FIRST MEETING, TUESDAY 11:00 A. M.

AUGUST 8, 1961

The Fifty-Second Annual Session of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle of the camp grounds at Camp Eden, St. Clair County, Alabama at 11:00 A. M. August 8, 1961.

Devotional service was conducted by V. O. Agan. Song service was directed by G. B. Vernon, Jr. Rev. E. L. Shigley, Sr. led in prayer.

Conference sermon was preached by Rev. A. C. Clemens, pastor of the East Lake Church. He made observations of "Effective Gospel Message", using several Scripture passages, exhorting the preaching of a 'productive Gospel' as the one great need of our day. Service was closed with a song by Mrs. A. C. Clemens and a season of prayer was observed around the altar.

Vice-President called to chair to hear the reading of the President's report. Report was read and adopted subject to report of Auditing Committee's report. (Report No. 2)

The Wesleyan Youth Conference presented the names of those nominated as their Officials for next conference year. By vote they were approved. By vote, E. L. Crowe was placed on Committee on Thanks in place of Roy Hayes.

E. L. Shigley, Jr. offered his resignation as chairman of Committee on Ways and Means. Resignation was accepted and authorization given to the Committee to elect its own chairman.

Adjourned for Committee work at 3:20 P. M.

REPORT NO. II**PRESIDENT'S REPORT 1961**

Greetings to Rev. Robert Lytle, to Every Pastor, Lay-Delegate, and Visitor. I want to greet you in the Name that is above every name - Jesus, the Son of God.

We have assembled for this fifty-second session of the Alabama Conference. I am sure that we come with a deep sense of our utter dependence upon the Lord, that we have come to report the work that was assigned to us, and to make plans for the uncertain future. The accounting of our stewardship to God is a humbling experience, since we are unprofitable servants. He has helped all of us so many times in the past year, that we are assured anew that He will give us help for the task that we now come to. We come praying that a spirit of unity will prevail, and also an awakening of our responsibilities to the whitened harvest field. Across the Church, the nation, and the world we are deeper in uncertainties than ever before. Would it not please the Lord and us, to clarify our vision so that our future would not be clouded with so many uncertainties; and that we may be filled with the Holy Ghost and Faith.

ACTIVITIES

I have endeavored to preach 281 times.
Quarterly Conferences held 79.
Other services attended 90.

I have been treasurer of the Wesleyan Insurance Fund, I was co-worker in the Pioneer revival at Sylacauga, was guest speaker at the Ohio Ministerial Institute, attended the Ala. Ministerial Institute, attended the board meetings of the following — Church Extension, Trustees, Camp meeting, Wesleyan Youth, Board of Trustees at Central College, attended the Southern Area Leaders' conference at Central, met with many local boards of stewards, and advised with them, held many private consultations, edited the Alabama Wesleyan, helped in one baptismal service, dedicated several children, served communion many times, attended the Wesleyan Youth Camp and taught a class, attended the Alabama Conference Camp meeting, have performed two weddings, and four funerals, correspondence has been heavy the entire year, dedicated the Stanton Church, and East Lake Sunday School annex, attended the Leaders' Conference at Marion Indiana, and read the Scripture at the dedication of Wesleyan World Headquarters, attended one week of Hobe Sound Camp (vacation time), I have held two week-end meetings outside the conference and some week, or less time meetings in the conference and from the proceeds above my allotted time I have sent in \$196.50 to the Conference Treas., for Conference Funds. I have also served as best possible at Norwood, since the pastor there resigned — I have urged them to send in all possible on the budget since I did not receive any remuneration for the services rendered there.

I have striven to do those things which seemed best, but as I look backward I see some things that could have been done differently with profit. You have been so kind and good; your prayers, and smiles have helped when the load seemed somewhat difficult. You are a wonderful people to labor with and among. Thanks to Rev. E. L. Shigley, Sr. and Mr. W. O. Finnen, my advisory Board for their counsel and help throughout the year.

OFFICIAL ACTION

August 25, 1960 At the request of Elder Billy Karanick, I gave a letter of Dismissal, and recommendation to the Church of the Nazarene.

September 23, 1960 On the vote of the Nixon Chapel Church, and the directive of the Pastoral Relations Committee, I appointed Rev. V. W. Owens as pastor — the advisory Board approving. He was reinstated to his Conference relationship.

