
### In Memorium



REV. WILLIAM DEAN CORRELL

Rev. William Dean Correll was born in Spartanburg County, South Carolina, October 9, 1885. He was the son of Mr. R. A. and Mrs. Emily Gibbs Correll. In 1912 he was married to Miss Mattie Lee Meredith of Central, S. C. He first entered the ministry in the South Carolina Conference in 1908 and for three years did evangelistic work while continuing his school work at Central College. He was ordained to Elders Orders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church in 1912. During the years 1911-1918 he was appointed to pastoral work and served as pastor of Mount Olivet, Welcome, Mountain View, Martin Grove, Landrum, Inman, Bethany, Piedmont, Williamston, Conestee, Pelzer, Spartanburg, Union and Glendale churches. In 1918 he was elected President of the Conference and continued in that office until 1931. From 1931 to 1947 he gave his life in general evangelistic work throughout the major part of the denomination. In 1947 he returned to the pastorate, accepting a call from the Carlisle Church, which he served until his death January 26, 1953. He always loved the Wesleyan Methodist Church very dearly. The South Carolina Conference and Central College were especially close to his heart. In addition to his services mentioned above, he also served as a member of the Board of Administration of the denomination for 24 years, was Chairman of the Board of Managers of Hephzibah Home at Macon, Georgia for 26 years and was serving in his 29th year as a member of the Local Board of Managers of Central College at the time of his death. His 45 years of service as a minister of the South Carolina Conference were given as service unto his Christ to whom he early dedicated his life.

### In Memorium



REV. WILLIAM R. FRENCH

Rev. William R. French was born November 9, 1887 in Lawrence, Kansas. He was the son of Rev. R. A. and Mrs. Eleanor Cowdy French. In 1925 he was married to Miss Annie Kate Cathey of Asheville, North Carolina. He gave his life in service to God through the Wesleyan Methodist Church, having entered the active ministry in 1916. Previous to that time he was singer and children's worker in evangelistic work with his He served as president of the Alabama Conference 1920-1923. family. During his ministry in the Alabama Conference he organized several churches, some of which were Mentone, Pell City, Anniston and Eden. During this time he also served on the Board of Managers of Hephzibah Home. While at General Conference in 1923, Rev. T. P. Baker, who was the Home Missionary Secretary, asked him to go to Oregon to do pioneer work which he did. There was on'y one church in Oregon when he went there. He served as president of the Oregon Conference 1925-1930 and organized Holly, St. John (Portland) and Emmanuel (Portland) churches. He spent the years 1930-1937 in evangelistic work. During this time he organized churches at Waterloo, Iowa and Albert Lea, Minnesota. In 1937 he returned to pastoral work in the Alabama Conference where he continued until 1944, serving Brent and Birmingham (First) churches. In 1944 he transferred to the South Carolina Conference. While in this Conference he served as pastor of Central (First), Clemson, Mt. Olivet, and Alice churches. He also organized the North Charleston Church. He went to be with his Lord February 17, 1953.

### Journal of Daily Proceedings

First Sitting, Tuesday, July 14, 2:00 p. m.

The sixty-first session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Campmeeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 14, 1953. The President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, conducted devotions using Acts 15:1-35 as a scripture lesson. He brought a very timely and challenging message.

Conference was called to order by the President who declared the conference bar to consist of the platform and the first seven seats in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 32 elders and 16 conference preachers responded to roll call.

Credentials—The Committee on Credentials reported and the roll of lay delegates was called with 37 responding.

In the absence of one of the delegates and the alternates from Graffney, Miss Genette Moss was seated as a delegate by vote of the Conference.

The Vice President was called to the chair.

President's Report—The Conference President gave his official report. The Conference adopted the report (except the recommendations) with a standing vote of appreciation for the work he has done. The recommendations were voted on separately. Recommendation No. 1 was referred to the Missionary Board for study and recommendation back to the Conference. Recommendations No. 2 and 3 were adopted. (See Report No. 1)

The President resumed the chair.

