STANDING RULES

- 1. The Conference fiscal year close June 30, and that the local church fiscal year close June 15; that all money shall be in the hands of the proper Conference Treasurers within one week following June 15th; that immediately thereafter each pastor shall submit to the Conference Treasurer his budget check sheet with receipts covering same, and his statistical blank completed except for the budget section.
- 2. That the President of the Woman's Missionary Society and of the W.Y.P.S. be members of the Missionary Board by virtue of their office.
- 3. That a Nominating Committee composed of four elders and the President, ex-officio, be elected by ballot and that this group upon arrival at conference select 2 properly elected lay delegates to serve with them; and that they bring their report at the first session of the ensuing annual conference.

Journal of Daily Proceedings

The first sitting of the Eighty-Second session of the Wisconsin Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle of the Burr Campground, at 9:15 a.m., Tuesday, July 15, 1952.

Devotional Period—The song service was in charge of the Rev. Harold Johnson, Baraboo; with Norma Clawson presiding at the piano. Two selections were sung: "Constantly Abiding" and "Tell Me the Old Old Story." The Scripture Lesson was brought by our Conference President, the Rev. Loring Peterson; reading from Eph. 4:1-6; prayer by the Revs. J. B. Clawson and Ernest Friebel.

Conference Sermon—Rev. Orval Butcher, Youth for Christ International, brought to us God's message for our Conference Sermon. He read to us from God's Word, Romans 12: 1, 2; then quoted from Ephesians, "I beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called." Said Rev. Butcher; "Our vocation is to be a Christian witness and to hold forth the truth that Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners. Everything else is to be secondary, the first business of the Christian is to be a Witness for Jesus."

His theme was "What is the message of the Christian Church of Wesleyan Methodists Today?" He brought forth five main thoughts which we should consider and with which we should stir ourselves regarding the projection of Jesus. 1. The curse of the Commonplace—the truth about sin, about salvation, sanctification, the Holy Spirit filled life, the resurrection and the second coming of Christ.

- 2. The matter of the machinery of our Church—mentioning the fact that we need the oil of co-operation upon our machinery.
 - 3. The ministry of our Church—quoting II Tim. 4:1-5.
- 4. Then Rev. Butcher mentioned the members of the church and their responsibility.
- 5. The business of the Weseyan Methodist Church is threefod—Revival, Evangelism, Missions.

Following the conference sermon all partook of the sacred emblems of communion—truly a precious and worthwhile way of beginning the business of the Conference. God blessed the message of the Rev. Butcher and the fellowshiping together in communion to the good of every partaker.

Tuesday Afternoon Session began by singing together, "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms"—Rev. Royal Bailic read from Matthew the 7th chapter, then led us to The Throne of Grace.

Business Session called to order by our Conference President, the Rev. Loring Peterson.

Roll Call of the ministers showed 31 ministers present.

Committee on Credentials—By motion Rev. Clarence Mason to act as Committee on Credentials. His report was adopted as given.

Bar of Conference—By motion Bar of Conference was set at the first 10 rows of seats in the center section.

Delegate—By motion Miss Louise Gardiner be seated in the Bar of Conference, as delegate from Baraboo; the pastor to fill in the blanks.

Time of Conference—By motion time of conference be the same as last year, namely: 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 noon; and from 2:15 p.m. until 5:15 p.m.

Presentation of our Connectional Representative, Dr. F. R. Eddy, by the Rev. J. B. Clawson.

Committee on Committees—By motion this committee be elected by ballot. Tellers—Carl Holder, Clarence Mason, Harry Johnson. The ballotting resulting in the following be elected to this committee: 1st member and chairman, Rev. Loring Peterson; David Peterson; Robert Mattke; lay members, Mack Budde and Chester Finley.

Motion carried that this committee retire for committee work.

Itineracy and Orders Committee to meet by the bookstand, also asked that those to be ordained to meet with them; aso candidates for conference preachers.

Adjourned to the call of the Chair, adjourned by limitation of time.

Wednesday A.M. Session

Devotional Period—Song Service in charge of Rev. Tilman Hicks. Sang "It Cleanseth Me"—Scripture reading by Rev. L. W. King, Vice President of the Conference—reading from Eph. 4:1-16—making a few very appropriate comments, then leading us as we do business for the King.