- October 2, 1960 On the Vote of the Norwood Church and the Advisory Board approving I appointed Rev. James DeMint as pastor of Norwood. His actual transfer from the Pilgrim Holiness Church was never fully made, and on May 23, 1961 I received his resignation from the Norwood Church.
- October 16, 1960 Organized Sylacauga Church, Advisory Board approving.
- November 14, 1960 I granted a letter of dismissal to Elder Eugene D. Smith, at his request, from the Alabama Conference, and gave him a letter of recommendation to the Congregational Church in Key West, Fla.
- March 5, 1961 Dedicated East Lake Sunday School Annex.
- June 11, 1961 Dedicated Stanton Church.
- April 23, 1961 In harmony with the Congregation of Sylacauga, and the advisory Board, I placed Rev. Billy Smith in charge of the work.

MATERIAL PROGRESS

Nixon Chapel has added some new Sunday School Rooms, and have them paid for.

Sylacauga — is now Brick veneering the Church.

East Lake — constructed and dedicated a new Sunday School annex.

West Blocton — has added bath room to their parsonage.

Greensboro — has installed rest rooms in the church.

Montgomery — the interior of the Sanctuary has been redecorated.

Tarrant — Now out of rented property - they have purchased two nice lots, with a building that is adequate until plans can be made for new building.

FINANCIAL

The Treasurers report will show that this has been a very difficult year financially. While the economic conditions have seemed somewhat unfavorable, yet it appears that all our financial trouble is not altogether in that area of economics. We will need to give attention to an effort in the field of finances.

PROSPECTS

Alabama is a great field, and a needy field, with many prospects that need immediate attention. We have the message, and the field. If God Almighty could get to us with the New Testament vision and help us to comprehend our opportunities - we would see that our field is un-

limited. We have the potential finances, and if the vision was strong enough to compel sacrifices of energy, and finances we could spread the message of real Holiness with a Scriptural Standard through our domain of this conference.

I would desire to recommend that prayer bands be raised up across the Conference for the purpose of intercessory prayer in this drifting day. God is our only hope, and help. I am fearful that if we miss the next few years that our field which is now ripe unto harvest, will be beyond the stage of rich harvest.

6. That we depart from every practice that would prove in any way to be a stumbling block to others or would in any way lead others toward the world.

7. That we despise the damning influence of liquor and tobacco traffic and the narcotic trade.

8. That we defend and exalt the truth of the Gospel by holy and exemplary living in all avenues of life, that we may thus glorify God before a world which lies in heathen darkness.

9. That our pastors and people inform themselves as to the subtle approach and destructive results of the political philosophy of Communism and Roman Catholicism, pray for our national leaders to have wisdom and courage to fight against their efforts to gain dictatorial powers over our nation, and support congressional committees who are engag-

REPORT NO. XI
WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE

We, Your Committee on Ways and Means offer the following recommendations:

I. That the budget be set as follows: Conference Items, President's Salary, Conference Missions, Conference Work, and Pastor's Sick Benefit Fund be combined and known as Conf. Budget Fund, and that the assessment for this fund be \$6.50 per member from all churches. That there be an assessment of \$1.50 per member for Conference Parsonage and that five cents per member of school be assessed for Conference Sunday School Work. That the General Budget be: World Missions, \$2.00; Australia, 25 cents; Brainerd, Indian School, 25 cents; Church Extension and Evangelism, \$1.50; Superannuate pension plan, \$2.00; Church Administration Fund \$1.00; General Conference Expense and Entertainment, 50 cents; Board Meeting Expense, 25 cents; Hephzibah Home, 35 cents; General Sunday School, 20 cents per member (based on total number of members in main school); Education \$3.00. We further recommend that each church pay the travel and registration expense of pastor and delegates to Annual Conference.

II. We recommend that the Conference President be paid a salary of \$3,600.00 with \$750.00 for travel, plus all utilities, from Conference Work Fund, and that he devote full time to administration and promotional duties of his office. We recommend, further, that he be permitted to keep the receipts from two revivals during the year. All other monies received from local churches and revivals (except personal gifts) above the two revivals permitted, be turned into the Conference Work Fund.

III. That the matter of development of pioneer fields be given special attention: That the President take a survey of prospective new fields and report his findings to the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism of the Conference with plans and recommendations for development of same, and that the board make provisions for execution of such plans as it may approve.

If, and when, it is thought that the need justifies it, a Conference Pioneer Evangelist may be engaged by the Conference or by the Board of Church Extension, to labor under the instructions of that Board.

IV. We recommend that the Rally Day offering be sent in to the Conference Treasurer to apply on the Conference President's home, and that it be given Budget Credit.