Revised Standard Version—The Committee (composed of L. D. Wilcox, K. W. Johnston, R. C. Mullinax, and J. B. Hilson) appointed by the Comference President, as the result of a discussion at the Ministerial Institute, to write out a statement regarding the Revised Standard Version of the Bible presented the following report which was adopted:

#### REPORT ON THE REVISED STANDARD VERSION

The recent issue of the Revised Standard Version has provoked much comment both favorable and unfavorable. Strong claims have been made both for and against this new version. As a result many people are un-

certain as to what attitude to take on the matter. To help in meeting this confusion we offer the following statements which are not intended as a detailed analysis of the subject, but as an over-all evaluation of the general character of the new translation.

The translators of the Revised Standard Version stated that one of their purposes in making this new version was to use modern English wording which would be understood by the common man of the day. To a certain degree they have succeeded in achieving this objective. At first thought this may seem a strong recommendation for the new version. But a translation is not to be judged by the beauty of its language nor by its usage of up-to-date words. The only true tests of a translation are its faithfulness to the text it claims to translate, and its accuracy in rendering the meaning of that text in English. In these vital points the Revised Standard Version fails. It takes unnecessary liberties with the text, emending, changing, and conjecturing without sufficient warrant. Further than this, the Revised Standard Version often interprets the text instead of translating it.

Since these things are true, we issue this word of caution that no one can make use of any passage of the Revised Standard Version with assurance that it is an accurate or correct translation unless he first checks it, either with the best texts of the Greek or Hebrew, or with another translation which is known to be accurate.

To be sure of having a dependable and accurate translation our people should continue to use the King James Version of the Holy Scriptures.

A motion prevailed to send a copy of the above statement to THE WESLEYAN METHODIST for publication.

Conference recessed at 10:50 to the time for the orders of the day.

At 11:00 o'clock, the Conference was called to order for the orders of the day.

Ordination—There was an ordination Service in which Revs. L. L. Jarrard, G. M. Nalley, W. R. Padgett, and J. W. Gains were ordained to Elders Orders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church. A very appropriate Ordination Sermon was delivered by Rev. L. D. Wilcox who used II Timothy 2: 1-6 as a text.

Conference adjourned at 12:15 p.m. to meet again at 1:00 p.m.

#### Seventh Sitting, Friday, July 17, 1:00 p. m.

Conference was called to order by the Vice President.

Challenger—The Committee on publication of the South Carolina Challenger reported. (See Report No. 13)

The Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location for Spartanburg District reported that it approved a site for the Chesnee Parsonage, the site being located beside the Church and a part of the Church lot. Report adopted.

Reports—Reports were given by L. J. Cherryholmes (read by Secretary), R. M. Morgan, A. W. Padgett, Levi Rigdon, O. B. Stewart, A. L. Vess (read by A. C. Sparks), L. D. Wilcox, S. Irving Keeler, Mrs. W. R. French, C. M. Elrod, F. B. Williams (read by L. D. Wilcox), J. R. Garrett (read by Secretary), K. W. Johnston, Mrs. G. I. Norman (read by secretary).

In the absence of Jack Funderburk and Beauford Mann the Conference voted to pass their character.

A motion prevailed that the secretary call the roll in reverse order forministerial reports next year.

The President was called to the chair.

Missionary Board—The Missionary Board reported. A motion prevailed that item 2 of the report be amended to make the salary of the President be \$75.00 per week instead of \$70.00. Another motion prevailed to amend item 3 of the report by adding the words "and that he be given two weeks vacation with pay." The report was then adopted as amended. (See Report No. 4)

A motion prevailed that the Missionary Board be instructed to take money from the fund for Conference Work to pay any deficit in the President's salary and traveling expenses in case the budget on President's Salary is insufficient to pay the President's salary and traveling expenses during the year.