Motion—Dr. F. R. Eddy, Connectional Representative be given an honorary seat within the bounds of conference.

Roll Call showed 28 ministers and 30 delegates present.

Minutes of the last session read and approved as read.

Committee on Committees gave their report—motion carried to adopt it as read. (See Report No. 6.)

Suggestion regarding Ordination Service to be referred to the Committee on Religious Services and Orders of the Day.

Recess for Committee Work.

10:00 a. m.—Orders of the Day—Election of Conference Officers. The Conference President called Dr. F. R. Eddy to the Chair to preside during the ensuing election.

Dr. Eddy called attention to the fact that the Committee on Ministerial Character should have the reports of ministers.

Motion carried that the Conference give a hearty vote of thanks to our outgoing Conference Treasurer.

Motion carried that we adjourn.

Wednesday p. m. Session-July 16, 1952

Devotional Period in charge of Rev. Clarence Titus—sang "It is Mine." Rev. Titus read from God's Word—I Peter 2:13—Prayer.

Roll Call showed 27 ministers, 30 delegates present.

Minutes read, and with the correction of the number of years the member is to serve on the Judiciary Committee, adopted.

2:30—Orders of the Day—Connectional Address given by Dr. F. R. Eddy. Dr. Eddy spoke to us on the Theme: "The Story of Church Life as I See It." Said Dr. Eddy: "I have come to represent not only the Publishing House, but the denomination as a whole. He spoke of the pressure of open doors in the mission fields which must be acted upon by the general board. Two things of interest regarding open-doors: Open-doors are becoming increasingly frequent in the past few years shows that we are not slowing down in the spread of the gospel, but we are pressing forward very actively.

This year is no different from other years. Work in Colombia is becoming increasingly difficult. But as the work in Colombia becomes more difficult, doors are opening in other fields, Puerto Rico, where Mr. and Mrs. Crosby are going.

Open doors in Cuba, missionaries already there. Cost this year will be about 2500.00 to carry on this year.

Puerto Rico and Cuba are to be added to our Missionary projects.

Dr. Eddy mentioned Japan, Africa, home mission fields, mentioning the work among the Indians and how God is blessing the ministry of Brother Newcomb.

He stressed the schools, the growth in buildings, the paying off of debts; the fact that Miltonvale has become accredited and that Central is also accredited.

Spoke briefly upon the Publishing Interests—in 17 years the circulation of the Wesleyan has been from 4,000 to 17,000; Missionary Magazine from 2,000 to 13,000; the Sunday School Banner from 17,000 to 45,000.

He mentioned the new press recently purchased and to be ready for use about October 1st.

Net gain in business this past year has been approximately \$15,000.00. Recess—motion carried to recess for a 10 minute period.

Courtesy Committee presented to the Conference, Rev. Leyh from Dakota.

Partial Report of the Committee on Ministerial Character read and adopted.

Pastor's Reports—Harry Johnson, Beulah; Carl Holder, Valton; Russel Buck, Mill Creek; Ernest Friebel, Stone Lake; Harold Johnson, Baraboo; Orval Butcher gave us an informal report of his work for Youth for Christ International.

Question asked Dr. Eddy as to what constitutes "Total Pastor's receipts."

Motion carried that we adjourn.

Thursday a. m. Session-July 17, 1952

Devotional Period—Song Service led by Rev. Orval Butcher—sang, "Revive us Again." Esther Johnson read from I Cor. 13—reading in unison. Prayer.

Roll Call showed 26 ministers and 29 delegates present.

Minutes of the last session read and approved as read.

Conference President called Dr. F. R. Eddy to the chair—The Committee on Pastoral Relations retired for Committee Work.

Letters were read from the following reporting their work: Mrs. Goodenough, Beloit; Donald Berry, Miltonvale, Kansas; Robert Fegan, Clarksfield, Minnesota.

Motion carried that the secretary reply to these letters.

Partial Report of Committee on Character included the name of David Peterson.

Rev. D. O. Deitzman from Beulah Charge gave his testimony.

Pastor's Reports—Clarence Mason, Mt. Pisgah and Oak Ridge; Tilman Hicks, Woodland; Mrs. J. B. Clawson read Spooner report; Robert Mattke, Hayward; David Peterson. Appleton; and I. J. Butcher, Hillsboro. Motion to adjourn to the call of the chair.

