## In Memoriam



REV. G. L. STEWART

Rev. G. L. Stewart was born October 16, 1888. He was converted in 1913 under the ministry of the late Rev. Joe Davis. He received his first appointment in the South Carolina Conference in 1923 and was ordained to Elders Orders in 1939. He spent thirty-eight years in the active ministry of the Conference during which time he served as pastor of the following churches: Easley First, Martin Grove, Smith Chapel, Mount Olivet, Oakway, Calhoun (now Clemson), Welcome, Mountain View, Liberty, Mount Calvary. During his entire ministry he was in great demand for evangelistic work and held many revival meetings throughout several states. He served as a delegate to the General Conference of 1943. He retired in 1961 but continued to serve as supply pastor of the Liberty church until his death. On March 2, 1965, he laid down his earthly life and went to be with his Lord.

The Seventy-third Session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Campmeeting Association at Greer, South Carolina, at 8:30 a. m., July 13, 1965. ## **Standing Rules**

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 3. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, together with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowered to execute, all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds for an expansion program or to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. Whenever money is borrowed for use of a local church the local church shall agree to and be responsible for its payment.
- 4. In case of necessity in order that a duly authorized expansion, building, remodeling or relocating program may be carried out; or in case of the claim of a municipal government, state highway department, or any other governmental agency, the trustees of the South Carolina Conference be and they hereby are duly empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which transfer or sale is requested (this writing to become a part of the permanent record of the trustees), and where the sale or transfer of such conference, church, parsonage, or other real estate has been approved or authorized by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of two-thirds of his Advisory Board, and provided further that the trustees and the President of the said Conference are satisfied that the object for which the transaction is sought is both necessary and desirable. (1961)
- 5. During the interim of Annual Conference the Board of Church Extension and Evangelism shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Mountain Missions and Conference Missions, for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Board on Church Exten-

sion and Evangelism, or signed by the President in behalf of the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism.

6. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a church building or a parsonage or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is advised to consult with the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location in the early stages of planning and final plans must be approved by said Board. (1964)

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

- 7. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 8. Conference shall convene on Monday, after the second Sunday in July. (1964)
  - 9. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close June 15. (1964)
  - 10. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 11. W. T. Hughey, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 12. The President and his Advisory Board shall appoint the Auditing Committee, the Statistical Committee, and the Apportionment Committee at a proper time before Conference. (1963)
- 13. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 14. Certificates of Citation are to be presented to each minister who has given twenty-five years of active service in God's Kingdom (twenty years in case of retirement or death) while he is a member of the South Carolina Conference. At retirement or death a certificate is to be given recognizing the total period of active service. An evangelist must hold ten meetings during the year to receive credit for a year of service. The Citation Committee is to be composed of the President and the Secretary. (1964)
- 15. During the interim of the Annual Conference, the Committee on Finance shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, Minutes, Conference Entertainment, Conference Parsonage, and President's Salary for the purpose for which each was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference; and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payment from

these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one-half the other members of the Committee on Finance or signed by the President by order and in behalf of the Committee on Finance. (1957)

- 16. The local church officers shall be elected within thirty days of the close of the fiscal year of the local church, and they shall take office at the beginning of the fiscal year. (1958)
- 17. All pastors shall mail their Statistical Reports to the Statistical Committee by June 25. (1964)
- 18. Anyone employed by the Board on Church Extension and Evangelism shall not be a member of the Board. (1959)
- 19. The joint committee composed of the President and his Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees, and the Board on Church Extension and Conference Evangelism are authorized to draw on monies available in the Conference Budget for Church Extension and Evangelism to aid churches which, in the opinion of this joint committee, are faced by dire emergency.
- 20. During the interim of the Annual Conference the Conference Trustees shall be duly authorized to draw on funds for Conference Parsonage Maintenance, for the purpose for which it was raised, as the Trustees deem best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least a majority of the Conference Trustees, or signed by the President in behalf of the Conference Trustees.
- 21. The Conference Officers, President's Advisory Board, Conference Trustees, Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism, and Committee on Finance shall constitute a Conference Board of Administration as provided in paragraph 245 of the 1963 Discipline.

