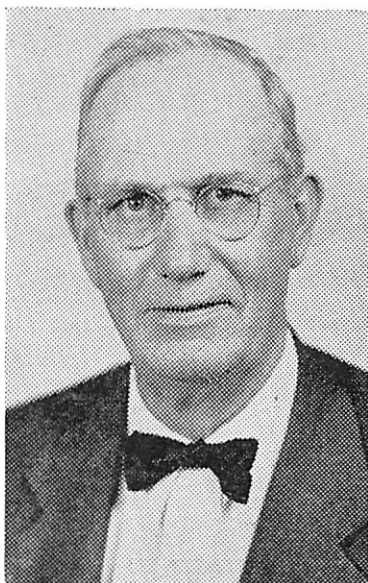

REV. J. M. MERRELL

Rev. J. M. Merrell was born in North Carolina, January 3, 1876, and answered the call to be with the Lord, February 21, 1956. He spent forty-two years in the active ministry of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, serving in the North Carolina, South Carolina, North Georgia, and South Georgia Conferences. For several years he was president of the South Georgia Conference. He came to the South Carolina Conference in 1912 and served for 15 years in the active ministry of the Conference. He was ordained an Elder in 1915. He served as pastor of the following churches in the South Carolina Conference: Carlisle, Converse, Davis Chapel, Eden, Gaffney, Glendale, Graham Chapel, Landrum, Pelzer, Piedmont, Providence, Spartanburg, Union.

2. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold if possible a two weeks' revival during the year.
3. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our Licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
4. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
5. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
6. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable.
7. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference be and they hereby are empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board.
8. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of

the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.

9. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

10. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a.m. Wednesday of Conference.

11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.

12. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation with pay each year.

13. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.

14. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.

15. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.

16. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.

17. W. T. Hughey, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

18. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.

19. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve

as Quarterly Conference Clerk.

20. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before conference.

21. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.

22. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to ministers who have given 25 years of active ministerial service in God's Kingdom (20 years in case of retirement or death) as a member of the South Carolina Conference. At the close of each succeeding five years the old certificate is to be returned and a new one given; and at retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and Secretary. (See Minutes of 1953)

Reports

REPORT NO. 1

President's Report

Through the providence of God we are permitted to report to the Sixty-Fourth Session of the South Carolina Conference. We wish to begin this report with an apology. On page 14 of the 1955 conference minutes the following is recorded: "The Chair announced that in the election of the College Trustees no one except those nominated could be voted on. There was an appeal made from the decision of the Chair in this matter. The Conference voted to sustain the Chair in the ruling." The Chair was wrong in his decision. In being wrong he no doubt influenced the body in the wrong decision. Robert's Rules of Order makes it clear that in voting by ballot one can vote for any eligible member of the body whether he has been nominated or not. We regret this error and sincerely ask your forgiveness. Likewise, we wish to apologize for any disappointment we may have caused anyone. If we failed you in any way, please forgive us. Our motive and desire has been to help, but human frailties often lead to failure.

STATE OF THE WORK

Over-all this has been a good year. However, it has not been as good as it should have been. We wish to give glory to God and our sincere thanks to the members of the conference for the victories won. Your prayers, consideration, cooperation, and financial support are gratefully acknowledged. You indeed have been noble.

FINANCIALLY:

In some areas we have found a slight recession which has made itself felt in the finances of some churches. In spite of this the financial condition of the church is good. The total contributed for all purposes does not justify the decrease in budget contributions made this year. In the totals contributed for Conference and Denominational budget we fall below the average compared with other conferences in our Church. This should not be, and must be corrected for efficient operation of the work.

MATERIALLY:

Knighton Chapel built a seven room parsonage with two bath rooms. Much of the labor was donated. The parsonage is well arranged and is valued at \$7,500.00. The church is to be highly commended for this venture. They likewise granted their pastor a raise in salary and report a splendid gain in church

membership.

Alice (Easley) has built a beautiful brick parsonage consisting of six rooms and two baths. Much of the labor was donated and the building is valued at \$15,000.00. The vision and devotion of the people are deeply appreciated.

