuneration of salary while in such a meeting.

## Report No. 3

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND APPROPRIATION

We, your Committee on Finance and Appropriation, make the following recommendations:

1. That the President shall have oversight of all the work of the Conference, and that he shall hold at least one quarterly meeting on each charge and the pastors shall arrange for the other three.

He shall cooperate with the pastors in raising the various budgets and the pastors shall report to him quarterly, and where a pastor fails to report it shall require a vote of the Conference to pass his character.

The President's salary shall be \$1500.00 and expenses incident to his work.

2. That the work of Conference Missions be under the supervision and direction of the Conference Board of Trustees as constituting the Conference Missionary Board.

3. That Conference Claims Budget be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer, quarterly except, that the Quarterly Meeting Apportionment shall be paid to the President when he holds the Quarterly Meeting. The President's salary and other expenses incident to Conference work shall be paid from this fund.

4. That newly organized churches are only asked for free will offer-

ings for the first two years.

5. That a Tithing Secretary be elected by this Conference and that one evening service in the Conference Session be given for a Tithing Service, and all Tithing Bands or Churches of the Conference be called to give their yearly report at this meeting and that some capable minister be chosen to preach on the Store House Tithing Plan.

The expenses of the Tithing Literature and Postage be paid from Conference Claims Fund and that churches desiring literature may secure same from the Tithing Secretary.

- 6. That the Sunday School offerings on the First Sunday of each month shall be promptly forwarded to the Conference Treasurer and that he divide it equally between Conference Missions and Home Missions.
- 7. That any deficit in the Minute Fund be apportioned to the various Conference Funds.
- 8. That each church elect a Budget Steward whose duty shall be to cooperate with the pastor in raising the Budget and the pastor shall forward same to the proper Treasurer either monthly or quarterly, and a statement be sent by the steward to each member of the Church quarterly, stating the amount of the budget assessment and the amount paid on same, provided they have not united with the Store House Plan.
  - 9. We recommend the Store House Tithing Plan for financing the

Church work and the following percentage basis for distribution for all churches: Local Church Work, 70 per cent; Budget, 30 per cent.

- 10. We recommend that the Budget be apportioned as follows: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Connectional Education, \$1.50; Conference Claims, \$.75; Conference Missions, \$.75; Home Missions, \$.50; College Building Fund, \$.50; Orphanage, \$.25; and one copy of the Minutes for each six assessable members.
- 11. Let all churches or Ministers purchasing church property or beginning a building program comply with our Book of Discipline, page 66, paragraph 110.
- 12. We recommend that the Superannuated Minister's Offering shall not be less than \$.10 per member.
- 13. That the Board of Trustees shall issue an order to the Conference Treasurer for the payment of all liabilities of the various arms of the work as funds are available.
- 14. That copies of the report of this committee be prepared for distribution at a cost of one cent each to the pastor.

## Report No. 6

## REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

- 1. With deepest appreciation for the years of faithful service rendered to their Conference by W. L. Thompson and F. R. Eddy, we pledge them our loyal support in the new offices to which the Church has called them. To this end we urge a full budget and a decided increase in subscriptions to the Church Papers, with a goal of one Wesleyan Methodist and one Wesleyan Missionary to each five members of the Church.
- 2. Evangelism. "Lift up your eyes and look on the fields; for they are white already to harvest." We urge that every pastor and every church shall prayerfully and aggressively undertake to evangelize, first in the home community, then some nearby community where a needed Wesleyan Methodist Church may be founded. We believe that God is definitely and unmistakably calling our Church to Pentecostal Evangelism.
- 3. Education. Believing that an enlightened laity is as essential to the Church as is trained leadership, that true knowledge is essential to correct belief, we urge both ministry and laity to give whole-hearted support to Marion College, our Institution which loyally teaches the doctrines of the Church. We ask them to support her by sending their own sons and daughters, by urging others to attend, by prayer, by financial help, and by carrying out the Educational Plan adopted by the last General Conference.
- 4. Youth. We recommend that this Annual Conference extend an invitation to our State W. Y. P. S. Organization to hold its Annual Convention and Business Meeting at the time and place of the Annual Conference gathering as a regular practice. We recommend also that all pastors be urged to promote effectively the Youth Movement in the local churches, finding for the young people a place of service and responsibility for which they have been prepared by a Christian experience and thorough acquaintance with the glorious doctrines and history of the Church; to the end that our young people may be challenged to the fostering of evangelism and the full financial, moral, and spiritual support of the local, Conference, and Connectional work.
- 5. Morals and Reform. We recognize the Bible as the inspired Word of God and the only safe guide for human conduct.