## Standing Recommendations

- 1. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and to hold, if possible, a two weeks' revival during the year.
- 2. That all ministers faithfully tithe their income and that any minister failing to do so shall be considered delinquent in his duty. (1959)
- That all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 4. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission; and it is recommended that each church or charge give its pastor a two-weeks vacation, with pay, each year.
- 5. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project should be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only
  one record book for church and quarterly records and the Church Clerk serve
  as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 7. We urge all pastors to seek earnestly to raise a full budget and that first consideration be given to the Pension Plan Budget. (1959)
- 8. That we adhere to Paragraph 132 (2) of our Discipline as long as there are ministers in our Conference who are qualified and who are available to take work. (1959)
- Any pastor, or church, desiring to invite a convention or rally group other than Wesleyan groups should first secure the approval of the President and his Advisory Board. (1959)
  - 10. It is recommended that all churches have their treasurers bonded.
- 11. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference, and the church is requested to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary. (1964)
  - 12. The fiscal year of the local church shall end May 31. (1964)

### REPORTS

#### REPORT NO. 1

#### **President's Report**

To the members of the Seventy-Third Annual Session of the South Carolina Conference, greetings:

At the outset of this report we would express our gratitude to God for the many manifestations of His love and faithfulness. We are grateful also to the pastors and laymen who have graciously shared the work-load of administering Conference affairs.

At this time, we are giving an accounting of an eleven-month Conference year. This will be reflected in our statistics. Let us consider the State of the Work:

#### **SPIRITUALLY**

This is an area that is difficult to evaluate. It would not be easy to take a poll of the effectiveness of the praying of our people or the measure of our obedience to the Holy Spirit. To what extent our churches are making a Holy Ghost empowered impact on their communities is hard to know. How free we have kept ourselves from Laodicean apathy and a materialistic emphasis is another area of concern.

Spiritual life, as a rule, is reflected in statistics. We cannot measure the spiritual power of a congregation by statistics, alone, but they are involved in such a measurement. We thank God for reports of a revival interest and spirit in a few of our churches. I believe the number of special prayer meetings is on the increase. Our pastors and people are becoming increasingly aware of the need for personal soul-winning to supplement our revival meetings. Our C. Y. C. and Youth Camps were very effective this year. This work among our children and young people will be reflected in our churches in the years ahead if these camps continue to be Bible-centered. This is a vital work and it is my opinion that it needs to be undergirded with Conference-wide prayer support.

The Conference-wide Teacher Training program seemed to produce good results. This is a much needed emphasis if we are to fill our place in this phase of evangelism.

We must face squarely our need to keep an atmosphere in our churches that will keep our congregations spiritually alive. This life must be manifested in an outreach that will win enough people to outnumber our normal losses. While the pastor is the key man, he cannot do the job alone. There must

be a greater participation of our laymen in the propagating of the Gospel. WE MUST EVANGELIZE NOW.

#### **FINANCIALLY**

Forty-seven churches paid a full budget during this eleven-month year as compared with forty-six last year. This is commendable and we deeply appreciate your loyalty in this responsibility.

The total paid for budget in 1964 was \$55,513 as compared with \$55,289 in 1965. 96.32% of the total assigned budget was raised in comparison to 96.70% in 1965.

The Rally Day offering, which was designated for the purchase of a new church site in Mauldin, amounted to \$1,091 and the Camp Meeting Sunday offering to be applied on pews amounted to \$1,192 in cash and pledges.

#### MATERIAL IMPROVEMENTS

LAURENS has done extensive remodeling and improving of both their church and parsonage. They put a new roof on the parsonage, remodeled one of the bathrooms, refinished the floors, tiled some of the ceilings and installed a new duct heating system.

They remodeled the sanctuary providing choir space, laid a new oak floor, put acoustical tile on the ceiling, panelled the wainscoting and altar, completed downstairs Sunday School rooms, purchased a new piano, and installed a new furnace in the church. All of this was done with no additional indebtedness involved at a cost of \$6,000.

SPARTANBURG has purchased a new brick veneer house with six rooms, a bath and a half and carport, to be used as a parsonage. Purchase price was \$14,250.

SMITH CHAPEL has constructed a brick veneer parsonage with six rooms, bath and a half, utility room, and carport. It is valued at \$13,000.

ANDERSON has enlarged and redecorated their parsonage. They have added kitchen and dining area, family room, and an additional complete bathroom at a cost of approximately \$5,300.

CONVERSE has installed new pews and pulpit furniture at a cost of \$2,380. ALICE has installed a Hammond organ at a cost of \$1,600.

