STANDING RULES

1. The Committee on Audit shall be a Standing Committee.
2. The offering taken on the evenings of Conference and Sunday morning shall be applied to the expenses and entertainment of Conference.
3. The President with his Advisory Board shall be a Committee on Orders of the Day and Religious Services during Conference.
4. The Conference Fiscal year shall begin on July 1 and close on June 30. Local treasurers shall close their books on the third Sunday of June, and only funds on budget received by the Conference Treasurer on or before July 5 will receive credit. All Treasurers of Auxiliary Organizations shall also close their books by the third Sunday of June; disburse funds and forward a report to the conference treasurer by July 5th.
5. That the Conference Secretary mail one copy of the Pastor's Statistical Report for each charge with the budget assessment from the Senior Conference and auxiliary organizations to the Conference Treasurer. The Conference Treasurer will fill in the total budget receipts paid for each assessed item from each church, sign each Pastor's Statistical Report and mail it to the pastors of each charge eight days before the Annual Conference begins. The pastor shall complete this report and mail it to the chairman of the Statistical Committee five days before Conference.
6. That this Canada Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, having become part of the Superannuate Pension Plan of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, will not feel any obligation to any of the Conference Ministers or their families, when such ministers retire because of physical inability, or, in case of death, to support their widows or children, if said ministers have neglected to become members of the Superannuate Plan, whose laity make provision for such periods of need. All members of the Superannuate Pension Plan are to make their payments on assessed incomes, and file reports according to regulation.
7. That the Conference President be Record Clerk.
8. That the Ministerial Member of the Houghton College Board of Trustees also be Conference Educational Secretary.
9. That the Pastoral Vote be completed by June 1.
10. That the third Sunday in August be the final Sunday for all pastors who are moving from their present charge.
11. That the churches grant each pastor two weeks vacation with pay at the time agreeable to the pastor and congregation.
12. That only the following items of the Pastor's Statistical Report be read on the Conference Floor:—1 Appointments; Item 2—Wesleyan Methodist; Wesleyan Missionaries, Wesleyan Youth; Item 3—Present number, loss or gain, number of family altars; Item 4—Total Number in Main School, average attendance, Wesleyan Youth Societies—both parts; Item 5 and 6 to be read in full; Item 7—Total for Church; Item 8—To be read in full; Item 9—Total for Benevolences; Item 10—To be read in full.
13. Those who travel on Conference Assignments, or to Conference gatherings where travelling expenses are remunerated, the following will be observed:—
 - (a) Where possible and convenient clergy rates will be paid.
 - (b) The expenses of meals, room, and when necessary travel to and from trains.
 - (c) When it is judged best to travel by train, where one has come by car, clergy rates be paid.
 - (d) When travelling by car, a basis of five cents per mile will be paid.
14. That the Committee on Itinerary and Orders decide on those who shall receive the benefits of payment of our Conference Educational Budget.

15. The Secretary of the Canada Conference be the Committee on Credentials, and all Lay Delegates' parchments to the Conference be mailed to him one week previous to the opening session of the Conference.

16. The ex-officio members of the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees of the Corporate Body shall be the Conference President, the Vice-President, the Conference Treasurer, and two elders, namely, the Conference Secretary, and the Wesleyan Youth President if an Elder.

17. The Conference Treaseurer be given \$100 per year, and the Conference Secretary be given \$50 per year for their services.

18. Churches calling pastors are to pay their moving expenses.

19. Churches having business with the Board of Directors and Conference Trustees requiring a visit of that body in their church, shall be responsible for the expense attached to suchcalls, unless released by the Board.

20. That the course in Theology given by the Brockville Bible College, be accepted in lieu of the course of study, or any studies comparable to our studies as outlined in the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.

21. That all reports to the Annual Conference be made out in triplicate. Two copies to be given to the Conference Secretary and one to be retained by the individual reporting.

The Corporate Body of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada convened for its Sixty-third Annual Conference on Silver Lake Camp Ground at Maberly, Ontario on Wednesday July 20, 1960 at 9.00 a.m.

