

Fairmount, Indiana, August 16, 1937.

The following resolution was offered and upon motion was adopted:

"Whereas, Since during the year, circuits may wish to sell or exchange parsonage properties and it may be needful to exchange church properties; therefore, be it resolved, That the Board of Trustees be and are hereby empowered to execute all such deeds, and that when ordered the President and Secretary are empowered to sign and transfer such deeds, and the Secretary shall record the sale of such properties in the journal after the words: 'The Indiana Yearly Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America has ordered the sale of the following.'"

It was moved and carried, That when churches which have been placed in the hands of the president, if they can and do decide as to who shall be their paster before the minutes are sent to the press, the same shall be entered in the minutes as if ordered by this Conference.

The Committee elected to name a person to be nominated by this Conference as a member of the Marion College Local Board of Control brought in the name of Horace Williams. Upon vote Horace Williams was nominated.

President E. J. Pitts made the following ruling, the same to be a Standing Rule of this Conference. That the First Sunday of our annual gathering belongs to the old year and the second Sunday to the new year.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave a re-reading of its report.

A rising vote was called for which resulted in the adoption of the report. See Report No. 7.

We next took up unfinished business—namely the election of Conference Officers.

- C. C. Decker was elected Conference Educational Secretary.
- C. D. Crabill was re-elected Conference Treasurer.

In conforming with the requirements of the Discipline, Section 8, paragraph 137, it was moved and carried that the President, his Advisory Board, and three other members selected by this Conference constitute a Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

The Conference proceeded to the election of three members of the afore-mentioned Board. A. M. Jackson, Vestal VanMatre and Ennis Kitterman were elected.

A motion prevailed that Robert Kendall preach the opening sermon next year. Rev. James Pickett, Alternate.

Rev. Alvin E. Kerst and wife were introduced to the Conference. The minutes were read and approved. Adjourned upon motion. Benediction, Rev. A. M. Jackson.

# RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

- 1. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be open to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments. And waiving of the above resolution by a contract or lease of building must be obtained through the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Conference.
- 2. Be it resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders shall require all those desiring to unite with us from any other denomination or Annual Conference to present credits equivalent to our Conference Course of Study, regardless of their standing in the body of which they have been a member, and if they cannot do this they shall be required to meet the same conditions as our local preachers before ordination.
- 3. That any candidate for Elder's Orders or traveling under the direction of the Conference, who fails to attend the Institutes and the examinations of the Committee, without sufficient cause, shall be deemed unworthy of the trust and care of souls, and refused a place among us as a minister of the Gospel, and when they shall fail to attend the Institute for two successive years they shall be dropped from the roll.
- 4. The Committee on Elder's Orders is hereby to transfer all persons to the study list who may have been recommended to travel and may not have been given work.
- 5. All charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall in addition to the regular stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.
- 6. Be it resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Pastors to look after the insurance of our church and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the Pastor shall be a censurable offense. If the church fails to insure their property upon reasonable effort of the pastor to secure the same, then said failure shall be reported to the President of the Conference who shall then have the property insured. In

such case all insurance monies received from losses by fire, lightning, hail, and tornado shall be used in Church Extension work as the Conference Board of Trustees deems best.

- 7. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the Pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said Pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with the previous arrangements between Pastors and charges. That where the Conference demands the services of any one, that it shall bear the moving expenses, if any expense shall thus be incurred.
- 8. Each Pastor shall file a duplicate statistical report with the Committee before the close of the fifth day of August with the exception of Pastor's salary and Membership. These items to be reported the first day of Conference, said report to be kept on file one year, and hereafter the full reports shall not be read in open Conference. The official character of any Pastor shall not be passed until he shall have submitted a satisfactory report, including statistics.
- 9. All unaccounted for members appearing in the statistics in the membership list shall be referred to the discontinued list. All members in excess of the number reported shall be reported received. The roll of all the classes upon the charges shall be put in the hands of the Pastors and they shall have charge of the same and make all entries therein.
- 10. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the President shall receive \$35.00, the Secretary \$50.00, the Treasurer \$100.00, the Assistant Secretary \$25.00, each member of the Auditing Committee \$10.00, Assistant to the Treasurer \$10.00, the same to be apportioned pro-rata among the various funds of the Conference. The Conference Sunday School Secretary shall receive \$50.00 and each of the other members of the Conference Sunday School Board shall receive \$25.00, the same to be paid out of the Sunday School Treasury.
- 11. It shall be a standing rule until revoked by this body that the President shall nominate his Advisory Board and the Conference shall elect his nominations.
- 12. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference that in the examination of character the Conference officials shall be called first.
- 13. The Conference shall elect three members of the Camp Meeting Committee, one to be elected each year for a term of three years.
- 14. The Pastor shall bring a report to each Quarterly Meeting and send a duplicate to the Conference President quarterly on blanks furnished by the Conference.

