JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, 1:30 p.m.

The Tennessee Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened for its twenty-third annual session on the Camp Ground at 1:30 p.m., Tuesday, July 8, 1952.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. D. P. Denton. Rev. A. L. Lowrance led in prayer. Roll was called with 12 Elders, 7 Conference Preachers and 24 Delegates responding. (See Roll). Mrs. J. C. Tolley, Mrs. Eileen Young and Mrs. J. A. Cassady were seated as Alternate Delegates.

It was voted that the first five seats and the space forward be made the Conference Bar. By vote, the Rev. R. S. Nicholson, Rev. H. L. Baker and Rev. L. D. Wilcox were seated as Honorary Delegates.

The following were elected as a Nominating Committee: C. F. Smith, Chairman, M. L. Arnold, N. C. Hoggle, A. L. Lowrance, Thomas Hampton. The committee was excused for work.

At the request of Rev. W. T. McMahan, he was granted a letter of transfer, to be effective at the close of this annual session.

The Chairman introduced Rev. L. D. Wilcox, College Pastor of Central College, who spoke in behalf of both the spiritual and educational interests of the College.

The hours of business were fixed as follows: Convene at 8 a.m., and close at 10:30 a.m. for the Religious Service. Re-convene at 1:30 p.m. and adjourn at 4:30 p.m. Meals to be served at 7 a.m., 12 noon and 5 p.m.

The time for Special Orders of the Day was set as follows: Election of Officers, Wednesday, 9 a.m.; Conference Sermon, Wednesday, 10:30 a.m.,; General Address, Thursday, 10:30 a.m.; Memorial Service, Thursday, 2:30 p.m.; Ordination Service, Friday, 10:30 a.m. It was voted that the business meeting of the Camp Meeting Association to be the first item of business on Friday morning following devotions.

The Rev. C. F. Smith, Vice-President, was called to the Chair, and the President presented a series of Resolutions to the Conference. Voted that these recommendations be passed on to the Resolutions Committee.

The Conference President read his annual report. (See Report 1). Report accepted with a rising vote of thanks. Adjourned for committee work.

Wednesday, 8 a.m.

Conference called to order by the President. Roll called. Mrs. John Greene and Cas Hamilton seated as Delegates. Minutes for previous session read. Voted to have one reading of Minutes daily.

The Courtesy Committee presented the Rev. R. S. Nicholson, General Representative, who gave words of greeting.

The Prohibition Committee read its report. Adopted. (See Report 2). The Auditing Committee gave its report, stating that the books of the Conference Treasurer and the Superannuated Pension Fund Treasurer had been audited and found in order. Report adopted.

The President nominated and the Conference elected Mrs. Wayts Music, Samuel Harmon and Michael Houser as lay members on the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.

The Treasurer of the Superannuated Pension Fund read his report. Adopted. (See Report 3).

The Conference Treasurer read his report, which was adopted with a rising vote of thanks. (See Report 4).

Chair called for Orders of the Day. Rev. R. S. Nicholson, General Representative, was called to the Chair and Officials and Standing Committees were elected. (See page of Conference Officials). Recessed until Orders of the Day.

The time for Orders of the Day arrived, and the Committee on Religious Service took charge. The Conference Sermon was preached by the Rev. Edward Schade. He brought a helpful and heart-searching message on "The Church and its Ministry," using as his scripture Matthew 16:18 and Philippians 1:17.

Voted that N. C. Hoggle serve as an additional member on the Committee on Character. Voted that the Conference Vice-President preside over the Pastoral Relations Committee. Adjourned.

Wednesday, 1:30 p.m.

Conference called to order by the new President, Rev. M. L. Arnold. Roll called. R. S. Nicholson was called to the Chair for the completion of electing Standing Committees.

The President nominated and the Conference elected N. C. Hoggle, Ministerial, and Gene Turner, Layman, as his Advisory Board.

Recessed ten minutes for Committee work. Following recess, General Orders were called. Voted that Pastors read only specified items on their statistical reports. Following pastors reported: J. V. Smith, Thomas Hampton, Edward Schade, A. C. Clemens, C. K. Crawley, Charles Haire (Bristol and Mendota), C. E. Harwell (Rockdale and Freedom Hill), W. L. Scarborough, C. E. Irby (Corinth and Liberty), O. H. Crabb, J. T. DeArmond, H. A. Harvey, J. F. Biddle. (Report read by J. V. Smith.) Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction, C. E. Irby.

Thursday, 8 a.m.

