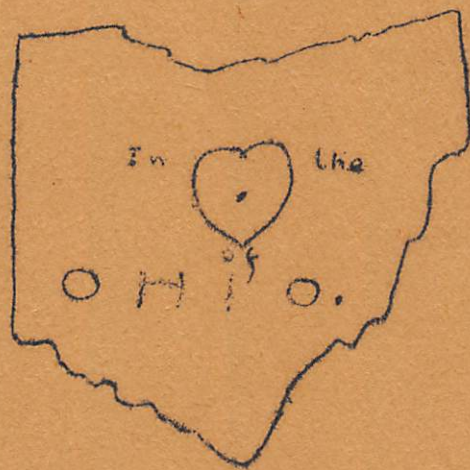

CONFERENCE RESOLUTIONS

1. All committee reports shall be copied neatly and in such form that the secretary can submit them to the printer without recopying.

2. All statistical reports shall be filed with the committee not later than the second day.

3. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge at the first meeting after the conference.

4. Pastors shall equalize the amounts required by budget before overreaching any one item and it shall be the pastor's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised and he shall at once proceed to raise the amount apportioned to his charge.

5. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor or evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate, except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference.

6. Any member leaving conference must present his excuse to conference.

7. The conference treasurer, with all persons introduced to the conference, shall be honorary members of the conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the conference ban.

8. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministerial Association, except for just cause, shall have his character passed at the next annual conference except by vote.

9. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference, who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said conference and it shall take a vote of conference to pass his character.

10. All candidates taking the Conference course of study shall appear before the Committee on Itinerary and Orders, some member of the Committee or someone whom the committee may designate.

11. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the seating of said delegate in the annual conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the annual conference.

12. Friday preceding conference shall be set aside as a day of prayer for the conference.

13. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliamentary guide of this body.

14. We recommend that pastors, sunday schools, W. H. & F. M. societies and Y. M. W. B. s remit all funds raised, quarterly.

15. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church benevolences at least once a year.

16. The first Sunday in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and efforts made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.

17. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expenses, the amount being agreed upon by the pastor and the church.

18. We order that no money be paid from the Conference Missionary Fund except by written order of the Missionary Board.

19. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all the sessions of the Camp Meeting unless providentially hindered.

20. The secretary shall send a statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the conference secretary.

21. We interpret Rule 5 to mean, that the committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give employment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule, without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.

22. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attendance of delegates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election as delegate to annual conference of any person who does not intend to attend the entire session. Information of the delegates' intentions shall be incorporated in their credentials.

23. The secretary shall prepare blanks for delegates' credentials, including the statement required by the last resolution. Said blanks are to be mailed to the pastors shortly before conference and when filled out by them, to be sent to the chairman of a standing committee on credentials, who, if possible should receive the same at least a week before conference in order that they may be able to inform the chairman of the Board of Trustees as to the number of delegates expected at conference and in order that they may be prepared to report immediately after the opening of conference. Said committee shall be composed of two members appointed by the President.

The twenty-fourth annual session of the Ohio Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened on Victory Camp Ground, Africa, Ohio. Conference was called to order by the Vice President, J.M. Williams, who was acting as President on account of the death of Rev. A.W. Smith during the interim of conference.

By order of the President the first five seats and platform were constituted the bar of conference.

I did not try to carry out the plan of holding one quarterly meeting on each charge as was required of the President for I knew Bro. Smith had partly visited the churches before his severe sickness. He held our first quarterly meeting in December at West View.

He organized a church at Coshocton and one at Findlay, of which no conference record has been made.

As Vice President, I have advised and done the best I knew concerning the conference work.

Report of Committee on Duties of Conf. Pres.

We, your committee on Duties of Conference President, submit the following report.

The duties of the President of the Ohio Conference for 1931-32, in addition to the duties as defined by the discipline shall be as follows;

1. To exercise general oversight of the spiritual and temporal welfare of the conference

2. To hold, or appoint a n elder to hold, one quarterly conference on each charge during the year. Such conference may be held during the week, day or night as agreeable to pastor and church and the compensation shall be a flat rate of \$5.00 per meeting and expenses, to be paid from the conference fund.

3. To receive offering and give receipt for the same to the pastor, such receipt to apply on Conference budget.

4. To submit to the conference an itemized statement of expense for any additional conference services, such expense to be paid from conference fund.

5. To direct the attention of the quarterly conference to the general interests of the Conference and Denomination, to see that the Conference and Denominational budget is being raised and to suggest ways and means of doing it.

6. To urge the use of our church literature on every charge and the reading of the Wesleyan Methodist in every home.

Report of Committee on Moral Reform.

We, your committee on Moral Reform, desire to submit the following report.

Inasmuch as our position on moral reforms is clearly stated in our discipline, we urge upon our people its careful consideration and strict observance in these matters. We give below a summarized statement of our attitude on various questions of moral reform.

1. We favor the use of the Bible in our public schools and the maintenance of chaplaincies in the army and navy and in state and national congress.

2. Back of the desecration of the Sabbath day is a spirit of covetousness and the exposure of this sin will greatly lessen the widespread violation of the fourth commandment. This day should be observed by cessation from labor and attendance at the public services of worship and in doing good. We are opposed to every form of amusement that would infringe upon the proper observance of this day.

3. The use of tobacco is a great evil that wastes the Lord's money and defiles the body. We require our members to refrain from its cultivation, manufacture, advertisement and sale, and abstain from its use in all its forms. We would discourage and suppress all forms of false and misleading advertising, especially in connection with the sale of cigarettes.

4. We believe total abstinence from all intoxicating liquors as a beverage, to be the duty of all Christians and we are for the entire suppression of the liquor traffic. We, therefore, favor and recommend the strict enforcement of the present national prohibition laws.

5. We will on no account tolerate our ministers and members in joining or holding fellowship with secret societies, as, in the judgement of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, it is inconsistent with our duties to God to hold such relations.

6. We insist on plainness of dress and urge that the strictest economy be observed in both dress and furnishings.

7. We believe that Jesus Christ is the Prince of Peace and that no permanent peace is possible so long as his gospel is rejected. Let us seek to eliminate those social and national customs which needlessly foster and perpetuate the war spirit. Further, let us not cease to pray and labor that the period may soon arrive when "nations shall learn war no more".