15. Whereas, our people are being deceived by the erroneous teaching that Divine healing of the body through faith in the Atonement is the same as for sin, therefore:

Be it resolved, That we record our belief that the healing of the body is among the gifts of the Spirit according to 1 Cor. 12:7-11, hence not for all Christians at all times as it is not always the will of God to heal the body.

- 16. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked, that no charge shall call any one as Pastor, or to supply the work, from without the bounds of the Conference as long as there are ministers in the Conference qualified and available to take the work.
- 17. Resolved, That the Treasurers shall submit their reports to the Auditing Committee who shall audit the same and in their report to this body they shall show they have audited the same.
- 18. Inasmuch as the Pastor's statistics reveal the true condition of the work as much as anything that might be said, therefore be it resolved, That the Pastors report in open Conference the amount of Pastor's salary received, the amount of budget raised and the loss or gain in membership, also the number of Wesleyan Methodist papers and Wesleyan Missionary magazines taken.
- 19. It shall be the standing rule of this Conference until revoked, that the term of office of the President of our Conference shall not exceed six consecutive years.
- 20. It shall be a standing rule of the Conference until revoked that the Board of Trustees shall authorize all disbursements not otherwise provided for.
- 21. Let it be the standing rule of this Conference that each Pastor whose total pastor's receipts exceed \$1000.00 a year shall seek to organize a new class or give his services in a revival meeting to one of the weaker churches—whose total pastor's receipts are \$500.00 or less—to help establish it. And that the church which he pastors grant him such privileges without censure and with full remuneration of salary while in such a meeting.
- 22. Let it be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked that the Storehouse Tithing Plan shall be the Conference plan for financing the Church work and the following percentage basis be the rule for distributing the same: Local Church Work, 70%; Budget, 30%. Further, that a Tithing Secretary be elected and that one evening service in the Conference Session be given for a Tithing Service and all Tithing Bands

or Churches of the Conference be called to give their yearly report, and that some minister be chosen to preach on the Storehouse Tithing Plan. The expenses of Tithing Literature and Postage to be paid from the Conference Claims Fund and that churches desiring literature may secure the same from the Tithing Secretary. Further, that this service be a Special Order of the Conference.

23. Let it be a standing rule of this body until revoked that the Assistant-Secretary act as reporter of the Conference and Camp Meeting to the Marion daily papers.

We recommend that fifteen percent of the "Conference Missions" Budget be applied on the arms liabilities as the nature of the liabilities demand; and, that, the Conference Treasurer disburse the unrestricted receipts in the "College Building Fund" as the nature of the liabilities demand, with the approval of the Conference Board of Trustees.

Be it resolved and become a Standing Rule of this Conference until revoked, That if emergencies should arise, wherein one or more of our Elders in good standing should be judged by the President of this Conference and his Advisory Board to be physically and also financially unable to support himself, and it shall be judged necessary to do so, that the President may call upon each minister of the Conference, who is employed, to be responsible for raising the sum of one dollar each month to help relieve the financial strain in such emergencies, the same to be disbursed according to the judgment of the President and his Advisory Board; and should there be a surplus in this fund it shall not be loaned, but kept in the Conference Treasury for this purpose.

By decision of the Conference President, the first Sunday of the Annual gathering shall belong to the old year, and the second Sunday of the Annual gathering shall belong to the new year.

Let it be a Standing Rule of this Conference until revoked that this body elect annually representatives for the Board of Directors of the Lord's Day Alliance.

# REPORT OF THE CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY

The Sunday School is one of the great evangelizing agencies of the Church, and this department of the work has enjoyed the blessing of God, and the coöperation of local and district workers that has made possible some increases for the year.

There has been an increase in enrollment during the year, more scholars having been converted than during last year, and more also have come through the Sunday School into full church relationship. Also the Sunday Schools have proved their loyalty to the Church by contributing more than \$3,000.00 for benevolences during the year. We believe that the department which contributes two-thirds of the additions to the Church, pays its own way, and also gives more than \$3,000.00 to the benevolences of the Church deserves the prayerful and enthusiastic support of all our people.

The spring conventions were well attended and God's presence very manifest. In some, the glory was in true Camp Meeting style. Rev. Roy S. Nicholson, Connectional Sunday School Secretary and Editor was the

principle speaker, and was blessed of God in every service. The conviction was general that the conventions were better than ever, and deeply spiritual. We recommend that sectional conventions be held during the two middle weeks of May, 1938, and the expenses be met by the one cent a member assessments. Our people are urged to give this one day a place in their calendar of religious activities for the coming year, and join the convention crowd in your section.