Chesnee is completing a six room-two bath parsonage costing near \$10,000.00.

North Charleston has provided living quarters for the pastor in the Sunday school rooms for the last four years. The Sunday school has grown so that additional room was needed. Upon approval of the Missionary Board they purchased a six room parsonage at a cost of \$10,835.00. They are paying \$50.00 per month on the payments and hope to relieve the Missionary Board of having to pay any on the parsonage in the near future. Our investment in pioneer fields is paying off.

Sans Souci (Greenville), upon approval of the Missionary Board, purchased a five-room house at a cost of \$6,650.00. It is located next to the church and is needed for the future development of the work. Due to waiting for a settlement with the Highway Department, which widened the street by the church and as yet has not paid anything for such, no church building program has been launched. If the church is to grow, a church building must be provided. It is hoped by this time next year such will be realized. There are good prospects in this work and some victories have been gained.

Graham Chapel has obtained a lot and is raising money with which to build a parsonage.

The Conference Parsonage now provides a wonderful home for the Conference President's family. The seven-room, two-bath parsonage, two-room office, and a half bath, garage, and basement on a valuable and well located lot makes it one of the nicest in the denomination. It is what is needed for a Conference parsonage and will be adequate for years to come. The total cost of \$31,811.25 is more than was anticipated but considering what we have it is well worth what it cost. It is something for which all of us can be grateful.

Greenville, First, re-located and completed the first unit of a beautiful church. The sanctuary, with balcony and choir, has a seating capacity of 425. The "T" will be built later and will have 23 Sunday School rooms, a church office, and a pastor's study. This colonial style building is the nicest in the conference. The total cost was \$76,667.00 and many items were purchased at wholesale. The pastor and the people did a great work. The indebtedness is \$22,324.00.

Spartanburg added an Educational building consisting of two stories with two rest rooms, pastor's study, youth chapel, nursery, and eight classrooms at a cost of about \$25,000.00. In addition the sanctuary has been insulated overhead and a new heating system and a water cooler installed.

Clemson improved their property and dedicated their parsonage.

Westminster improved the parsonage, laid a new carpet in the church, and dedicated the church building.

Oakway paid off their indebtedness, remodeled the interior of the church, purchased a lot on which to build a new parsonage, and dedicated the church

and parsonage.

Clinton Road (Whitmire) dedicated their new church. The portable tabernacle was used there until they completed the cement block building valued at \$30,000.00. The tabernacle was dismantled and erected at *Belton*. The *Piedmont Church* is sponsoring a Sunday School in this new field and some progress is being made. They are to be commended for this vision and your prayers are needed for this undertaking.

Carlisle paid off the \$6,000.00 indebtedness due on the parsonage and dedicated this beautiful building valued at \$25,000.00. In just a few months they have built and paid for this parsonage.

Central, Second, erected a beautiful bulletin board, modernized the kitchen, and paid a substantial amount on the indebtedness of the church.

Tuckasagee has excavated a basement under the present church building; laid cement blocks around the outside walls, and run the hall partitions. They plan to finish the rooms and install rest rooms as the money becomes available.

Whitmire, First, has purchased property adjacent to the church, have accumulated a good building fund and plan to build a new church in the future.

Clifton has purchased a lot adjacent to the church and hope to move the present building to the new lot anticipating remodeling and adding to the building when on the new lot.

Eden has begun a building fund for a parsonage.

Lyman has begun a building fund for additional Sunday School rooms.

Pickens View installed a new heating system and redecorated the interior of the church.

Anderson modernized the kitchen and reroofed the parsonage.

For other improvements you are referred to the "Challenger."

NUMERICALLY

We are happy for the gain in church membership. The fact that our gains were in Junior Church membership is encouraging now and speaks for continued benefits tomorrow. However, our gains were too small and our losses were too high. Let us resolve that we shall do better next year.

