# REPORT OF COMMITTEES

## Report No. 1

# OHIO CONFERENCE PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Your President entered immediately on the discharge of his duties and has continued through the year. This has been a year of much blessing and grace. The blessing of the Lord has rested on the work of the Conference. The Quarterly meetings have been times of refreshing. I have held five revival meetings and have paid especial attention to the weaker churches and to such as have been left without pastorial care. The Conference has been able to continue its work in Dayton and that church is in a prosperous condition. That the future hope of the Conference depends on our development of Conference Missions, is without question. Many open doors are before us and can be entered and churches organized and maintained if the proper support can be secured. Our rural population is drifting to the centers of population and employment and we are forced to follow or to loose a large portion of the fruits of our labor.

The financial support of the Traveling President has been the most regular and best since the inauguration of the plan. I have received, as was shown by the Treasurer's report, \$1164.83. The moral support and loyal cooperation of our people has been all that could be desired.

My official actions have been few. In March of this year, I received the resignation of Rev. R. C. Crossman as pastor of the Africa church. June 25, I transferred Rev. L. L. Folger and Rev. Anna K. Folger to the Ind. Conference. At the same time, I sanctioned the arrangement whereby Rev. G. W. Calhoun became the pastor of Africa church for the remainder of the year. August 3, I gave Rev. Jennie Miskimens a letter of standing.

#### Report No. 2

#### RESOLUTIONS

Where as: Certain rumors have been rampant in the city of

Zanesville, O. concerning the attitude of the Ohio Conference toward the Park St. Wesleyan Methodist church and Whereas: we believe that the rumors have been started and circulated with malicious intent to alienate that society from this conference and turn it toward the S. Ohio Conference. Therefore be it Resolved, That this Conference go on record as serving notice on all men, that the Park St, Church is held in the same high esteem and love as is any other church in our body. Farther, we likewise desire to assert that any imputation that either officers or members of the Ohio Conference are prejudiced against Park Street Church on account of racial prejudices is unfounded and false and that we not only desire this church to recognize our brotherly attitude toward them but that we desire them to know that they are both a welcome and desirable part of our Conference organization. We also by rising vote this day not only express these sentiments to them but serve notice on all such organizations as may seek, for selfish reasons to alienate this church, that we will love, serve and to the full extent of our Disciplinary rights protect this church from all encroachments of other conferences and organizations. More over we deplore the fact that it has been necessary for us to carry on for years a defensive campaign against a sister Conference for the protection of our territorial rights, and that we now publicly and in the light of a recent General Conference decision, call on the South Ohio Conference to fully carry out the provision of that body in relation to the continued campaign which has been waged for the purpose of alienating the Park Street Church and transferring it to the S. Ohio Conference.

# COMMITTEE ON YOUNG PEOPLE'S WORK

We, the Committee on Young People's Work, beg leave to submit the following recommendations:

- 1. We recommend the election of a Conference Executive Committee on Young People's Work;
- 2. We recommend that each pastor urge and supervise the organization of a W. M. Y. P. S. on the respective charges;
- 3. We recommend the division of the Conference into two districts on an east and west line passing south of Fargo;
- 4. We recommend that Rev. L. A. Smothers be the temporary chairman of the Northern District.

- 5. We recommend that Rev. G. W. Calhoun be the temporary chairman of the Southern District.
- 6. We recommend that one day be set apart during our Annual Conference each year for the Annual Convention of the W. M. Y. P. S., and that the various pastors and District Executive Committees, together with the Conference Executive Committee, look forward to and prepare for this convention;
- 7. We recommend that the Constitution and By-Laws, as they appeared in the July 22 issue of the Wesleyan Methodist be carefully read in each society.
- 8. We recommend the holding of a District Convention in each District sometime before January 1, 1928.

# Report No. 5

#### SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The Sunday School Board wish to make the following recommendations:

1. That the Sunday School Superintendents and the pastors of the different churches keep constantly before the schools the provisions of the Standards set by the Connectional Sunday School Department.

2. That more attention be given to special days, such as Decision Day, Missionary Day, Rally Day and that special effort be put forth

through the year to enlarge our Sunday Schools.

3. That each member of the Sunday School Board be made responsible for the holding of Rallies and conventions in the districts as follows: Southern District, Miss Rogers; Central District, Wortha Springs; Northwestern District, W. E. Ballinger.

4. That the different Schools have a special Rally Day, at which time, if possible, some member of the Sunday School Board be called in to present plans and methods for better Sunday School work.

5. That each pastor make a special effort to get "The Sunday School Transformed" by Louis Entzminger into the hands of his Sun-

day School workers for reading.

6. That reports and comparisons of the attainments of the different Schools of the Conference be sent by the Conference Sunday School Secretary to the Wesleyan Methodist quarterly.

7. That each School of the Conference be assessed ten cents per member exclusive of Cradle Roll and Home Departments, for Con-

ference and Connectional Sunday School work.

8. That the funds so raised be divided equally—one half of which shall be sent to Brother Willett to satisfy the Connectional February appeal of five cents per member, and one half of which shall be used for developing the Sunday School work of the Conference under the direction of the Sunday School Board.