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL REPORT

To the Members of the Sixty-third Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in Canada.

Once again we join the sincere and devoted members of this body in gratitude to God for His many blessings and unquestioned protection and guidance through another fiscal year. Reflection on the past twelve months reveal quite clearly to us that we have not attained all the desired heights but we have under God made progress and have not stood still on the great

battle field of life.

The grace of God and the leadership of the Holy Spirit have made it possible to accomplish things in the plan of the work of God.

All of us as members of the Christian ministry and laymen of the Church are quite aware of the uncertainty that prevails everywhere for a world revolution is on. It seems that from every part of the Church comes the word that things are changing fast and demand a new approach and greater labours. To meet the demands of the day in which we live means that we must become more aggressive on all fronts if we are to fulfill the great Divine Commission that is ours namely: to "Go" with the Gospel message of Salvation from sin, faithfully "serving this present age." It is the prayer of your Conference President that we shall not be hindered in our mission, that of proclaiming the Gospel of Salvation and Scriptural Holiness. It is true that the restlessness in the world tends to make us restless and the insecurity in the world very often affects the peace of the most sincere Christian, yet I firmly believe that His Grace is sufficient for our every need.

Throughout the year, as our official acts will show, we have, under God, endeavoured to carry out the work that was assigned us by last Conference. We have visited all of the churches in one way or another. Some of them have been visited a number of times or as the need arose. Conference work coupled with the parochial duties of the Belleville Church naturally took up most if not all of our time. The coming of the Rev. Nancy White to our assistance the first of November and continuing with us through the year has helped greatly in the office and secretarial work of both church and Conference. I would also make mention of the excellent co-operation given to us by the Vice-President, Rev. R. L. LeRoy, Dr. E. W. Dow, the lay member of the Advisory Board, all Conference officers and officials, and in fact, all my fellow ministers. The task though wearisome at times has been most pleasant and encouraging.

The re-locating of our Church at North Bay with the erection of a new place of worship on McKay Avenue means the addition of another new church building within the bounds of the Conference. Another new parsonage has also been added this year with the erection of a home for the pastor at Brockville. The pastor and congregation on each of these fields deserve credit for the work and sacrifice in bringing to completion these projects.

While we are thankful to God for our many fine churches and parsonages and all that we have from the physical point of view, yet we have been brought to realize more and more that extension work in its purest form is that of following the example of our Lord who went from village to village proclaiming the good news of salvation. The crowds walking to Jerusalem at least time did not take the place of our Lord's going to them in their own villages. Neither can the strong voices of our beautiful city and country churches replace the need of taking the Gospel to outlying areas. Extension is more than bringing the sinner in, it is taking the Gospel out. We dare not omit the first and we must include the second. May God help us in these days of opportunity to meet the present day challenge under the anointing of His Spirit and Power.

RECOMMENDATIONS

1. That we continue to give our wholehearted support to evangelism through the adopted plan of the Conference on Evangelism as Operation Outreach.
2. That we hold a joint Ministerial Fellowship extending an invitation to our fellow pastors of the Pilgrim Holiness and Standard Churches.
3. That we devote ourselves to prayer and fasting for revival and urge our people to join with us.
4. That the camp entertainment budget be raised from thirty cents per

member to one dollar per member and that it be known as Conference and Camp entertainment fund.

REPORT NO. 7

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY

Our Sunday School is our future church. I wonder if we are conscious of it. I have no doubt but what we all know it, but somehow I cannot help but think that during the year our minds never considered this truth. I think this could be expressed as the song writer put it: "I'm a million miles from the gates of light when I'm one little step from God." Somehow I cannot help but think that we are missing the goal and this failure rests with us.

Why do we have Sunday School? To give the lay people something to do? To entertain some children for one hour a week? or do we really want to reach them for Christ. Our desire should be to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord; that they in turn would be Christ filled, full of zeal, willing to do exploits for the Christ and to do all they can to build up the kingdom without complaint. Having a joy welling up and effervescing in their hearts to a foaming expression of Christ's wonderful love.