We deplore the breakdown of general moral standards and pledge our cooperation with every organization which seeks to develop a higher standard of national ethical idealism than that which is exemplified by much of our present social and political leadership.

We re-affirm our belief in the principle of religious freedom and hereby declare our united opposition to the present organized attempt to spread in our country the doctrines of atheism agnosticism, Communism, Fascism, Nazism, and all other political or social philosophies which seek to undermine the Church, and to take from the individual his constitutional rights to worship in accordance with the dictates of his conscience.

We urge our people to supply their homes with reading matter, music, and entertainment which will create in the minds of our youth a desire for something other than that which is typified by the "True Story" magazine, the radio jazz orchestra, the sex appeal movie, and the nudist colony. We recommend further that our people be not swayed by the passing fads in both conduct and dress which annually catch the popular fancy, but rather that in all our human relationships we seek to conduct ourselves like beings created in the image of Divinity.

We voice our protest against the almost unlimited debauchery of human life which is being permitted by the present administrations, both federal and state, through the organized liquor traffic, and we urge our people that in the coming primary and general elections they forget party alignments and support state and national legislative candidates who will pledge their allegiance to prohibition legislation. We recognize also the need for authentic information on the present liquor situation which can be made available to all our people. Therefore we recommend that the Indiana Conference petition the Book Committee to take whatever procedure may be necessary to set up the Connectional Commission on Prohibition and Morals which has been authorized by the Discipline the past three quadrenniums, but which has never functioned.

## Report No. 7

#### REPORT OF CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The work of the Sunday Schools has shown life and enthusiasm during the past year. Enthusiastic Conventions were held in the various districts in May. Each Convention revealed a lively interest in the Sunday School work, and each registered a splendid attendance. Much interest was added to the Convention work by the Round Table Discussion led by Rev. F. R. Eddy and the high point of enthusiasm was reached in his Convention address, "The Making of a Man." We surely appreciate the work of our retiring Connectional Editor and Secretary, and extend to him our good wishes and pledge him our support in his new field.

In Teacher's Training several classes are making progress toward graduation, and two new classes have been organized, one at Elkhart of 9 members and one at Nelson Street, Marion of 18 members. Rev. T. M.

Addison and Vivian Farris have graduated from the course this year.

We recommend the holding of Conventions in each of the Districts during the two middle weeks of May, and that our Pastor's and people set apart one day in the year in the interest of Sunday School work, and plan to attend these Conventions. As this work has been so splendidly taken care of by the 1ct. per member assessment, we recommend its continuance.

We recommend the districts for Convention work as follows:

Northern District, Western Section: Hamlet, South Bend, North Liberty, Elkhart, Plymouth, with C. C. Decker as Superintendent. Eastern Section: Edgerton, Albion, Ft. Wayne, Larwill, Warsaw, with C. D. Crabill as Superintendent.

Central District, Western Section: Elwood, Peru, Greentown, La-Fayette, Fowler, Kokomo (1st and 2nd Church), Marion (West 8th St.), Marion (Nelson St.), Logansport, Mt. Olive, Mt. Zion (Howard Co), Miami, Santa Fe, Wabash, Converse, Tipton, Hoopston, Sims, with A. M. Jackson as Superintendent. Eastern Section: Bryant, Fairmount, Fowlerton, Gas City, Hartford City, Jonesboro, Lancaster, Marion (South), Marion (George Street), Mt. Etna, Portland, Eouth Salem, Summitville, Laketon, Warren, Bluffton, with Thomas Ballard as Superintendent.

Southern District, Western Section: Anderson, Waveland, Indianapolis, Kirklin, Sheridan, Westfield, Carmel, Baker's Corner, Robert's Chapel, Cicero, Fishersburg, Thorntown, with F. L. Berkebile as Superintendent. Eastern Section: Blue River, Shelbyville, Lewis Creek, Mt. Zion (Henry Co.), Newcastle, Muncie, Gaston, Fountain City, Grant City, with C. C. Fields as Superintendent. If any charge has been overlooked in the districting please join your nearest district.

We recommend the 10 cents per member assessment for Connectional and Conference Sunday School work be continued, to be divided equally between these branches of the work.

We recommend that the Board Treasurer enclose with his regular assessment notice, a Pastor's Annual Sunday School Report Blank and that each Pastor be requested to fill out the same and forward to the Conference Sunday School Secretary immediately after July 31.

Our Sunday Schools show an increase over last year in enrollment of 284, in scholars converted 64, in scholars joining church of 90 and in money raised for Home Missions of \$188.00. These gains may not be large but they are gains, and reveal life and interest. Let us put forth greater effort during the year before us, that, under the blessing of God more souls may be saved, and more added to the Church of our allegiance.