LYMAN has finished the floors in the sanctuary, installed thirty new oak pews, and laid new carpet at a cost of \$5,000.

SUMTER has built a steeple and installed new pews and laid a carpet in their sanctuary.

FELLOWSHIP has a new parsonage under construction.

GREENVILLE, FIRST liquidated the indebtedness on their Church during the year and has started a building fund for the completing of the T on their church building.

CLEMSON liquidated their indebtedness during the year and their entire property is free of debt.

#### CHURCH EXTENSION

MAULDIN was designated as the special project for this year. We now have \$2,051 in the treasury for this project with an additional \$2,000 available at the time we purchase property in the area.

Many trips have been made to Mauldin to try to determine the best location available. Efforts to purchase suitable property have failed thus far. However, we have now found an excellent piece of land in a strategic location and are trying to effect the purchase of it. We are not sure that we can get the amount of land that we need.

BELTON moved into a building, purchased from another group, on Easter Sunday. They have reported increased attendance since moving.

SANS SOUCI continues to show increase both numerically and financially. They plan to relieve the Conference of some of the load that the Conference has been carrying on their property. If the Mauldin project reaches the point of holding their own services during the year it would call for a review of the finances at Sans Souci.

ALLEN MITCHELL MEMORIAL now has plans for a new sanctuary and plans to begin construction as soon as plans can be approved and other arrangements made.

#### **OBSERVATIONS**

It is felt that the Conference Board of Administration has good possibilities in helping to coordinate the work of the Conference. However, a clearer understanding of its function and purpose needs to be realized.

The coming General Conference Session promises to be an historic one. With the rebuilding of our headquarters building and the consideration of merger before us, we need to think clearly, speak carefully, and pray earnestly.

The shortage of preachers continues to be a concern across Wesleyan Methodism. We must pray that God will call our youth and then we should guide and encourage them to answer the call.

We need an increased sense of loyalty to our Conference gatherings. These dates should be kept open on our calendars and we should allow nothing short of an emergency to keep us from them. Keeping records and reporting accurately and on time may not be our favorite activity but it is important and necessary. We can and must improve at this point.

#### LOSS BY DEATH

We suffered a great loss in the home going of Rev. G. L. Stewart. At 11:15 a. m. on Thursday there will be a memorial service.

#### GOALS AND PROJECTS

- 1. That each church push every phase of evangelism until "Evangelize Now" becomes the dominant concern of each church member.
- 2. An organized group of intercessors in each church praying for revival until it is a reality.
  - 3. A systematic visitation and soul-winning movement in each church to

supplement the spontaneous witnessing of our people.

- 4. A five per cent increase in church membership.
- 5. A new church in the Mauldin area and an increase in giving for the purchase of property in new areas.
  - 6. Sixty-five per cent of our membership tithing.
  - 7. A ten per cent increase in subscriptions to our church periodicals.
- 8. The stepping up of the liquidation of our Camp indebtedness that we might begin a long-range program of modernizing our Camp facilities.

#### RECOMMENDATIONS

- 1. That the following become a standing rule: During the interim of the Annual Conference the Conference Trustees shall be duly authorized to draw on funds for Conference Parsonage Maintenance, for the purpose for which it was raised, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least a majority of the Conference Trustees, or signed by the President in behalf of the Conference Trustees.
- 2. That this Conference go on record as approving Rally Day as Church Extension Sunday and the third Sunday in March as Camp Meeting Sunday.

### REPORT NO. 3

### Church Extension And Evangelism

### ITEM I.

**Business Transactions:** 

- 1. The sub-committee elected to survey the field of Mauldin and advise with Columbia is as follows: Karl W. Johnston, C. T. Bryant, P. C. Lusk, and W. M. Rampey.
- 2. That we ask the Church of God at Belton to remove or tear away that part of the church which is over the church property line and that it be repaired to meet approval of the Conference president and lawyer before we make final payment on the purchase of the property.
- 3. That we give the Columbia Church \$200 to help floor the Sunday School rooms.
- 4. That we express appreciation and thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Robert McClay for the piano donated for pioneer work and to Lyman Church for donating the old church pews for Conference and camp use.
- 5. That the arrangements for the sale of the property of Conestec be revised to monthly payments of \$35, first to be applied on interest and then the balance on principal.
- 6. That we take an option on the property located at the corner of Old Laurens Road and Log Shoals Road in the Mauldin area for church property, and that this tract of land be surveyed to determine the amount of land in the plot, and that we try to limit our purchase to five acres of the plot.
- 7. Approval was given for the following churches to vote on their pastors: Columbia, William R. French; Buck Creek, George M. Nalley; Belton, V. E. Gilreath; Sans Souci, W. C. Young.