Devotions by A. C. Clemens. Roll called. Mrs. Jim Young seated as alternate delegate for H. A. Harvey. Minutes read. The Committee on Courtesy introduced Mrs. Cockrell, C. E. Irby and Rev. Douglas Heffner, who gave words of greeting.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading. The Rev. R. S. Nicholson was called to the Chair and General Orders resumed. Following pastors reported: R. E. Rice, Earl Seibers, W. G. Harwell, L. C. Elbell, D. P. Denton, C. F. Smith, M. L. Arnold, N. C. Hoggle, A. L. Lowrance, W. T. McMahan, H. A. Harvey, Mildred Thomas, Mrs. Frances Palmer.

Rev. H. A. Harvey, Elder, requested that his name be placed on the retirement list of Superannuated Ministers. Voted that his request be received and referred to the proper committees for recommendations.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders read its report. Adopted. (See Report 5).

Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. and Mrs. G. E. Davis, of Hephzibah Orphanage, Mrs. Essie Brookshire, and Mrs. C. E. McMahan. Each spoke words of greeting.

The Committee on Religious Services gave its report. Adopted. (See Report 6).

Voted that the first item of business after the Roll Call in the afternoon session be the reading of the report of the Committee on Resolutions.

Recessed until Orders of the Day.

Orders of the Day under Chairman of Religious Services. Rev. R. S. Nicholson brought the General Address, speaking on the subject, "The Ideal Wesleyan Methodist Church," basing his message on I Thess. 1:5-7. Motion carried that we, as a Conference, express to Brother Nicholson, and through him to all of our General Officials, the loyal support and cooperation of the Tennessee Conference. Adjourned.

Thursday, 1:30 p.m.

Conference called to order. Roll called. Voted that following the reading of the report of the Committee on Resolutions, debates be limited to two minutes for each speaker, and only those having authority be allowed to speak.

Committee on Resolutions read its report. Adopted. (See Resolutions).

The W. M. S. read its statistical report, which was adopted with a rising vote of thanks. (See W. M. S. Minutes).

The Statistical Committee read its report. Adopted. See statistical report.

The Apportionment Committee read its report. Adopted as amended. (See Report No. 7.)

Memorial Service, 2:30 p.m.

The Memorial Service was conducted by Rev. J. A. Cassady. Rev. and Mrs. W. T. McMahan sang "The Day Without A Cloud." Rev. C. K. Crawley led in prayer. Rev. Charles Haire paid due reverence and respect to the life and memory of Mrs. Lizzie Smith, of Bristol; Rev. N. C. Hoggle, to that of Robert Allen, of Knoxville, and Rev. D. P. Denton to that of Willard Milton, of Clinton.

Business was resumed. Committe on Courtesy presented Rev. W. L. Manuel, who spoke words of greeting.

Recessed to call of the Chair.

Friday, 8 a.m.

Devotions by C. E. Irby. Roll Called. Minutes read. Orders of the Day arrived. Motion carried that the time be extended for presenting the interests of our Orphanage. Rev. and Mrs. G. E. Davis brought out many interesting facts regarding Hephzibah Home and their needs.

Services were turned over to the Camp Meeting Association, when Camp Meeting interests were considered.

Recessed until Orders of the Day.

Orders of the Day arrived and the Ordination Service was held, when Rev. A. C. Clemens was ordained to the office of Elder in the Wesleyan Methodist Church. The Ordination sermon was preached by the Rev. R. S. Nicholson, his text being "The Magnitude of the Ministerial Office," Scripture, Romans 11:13. At the conclusion of the Ordination Service, a brief consecration service was held for Mrs. Clemens, and the service was concluded with the dedication of the Clemens' infant son, Stephen Gwin.

Conference called to order. Motion carried that there be an extension of time for the reading of the Pastoral Relations Committee. The Pastoral Relations Committee gave its second reading. Adjourned.

Friday, 1:30 p.m.

Conference called to order. Roll called. Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. Richard Boswell, who spoke words of greeting.

The Committee on Boundaries read its report. Adopted. (See Report 8). The W. Y. P. S. President read his annual report. Miss

June Blackburn, W. P. P. S. Treasurer, read the statistical report. (See in W. Y. P. S. Minutes). Reports adopted.

The Conference W. Y. P. S. President read the following petition: "We petition our Annual Conference to make our Youth Camp a permanent yearly camp. The time each year to be set by the Young People's Council in accord with the Annual Conference President."

Voted that this petition be accepted.

The Sunday School Board read its report. Adopted. (See Report 9). The Sunday School Banner was awarded to the Knoxville First Church for the last quarter. Voted that pastors cooperate with the Sunday School Board in sending in their quarterly Sunday School reports.

The Vice-President was called to the Chair and the President expressed his views regarding a parsonage for the Conference President. Motion carried that the Conference Board of Trustees be authorized to make investigation with regard to the possibilities of securing a lot and building this parsonage. Voted that the Conference Board of Trustees be authorized to secure a loan, if necessary, for this purpose. Voted that the Conference make provisions for paying the Conference President's house rent.