SPIRITUALLY

Taken as a whole we have a spiritual conference. God's anointing is upon us. Let us ever keep it thus. We have many saints that have made a life-time commitment of themselves to God. They have made up their minds to go with God whatever the cost. It is our prayer that all shall come to this spiritual state. The Wesleyan Methodist Church has given us a great spiritual heritage. From an over-all standpoint, I do not know of a church that has more spiritual leaders and members than does our church. Thank God for such a spiritual church home. Let us devote ourselves to keeping it spiritual in this our greatest hour.

PROSPECTS

With better trained ministers, better located churches, better constructed churches and equipment we are in a better position to make our greatest progress. However, progress will not come from these things alone. The presence of God, prevailing prayer, a large vision, hard work, unity, and revival are the secrets

of growth. It should be a source of concern to each of us that our growth has been so slow. We all recognize that spiritual victories are never easy. Our rigid position on the evils of the day may deter some from coming our way. However, I feel that this is not the only cause of our slow growth. While no quarters should be given even to the thought of compromising our lofty standards, yet much thought and real effort must be given to promoting a healthier growth. We ought to be larger. We can grow without compromising our position. Harvest, production, results are expected in any enterprise. The Kingdom of God is no exception. Let us return from this session of Conference determined to see a steady growth in our work.

RECOMMENDATIONS

First, That the Missionary Board be increased from four elected members to eight elected members.

Second, That a Committee on Finance be elected by this Body consisting of the Conference President and the Conference Treasurer as Ex-Officio members and at least five elected members. The duties of the Committee shall be to study the financial needs of the Conference and make such recommendations as they deem proper, make recommendations relative to budget items, and consider any other matters such a committee should consider. The Apportionment Committee will then be responsible only for the apportionment statistics.

Third, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders, or a committee elected by this Body, shall arrange for a Pastor's Training School to be held as soon after Conference as possible. This should be primarily for beginning pastors and such subjects as follows be taught: "Conducting Public Worship," "Pastoral Visiting," "Administering Church Rites," "The Funeral Service," "Receiving Church Members," "Public Relations," "The Relation of the Minister and Church to the Total Church," "Consistency in Reporting," and other related subjects. No business firm would send a salesman into the field without training; yet we send the pastor out to do the greatest work on earth without the practical training to do it. The details should be worked out by the committee.

REV. J. M. MERRILL GOES HOME

On February 21, 1956, Rev. J. M. Merrill went to be with the Lord. He was a man of prayer and his presence is missed. A memorial service will be held for him during this Conference Session. A number of faithful laymen were claimed by death. Their memory shall be cherished by us who are left behind.

OFFICIAL ACTS OF THE PRESIDENT AND HIS ADVISORY BOARD

August 26, 1955, I received the transfer of Rev. J. M. Merrill, an Elder, from the South Georgia Conference.

October 29, 1955, we received the resignation of Rev. J. M. Merrill as pastor of the Providence Church due to a stroke he had suffered. On December 16, 1955, his resignation was accepted. The church has been without a pastor since.

November 1, 1955, we received the resignation of Rev. C. V. Marchbanks, Sr., as pastor of the Eden Church. On December 16, 1955, his resignation was accepted and on the same date Rev. W. R. Padgett was appointed pastor

of the Eden Church.

December 16, 1955, upon the request of the Greer Church, Rev. R. C. Kendrick was appointed Assistant Pastor of the Greer Church.

December 16, 1955, Rev. C. V. Marchbanks was granted a letter of transfer to the South Georgia Conference.

January 1, 1956, Rev. T. C. Childs resigned as pastor of the Rock Hill and Morgan Memorial Churches. On January 16, 1956, his resignation was accepted and Rev. Paul Wilcox was appointed pastor of the Rock Hill Church and Rev. James C. Jennings was appointed pastor at Morgan Memorial.

April 23, 1956, we approved the sale of the Greenville First Church property located at Aiken and Burdett Streets to the United Mission of America for \$18,000.00, the same to be applied on the cost of erecting the new church.

June 7, 1956, I received the transfer of Rev. F. K. Smith, an Elder, of the North Georgia Conference.

July 11, 1956, I appointed Rev. A. W. Padgett and Mr. George A. Fowler to audit the Conference Treasurer's books.