Record—The Committee to Grade Records reported. Report adopted. (See Report No. 8)

Advisory Board—The President nominated and the Conference elected elected the following as the President's Advisory Board: Elders—R. C. Kendrick, E. L. Gunby, J. B. Hilson; Laymen—Dan H. Gambrell, George W. Fowler, G. C. Summey.

Youth Camp—The Committee to study the matter of a site for youth camp reported. Report adopted. (See Reported No. 12)

Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location—The President nominated and the Conference elected the following as Boards on Church and Parsonage Building and Location:

Central District-V. A. Mitchell (ex-officico), P. C. Lusk, G. C. Summey.

Columbia District-V. A. Mitchell (ex-officio), E. L. Alexander, Dan H. Gambrell.

Greenville District-V. A. Mitchell (ex-officio), E. L. Gunby, W. F. Mullinax.

Spartanburg District—V. A. Mitchell (ex-officio), J. B. Hilson, J. T. Chandler.

Standing Rule—The Conference voted by the necessary two-thirds majority to change standing rule No. 22 by striking out the name of Talmage Evatt and inserting the name of W. T. Hughey.

Conference Sermon—C. T. Bryant was elected to preach the Conference Sermon in 1954. J. A. Giles was elected the alternate.

Local Option—The Conference voted to adopt the following resolution:

We heartily favor and support the efforts to obtain Local Option legislation now being sponsored by the Christian Action Council as a means of extending democracy in South Carolina and as an instrument to fight the liquor traffic, and we call on our people to support the campaign with their prayers, their energies, and their money.

Judiciary Committee—The Judiciary Committee reported that it took no action during the year.

Superannuate Board—The Superannuate Board reported no action during the year.

Edit Minutes—The Conference voted to authorize the secretary to edit the Conference Minutes.

Unfinished Business—The Conference voted to authorize the President and his Advisory Board to take care of any unfinished business after the adjournment of Conference.

Sunday School Board—The Sunday School Secretary nominated and the Conference elected W. D. James and C. R. Siebert as the other members of the Sunday School Board.

In the absence of Elders Mrs. Harriet E. Miller, O. D. Bowling, and E. M. Turner, the Conference voted to pass their character.

Pastoral Relations—The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its second and last reading. Report adopted. (See Report No. 2)

Itineracy and Orders—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave the balance of its report. Report adopted. (See Report No. 5)

The minutes were read and approved.

The Conference voted to adopt the minutes of the entire session.

By vote Conference adjourned sine die at 3:15 p. m.

# Standing Rules and Resolutions

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourth vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two-weeks' revival during the year.
- 4. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 5. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship shall not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 6. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 7. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conference Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 8. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
- 9. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most carefully to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. The Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

- 10. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 11. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also hereby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.
- 12. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 13. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

14. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.

- 15. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 16. In the ordination of ministers, to Elders Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.
- 17. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission.
- 18. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 19. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 20. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
  - 21. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 22. W. T. Hughey, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 23. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- 24. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly conference records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 25. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before Conference.
- 26. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 27. If a church obligates itself to its pastor in a financial way and for some reason fails to meet its obligation by the end of the conference year, the board of stewards of said church shall state in writing their reasons for not raising the amount pledged. The same shall be filed with

the President of the Conference who shall deal with the situation as he sees fit.

28. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) as a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding five years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and Secretary. (See Minutes of 1953)

## Reports of Committees

#### Report No. 1

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the members of the South Carolina Conference assembled for our sixty-first annual Session-sincere greetings. To God be the glory for the good year He has given us. In spite of satanic opposition the Lord has moved among us in a marvelous way, making an impact on the spiritual, financial, and numerical life of the conference. When the committee on statistics completes its report I believe it will reveal a gain in church membership, a gain in over-all contributions for budget, a reduction in church and parsonage indebtedness, numerous improvements on church property, and other tangible evidences of a visitation of God among us. The morale, brotherly love, vision, anointing, and deepening of religious life of the conference also indicates that in many respects this has been one of our best years for some time. The conference is on the move and I see greater days ahead of us. God is moving in revival in Japan, Brazil, and the Hebrides Islands and other places where the people are meeting the conditions for revival. The paramount notes in these revivals have been: (1) Confession of sin, (2) Prayer, (3) Praise, (4) The Word of God, and (5) Faith. Prolonged pleadings, agonizing intercession, frequent fastings, and all-night's of prayer for revival is bringing revival to these places. The chief sins the Holy Ghost has brought under conviction in these places are: coldness of heart, pride. wrong attitudes, formalism, criticalness, unclean thoughts, lusts, lack of prayer, and Bible reading, gossiping, bitterness, and lack of love for fellow man.

My heart is burdened and longs to see God break in on this occasion of the completion of sixty years of conference life in South Carolina. If the members of this conference will meet the condition of revival this can be the beginning of a great spiritual awakening among us. Horatius Conar in "Words to Winners of Souls" lists the following sins of the ministry: want of nearness to God, glad to find excuses for the neglect of duties, great neglect of reading and other preparation, indulging the body and wasting much time, too much taking own credit and applause, lack of sacrifice, selfishness, not pouring our whole soul into duty, wanting in solemnity, not honoring the Spirit of God, preaching more from hearsay than from experience." The acknowledging and forsaking of such is the road to revival. Let us not "Exhaust our concern," for revival "By merely preaching about it," but let us make revival our quest. Progress today, hope for tomorrow, and the well being of souls in eternity are dependent on this.

#### The Budget

To the churches that paid a full budget and more we congratulate them and thank them most sincerely; to the churches that did their best but failed to meet this obligation we say, "God bless them"; and to the churches who failed because of wrong attitudes, negligence, and lack of vision we say, "The Lord have mercy on them." While we paid more on the total budget yet we paid less on Education, Orphanage, Administration Expense, Australia, President's salary, Conference missions, and Mountain missions. The conference and connection operate on the budget system and when the churches fail to raise a full budget both suffer. Thank God for what was contributed but a better record could have been realized had better planning and effort been done.

#### Year of Sickness and Death

This has been a year of siokness and death in a number of the parsonages. Revs. Lackey, McCall, Kendrick, and W. R. Padgett have had serious afflictions, but the Lord has spared them to us. Mrs. M. C. King, Mrs. Ray Lewis, and Mrs. H. A. McCutcheon have undergone serious operations and hospital treatments. The Rev. J. D. Evatt family suffered the loss of most all their household and personal belongings in a fire that destroyed their home. George Giles, son of Rev. J. A. Giles, was ushered from us on September 13th in a tragic accident. Rev. W. D. Correll was claimed by death on January 26th. His life and ministry were given to the South Carolina Conference for forty-five years. Everyway one turns he sees the influence of this soldier of the cross on the South Carolina Conference. Rev. W. R. French, a minister of the Wesleyan Methodist Church for thirty-seven years, and a member of the South Carolina Conference for nine years, was suddenly summoned to be with the Lord on February 17th. Rev. J. E. Merck, a pastor in the conference in former years passed to his reward on June 4th. Brother Ted Bartlett, a song evangelist who joined our conference in May of 1952 was transferred from earth to heaven on December 27th. Mrs. C. H. Pickel, a faithful minister's wife, likewise answered the heavenly roll call during the year. An appropriate memorial will be conducted in their honor during the conference session.

#### New Field Work

The work at North Charleston continues to show improvement. We have purchased some valuable property in a well located section for the Sans Souci church. The church is doing well and is on the way to real progress. They are now worshiping in a house but as soon as some restrictions can be removed we hope to begin the erection of the first unit of a church. Converse has had a good year. The Conference Card Call

was sent out for them and netted \$111.50. The mission that was organized at Seneca now has \$640.00 on hand for building purposes. The mission at Newberry has had some battles but now appears to be getting on better footing. More could have been done had we had more means with which to do it.