Motion carried that pastors send in their four Fifth Sunday Sunday School offerings to the Conference Treasurer for paying the Conference President's house rent.

The Committee on Thanks read its report. Adopted. (See Report 10). General Orders resumed, and the following reports read: E. B. Carnes, Luther Lawson (report read by Mrs. Lawson), Mrs. Jennie Whitaker (report read by Secretary—character passed by vote of Conference), J. A. Cassady, Carl Cox (oral report given by his pastor, Charles Haire), E. L. Robinson (oral report by his pastor, D. P. Denton), Grace Winebarger (oral report by her pastor, Charles Haire), Dortha Shook (voted by Conference that she be placed on list of Unstationed Elders).

It was voted that the next annual Conference be held on the second Tuesday in July, 1953. Voted that the Conference President assist the Secretary in editing the Minutes. By motion, the President and his Advisory Board were authorized to take care of any unfinished business of the Conference.

The Pastoral Relations Committee read its final report. Adopted. (See Report 11).

Minutes read. Minutes for entire session approved, with a rising vote of thanks.

Upon motion, Conference adjourned sine die. Benediction, Rev. D. P. Denton.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report: Be it resolved, that these articles shall become the standing rules and law of this Conference:

- 1. Before a local building committee proceeds with a building plan or program that they be required to have all plans approved by the President and his Advisory Board and the Missionary Board; and further, that no financial obligations be assumed without the consent of the Conference Trustees.
- 2. That the Board of Conference Trustees be, and they are hereby empowered, to sign all papers necessary for the sale or transfer of Conference, Church or Parsonage property, providing the said sale or transfer is authorized by the President and his Advisory Board and shall not violate the spirit of paragraphs 386, 387 of our Book of Discipline.
- 3. The Board of Conference Trustees are hereby authorized to execute papers to secure funds for the liquidation of Conference, Church or Parsonage indebtedness, providing that the Churches set forth in writing the amount and the purposes for which the loan is to be used; and that no funds so secured shall be used for any other purpose than that set forth in the notice to the trustees of the Conference.
- 4. When a deed for Conference, Church or Parsonage property is received and before it is recorded it shall be referred to the President and his Advisory Board who are hereby designated as a Deed Examining Committee whose duty shall be to examine the deed and see that there are such disciplinary clauses included as may be necessary to make the property secure to our Church. Said Committee shall have power to engage such legal advice as may be needed to insure the proper steps regarding the reception or transfer of the property. See paragraphs 388, 389 of present book of Discipline.
- 5. The President's salary shall remain at \$1650 per year, plus traveling expenses for Quarterly Meetings. Each Pastor is urged and expected to receive a love offering at the first and fourth Quarterly Conference for the President. Each Pastor is also urged to take at least one fifth Sunday offering for the Conference Fund. The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to remit the President's salary semi-monthly. We further recommend that if the budget does not take care of the President's salary, the deficit be taken out of the Pioneer Fund.
- 6. We shall proclaim with voice and pen and holy living the gospel of full salvation, recognizing our dependence upon, and need of the indwelling power and presence of the Holy Spirit.
- 7. We shall continue to interpret the teachings of the Scriptures and the Special Rules of the Discipline in accord with the standards held by the early Methodists and the Wesleyans of the past generations. To this end we reaffirm our stand against the reception of any member as a full member who wears jewelry, including the wedding band or other unnecessary ornaments, and declare ourselves in favor of higher standards on dress, and other worldly manifestations on the person. Our ministers are asked to refrain from performing wedding ceremonies using the ring, and to be positive in their declarations regarding this entering wedge of worldliness. We further declare our opposition to such things as commercialized ball

games, Sabbath desecration, theatres, television, and such like, and shall support our ministers in their endeavors to counteract these menaces. We further urge our ministers to take an active stand in exposing the three "C's" of the world—Communism, Catholicism, and Compromise.

