We, your committee on Thanks, Resolutions and Memorials, desire to submit the following report:

- 1. We desire to render thanks unto God for His kind providence that has brought us through another Conference year toward our desired haven.
- 2. We are indeed grateful for services rendered by our Conference officials.
- 3. We extend thanks to our Connectional Representative, Rev. Rufus Reisdorph and wife, whose Spirit-filled messages have been a challenge to us all.
- 4. The courtesy and hospitality of the Los Angeles First Church bave been greatly appreciated.
- 5. Our thanks would be inadequate to the many others who through their labors of love have contributed toward making this camp and conference a success.
- 6. We therefore resolve that as a mark of appreciation each remain throughout the entire camp, thereby casting our vote for a repetition the following year.
- 7. Be it resolved that we, the members of the California Conference, now in its Eighteenth session, re-affirm our faith in the Bible at the inspired Word of God. It is the criterion of authority, though opposed by Satan, in this world of sin. STANDING RULES OF THE CALIFORNIA

CONFERENCE

- 1. The Conference rhall convene at the cell of the chair. The President shall announce the date of its meeting sufficient time before the opening is conformity with the desire of the Connectional Board.
- 2. As soon as possible after the last Quarterly meeting on each charge the pastor shall foarwrd the Delegate's credentials to the Conference Secretary. The Secretary shall then compile the roll of the Conference to be ready for the opening of each session.
- 3. The quorum of this Conference shall be twenty-five per cent of its possible enrollment. Ministerial or Lay members of the Conference must not leave the bar of the Conference without consent of the chair, nor withdraw from the Conference session permanently without consent of the Conference.
- 4. The President of the Conference is authorized to appoint the Chairmen of Sessions Committees and to announce the same not later than the first morning session of the Conference.
- 5. All recommendations to study, to travel, to receive Elder's Orders or to be received on credentials shall be handed to the Secretary as early as possible and he shall pass them to the proper Committee without vote of the Conference.
- C. Pastors shall not drop any of their appointments without consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- 7. All charges shall pay the moving expenses of the incoming paster within the bounds of the Conference.

- 8. No charge shall call anyone as pastor, or to supply the work, from without the bounds of the Conference, as long as there are ministers in the Conference qualified to take the work.
- No local preacher shall supply a charge or be called to supply the same while there is a member of the Conference available.
- 10. While we believe in and will practice ministerial courtesies, yet it is the sense of this Conference that our churches shall not ha opened to other denominations to maintain a regular appointment as such is likely to scatter the flock.
- 1. It shall be the duty of the pastors to see that all property is properly insured. Failing to do so the Conference will insure it and in event of fire collect the moneys.
- 12. All persons applying for membership on profession of faith, or without letter of standing from another church of like faith, shall be received into an associate relationship. All persons, save those of unquestioned Christian experience, shall first be received into an associated relationship.
- 13. No person making application for membership on letter of d'smissal shall be received until the impediments in the way of granting a letter of good standing shall have been removed by proper adjustment.
- 14. All persons, whether presenting a letter of standing or not, must first be examined by the proper c must't a before be not well a into the church. And in the event of any doubt as to the candidate's worthings they shall be placed in the associate relationship.
- 15. The fiscal year of the Conference shall close two weeks before the opening date of the Conference and the Conference Treasurer shall close the Conference books on that day.
- 16. All local prachers shall finish the course of study for Local Preachers before being recommended to the Annual Conference to pursue the Course of Study for Candidates for Elder's Orders. The examination on the course of study for Local Preachers shall be taken before some member of the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders.
- 17. The President and his Advisory Board are to be the Board on Church and Parsonage Location.
- 18. The President and his Advisory Board are designated as a Deed Examining Committee for the Conference. When deeds to Conference, Church or Parsonage property are received, before being received, they shall be submitted to this Committee for examination, and the insertion of such disciplinary clauses as necessary to make the property safe for the Conference.
- 19. The Committee on Religious Services for the Conference shall be composed of the President and Es Advisory Board. The President of the W. H. and F. M. Seciety, the President of the Conference W. Y. P. S. and the paster of the entertaining church.
- 20. All pastors are required to subscribe to the Wesleyan Methodist and the Wesleyan Missionary.