V. We recommend that for promotional activities the Conference continue the division into five districts the same as last year.

VI. That new churches facing a financial struggle be assessed only twenty-five percent of the regular conference budget for the first two years.

VII. That item 2 of the Standing Rules of the Conference be amended to harmonize with this report.

REPORT NO. XII CHURCH EXTENSION AND EVANGELISM

The Board has held five meetings during the year. The following business was transacted:

1. Motion Rev. E. L. Shigley, Sr. be elected Secretary of Pioneer Evangelism. His salary was set at \$25.00 per week for the time engaged plus six cent per mile travel expense.

2. Motion - The property known as Emmanuel Baptist Church of Sylacauga be purchased for \$4,500.00. A down payment of \$1,500.00, and the balance to paid as follows: \$500.00 the first year, \$1,000.00 for the two succeeding years and \$500.00 in 1964 completing the payments at 5½ % interest.

Motion - The Sylacauga Trust Fund be applied to down payment, with the provision to borrow from the Jackson fund the amount needed to complete the down payment interest free, with notes on same made to the conference.

Motion - Funds for repairs be secured under note, interest free, from the Jackson fund.

3. Motion - That prices for printing 300 copies of the Conference Minutes be secured from the Centreville Press and from the Pell City Press.

4. Motion - That we approve the purchase of property for the Tarrant City Church if finance can be arranged for by the local church. This to be approved by a committee which will represent the conference Trustees and the Church Extension Board.

5. Motion - That the Rally Day offering from the Sunday School be applied on the Conference President's Parsonage. This amount to be applied on assigned budget.

6. Motion - That a committee be appointed to survey the field for

a second church at Tuscaloosa and the recommendation of this committee be reported to the Church Extension Board.

STANDING RULES AND RESOLUTIONS

1. Opening of Conference. Annual Conference will begin on the first Tuesday after the first Sunday in August. All meetings open at 8:45 A.M. except the opening day of conference and that at 11:00 A.M.

2. Conference President. The Conference President be required to hold or provide for the holding of the first and fourth quarterly meetings or conferences of the churches, and that he encourage the pastors to arrange for the observance of the communion of the Lord's Supper on these occasions when possible, and to meet with the board of stewards and advise with them relative to proper support of pastors and methods for raising the Conference and General Budget. That time not required for holding quarterly meetings and in general official duties of the Conference President, he be engaged in pioneer and church extension work within the bounds of the conference, under the direction of the Missionary Board. Proper remuneration for such services to be provided for by the Missionary Board. It is advised, however that he spend approximately one week of each month in relaxation, meditation and planning.

3. Committee Reports. All reports of committees shall be made in writing and handed to the secretary at the adoption by the conference.

4. Sunday School. Sunday School shall be held at the camp on Sunday of the camp meeting and those attending the camp ground groups will be counted as attending in their respective churches. That all Sunday Schools under the supervision of Wesleyan pastors be counted in

their statistical reports.

5. Quarterly Conference Reports. All treasurer's books shall be audited quarterly and all treasurers shall give a written report of all receipts and disbursements at each quarterly conference.

6. Credentials. Each annual conference preacher, shall present his credentials at each annual conference session for renewal and proper signature. Paragraph 170 subdivision 2 of the Book of Discipline 1959 Edition shall be adhered to in renewing authorizations of annual conference preachers.

7. Illness or Death. The secretary shall be notified by telephone in case of critical illness or death in a minister's home and he shall mail notices at once to each pastor.

8. Financial Year. The financial and statistical year of each church shall close with June 30th each year and all receipts and budget money be mailed to the Conference Treasurer not later than July 15th with a completed pastor's report.

All pastor's reports not in hands of the Statistical Committee by the first day of conference shall be omitted from the Statistical Report.

9. Ministerial Labors. The pastor's labors shall terminate with the Sunday following the close of the annual conference session.

10. Moving Pastor. Each church shall make provisions for the moving of the incoming pastor, either by paying moving expenses or providing way to move him.

11. Vacation. The Conference President and all pastors shall be given a two weeks vacation with pay, with one Sunday absent from their pulpit.

Also that the pastor have the privilege of holding two revival meetings each year, as arranged between him and the church.

12. Conference Entertainment. Each member and each visitor to the annual conference above 12 years of age shall be required to pay \$2.50 for entertainment purposes, and children between the ages of 6 and 12 shall pay \$1.25.

13. Trustees. (A) Buying Church Property.

All property purchased by a local congregation shall be taken in the name of the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, a corporation doing business in the State of Alabama.