Thursday p. m. Session-July 17, 1952

Devotional Period—Song service in charge of Rev. Harold Johnson, sang "He Ransomed Me." Ronald Heavilin read from Psalm 97. Prayer.

Roll Call showed 29 ministers and 27 delegates present.

Minutes of last session read and approved as read.

Introduced Russel Kingsley, director of "Christ for Wisconsin" by the Conference President. Orders of the Day—Rev. Kingsley.

Mr. Kingsley briefly related some of his experiences in his work. Said, Rev. Kingsley: "The incorporation of the "Christ for Wisconsin" is a non-sectarion and non-profit organization. We do not all see alike, but we can all get together on the fact that the world needs Jesus. Wisconsin is the only state set up for mass evangelism. If we could go all-out for Christ we could evangelize the whole world for Christ. Christ for Wisconsin is only trying to strengthen your churches. It is dedicated to the

work of Saving Souls! We have reached the time when we have to work together—meet conditions—get God's results.

Orval Butcher offered prayer centered on souls for Wisconsin.

Courtesy Committee presented Rev. Dudeck, pastor of the Bible Baptist Church, Reedsburg. Rev. Dudeck gave his testimony.

Vice President called to the chair by the conference president.

President's Report given and adopted. Rising vote of thanks given Rev. Peterson for his labors throughout the year. (See Report No. 1.)

Pastoral Relations Committee retired for work.

Pastor's Reports—L. W. King, Eau Claire; Royal Bailie, Milwaukee. Conference Treasurer's report read and accepted. (See Report No. 2.) Committee on Morals—report read and adopted. (See Report No. 3.) Committee on Budget—read their report which was adopted. (See

Committee on Budget—read their report which was adopted. (See Report No. 4.)

Carl Holder, Tithing Secretary reported requesting information on how to carry out the duties of his office.

Motion carried that an appropriate amount of around \$25.00 be used from the Conference Administrative Fund or other appropriate fund, for the use of the Tithing Secretary.

Pastor's Reports—G. M. Hahn, Rice Lake; Harold Keller, Darrow Road; Raymond Warren, Trippeville; Clarence Titus, Gill Lake.

Committee on Resolutions—read report which was adopted. (See Report No. 5.)

Motion carried that the Itineracy and Orders Committee contain in its report a standing date set for the ordination service.

Motion carried that the Conference President, Board of Trustees, and Advisory Board look into the possibility of a Conference President's home and that something tangible be done this year. The type of building, and location as to whether to build on campground or not be left to the discretion of this body.

Motion carried that we adjourn.

Friday a. m. Session—July 18, 1952

Devotional Period—Song Service in charge of Ronald Heavilin— Prayer by our Conference President.

Roll Call showed 26 ministers and 25 delegates present.

Minutes of last session read and approved as read.

- b. A Magazine Solicitor to be elected who will faithfully endeavor to obtain all renewals and will gain not less than two new sbscriptions a year.
- 5. Each society to be represented in annual conference by the new president and a delegate.
- a. Delegate to be instructed by local society regarding the amount to be pledged by that society at the annual conference session.

- 1. That the Young People's Conference be held the first Monday of the Camp.

- 4. That there be a convention in each district sometime during the spring which the district chairman be responsible for.

- 6. We invite a recognized holiness leader to meet with us for the State Convention.
- The Executive Committee shall present to the Annual Conference a slate of candidates from which the district chairman be elected.

- We recommend that in each society there be classes taught on Personal Evangelism and that the same be stressed and practiced.

- 12. We recommend that the W.Y.P.S. President and district chairmen compose a Committee to investigate the possibilities of organizing gospel teams and sponsoring Youth Crusades.

- 14. We recommend that each society strive for a ten per cent gain in membership.
- 15. We recommend that each society measure its progress by using the Efficiency Standard.
- 16. The Conference W.Y.P.S. President or a representative meet with as many societies as practical in area rallies in the interest of the local and connectional work of the W.Y.P.S.
- 17. We recommend that each society observe Youth Week in so far as possible and where there is no organized society this week be used as a time of promoting Youth interests.
- 18. We recommend that we raise seven hundred dollars during this Conference year; \$350 to be used for equipment for Rev. and Mrs. Harold Johnson, and \$350 to be used for building improvements on the Conference Campgrounds.
- 19. That our societies be radiating centers of Christian character and the beauty of holiness.