#### Recommendations

In order to have more means with which to enter new fields, and in order to realize more benefits from our church extension dollars, and to help meet some of the delicate problems appertaining to the administering of the conference mission funds, I recommend that these funds be no longer granted to new churches as outright gifts, but be administered as loans to be repaid when the church is financially able to do so without any interest provided it is repaid within a reasonable period of time. The Missionary Board should be instructed to work out final details and report to this conference session.

Inasmuch as Mr. Talmage Evatt has informed me that he does not desire his name be considered as Conference Treasurer for another year;

Whereas, he has rendered efficient service to the South Carolina Conference during the thirty-three years he has served as treasurer;

Whereas, with a heart of love, devotion, loyalty, and a desire to be of service to the pastors and churches of the conference while serving as treasurer, he likewise has served on most all of the major committees, served the conference as a delegate to the General Conference on occasions, and served the Central Second church for years as Sunday School

Suprintendent:

Be it resolved that we pay tribute to this brother beloved and express to him our deep appreciation, our confidence, and our sincere love. We also express our gratitude to God for this life of consecrated service which we know our Heavenly Father will graciously reward.

Inasmuch as Rev. R. C. Kendrick rendered invaluable service to the South Carolina Conference for thirteen years as its president, and inasmuch as he served longer than any man that is now living I recommend that he be named President Emeritus of the conference.

#### Improvements

Anderson received a donation of \$800.00 in property from Scarbough-Dobbins & Company. Carlisle extended their auditorium, built a new front, installed new pews, and made other improvements. They also purcased a new bus at a cost of \$3,465.00. Central, First installed a new furnace and redecorated the interior of the church. Clemson installed new pews, pulpit furniture, erected a church sign, and surfaced treated the parking area surrounding the church. They have also begun a building

fund in anticipation of building a parsonage. Clifton purchased a Sunday school bus. Mr. Broom and son donated to the Columbia church a piano with an organ attachment. Easley, Ariail paid off the balance of the indebtedness on the church and parsonage and made other improvements. Thus in two years they have paid for \$11,500.00 for improvements and \$2,500.00 on the parsonage indebtedness. Easley, Glenwood received as a donation from the mill company the installation of a second bath room, a remodeled kitchen, a complete sheet rock and redecoration of the interior of the house the company furnishes as a parsonage. Fountain Inn received as a donation from Mr. Wilton Stewart 21 000 bricks to be used in brick veneering the church. Graham Chapel finished paying for their church and dedicated it on June 14th. Greenville, First installed an organ, landscaped the parsonage yard, and redecorated the parsonage. Greenville Woodside purchased a parsonage on 309 Parker Road at a cost of \$3,000.00 and have begun the construction of the basement unit of a new church. The present church and parsonage will be torn down. Iva redecorated the interior and exterior of the church, laid a new carpet, installed new pews, installed gas in the parsonage, and purchased new hymnals. Landrum paid off the balance due on the parsonage. Mt. Olivet erected a brick entrance and vestibule and purchased a new piano. Oakway purchased, repaired, and paid for a parsonage located near the church at a cost of \$3,000.00. Spartanburg improved their parsonage by sheet rocking the interior, refinishing the floors, veneering the outside with asbestos shingles, and installing a second bath room. This work was done last year but was not reported. Walhalla purchased and paid for a parsonage valued at \$4,000.00. It was purchased from the Mill Company for \$3,600.00 who gave them \$1,800.00 on the purchase price. They also gave them the lot north of the church. Westminster paid off the \$990.00 due on their church and have near \$1,000.00 on hand to purchase new pews. For other improvements you are referred to our conference paper.

