

1. All committee reports shall be copied neatly and in s uch form that the secretary can submit them to the printer without recopying.

2. All statistical reports shall be filed with the

committee not later than the second day.

3. Every pastor shall make a duplicate of his statistical report and shall read the same to his charge

at the first meeting after the conference.

It. Pasters shall equalize the amounts required by budget before overreaching any one item and it shall be the paster's duty to inform his people at the beginning of the year concerning the amount to be raised and he shall a t once proceed to raise the amount apportioned to his charge.

5. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attention and the attendance of all its elders and licentiates, therefore we will not employ as pastor on evangelist any elder or licentiate or pass the character of any elder or licentiate, except by vote, who does not attend the entire session of conference.

6. Any member leaving conference must present his

excuse to conference.

7. The conference treasurer, with all persons introduced to the conference, shall be honorary members of the conference, and shall be accorded a seat within the conference bar.

g. No preacher or licentiate who fails to attend the Ministeria 1 Association, except for just cause, sha 11 have his character passed at the next annual

conference except by vote.

9. Any minister accepting work on a charge at the hands of this conference, who resigns or abandons it before the year is out without a good excuse or lawful reason, shall be considered by said conference and it shall take a vote of conference to pass his character.

10. All candidates taking the Conference course of study shall appear before the Committee on Itineracy and Orders, some member of the Committee or someone

whom the committee may designate.

ll. When an elder resides outside the bounds of the conference but retains his membership with a church within the bounds of the conference, a delegate shall be elected from this church to represent said elder, the sest ing of said delegate in the annual conference depending upon the attendance of said elder at the annual conference.

12. Wriday preceding conference shall be set aside

as a day of prayer for the conference.

13. Robert's Rules of Order shall be the parliament-ary guide of this body.

.7.

14. We recommend that pastors, sunday schools, W. H & F.M. societies and Y.M.W.B.s remit all funds raised, quarterly.

15. Pastors shall preach on the subject of church

benevolences at least once a year.

16. The first Sunisy in October shall be set apart as a day for special prayer to be offered and efforts made to interest and enlist the young people of our church in its work.

17. All charges receiving a new pastor pay the moving expenses, the amount being agreed upon by the pastor

and the church.

als. We order that no money be paid from the Confessence Missionsry Fund except by written order of the Missionsry Board.

19. Be it required that all pastors of the Ohio Conference attend all the sessions of the Camp Meet-

ing unless providentially hindered.

20. The secretary shall send a statistical blank to the clerk of each charge having no pastor, requesting that the same be filled out with all available statistics and returned to the conference secretary.

21. We interpret Rule 5 to mean, that the committee on Pastoral Relations shall not give employment to any preacher who does not meet the requirements of this standing rule, without bringing his excuse before the conference for its action in the matter.

27. Inasmuch as the work of the conference demands the attendence of delagates as well as preachers, therefore we discourage the election as delegate to amount conference of any person who does not intend to attend the entire session. Information of the delegates intentions shall be incorporated in their credentials.

Report of Committee on Duties of Conf. Pres.

We, your committee on Duties of Conference President, submit the following report.

The duties of the President of the Ohio Conference for 1931-32, in addition to the duties as defined by the discipline shall be as follows:

1. To exercise general oversight of the spiritual and tempora 1 welfare of the conference

2. To hold, or appoint a n elder to hold. one quarterly conference on each charge during the year. Such conference ma y be held during the Week, day or night as agreeable to pastor and church a nd the compensation shall be a flat rate of \$5.00 wer meeting and expenses, to be paid

from the conference fund.

3. To receive offering and give receipt for the same to the pastor, such receipt to apply on

Conference budgets.

4. To submit to the conference an itemized sta tement of expense for any additional conference services, such expense to be paid from comference fund.

We, your committee on Moral Reform, desire

to submit the following report.

Inasmuch as our position on moral reforms is clearly stated in our discipline, we urge upon our people its careful consideration and strict observance in these matters. We give below a summa rized statement of our attitude on various

q uestions of moral reform.

1. We favor the use of the Bible in our public schools a nd the maintenance of chaplaincies in the army and navy and in state and national congress.

2. Back of the desecration of the Sabbath day is a spirit of covetousness a nd the exposure of this sin will greatly lessen the widespread violation of the fourth commandment. This da y should be observed by cessation from labor a nd attendance at the public services of worship and in doing good. We are opposed to every form of amusement that would infringe upon the proper observance of this day.

3. The use of tobacco is a great evil that wa stes the Lord's money and defiles the body. We require our members to refrain from its cultivation, manufacture, advertisement and sale, and abstain from its use in all its forms. We would discourage and suppress all forms of false and misleading advertising, especially in

connection with the sale of cigarettes.

4. We beleive total abstinence from all intoxicating liquors as a beverage, to be the duty of all Christians a nd we are for the entire suppression of the liquor traffic. We, therefore, favor and recommend the strict enforcement of the present na tional prohibition laws.

5. We will on no account tolerate our ministers and members in joining mor holding fellowship with secret societies, as, in the judgement of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, it is inconsistent with our duties to God to hold such relations.
6. We insist on pla inness of dress and urge

that the strictest economy be observed in both

dress and furnishings.

7. We believe that Jesus Christ is the Prince of Pea ce and that no permanent peace is possible so long as his gospel is rejected. Let us seek to eliminate those social and national customs which needlessly foster and perpetuate the wan spirit. Further, let us not cease to pray and la bor that the period may soon arrive when "na tions shall learn war no more".