We recommend that the districting be as follows:

Northern District, Western Section: Hamlet, South Bend, North Liberty, Elkhart, Plymouth; with C. C. Decker as Superintendent.

Northern District, Eastern Section: Edgerton, Albion, Ft. Wayne, Larwill, Warsaw; with C. D. Crabill, as Superintendent.

Central District, Western Section: Elwood, Peru, (1st and 2nd), Greentown, Amboy, LaFayette, Fowler, Kokomo, (1st and 2nd), Marion (West 8th), Marion (Nelson), Logansport, Mt. Olive, Mt. Zion, (Howard County), Miami, Santa Fe, Wabash, Converse, Tipton, Hoopston, Sims; with A. M. Jackson as Superintendent.

Central District, Eastern Section: Bryant, Fairmount, Matthews, Gaston, Fowlerton, Gas City, Hartford City, Jonesboro, Lancaster, Marion (South), Marion (George St.), Mt. Etna, Portland, South Salem, Summitville, Laketon, Warren, Bluffton, Pleasant Valley; with Thomas Ballard as Superintendent.

Southern District, Western Section: Anderson, Byron, Indianapolis, Kirklin, Sheridan, Westfield, Carmel, Baker's Corner, Robert's Chapel, Cicero, Fishersburg, Thorntown; with C. N. Porter as Superintendent.

Southern. District, Eastern Section: Blue River, Shelbyville, Lewis Creek, Mt. Zion (Henry County), Newcastle, Muncie, Fountain City, Grant City, Mechanicsburg; with C. C. Fields as Superintendent.

We recommend that the ten cents a member assessment be continued for Conference and Connectional Sunday School work.

We recommend that the Board Treasurer enclose with the annual assessment notice a Pastor's Annual Sunday School Report Blank to be filled out and sent to the Conference Sunday School Secretary not later than August 1, 1938.

We want to encourage our pastors to emphasize the Teachers' Training work for more efficient teachers in their Sunday Schools. Several have completed the course during the year, and some classes are busy with the book.

Not enough attention is being given to the Temperance Work and we feel that this is of vital importance now, and ask that Sunday Schools furnish Temperance instruction and urge signing of pledges.

#### Report No. 6

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND APPROPRIATIONS

We, your Committee on Finance and Appropriations, desire to make the following recommendations:

Item 1. The President shall have oversight of all the work of the Conference, and shall hold one quarterly meeting on each charge during the year; and also he shall render whatever other assistance he may deem necessary to the weaker charges of the Conference, as time will permit. He shall coöperate with the pastors in raising their budgets, and they shall report to him quarterly. Should a pastor fail so to report it shall require a vote of the Conference to pass his character. The President's salary shall be \$1500.00 a year, and travelling expenses.

#### Item 2. Conference Missions:

First—That the Conference be divided into districts corresponding to the Sunday School Districts.

Second—That a Superintendent and an Advisory Committee of two members be nominated for each District by the Committee on Pastoral Relations and elected by the Conference.

Third—That the Missionary Board shall have general supervision of all the work carried on in these Districts.

Fourth—That the District Superintendent and his Advisory Committee shall have authority to call to their aid evangelistic help as they shall deem advisable.

Fifth—That the travelling expenses of the Superintendent shall not exceed two cents a mile.

Sixth—That the evangelistic help and the Superintendent's expenses which are not raised within the District shall be drawn from the Conference Missions fund as it is available.

- Item 3. That the Conference Claims Budget be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer quarterly, except that the Quarterly Meeting Apportionment shall be paid to the President when he holds the Quarterly Meeting; and that the Conference Treasurer pay the Conference President's salary and other expenses incident to the Conference Work monthly from this fund.
- Item 4. Newly organized churches are only asked for free will offerings for the first two years.

- Item 5. That the Sunday School offerings on the first Sunday of each month be divided equally between Home and Conference Missions and shall be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer at least quarterly.
- Item 6. That any deficit in the Minute Fund be apportioned to the various Conference Funds.
- Item 7. That each church elect a Board of Stewards whose duty shall be to coöperate with the pastor in raising the Budget and that the pastor shall forward the same to the proper treasurer quarterly.
- Item 8. Since the Storehouse Tithing Plan has been adopted by this Conference as the Financial Plan of the Conference, we urge our pastors to conform to this plan as quickly as possible.
- Item 9. We recommend that the Budget be apportioned as follows: Foreign Missions, \$2.00; Orphanage, \$.25; Connectional Education, \$1.50; Conference Claims, \$.75; Conference Missions, \$.75; Home Missions, \$.50; College Building Fund, \$.50; and the Superannuated Ministers' Fund, \$.10 a member, all to be paid quarterly.
- Item 10. Let all the churches or ministers purchasing church property, or beginning a building program, comply with the Book of Discipline, Page 65, Paragraph 110.
- Item 11. That the Board of Trustees shall issue an order to the Conference Treasurer for the payment of all liabilities of the various arms of the work as the funds are available.