- 8. We urge all Conference Preachers and Elders to become members of the Women's Missionary Society, and that the pastors attend each meeting and encourage the women, this being one of the strong arms of the Church.
- 9. Each Church shall make a special effort in behalf of, and loyally support the Church Extension Card Plan.
- 10. Each pastor, or charge, shall have in the hands of the Statistical Secretary not less than five days before the Annual Conference, one copy of his statistical report in full. This report shall be accompanied by a statement from the Conference Treasurer giving the amounts paid on budget under Item VIII in the pastor's statistical report, and the pastor's report must check with that of the Conference Treasurer.
- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books shall close on June 30 of each year and no credit shall be given on the Budget for that fiscal year for money received after this date.
- 12. The President's, Secretary's and Treasurer's correspondence expenses shall be paid from the Conference Fund by the Conference Treasurer.
- 13. Minutes of this Conference shall be published through arrangements made by the Missionary Board and delivered to the pastors in numbers equal to 50% of their Church membership.
- 14. Preachers and Delegates shall remain throughout the entire Conference session unless providentially hindered or excused by the Conference.
- 15. All Elders received from other denominations shall be required to pass examination on our Book of Discipline, and must have passed a course of study which is equivalent to our course for ordination, and harmonize with our theological views. They shall give special attention to the requirements found in paragraphs 171 of our book of Discipline.
- 16. Copies of these resolutions, together with the apportionments and the addresses of the President, Secretary and Treasurer, shall be in the hands of each pastor within two weeks of the close of the Annual Conference. The Conference Secretary be authorized to carry out this resolution.
- 17. Pastors shall mail all Delegate's credentials to the Conference Secretary not less than five (5) days before convening of Conference.
- 18. The Conference Budget shall be raised and remitted monthly to the Conference Treasurer.
- 19. All monies which are reported through the Conference Treasurer shall be sent to him either as cash or receipts and he shall give Conference Treasurer's receipt for each item, and no money shall be listed paid out by the Treasurer except by check, on order

of the President, and he shall be required to present cancelled checks and vouchers for each bill paid.

- 20. Those wishing to take examinations in the Course of Study for credit during any year, shall write for questions before May 31 of that year, and shall have the answers in the hands of the roper instructor before June 30 for credit for that year. The Committee on Itineracy and Orders shall not be expected to send out questions or accept papers after these dates.
- 21. It shall be a standing rule that the Secretary shall be remunerated the sum of \$50.00 for each session of Conference. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be given \$25.00 per year for services.
- 22. We recommend that when the Conference President labors as an evangelist in any of our Churches he be paid as other evangelists are paid.
- 23. Each unorganized work which is being run under the direction of the Conference and served by a member of this body, shall be allowed to elect an honorary delegate who shall be permitted to sit with the Conference and speak on matters of business, but not allowed to vote.
- 24. The Conference President shall be required to hold Quarterly Business Meetings at all unorganized works that are under the Conference Missionary Board or with the Conference, and the pastors of these works shall receive an offering quarterly to be sent to the Conference Treasurer and used toward the President's salary. Treasurers of these unorganized works shall be members of some Wesleyan Methodist Church unless otherwise approved by the Conference Missionary Board.
- 25. In order to help maintain the spirit of brotherhood among our members and ministers, we ask that designations of titles, degrees and authority be omitted both in our public meetings and in the printed minutes, except in the first public introduction of each individual.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE, WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH TO THE TWENTY-THIRD ANNUAL SESSION, JULY 1952

Beloved in Christ:

Since a report is a report and not an exposition or a thesis, I shall give only facts that are pertinent to the business of the Conference.

Several changes have taken place within the Conference membership and minstry and these will be reported by the proper Committees.

Following last Conference, George D. Akers declined to accept the Pastorate of the Mascot Church as appointed, and a new man in our midst, Luther Elbell was appointed to this place.

In January, James C. Harmoning resigned the Pastorate at Corinth, and another new man was appointed to supply it, C. E. Irby.

The Crossville Church has remained in the hands of the President throughout the year and he has supplied the work.

The rest of the appointments have remained as set by Conference. We have done our best and have devoted ourselves exclusively to the work of the Conference, and submit the following report of our personal activities.

We have preached 246 times; Have been in 313 other services; Have made 810 visits; Have travelled 27,065 miles; Have labored 88 days (averaging 8 hours or more) on Churches and the Camp (without pay); and have conducted 6 revival meetings of one week or more. We have attended all meetings of the Local Board of Managers of Central College as your Board Member; Attended the annual meeting of the Central Area Conference Presidents; and have otherwise sought to carry out the instructions of the Conference. We have conducted all but a few of the Quarterly Conferences for which we are responsible, and would have made them all but for the pressure of work.

We have received for our services: Salary—\$1650; Crossville Church—\$261.88; Gifts and Expense Money—\$819.21, making a Total of \$2731.09. Of this amount we have spent for expenses in serving the work; Travel—\$1052.60; Phone & Mail—\$255.16, making a total of \$1307.76, leaving a net income of \$1423.33. No personal travel or correspondence is included in these figures.

The Annual Session closed with the public meeting on Tuesday evening at 7:30, with the President in charge. The new officers for the ensuing year were introduced. Dr. R. S. Nicholson, General Conference President, spoke briefly on the needs of Missions. Pledges were taken amouting to \$2223.00.
