Another year has gone and we are another year nearer
our eternal home. There have been trials but there
have been victories also. We have endevored to keep

The world has been and is in a terrible uproar but God is still on the throne and is working His purpose out. I gave Rev. D.C. Elmer a transfer to the Iowa Conference and Floyd Titus a transfer to the Indiana Conference. I received the Elders Transfer of the Rev. G. M. Hahn from the Kansas Conference to the Wisconsin Conference. I appointed Rev. H.H.Turner to the Beulah charge. I expect to be loyal to my Church, my Conference and to my Lord and do my best to fit in to His plan.

Because of the condition that now prevail in Japan, the properties were sold and the Churches are being continued by the natives.

The South American work is now being investigated and we hope, before long to find the right place to begin a work there.

Bro. McLiester said he was greatly interested in Home Missions and Church Extension and told how many churches have been organized and built through the sacrificing efforts of Rev. & Mrs. Hamppe. He told of others who by sacrifice were instrumental in building churches and called it "Investing in Heaven."

His grandfather built a little log church in which Bro. Campbell, himself, Oneda Gleason and Joe Clawson were saved, showing how, sometimes, a small investment yields largely and asked us all to invest with God by helping with Church Extension.

- 2. The annual convention program is to be planned by the Executive Comm. and officers.
- 3. Dues, 50¢ per year, per member, to be divided thus: 20¢ W.Y.P.S. Conference work. 20¢ Education. 10¢ Church Extension. Dues to be sent in to the Conference Treas. not later than July 1.
- 4. Wisconsin W.Y.P.S. to be divided into two districts the Northern and the Southern.
- 5. There is to be at least two conventions held in each district, during the year.
- 6. Officers of each district to be elected at the first convention of the Conference year. District officers to serve for a term of one year.

- 7. Suggested that the W.Y.P.S. Conference President visit the local societies this fall and also the district conventions. That he encourage the taking of offerings for Church Extension, pledges for Conference worker and subscriptions to the "Journal". Also that the Area President be contacted in regards to meeting with the Wisconsin Young People at the district convention.
- 8. The District officers shall be; Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer, these three to act as program committee to arrange programs for their own districts, cooperating with the Conf. W.Y.P.S. Pres. Time and place of the conventions to be arranged by the districts.
- 9. Pledges and offerings to be taken in at least one convention in each district. (Fall convention suggested) for the annual work and workers.
- 10. During the first month of wach Conf. year, each Society send in \$1.00 to the Genl. Treas. Rev. F. R. Eddy, to be used for promotion work of the Society.
- 11. Please read Article # 398 in the Wesleyan Discipline, "The Local Society", at the annual business meeting of the society.
- 12. Motion carried that there be a Gospel Team in each district and and that each team hold two revivals a year. Motion amended: That the appointing of Gospel Teams and plans for special services in new places, be left in the hands of the Gospel Team Comm., consisting of; Lester Puckman, Wilma Bakke, and Rev. Clawson. A list of names was submitted to the Comm. from which to choose teams.
- 13. Resolved: That Wisconsin Young People of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, strive to win Wisconsin for God.
