DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The first service of the 1939 Annual Conference session was of the Wisconsin Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection or Church of America, was held at the Burr Camp Meeting Tabernacle, July 17, 1939 at eight O'clock. Clinton Jones, a student preacher from the Eau Claire charge, brought the message under the title of, "The Cost of not Being a Christian." Some very searching questions were submitted and a good, personal testimony was given.

The first business session of the Conference was convened, Tuesday morning, July 18, at 9:30 o'clock.

The Rev. J. B. Clawson, president of the Conference, conducted a very inspirational devotional service which closed with general prayer, all present gathering at the altar for prayer. A sense of the need of the Divine Presence was present.

Conference called to order and the roll was called, to which seventeen ministers responded.

Rev. I. J. Butcher, was elected Committee on Credentials.

By motion, the Committee on Religious Services & Orders of the Day, was instructed to appoint the preacher for the 1940 session of the Conference.

By motion, the church building at Excelsior was ordered to be sold for the sum of \$ 100.00.

The following named co-pastors gave their personal testimony; Mrs. Lloyd King, Mrs. Chas. Butcher, Mrs. Hazel Butcher.

The Rev. E. F. McCarty, Foreign Missionary Secretary was introduced to the Conference and briefly addressed the body.

The Rev. Mrs. M.F. Lienard was introduced to the Conference.

Adjourned for committee work to call of the chair.

THURSDAY MORNING SITTING

July 20

Devotional service conducted by the Rev. Mrs. M. F. Lienard, who spoke very earnestly of matters she felt had been given her of the Lord. The reaction was very gratifying. A season of general prayer prevailed.

The Conference was called to order by the President.
Roll call. 16 ministers and 15 delegates present.

The report of the Conference Sunday School Secretary was read and accepted.

By motion, the Conference Secretary was instructed to write a letter of sympathy to Mr. & Mrs. Wallace Grover in their recent bereavement.

Rev. Wilma Bakke, read the statistical report from the Oak Ridge charge.

By motion, it was ordered that all statistical reports shall show only the number of W.Y.P. Societies in item IV, place 16.

Adjourned by limitation of time with an indefinite motion before the house.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON SITTING

Devotional service conducted by the Conference President.

As per Orders of the Day, the Rev. E. F. McCarty, our Foreign Missionary Secretary, gave the Connectional address. The address was introduced by Scripture, referring to counting the cost before building and the subject was "Spiritual Kingdom Building." A brief resume is as follows; "There is a plan with God and He will find His workers for the plan. Wesleyan Methodism has been given a large place in this plan. We are responsible for finding the best methods to do our work. We must have rules and discipline. Three departments of our Church were referred to; viz. Our Schools, our Publishing Interests and our Mission work. Our schools care for approximately 1200 students. Returns from our schools is to be counted in producing Christian laymen as well as ministers and special Church workers. The pastor is the key man in the matter of forwarding our publishing interests.

Our present numerical and equipment size does not indicate the sum of our service, the constant turnover through the years, aggregates a large service.

Recounting some of the great opportunities in the foreign fields and making a plea for a deeper loyalty, closed the address.

The Conference was called to order by the President. Roll call. 13 ministers and 14 delegates present. Minutes of the previous sitting read, corrected and approved.

Prof. O. G. Wilson, of the Miltonvale Wesleyan Methodist College, was introduced to the Conference and was voted an honorary seat in the Conference.

Rev. J. K. Peckham, pastor of the Beulah charge, read the statistical report from said charge.

By motion, it was ordered that the Budget Committee be instructed to strike from the budget the \$ 2.00 for Conference President's salary and that they recommend that said salary be raised as such and be apportioned to the charges to be raised quarterly.

By motion, it was ordered that each minister of the Conference be required to pay ten percent of his salary into the Superannuated Ministers Fund.

Adjourned for committee work to call of the chair.

FRIDAY MORNING SITTING

July 21

Devotional service conducted by the President, after which he called the Conference to order.

Roll call. 12 ministers and 11 delegates present. Minutes of the previous sitting read and approved. The Rev. Geo. Nofsinger, pastor of the Burr charge, read the statistical report from said charge.

The Rev. Mrs. M. F. Lienard, was voted an honorary seat in the Conference.

The Committee on Itinerary & Orders gave a partial report which was adopted.

The report of the Budget Committee was read by the Secretary and the report acted upon, item by item.

Items from 1 to 5 were accepted and item No. 6 was referred back to said Committee for reconsideration.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON SITTING

As per Orders of the Day, the educational service was held. The service was directed by Myron Holloway, of Miltonvale Wesleyan College. All present and former students of Miltonvale College, were invited to come forward and give their name and the number of years they attended Miltonvale.

The College male quartette rendered several selections. Prof. O. G. Wilson, a peacher in the college, gave the address, under the subject of "God Measuring Worshipers Today." His points of consideration were; 1. Measured by our vision. 2. Measured by our obedience. 3. Measured by our sacrifice.

