### DAILY JOURNAL.

The Champlain Annual Conference met for its seventy-third gathering with the Church at West Chazy, N. Y., April 21, 1914. At 7:30 p. m. opening sermon was preached by L. C. Mattoon.

Conference was called to order by President promptly at 9 o'clock.

Previous to this C. C. Hill conducted devotional services.

Committee on Credentials makes a partial report which was adopted, also voted that extra names may be added as may be necessary.

Moved and carried that the bar of Conference be fixed at the fourth row of seats.

Voted that all ministers of our own and other orthodox denominations be invited to honorary seats in Conference.

President makes his annual report. See report No. 1. Moved and carried that his report be adopted. President also reads a paper, which Conference orders printed in our Church paper.

Time was fixed for opening and closing sessions of Conference, as follows: Morning session opens at 9; closing at 11:30. Afternoon session opens at 1:30 and to close by vote.

Election of Committee on Passage of Ministerial Character: E. D. Carpenter, ex-officio, O. G. Wyman, and Ruth Baxter.

Moved and carried that Conference now adjourn.

### Wednesday Afternoon Session.

Devotional services conducted by A. J. Allen.

Roll was called to which 15 elders, 3 licentiates and 10 delegates responded.

Committee on Orders of the Day report. See report No. 2.

The name of E. Trowbridge was called and character passed. Also matter of South Albany Church was brought up and Brother Trowbridge reported as having sold the church. Report was adopted. By vote Conference accepts a cheque for \$400 from sale of South Albany Church, provided that in case of litigation the Conference bear the expense of such litigation to the amount contributed. A vote of thanks was extended to the Church for the amount contributed. Treasurer of Conference was directed by vote to place this sum, \$400, in a savings bank at his discretion.

Moved and carried that the President be directed to look into the matter of selling the Ellenburg Church.

Conference gives way to an Order of the Day. Rev. S. A. Warner preaches the Word from text in Mark 6:42. Brother Warner preached with the old-time power, with a great blessing on the Conference.

1. Having been elected by Conference to travel the Conference caring for the work as the need seemed to be, spent my first Sunday at Lisbon.

2. The Glens Falls charge having secured no pastor was left "in care of the President." I spent my second Sunday at Glens Falls. An earnest effort was made to secure a pastor for the charge, not succeeding in so doing on the advice of my Advisory Board have cared for the Glens Falls work the balance of the year.

3. July 30th gave a letter of standing to A. P. Lienard.

4. In August Rev. H. Ricketts resigned his pastorate of the Macomb charge.

5. Early in September secured Rev. D. W. Summers of the Canada Conference to take the work at Macomb.