#### ITEM II.

We Recommend:

- 1. That when it becomes necessary for the Conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by this committee and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said committee. We further recommend as long as a church receives aid from the Conference, it shall consult this committee before calling a pastor, or before borrowing additional funds.
- 2. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the Conference shall secure permission from this committee before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his said church during the year.
- 3. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the Conference and who desires to move or to live away from said church or change his relation to the charge in any way must first consult this committee.
- 4. That when the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee is making payments on loans or church property, the payments shall be made directly to the mortgagee.
- 5. That we continue to assist in the payment on the loan on the North Charleston Parsonage.

- That the Conference president be Sales Manager of the Conference history book.
- 7. That we give \$100 per month to Belton for the purchase of a church building providing the local church assumes the \$50 a month rental allowance previously provided by the Conference Church Extension and Evangelism funds; also with the understanding that the church, as they are able, assume as much of the payments on the building as possible.
- 8. That we pay the pastor of Tuckasegee \$25 a month from the Mountain Mission budget.
- 9. That we pay the pastor of Buck Creek \$15 a month from the Mountain Mission budget.
  - 10. That the Rally Day Sunday School Offering be for the Mauldin Project.

#### ITEM III.

Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism:

- 1. His duty is to conduct rallies and cultivate interest in church extension and explore prospective fields, and he shall work with and under the direction of the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee.
- 2. That the Church Extension and Evangelism Committee nominate the Secretary of Church Extension and Evangelism and the Conference elect, and further nominations may be made from the floor.
- 3. The Committee on Church Extension and Evangelism nominates Rev. Earl L. Alexander as secretary.

### Finance Committee

We, the Committee on Finance, present the following Denominational Budget per member: Education \$4.00; World Missions, \$2.00; Australia \$0.25; Brainerd Indian School \$0.25; Church Extension and Evangelism \$1.50; Superannuate Pension Plan \$3.75; Church Administrative Fund \$2.00; Hephzibah Home \$0.35; General Conference Expense \$0.50; Board Meeting Expense \$0.15; Wesleyan Seminary Foundation \$0.30; and General Sunday School Work \$0.25 per member in main school.

We recommend that the Conference Budget be as follows per member: Conference Church Extension and Evangelism \$2.50; Conference Administration \$2.50; Conference Entertainment \$0.50; Conference Minutes \$0.50; Mountain Missions \$0.25; Conference Parsonage \$1.25; Conference Work \$0.50; Conference Insurance \$1.00 and Conference Sunday School Work \$0.05 per member in average attendance.

#### We further recommend:

- 1. That the Conference President receive \$500.00 per month salary, one-half social security tax, parsonage rent, utilities, and that he be given two weeks' vacation with pay.
- 2. That the President be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the Conference and retain the offerings from two meetings.
- 3. That the President hold one quarterly meeting or visit each charge at least once during the year and at other times as often as he is able.
- 4. That the President advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for the better payment of pastors, including the church helping with their social security taxes and utilities and that he also shall counsel with the boards of stewards relative to the superannuate budget item.
- That the members of the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each from the Conference Work Fund.
- 6. That the Treasurer's salary be \$250.00 and the Secretary's salary be \$150.00 to be taken from the Conference Work Fund.
- 7. That the President be authorized to draw on funds of Conference Work for secretarial help, printing blanks, other such items, and also for flowers for the funeral of a minister or a minister's wife or widow, children or parents.
- 8. That all profit from sale of Conference History books be put into Conference Work Fund.
- That the President have the privilege of representing the Conference at meetings of the N. A. E. and N. H. A. with the expense being paid by the Conference.
  - 10. That the Finance Committee meet at the call of the President.
- 11. That the Finance Committee continue to sponsor a tithing promotional program with a secretary under the supervision of this committee and that funds be made available for literature and printing; also that Rev. C. G. Shirley be re-elected as tithing secretary.

