Resolved 1 That we rejoice in the Continued Editorial ability of our honored organ the "Wesleyan" as also that of the Juvenile Instructor and most heartily recommend them to our people, as an healthful and appropriate medium of religious and moral instruction.

- 2 That we would not forget in this connection the improved appearance typographical of the "Wesleyan" and trust its improved face will win increasing friends, and a wide circle of readers.
- 3 That in view of the unparaleled [sic] prosperity and increase of our youthful Connection, propriety to ourselves, as well as justice to our Book Concern demand a more strenuous and persistent effort to increase the circulation of these papers, and we pledge ourselves anew to this work.
- 4 That as a Conference we have the fullest confidence in the ability of our able and effi-

cient Agent, and pledge ourselves to sustain him in his efforts to extricate the Book Concern from its heavy embarrassments by every means within our power.

Committee on Reforms. Reported as follows.

The Committee on Reforms respectfully ask leave to report as follows.

Your Committee, concious [sic] of the exigencies of the day in which we live, are fully convinced that the Present is not the time for any relaxation of effort in steming [sic] the tied of moral evil which is now rolling so madly around us.

When justice and right are openly set at defiance – when ruffianism is allowed to reign and rule, not on our borders only but in our Legislative halls:

When despotism marches, with hedious [sic] form and hasty strides, upon free territory, and is threatning [sic] to invade our altars and our homes:

When political demagogues approach the sanctuary of the Lord of Hosts, and attempt to sear the lips and enchain the tongues of Christ's Ministers:

When unjust judges dare to robb [sic] our fellow-men of their God-given and inalienable rights, and because the Almighty, in his infinte [sic] wisdom has seen fit to clothe them with a colored skin, on that account to deprive them of the common rights of citizen-ship [sic] – reducing God's image to chattlism [sic] – thus enacting and enforcing laws that utterly contravene the laws of God:

And when the church, whose ministers ought ever to be the standard bearers of truth – supporting the weak and befriending the oppressed, shrinks from the performance of her duty – and lends her aid to bolster up and defend the wickedness

and weakness of the State: When the sanctity of the Sabbath is profaned – When the name of God is blasphemed – when licenciousness [sic] and polygamy are winked at – and when the laws of God, founded by unerring wisdom, in-flexible justice, immutable equity, and boundless benevolence, are openly set at defiance, and that to by the verry [sic] highest authorities in the nation, surely it is not time for Christian Reformers to falter in their efforts to stem the tide of moral evil, that now threatens to sweep away all that is excellent in morals, and pure and holy in religion. It is therefore

Resolved, 1. That come what will, we will not reax our efforts, or fail to utter out remonstrances, or ceas [sic] to offer our prayers, untill [sic] Slavery with all its filthy abominations, is completely uprooted from our soil.

- 2. That we will never lend our influence directly or indirectly at the ballot-box or anywhere else, to that individual [insert: or] party, that is known to be in favor of extending or perpetrating a system, that is so directly repugnant to all righteousness, and that so utterly contravenes the Holy Law of God.
- 3. That as a Conference we will never be parties to the burning disgrace of legalizing the traffic in rum, but we hereby pledge ourselves, individually and collectively, to increased exertions, in order to obtain a righteous prohibitory liquor law.
  - 4. That we are directly and absolutely opposed to all systems of legalized

murder, adultery; and licenciousness [sic] in all their varied forms and modifications, Whether they are called border ruffianism, war, Mormanism, [sic] or known by any other name, believing that all such abominations are as much opposed to the law of a Holy God as they are to the true spirit of our national institutions.

5. That having withdrawn all connection with pro-Slavery Churches, menstealers, and their abettors, and every beat of the electric telegraph on the subject from the South, East, North, and West, but convinces that we are in the way, of Christian duty, therefore we are more than ever convinced of the criminality of such connections.