REPORT NO. 3

Retiring Missionary Board—1955-1956

The Missionary Board met at the Sans Souci Church on August 5, 1955, and authorized the Conference Board of Trustees to purchase a parsonage located at Perry Road, Greenville, South Carolina, for the sum of \$6,650.00.

The Joint Committee for Conference Parsonage (the Missionary Board, Conference Trustees, and the President's Advisory Board), met September 9, 1955, at Greer, South Carolina, and voted to authorize the President and Conference Trustees to draw on the reserve funds of General Conference Travel and the old Conference Superannuated Fund or any other satisfactory method to meet the \$1,000.00 needed to complete the Conference Parsonage.

The Missionary Board approved the purchasing of a six-room parsonage at North Charleston, South Carolina, on January 20, 1956, at a cost of \$10,835.00.

The Missionary Board met at Greenville, South Carolina, on May 22, 1956, and recommended the following in relation to securing a pastor for the churches under its supervision:

REPORT NO. 4

Missionary Board—1956-1957

We recommend:

1. That the Conference President receive \$75.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, utilities, and seven cents per mile traveling expense, and he is to choose his own mode of travel, and that he be given two weeks vacation with pay.
2. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside of the Conference and retain offerings from two meetings.
3. That he hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year, and at other times as often as he is able.
4. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for better payment of pastors.
5. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each from Conference Work Fund.
6. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's salary be \$150.00 each, to be taken from Conference Work Fund.
7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference Work, for secretarial help, printing blanks, and other such items.
8. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for Church Extension Work for the following year.
9. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Missionary Board and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Board. We further recommend that as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.
10. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from the Board before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
11. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult the Board.
12. That the salary of the Pastor at Sans Souci Church be supplemented in the amount of \$30.00 per week, and living quarters.
13. That we continue the payments on the loan on the North Charleston Church.
14. That we pay the moving bill (\$35.00) and the advance rent (\$120.00) for the Pastor at Sans Souci and that it be taken from the Conference Mission fund.
15. That we refund the \$50.00 borrowed by the Sans Souci church to pay the salary of the outgoing Pastor.
16. That we give the Pastor at Glenville a bonus of \$100.00 from the Mountain Mission fund.
17. That we reimburse the Piedmont Church the sum of \$37.37 for paint for the Conference portable tabernacle in use at Belton and that this be taken from the Conference Missions fund.
18. That we give Community Church \$50.00 to be applied on their new

building.

19. That Rev. W. C. Young be designated as sales manager for the Conference History Book.

20. That we pay the Pastor of Buck Creek and Rock Bridge Mission \$30.00 per month and the Pastor of Smokey Mountain Mission the salary of \$10.00 per month to be paid from the Mountain Mission fund.

21. That our Sunday Schools pay ten cents per member for the total enrollment in the main school to the Christian Action Council; this is to be sent to the Conference Treasurer. We further recommend that the second Sunday of September be designated as the day for this special offering.

September 9, 1955, we signed a note and mortgage against the Conference Parsonage to secure a loan of \$25,000.00 for the cost of building of said parsonage.

September 15, 1955, we received deed to property at 708 Perry Road in Greenville for a consideration of \$6,650.00. By borrowing \$2,000.00 from a private source we paid the grantor his equity and assumed payments on a mortgage note with a balance of \$3,610.24.

December 5, 1955, we signed a note and mortgage against the Pickens View Church property to secure a loan of \$1,750.00 from Easley Building and Loan Association for improvements on said church.

January 16, 1955, we signed a note and mortgage against the North Charleston property to secure a refinance loan of \$14,065.00 from the Easley Bank, \$10,767.80 of said loan to be used in buying a parsonage at North Charleston. The balance was applied on church debt.

April 17, 1956, we signed a mortgage against the Spartanburg property to secure a note for a loan of \$20,000.00 from the Greer Federal Savings and Loan Association. The money was used in building an annex to the Spartanburg Church.

May 7, 1956, we renewed the note with the Easley Bank for the loan for

the Sans Souci Church property.