- 13. That the Treasurer be authorized to put any temporarily surplus funds in a government guaranteed Building and Loan Company on interest at his discretion.
- 14. In keeping with last year's Conference action and after further study we are recommending hospital insurance for ministers and employees of the Conference and churches which is being presented in a special report.
- 15. That Rev. J. B. Hilson be elected to administer this group hospital insurance.

## REPORT NO. 6 Board Of Trustees

We, the Board of Trustees of the South Carolina Conference, submit this report of our official acts during the year.

1. October 19, 1964, we signed an easement to the Highway Department for a strip approximately five feet wide in front of Pickens View Parsonage for the widening of the highway.

2. November 17, 1964, we signed a mortage to secure a note for \$17,236.48 which was a refinancing of the Woodside Church debt in which they borrowed an additional \$4,500.00 bringing all of their indebtedness under this one note.

3. We met at the Conference parsonage December 12, 1963, and approved

the purchase of a parsonage for the Williamston Church for the price of \$2,750.00. We voted to approve the plans of the Golden Grove Church to borrow \$18,000.00 for building Sunday School rooms provided that this is the limit of their indebtedness and that if possible they avoid encumbering the parsonage property.\*

- 4. February 24, 1965, we signed a mortgage to secure a note for a loan of \$4,500.00 from the Greer Federal Loan Association. The fund is for the purchase of the Bell property which the Campmeeting Board bought from Rev. F. H. Pressley.
- 5. April 6, 1965, we signed a mortgage to secure the note for a loan of \$4,500.00 for the Spartanburg Church. Some of the money is to be used to make some necessary repairs on the old parsonage and the balance will pay the equity on another residence which the church is purchasing for a parsonage. Said residence is under mortgage which the church through its trustees will assume and pay off.
- 6. May 24, 1965, we met at Greenville First Church and signed a note for a loan of \$10,000.00 from the Wesleyan Investment Foundation for the Belton Church. Said money is to be used for the purchase of the building and facilities formally owned and used by the Church of God in Belton. We signed a mortgage against said property to secure said note.
- 7. June, 1965, we signed an easement to the City View Municipality for an eighteen foot wide strip across a corner and down the west side of the Trailer Camp owned by the Woodside Church. The strip is to be used to extend Langdon Street from its present dead-end to West Parker Road.

- 2. That the title page appear in the front of each book giving the name of the church, and also designating whether it is a church record book or quarterly conference book. If both records are combined in one book, please state this on the title page. If it is only a roll book designate this.
- 3. That a table of contents be placed on the second or third page of each record book. If no space is available, a sheet may be inserted with cloth tape.
- 4. That the proceedings of each business meeting of the church be recorded in the form of minutes.
  - 5. That the minutes be placed in chronological order.
- 6. That the church clerks read carefully paragraph 131, 270 (10) of the Wesleyan Methodist Discipline.
- 7. That the roll be kept up to date and that it include as complete as possible the following information: the names of members, date received, how received and removal.
  - 8. That if a church fails to send a record, its grade becomes zero.
- That all pastors call attention to their church clerks and quarterly conference clerks to these recommendations.
- 10. That the following method of grading be used for the church and quarterly conference records: completeness of records 20%—divided as follows: for quarterly conference books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes, 15%; for church or combined books—title page, 5%; completeness of minutes, 10%; church roll, 5%; binding, 10%; table of contents, 10%; permanency of records, (ink or typewritten), 10%; cleanliness and neatness, 10%; penmanship, 10%; date at top of page, giving day, month, and year, 10%; composition and grammar, 10%; spelling, 10%.

### Solicitor Of Periodicals

We of the South Carolina Conference can give praise to God for a fine improvement in subscription to our church periodicals. Five of our churches were on the High Honor Roll with 100% or over of their membership subscribing and eleven were on the Honor Roll with 50% or over of their member-

ship subscribing to the Wesleyan Methodist.

We had 627 subscriptions in 1964 with an increase of 250 for a total of 877 for 1965. Our Conference goal was 20% increase. This is an increase of about 40%! Thank God. This is the most Wesleyan Methodists coming into South Carolina that we have ever had.

The Wesleyan Youth rose from 321 to 513 for an increase of 192 for a gain of 60%.

The Wesleyan Missionary had a gain of one for a total of 790.

Our Wesleyan subscriptions are still much lower than they should be. If we had just half of our members receiving this magazine we would have over 1400 subscriptions. This can and should be done. We need to reach at least a thousand this year.

