MEMORIAL

Rev. Frank H. Harris, Sr., one of our retired ministers of the South Georgia Conference died March 4, 1958, at his home near Odum, Ga., at the age of 69. He was a native of Wayne county.

He began preaching in 1912. He held meetings at Oak Ridge in front of the school, Antioch in Appling County, Piney Grove, and Effie Chapel, Hortense, Mt. Pleasant, and Coffee. He pastored the Wayne Charge for twenty years. He was licensed to preach in 1915. On October 31, 1930, he was ordained at the Hortense Church when Rev. Baker was the Conference President.

At his death, Rev. Harris was serving as a member of the Conference President's Advisory Board, Trustee of the Conference, on the Committee on Itineracy and Elders' Orders, and on the Conference Judiciary Committee. In the 1930's he served four years as Conference President.

The Funeral service was held in the Liberty Church and he was laid to rest in the Liberty Cemetery. His funeral was one of the largest ever held in the county. There were over one thousand people who came. Rev. T. B. Rhodes, Pastor, conducted the funeral. Rev. W. M. Phillippe, Jr., Conference President, preached the message. Rev. Bacon and Rev. Hall, neighboring ministers, also took part in the service. Ministers of the South Georgia Conference, other ministerial friends, and close friends of the deceased served as honorary pallbearers. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Maude B. Harris, six daughters, and one son.

STANDING RULES

1. The Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books two weeks before the opening date of conference, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on the statistical report is desired.

2. The president, after his fourth round of quarterly conferences, shall mail the delegates' credentials to the secretary who shall be the committee on credentials. It shall be his

duty to prepare the roll before conference begins.

3. All persons introduced to the conference shall be given honorary seats with the right to speak on all questions but not to vote.

4. The office expense of the President, Secretary, and the Treasurer shall be paid by the conference. Also all conference supplies shall be purchased by the conference.

5. The secretary and treasurer shall be paid twenty-five

dollars per year for their services.

6. The Conference Treasurer shall be bonded.

7. An abbreviated form of the pastor's statistical report

shall be used for conference reading.

8. The Annual Conference shall elect a Nominating Committee of five, of which one shall be the Conference President, to meet prior to the next annual session and nominate the working committees for the session.

9. The Conference President and the Board of Trustees shall constitute a committee for the Building and Location of

Churches and parsonages.

- 10. Each pastor shall be allowed time out from his duties as pastor to hold two revivals each year if he so desires. The church he serves as pastor shall not withhold his salary while he is absent on such authorized revivals. In case any extra expense is involved in filling the pulpit while the pastor is engaged in such said revival such extra expense shall be paid by the church whose pastor is absent holding the revival.
- 11. All church records shall close the 15th day of June, and all statistical reports shall be sent to the Conference Treasurer by the 20th of June. After his approval, he shall

mail them to the committee on statistics.

- 12. It is the duty of the pastors to look after the insurance of the church and parsonage property. All insurance shall provide for fire, lightning, and tornado. If the church fails to do so upon reasonable effort by the pastor, the conference president shall be notified and he shall take care of such business. A failure upon the part of the pastor shall be a censurable offense.
- 13. This Conference asks that each pastor shall keep a file of his calling list and those connected with the church and Sunday School with names and addresses, the same to be kept for his own work and to be turned over to his successor.
- 14. Each pastor should seek to organize a new class or give his services in a revival meeting to a new or weaker church to help establish it. The church which he pastors should grant him such privileges without censure with full remunerations of salary while in such meeting. The President must serve as co-ordinator and help arrange such meetings.

15. The Conference President shall be the Ashburn Camp Meeting president and chairman of the camp committee, ex-

officio.

Report No. 1

CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of this Sixty-third Annual session of the South Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, greetings in the Name of our All-sufficient Saviour Jesus Christ.

Dear Brethren and Co-laborers in the work of our God. It is wonderful that we are permitted to come together on this great annual occasion with praise and glory unto Christ who has done much for us.

We have met with hard striking attacks from the enemy, but thank God for the Victory. I feel like we are living in the east days and the devil knows his time is short and he is throwing all he has in the heat of the battle.

OUR FOUNDATION

I have sought in the past several years how that our conference might continue to be progressive for the cause of God until Jesus comes. In building a conference or church is like building a large building that is to be serviceable for years to come. You must have a good foundation. The type of foundation is laid out for us in God's word. Then again we read in Psalms 11:3, "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?"

If we destroy the old faundation that was given to us by God and our fathers what can we do? I feel we need the old paths, the rugged uncompromising truth, taking a definite stand against sin. Bickering, backbiting, and sour religion comes about by failing to get sanctified Holy. Preach the truth, be instant in season and out of season. This is the foundation to build upon.

Brethren, if we build upon this foundation we need not worry about our church bringing in the things of the world to keep its doors open. There will be a spirit of prayer and a passion for souls. We have a responsibility to those of our community. There are 36 million young people out of the church in America today. One out of every 125,000 will be saved after 25 years of age. Juvenile crime waves are greater than ever before. Who is to blame? Not the dance hall, beer garden, or the pool rooms etc.. Some say it might be parent delinquency, but I am wondering if it couldn't be Church delinquency. Has your church failed to win the young people of your community to God? Have they been your concern? If we go after them while they are young and tender with a developing mind, forming habits, then we can save them. It is our responsibility to train them to love the church and be interested in their salvation, while they are young. If they are taught the way of God and some one becomes interested in their life they will not want to go to the places of sin. Has Your Church been Delinguent?

"If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous do?" If we want our church to be on fire for God and not drift into worldliness and indifference as many have done in these last days, we must establish our children and young people in the things of God. They will soon be our teachers, preachers, leading laymen, missionaries, and

conference president. You train them the way you want

them to lead our church in years to come.

When we fail to preach the truth and be fervent in our church work, and fail to hold strictly to our book of discipline and keep the anointing of God upon our souls then we have failed. We then become like many others, "the form of Godliness, but denying the power thereof."

My soul yearns to see an Old Fashion Revival in our entire conference, that every church may be aglow for God. But "If the foundations be destroyed, what can the righteous

do?"

The Wesleyan Methodist Church is the only denomination in America that has held up its original doctrine with out compromise over such a long period of time. Brethren, what are we going to do with it? I propose that we arise out of our little nest and seek God's will for us and buckle on the armor of God a little tighter and go out to battle against sir.

W. Y. PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Report of W. Y. President to Annual Convention on July 7, 1958.

Numerous responsibilities tend to lessen effectiveness but we have met the Youth challenge with a glad heart in spite of limitations. Eight district rallies were held this year with an average attendance of 83. On the agreed two to one ratio, Ashburn District took the gold star three out of four times and had an average of 65 for the year as compared with 101 in the Hortense District.

We fear that the Quarterly reports have not been as effective in promoting the work as we had hoped. Special mention, however, goes to the Brunswick W.Y. with an average of 95% for the year's work.

The new youth building for our camp has taken much of my time this year. I have traveled 1,740 miles in fund raising efforts that we might build. Over \$600.00 has been raised to date; and excluded from this amount is \$73.70 taken for travel expense. The building, of aluminum, concrete and wood construction houses 20 boys and has a separate room for the counselor.

The Senior Youth Camp of July, 1957 gave great promises and encouragement. The registration was about 30. Interest and deportment were good; many commendable comments were received.
