TOPIC - "Pray Always" Thelma Adams Zanesville, Ohio

According to the Bible, pray always means "pray without ceasing," I Thessalonians 5:17.

We should always pray to Jesus before we undertake to do anything. Often we take things in our own hands and try to work out our own problems only to make a mess of them. Jesus never ceases to pray. TOPIC - "A Growing Church" Mary Harris Dayton, Ohio

BY LAWS AND CONSTITUTION OF THE CONFERENCE AIDE CONVENTION OF THE WESLEYAN RETHODIST CHURCH OF THE SOUTH OFFICE CONFERENCE OF AMERICA

(RTICLE 1 - SECTION 1: This organization shall be known as the Conference Aide Convention of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection of the South Ohio Conference.

ARTICLE 11 - The object of this Convention is to enlarge and enable the lives of our men and women by leading them to see the needs of humanit by giving them a part in realizing Crist's great purpose, to bring the whole world to God, by cultivating in them Christ's own spirit of loving service for the needy and help them to realize that we are not our own but Christ's.

ARTICLE 111 - Any local Aide Society of the South Ohio Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church can became a part of The Conference Aide Convention by complying with Article VI, Section 1, of this constiution and shall be entitled to be represented.

ARTICLE 1V - SECTION 1: Officers. The officers of this convention shall be: President, Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Asst. Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Financial Secretary, Treasurer, Supervisor, Junior Aide, Pianist and Local Officers.

SECTION 2: The Excutive Board shall take under consideration and decide all matters of interest that shall come up for action during the period of time between the sessions of the Convention.

ARTICLE V SECTION 1: The Annual Session shall begin and close each year as designated by Convention.

SECTION 2: The Annual Session shall consist of such study and work as will acord with and promote the object of this Convention.

ARTCILE V1 - SECTION 1: Finance. Each local Society shall send twenty percent of all monies raised each year to each Annual Session of The Conference Aide Convention.

SECTION 2: Each member of Convention shall be required to pay twenty-five cents as annual dues.

ARTICLE V11 - SECTION 1: A quorum shall consist of from five to seven members of said bldy.

SECTION 2: By-Laws may be amended at any regular session by a majority of votes.

ARTICLE VIII - SECTION 1: The Costitution maybe amended at any annual session by a two-thirds tote.

SECTION 2: It was moved and supported that the President and Secretary receive compensation.

ARTICLE 1x - SECTION 1: Each local society may have a Conference Aide Children's roll.

SECTION 2: Each member shall be required to pay fifteen-cents as Annual dues.