#### Official Acts

July 26, 1952, Upon the recommendation of the Superannuated Board we appointed Rev. A. E. Belk to the Superannuated relation.

July 26, 1952, We appointed Rev. W. A. Wiggins pastor of the Rock Hill Church.

July 26, 1952, We designated October 21st, as the day for the special offering for the Christian Action Council.

August 6, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. P. C. Lusk as an Elder from the Ohio Conference.

August 14, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. W. S. Allred as an Elder of the North Carolina Conference.

August 30, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. W. D. James as an Elder of the Indiana Conference.

October 8, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. Robert Harper as a Conference Preacher of the North Georgia Conference and designated him a student of Central College.

October 23, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. T. Edwin Cowart as a Conference Preacher of the North Georgia Conference. He united with the Greer church in April and due to an oversight he failed to transfer his conference relation to this conference. However, he has been functioning as a Conference Preacher in the South Carolina Conference since conference time at which time he was given a conference appointment. I recommend that the reception of his transfer be made retroactive until July in order to keep his service record straight.

October 24, 1952, We appointed Lee Newton pastor of the Rock Bridge

Mission.

January 10, 1953, Due to ill health Rev. W. R. Padgett submitted his resignation as pastor of the Pickens View Church. On January 29, 1953 we accepted this resignation and at the request of the Pulpit Supply we appointed Rev. K. W. Bauer pastor of said church.

January 18, 1953, upon authorization of the Advisory Board I organized a mission at Seneca with 8 members, and we appointed Rev. Frank McCool pastor. This is the result of Brother McCool and others from Central College working among the people at Seneca. They are holding service in a rented store building and have made some progress.

February 12, 1953, At the request of the Pulpit Supply and the Board of Stewards we appointed Rev. C. M. Elrod pastor of the Carlisle church

made vacant by the death of Rev. W. D. Correll.

March 2, 1953, At the request of the Pulpit Supply Committee and a unanimous vote of the church we appointed Mrs. W. R. French pastor of the Easley, Alice church made vacant by the death of Rev. W. R. French.

June 3, 1953, I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. G. H. Cary as an Elder to the Dakota Conference.

July 1, 1953, I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. J. M. Merrill as an Elder to the South Georgia Conference.

July 1, 1953, I granted a letter of transfer as a conference preacher to Rev. Robert Harper to the North Georgia Conference.

July 10, 1953, I appointed Revs. W. D. James and F. B. Williams to audit the Conference Treasurer's books.

#### Missicnary Board, 1952-1953

We purchased a lot and house in the San Souci Community for the San Souci Church. The price of the property was \$6,700. We paid \$1,200 from conference funds and the church is keeping up the payments on the balance. Later we purchased an adjoining lot which had on it a house that was partially burned. The purchase price of this was \$3,300. We paid \$1,000 on this from conference funds and the church is paying the balance.

We gave A. C. Parker \$100 as a supplement to the salary the Florence Church paid him.

We granted the request of L. W. Barbee that he be given the privilege of working one day a week to help in his financial needs. He agreed to cancel one of the three meetings which he had planned to hold.

We instructed the Conference Treasurer to pay J. B. Hilson the \$450.00 owing on the Conference Histories.

We granted the San Souci and North Charleston Churches permission to vote on E. L. Gunby and L. W. Barbee respectively as their pastors for another year.

We instructed the Conference Treasurer to pay the cost of \$35.00 for repairing the electrical wiring of the Conference President's parsonage, the damage having been caused by lightning.

We voted to have the floors of the President's parsonage refinished and if necessary the money is to be borrowed from the fund for General Conference Expense.

#### Report No. 4

#### MISSIONARY BOARD, 1953-1954

We recommend:

1. That Evangelistic Offerings be disbursed as President's Salary and that the \$67.74 in the said item along with \$3.30 from Conference Work be paid the Conference President to make up the dificit in his 1952-1953 travel expenses.