The Conference was called to order by the President. Roll call. 13 ministers and 12 delegates present. Minutes of the previous sitting read and approved. The Rev. Chas. Butcher, pastor of the Eau Claire charge read the statistical report of said charge.

Chester Findley was elected chairman of Budget Committee in the absence of Rev. D.C. Elmer.

By motion, the Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day is instructed to arrange for a special sermon on Tithing, to be delivered at this or the 1940 session of Conference.

Adjourned For committee work to call of the chair.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SITTING

July 22

Conference called to order by the President.

Roll call. 13 ministers and 9 delegates present.

Minutes of the previous sitting read and approved.

Annual report of the Conference read.

The Adding Committee reported the Treasurers books correct. Report accepted.

Report of the Treasurer accepted.

Motion carried that the Conf. Treas. shall hereafter report the actual cash in each item apart from the notes or other values.

Committee on Pastor's Relations gave first reading of first partial report.

Budget Committee reported on item which had been referred back to it. Report adopted.

Motion carried that Rev. Esther Johnson be committee to make posters for each church, illustrating our budget program and she to be paid for material and labor.

Motion carried that minutes of the several Conference groups be printed under one cover.

Rev. Grace Kauffman elected on the Committee of Itineracy & Orders to fill a vacancy on said committee.

Motion carried that there be a standing committee to examine the statistical reports before they are turned to the regular committee.

Adjourned to the call of the chair.

MONDAY MORNING SITTING

July 24

Prayer by Rev. Grace Kauffman.

Conference called to order by the president.

Roll call. 12 ministers and 8 delegates present.

Minutes of the previous sitting read and approved.

Motion carried that Rev. G. M. Hahn, Louise Gardner, and Mrs. Laura Hotchkiss be committee to examine statistical reports and that they send to the Publishing House any suggestions for the new blanks, The Conference Treasurer also advising with them in the latter matter.

By motion, the Conference Treasurer is requested to be at the seat of Conference on Monday afternoon at the next session.

By motion the following named Treasurers are instructed to send a financial statement to each charge; Conf. Treas. W.H.F.M. Treas. W.Y.P.S. Treas. Y.M.W.B. Treas. Camp Meeting Treas. and Sunday School Secretary. Statements to be sent one week before the date of Conference.

Motion carried that the Superannuated Ministers Fund be paid quarterly.

By motion, I. J. Butcher elected third member of the Conference Missionary Board.

This was a public meeting, opened by singing, led by Clinton Jones. Mrs. Kauffman read several Missionary Scriptures and Brother Correll offered prayer.

The Johnson children from Superior sang the song, "The Books of the Bible." Merlin Aspen sang, "When God speaks." followed by a song by the Burr Y.M.W.B. Dorris Butcher gave the reading, "The Lost Word."

A group of young people sang, "Such Love." Rev. E. F. McCarty spoke on the theme, "Our Golden Jubilee." He said our first missionary landed in Africa in 1889 and likened the building of our missionary work to a man building a house in a forest. He spoke of the organizing of our schools and the beginning of our medical work by Dr. Harris. Now, after fifty years, we have many dispensaries, besides a good hospital with a dozen or fifteen trained to help the Dr. and nurses. We have 45 native preachers, 25 native teachers and 40 out-stations besides the main stations in Africa.

In India the work is progressing rapidly, since the roads have been improved, enabling one missionary to do the work that five used to do. Japan now has about 15 splendid workers, but because of the conditions in Japan, our missionaries may have to be recalled.

Our Missionaries reach about 500 towns yearly in Africa but there are still about 2000 towns to be reached in this jubilee year and asked us to give our best in prayer and means that it might be accomplished.

An offering of \$ 5.17 was taken.

Committee on Resolutions read report which was adopted.

Discussion of the plan of work and the remodeling of the missionary building. Motion carried that the building be enlarged to make two bed rooms and a study hall.

Mrs. Clawson, Mrs. D. Mortimer and Mrs. Kauffman, elected committee to take charge of the building project.

Motion carried that the books, "Miracles in Black". and "Johnathan Goforth". be purchased and placed in the missionary building library.

Brother McCarty was introduced and spoke to us.

He said the local societies fill a very important place in our missionary work and it was, therefore, important that we read our literature, to be well informed. The societies should interest both men and women and create a spiritual atmosphere in their communities. They should educate the people as to what is being done in the world. He spoke of the new study book, "The Life of Chas. Studd." as a very inspiring book. The local society should help raise the budget. Objects for prayer were given as follows;

In Africa. Pray for a revival at every station. Pray for the return of boys who went out into Govt. work that they may return to the missions. Pray for a home for the missionaries up in the mountains. Pray for a dispensary in the field. Pray for the opening of a new field, 45 miles from the girl's school. Pray that a portion of the Word may be printed in the language of each tribe.