The following paragraph shall be inserted in every deed, "That this property is taken in the name of the Alabama Conference exclusively for the benefit of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, subject to the direction of the local Board of Trustees with the pastor and the Annual Conference with its Board of Trustee."

If the said local church shall cease to exist as an organized Wesleyan Methodist Church, the conference, at the direction of the Presi-

dent and his Advisory Board, with the approval of two-thirds of the conference Board of Trustees, either separately or in session, shall have authority to do as it deems advisable in the local situation, and if any money is received from the sale of said property, it shall be used as Conference Mission Fund to establish another new church.

(B) Mortgaging Church Property.

1. Resolved that the Conference Trustees be empowered and requested to sign and execute a mortgage in behalf of any local church or church group. When the said church or church group shall request it at a business meeting announced at each regular meeting for at least 8 days prior to the meeting and further providing that at least two-thirds of the eligible local church voters are favorable. A copy of the said minutes of the local meeting shall be presented to the conference trustees together with a suitable mortgage properly drawn up for their approval and signatures.

2. The local church property only shall be security for the mortgage in question.

(C) Selling Church property

Resolved that if at any time the local church, at a public business meeting which has been announced by the chairman of the local Board of Trustees at each public meeting for at least 8 days previously, shall if a two-thirds vote of the eligible voting membership, desire to sell, transfer, or trade the local church property, or any part thereof, that a copy of the minutes of this meeting be presented to the Chairman of the Annual Conference Trustees together with a warranty deed properly drawn and that they take into consideration the request together with the deed and if there is no moral issue involved, they shall sign the deed and thus convey a clear title to the said property.

14. Marriage. No minister may perform a marriage involving a divorcee except in cases where thorough investigation reveals that the divorce has been on scriptural grounds. This does not prohibit the remarrying of persons who have been divorced from each other.

15. Resolved that we, the Alabama Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, declare our opposition to the present trend of drift toward worldliness as evidenced by the mad rush for earthly possessions, the immodesty in dress, such as wearing of Slacks, Sleeveless dresses, shorts and other apparel which do not conform to scriptural standards of decency, and the adorning of the body with jewelry and rings, including the wedding ring, and the practice of wearing short hair among the women. We, therefore, do earnestly request that all our local churches comply with this expressed standard. It shall be the duty of our pastors and ministers to support this standard rule.

16. The Alabama Conference believes that the use of the wedding ring ceremony in holy matrimony and the wearing of the wedding ring

is a violation of both Scriptural admonition and our Book of Discipline. We do hereby voice our opposition to this practice and sincerely request the ministers of the Alabama Conference to refrain from conducting such weddings. We request that this rule be considered by the Committee on Ministerial Character before the Ministerial Character blanks are endorsed.

Be it further resolved that no one be asked to preside over our conference sessions that is not in harmony with this Rule and Rule 15.

17. In the judgment of the Alabama Conference, viewing television programs of the type commonly offered in response to the public clamor for entertainment, is an impediment to the development of holy character. We deplore the current television programs' evil effects upon the moral and spiritual life of the Nation. The principles of Wesleyan Methodism — being the epitome of the Christian religion — obligates Wesleyan Methodists to an unblamable life which constantly rebukes every form of evil and zealously advocates holiness of heart and life. Therefore we must request our ministers and members, as those who must give an account unto God in the Day of Judgment for anything which tends to influence toward evil, to refrain from the purchase of television sets and from viewing such programs for Jesus' sake.

Since Paragraph 39 of the Discipline declares: "It is the duty of all ministers and members of the church to maintain godliness and to oppose all moral evil." And since ministers, especially, are examples and patterns to the flock of Christ, the Alabama Conference expects each of its ministers to set a wholesome example and to be a godly pattern in this respect, so that those to whom he ministers will follow his example and avoid this which menaces vital godliness.

Inasmuch as this resolution expresses the will of the Wesleyan Methodists of Alabama, in Conference assembled, and inasmuch as the Ministers of the Alabama Conference are obligated to comply with each of the Standing Rules of the Conference (See paragraph 141, section V, subsection 4) we request that this rule be considered by the Committee on Ministerial Character before the Ministerial Character blanks are endorsed.

18. Be it resolved that each district of the conference be represented on the nominating committee of the conference.

Be it further resolved that no member except the Conference President shall be eligible to succeed himself on the committee. The conference president shall be co-chairman.

19. When the Conference President is elected Editor of the Alabama Wesleyan, he is to be granted the privilege of choosing the Business Manager of the paper.