REPORT NO. 14

Committee On Moral Reform

We declare ourselves as approving the principles of Christian living as set forth in the general and special rules in the Book of Discipline, and that we urge our people to preserve the positive things for which we stand; to observe the prohibitions we require and the prudentials we advocate.

A. Therefore, be it resolved that we urge our people to avoid the world

spirit that is so dominant in our time as manifested:

1. In an earth-minded, excessive attachment to and occupation with things material.
 2. Wearing of jewelry.
 3. Immodesty of dress, such as failure of women to wear hose, adult youth wearing bobby sox, women wearing slacks, pedal pushers, shorts (including Bermuda), sleeveless dresses, too sheer garments, and men wearing shorts (including Bermuda), and not wearing shirts.
 4. Short hair.
 5. Improper recreational activities such as mixed bathing, dancing, worldly sports events.
- B. Recognizing that the movie, the radio, the television, and the crime and sex comics are the four greatest contributors to juvenile delinquency, be it resolved that:
1. We urge our people to lift up a standard against crime and sex comics, pornographic and other lewd literature; against the rottenness and corruption of Hollywood and its movie program; and against the detrimental influences of the Hollywood world through the media of television and radio.
- C. As the flood-tide of liquor is threatening to engulf our nation, we strongly urge our preachers to fight this Satanic menace from the pulpit, at the polls, by the pen, by the public press, and by refraining from patronizing businesses that sell alcoholic beverages.

We urge our people to aggressive action against the subtle efforts of the narcotics and tobacco trusts to enslave our youth.

We commend the Congress and the President of the United States for the recent action in tightening laws concerning the peddling of narcotics.

REPORT NO. 17

South Carolina Conference Loan Fund

1. The Loan Fund shall be established for the purpose of aiding in building churches, parsonages, Sunday School buildings, etc., primarily in new fields.
2. The loan fund shall be established through annuities and sale of bonds.
3. Interest shall be as follows:

- A. The bonds shall mature in ten years. The \$25.00 bonds shall mature at \$34.00; the \$50.00 bonds shall mature at \$68.00; the \$75.00 bonds shall mature at \$102.00; the \$100.00 bonds shall mature at \$136.00. If the bonds are cashed in before date of maturity, they shall bear 3% interest computed annually.

- B. The interest on annuities shall be as follows:

Age	Single Bond (One life)	Survivorship (Two lives)
Twenty to thirty	2% rate	2% rate
Thirty to forty	3% rate	2½% rate
Forty to fifty	4% rate	3½% rate
Fifty to sixty	4½% rate	4% rate
Sixty to seventy	5% rate	4½% rate
Over seventy	6% rate	5½% rate

4. Loans and annuities shall be accepted beginning with the amount of \$25.00.
5. Request payment of loan shall require sixty days notice.
6. The Loan shall be administered by the Missionary Board and the Board of Trustees.
7. Monies from bonds and annuities will be re-loaned to churches under the following conditions:
 - A. Local church must, by vote, petition for such loan.
 - B. Such loan must be recommended by Missionary Board and Conference Trustees.
 - C. The loan shall be secured by a note signed by the pastor and the Local Church Trustees in behalf of the church.
8. The rate of interest paid by churches shall be six per cent.
9. The rate of repayment of the loan shall be at least six per cent of the principal the first year and at least seven per cent of the principal each year thereafter paid monthly.
10. At least thirty per cent of Loan Fund shall be retained as a reserve fund.
11. The reserve fund may be invested in reliable securities.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.

2. The W. M. S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows: Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25; and Unspecified, \$.25.

3. The Y. M. W. B. dues are fifty-five cents (55c) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1c) desk expense, and two cents (2c) for General Conference travel expense of Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.

4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1 of each Conference year.

5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five (25c) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.

6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group, and a large Prayer Partner circle.

7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.

8. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the Honor Roll.

9. The Executive Committee will serve as a nominating committee to nominate committees as deemed necessary before the opening of conference.

REPORT NO. 1 President's Report

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE SOUTH CAROLINA CONFERENCE W. M. S.:

Greetings in the name of our blessed Redeemer! We trust that this has been a good year in your work in the local groups.