Is this what the Pastor wants? Do your efforts substantiate your wants? Does your example or efforts in the Sunday School tend to encourage or discourage? We all face times of discouragement but let us not allow God's work to suffer because of it. Was it not Christ who said: Be not weary in well doing? Is God's grace not as sufficient now to sustain, when seemingly everything has gone wrong. Let us not fail our boys and girls; we need them for the future.

From the few reports which were received during the year from the Pastors, I cannot help but agree with Brother Brentlinger in his last years report when he wrote, "It is evident that programming and faithful reporting is not taken too seriously by many of our churches." I suppose because he was a Pastor himself, is the reason why he put it so mildly. I would like to add to his statement that it is shameful. I can readily see now why this post seems to have some sort of disease. Thus no one wants it. The response from many of the Pastors is terrible, giving little response to the Sunday School Department; thus rendering its efforts practically useless. It need not be so. The reports which were received were encouraging however, and a blessing. Many mentioned and expressed the Lord's Presence in their meetings through conversions. One Pastor wrote of a young married man's commitment to the Lord. His wife is the new Sunday School Secretary in their local church and their children are now attending Sunday School. Other wonderful reports of God's spirit have been expressed from various parts of the Conference. How our heart rejoices when we hear and see others finding Christ and especially when they avail themselves of serving God in an official capacity.

Let us work together, pull together, pray together, and win together,

and see the Salvation of the Lord in our Sunday Schools as we put Him first. Christ said in His sermon on the Mount: "But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and His righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you.

REPORT NO. 10.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

1. We recommend that every member of the church; pastor, and people, bear in mind their responsibility to our Wesleyan Heritage for the promotion of our doctrine and teaching, and maintenance of the standards and ethics of life as outlined in the Word of God and in our Church Discipline, that the trend toward materialism and worldliness may be obviated.

2. We recommend that we as a Conference and people, set aside one day each month; preferably the 1st Friday, as a prayer and fast day for the spiritual welfare and revival of our Conference.

total budget receipts paid for each assessed item for each church, sign each pastor's statistical report and mail to the pastor of each charge by June 25. Pastor shall complete this report and mail to the chairman of the statistical committee by July 5.

6. We recommend that one of the organizations of our conference implement a Junior Youth Camp as soon as they deem it feasible.

The closing hymn "A Charge to Keep I Have" was sung and Mrs. Rae Helmer closed with prayer. Offering \$18.61.

The Sunday afternoon service of the Annual Conference was opened with a song service led by the "Youth in One Accord" of Houghton College. They gave us several special messages in song interspersed with testimonies from the group and exhortations on missionary work by Dr. Wells. Dr. Wells led in prayer after which our President, Mrs. Spearman welcomed the assembled congregation. After the singing of a special song, "So Send I You" sung by the Houghton trio, Rev. Ridgeway of Australia, spoke to us from St. John 4: 31-38. He spoke of the needs of funds to carry on our Missionary work on the Foreign Fields. Workers are trained but there is not enough funds to send them. Said Bro. Ridgeway, "Jesus wants us to see the urgency of the need. The plan of God is world missions." An entire State in India went Communist and it was noted that a higher percentage of these were Christians, all because of apathy among Christian people. Christians are on the offensive and we need to pray for our missionaries. In Japan the harvest is nearly lost because of the people going back to their pagan religion.

Speaking of his own country Australia and New Guinea, Bro. Ridgeway, mentioned the fact that false cults are just waiting for permission to spread their false doctrine in New Guinea. Fear rules these heathen people and they worship evil spirits. They do need Jesus and are asking the question, "Why didn't you come sooner?" The harvest truly is overripe. Prayer warriors are needed for our missionaries. He ended with an urgent appeal to consecrate our giving to the Lord and the question, "Are you ready to meet Jesus with the way you have supported the missionary cause?" He appealed to the young people to dedicate their lives to the Lord and several came forward. The Houghton Trio sang, "Where He Leads Me I will Follow" and a verse of "So Send I You" and Dr. Wells closed with a dedicatory prayer.