The following is our finding relative to adopting of the resolution to put a Missionary Evangelist in the field:

After a careful examination of the Treasury of the Conference Missions Arm of the work we find that there are notes payable, bearing 6% interest, to the amount of \$1392.07. This interest amounts to \$83.52 annually and should be paid each year. Also that there is an amount of \$214.66 of accrued unpaid interest which should be paid now. Most of this interest is due the Superannuate Funds. Also, that the receipts paid into the Conference Missions by the Church this year was only \$1512.39. It will be necessary to pay a man in the field \$1200.00 and expenses of \$200.00, which will make an increased expense to this arm of \$1400.00 yearly. In order to meet this increased expense in the Conference Missions Arm, it will be necessary to raise the assessment from \$.75 as it has been heretofore to \$1.50 a year for each member.

If the Conference sees best to place a man in the field as is provided for in this resolution, we recommend that he be elected for one year, and

that his labor be confined exclusively to new work and weak points in the Conference.

Relative to the proposed Radio Broadcast:

We believe we should not increase the Budget to finance a broadcast program and that the proposition be dismissed, unless it can be financed by popular subscriptions for a trial period of three months.

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

Let us promote reverence in the house of worship, reverence for the Lord's name, the Lord's Day, the Holy Bible, and everything pertaining to our Holy religion.

Let us warn our young people against being deceived by the false-hoods of the liquor and tobacco interests. Let us not be led into compromise by the deceptive claims of hypocritical moving picture producers who mix a little good with much poison.

Let us abhor the vicious tendency to nudism and semi-nudism with all their train of moral degradation at all times and in all places, dressing ourselves, and conducting ourselves, with our children, with a modesty

which can inspire only pure thoughts in the minds of those with whom we are in contact; and, as far as possible, let us refrain our eyes from seeing and our ears from hearing those things which might become a temptation to us.

## Report No. 1

#### PRESIDENT'S REPORT

For weeks we have looked forward to our coming together, wondering who of you were planning to be with us, looking forward to meeting those who never fail being with us, and greeting those that are with us for the first time. May God richly bless each session, and may each of us with faith renew our consecration to the service of His Kingdom for the saving of the lost.

The only life that for us can be perfect is the dedicated life, dedicated to do God's will and to serve others. The talented and consecrated young women of our church will mean much to the missionary work, so let us put them to work. Mrs. Alice Aldrich, Director of Welfare Work in Illinois, reported Chicago's present day saloons are causing delinquency among girls to an extent never equalled in the old days. Young people of opposite sexes drink openly until they are no longer responsible for their acts. The saloons with their back room and upstair facilities, constitute an alarming cause of immorality. Eighteen thousand victims of social diseases were treated on a single W. P. A. nursing and public health project in New York during the period of one month. It is time we, as Christians, face our responsibility for these conditions. What if it were your boy of girl, or mine? It is some mother's boy or girl, for whom Christ died.

While we are organized to do missionary work, and that is our main objective, yet these social conditions are thrust upon us, and we are to some extent our brother's keeper.

There are two things pertaining to all our work; to do and to be. In our anxiety to do, we sometimes lose sight of the other. We should aim to reach in our lives the highest ideal of Christian womanhood, and after being, should plan to do; that the missionary work will be advanced in every land. Let us light the torch of renewed effort to our task. Here we come to receive the inspiration that is to carry us forward; here we sit together in heavenly places; here we learn from each other things that will fit us for the duties that await us when we get back to our local societies. Ruth gleaned until evening fell, using the full time in the harvest field, and leaving to us today the example of remaining in our places till the Master says it is enough.

Paul's challenge is a good one. He is calling to each of us to continue in a good work, for in due season we shall reap if we faint not.

"Hark the voice of Jesus calling
'Who will go and work today?'
Fields are white and harvests waiting,
Who will bear the sheaves away?

"Go, labor on; spend and be spent,
Thy joy to do the Father's will,
It is the way the Master went,

Have we taken any new territory this year? If not, why not? We are either gaining or losing. Let us pray much and work more.