Some of our churches did exceptionally well. Clemson has the largest number of subscriptions with 63, Greenville First, 48, Seneca, 45, yet only 30 of our 65 churches reported in the campaign.

Our subscriptions can be improved. We must not be satisfied until every Wesleyan family is receiving our periodicals, and we are sending an influential number into non-member homes and local institutions.

The successful churches are working out a tried and proven method that will increase subscriptions in any church not on the Honor Roll.

We have done well this year, but our goal is still far ahead. Will we reach it? By the dedication of each one we will.

## Journal of Daily Proceedings

TUESDAY, JULY 13, 1965, 8:30 A. M.

Rev. J. B. Hilson presented Miss Bernice Quarles, Missionary-elect to Africa, to Rev. K. W. Johnston, President of the S. C. Conference, who commissioned her for service. Rev. C. T. Bryant offered prayer in her behalf.

Mrs. Violet Gunby announced the Area Quadrennial Convention to be held at the Greenville, First Church, September 21-23.

Mrs. Doris Armstrong from Sans Souci very feelingly sang "I've Found a Way."

Mrs. Childs presented Miss Marie Evatt, Missionary to Sierra Leone, West Africa, who, using as a text Esther 4:10-17, brought a message from the words found in the fourteenth verse, ". . . for such a time as this."

She pointed out the state of the kingdom at that time, the vessel God used, and the maiden who dared to be used. Then she vividly pictured some of the characteristics of this age in regards to missions, showing how the pattern, the attitude of the missionary, and the place or position of the missionary is changing. To many the image of the missionary has enlarged, while to some it has decreased. Another characteristic today is the knowledge that the natives have about our country, much of which we wish they did not know.

In the light of this, she pointed out some of the changes which have taken place on our own mission fields.

With strong feeling, she urgently pled with the people that they support Wesleyan World Missions with prayer and finances.

In closing she reminded that God is calling the members of the Wesleyan Methodist Church to be vessels through which God can get to His kingdom for "Such a time as this."

An offering amounting to \$200.00 in cash and \$2,122.95 in pledges was received for Miss Marie Evatt.

Rev. J. M. Hames dismissed the service with prayer as Bernice and Marie knelt at the altar.

#### WEDNESDAY, JULY 14, 1965, 8:30 A. M.

The ladies met at 8:30 on Wednesday morning for the third sitting of the 1965 Conference. After the singing of the theme song, Mrs. Ruth Lusk, Spartanburg Area District Chairman, conducted devotions.

Basing her remarks on Psalm 25, she spoke on "Tarrying For Guidance." In carrying out the theme, she emphasized the fact that Christ is the Great Counselor, pointing up the fact that there is a need and time of need, but always there is The Source, who is reached by prayer. She closed her remarks with prayer.

A duet, composed of Mrs. Ann French and Mrs. Mary French, accompanied at the piano by Mrs. Margaret Childs, sang "It May Be Today."

Roll call revealed 11 officers, 19 presidents, and 33 delegates present. The roll was answered with "gain" or "loss" in magazine subscriptions and percentage of standard of efficiency.

Miss Sallie Evatt presented her sister, Miss Marie Evatt, who brought words of greeting and an urgent request for prayer. Hands were raised to pledge prayer support for Marie.

## Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W. M. S. dues for this Conference will be one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50) per member. Fifty cents (50c) of this is to be retained in the Conference treasury for working fund.
- 3. Y. M. W. B. dues will be sixty (60c) per member for this Conference. Fifty-two cents (52c) is to be used for Foreign Missions, five cents (5c) for desk expense, and three cents (3c) for General Conference travel expense of the Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
- 4. All money should be in the hands of the Treasurer two weeks before Conference. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician two weeks before Annual Conference.
- 5. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study Group, and a large Women's World Fellowship Circle.
- The Executive Board will serve as a nominating committee to nominate secretaries and committees as deemed necessary before the opening of Conference.
- 7. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the honor roll.
- 8. Each district will elect the following officers: Chairman, Secretary, Magazine Solicitor, Mission Study Promoter, and Y. M. W. B. Superintendent.
- 9. Each district should plan at least three district meetings annually—one each quarter in which workshops will be held for: local presidents, treasurers, magazine solicitors, Women's World Fellowship secretaries, and Y. M. W. B. superintendents.
- 10. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists, and giving of her time as she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expense on said visits.