2. That the Conference President receive \$75.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, telephone expense, and six cents per mile traveling expense,

he is to choose his own mode of travel.

3. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the Conference, and retain offerings from two meetings, and that he be given two weeks vacation with pay.

4. That he hold one quarterly meeting on each charge and visit the

charges at other times as often as he is able.

5. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for better payment of pastors.

- 6. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each from Conference Work fund.
- 7. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's salary be \$125.00 each, to be taken from Conference Work fund.
- 8. That the President be authorized to draw on funds for Conference Work for the purpose of printing blanks and other such items.
- 9. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for Church Extension Work for the following years.
- 10. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Missionary Board and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Board. We further recommend that as long as a church receives aid from the Conference it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.

11. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Board before he can conduct more than

two revivals away from his church during the year.

- 12. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the .Conference and who desires to move or live away from said church or change his relations to the charge in any way must first consult the Board.
- 13. That Rev. L. W. Barbee's salary be \$55.00 per week and living quarters, and the local church pay as much of this amount as possible.
- 14. That Rev. E. L. Gunby's salary be \$55.00 per week and living quarters, and the local church pay as much of this amount as possible.
- 15. That Rev. Sam Hanvey be paid \$20.00 per month from Mountain Missions fund for his services at Buck Creek, also that Rev. H. M. Moody

receive \$20.00 per month for services rendered to Smoky Mountain Mission.

- 16. That Rev. W. C. Young be designated as sales manager for the Conference History Book.
- 17. That we pay Rev. Lee Newton \$50.00 for services rendered at Rock Bridge Mission, to be paid from Mountain Missions fund.
- 18. That our Sunday Schools pay 10¢ per member for total enrollment in main school to the Christian Action Council, this to be sent to the Conference Treasurer. We further recommend that Sunday, October 18th, be designated as the day for the special offering for the Christian Action Council.
- 19. That I tem I of the President's recommendations, in his report to the Annual Conference, and which was referred to the Missionary Board, be left open for further study during the conference year.

#### Report No. 10

#### COMMITTEE ON CITATION TO MINISTERS

- 1. That a certificate of citation be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service to God's cause as members of the South Carolina Conference.
- 2. That at the close of each succeeding five year period of service, the old certificate be turned in and a new one (giving the service record up-to-date) presented, and that at retirement or death a certificate be given recognizing the total period of active service.

#### COMMITTEE ON YOUTH CAMP SITE

After study of the matter referred to this committee regarding the purchase of a site for youth camp, it is our opinion that certain advanages may be served by the purchase of a youth camp site. Among such advantages are:

- 1. The encouragement of our youth in spiritual things by provision of a suitable place to provide intensive religious training.
- 2. The provision of a project to enlist the activity and enthusiasm of youth.
  - 3. The advantage of a separate site from that of the Camp meeting in:
    A. Its separation from the temptations and disadvantages of city
    - A. Its separation from the temptations and disadvantages of city surroundings.
    - B. Its possible provision for the use of the proposed grounds for other meetings of ministerial or church groups.
    - C. Its provision of separate facilities for the youth camp, thereby saving the camp meeting facilities from additional wear and tear.

These advantages are such that this project ought to be studied carefully. With proper regulations such a plan might be carried out with profit to the total work of our church. Since these things are true, it is our

opinion that this matter deserves additional study. Therefore we recommend that the plan be given further study by the same committee before final decision.

## Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W. M. S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows: Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25 and Unspecified Fund. \$.25.
- 3. The Y.M.W.B. dues are fifty-five cents (55¢) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52¢) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1¢) desk expense and two cents (2¢) for General Conference travel expense of the Y.M.W.B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1st of each conference year.
- 5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five cents (25¢) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
- 6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group and a large Prayer Partner Circle.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists and giving help which she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expenses on said visits.
- 8. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the Honor Roll.
- 9. The Executive Committee will serve as a nominating committee to nominate committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference each year.
