#### STANDING RULES:

1. The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President, who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds, abstracts. and other valuable papers. The Conference shall pay for rent on space.

2. The President and Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deeds for churches, parsonages, or other Conference property are to be submitted to them for examination before recorded, to make sure that such disciplinary clauses

are included as are needed to make such property secure to the Conference.

3. The Conference shall convene annually on Monday following the last Sunday of July, subject to the approval of the board of administration. The Conference sermon shall be preached Monday night, with the business session beginning Tuesday morning. Camp Meeting shall begin on the following Thursday evening, continuing through two

4. The local church fiscal year shall end June 30th. Pastors shall report membership as of this date. The conference treasurer shall close his books July 10th. The

pastoral year shall end with the closing of camp meeting.

5. Near the end of the fiscal year the Conference secretary shall forward one copy of each pastor's statistical blank, to the Conference treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item No. IX "Disbursed for Budget", forwarding the same to each pastor. The pastor shall complete the report in full, make a second copy and be ready to read it the first day of Conference.

6. Pastors are required to report number of calls at the time of reading their

report.

- 7. The following items of the Pastor's Statistical report shall be read each year on the Conference floor: Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodists, Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership, gain or loss; Average Sunday School Attendance; number of church Buildings, Value and Insurance; Item VII Complete; Total Contributed for Church; Item IX complete; Total Benevolence; and the Contributed totals.
- 8. Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- 9. The Conference Secretary and Treasurer shall each be paid ten dollars annually from the Conference Treasury.

10. No Treasurer is allowed to pay out funds without proper authorization.

11. The Standing Rules of the Conference are to be included in the Conference Minutes from year to year.

12. The Superannuate Pension Fund Treasurer shall be a member of the Superannuate Pension Fund Committee.

13. The Camp Meeting Board shall consist of seven members: the President of the Annual Conference, W.M.S. President, W.Y. President, and Camp Meeting Treasurer who will be members by virtue of their offices; and that the other members be elected from the floor after the election of Conference officers.

14. The Conference W.Y. President and the Conference Treasurer and the Conference W.M.S. President will be members of the Conference Board of Church Extension and

Evangelism, by virtue of their offices.

15. The pastor of each charge shall send to the Conference President written notice of the names of each delegate-elect from his church, said notice to be sent immediat-

- ely following the official election of said delegate or delegates.

  16. All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof, and the Conference officials and all pastors shall keep these regulations in mind in helping their young people plan this important preparation for service.
- 17. The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and the platform.

18. The time of meeting for the conference sessions shall be as follows: mornings 9:00 a.m. to adjourn at 11:30 a.m., afternoons 1:30 p.m. to adjourn by motion.

19. The time for the election of conference officers shall be set for 9:00 a.m. the first Wednesday of conference.

2. To conduct as many revivals within the conference as they deem their time would permit and the churches would tender.

3. The Conference President hold the last quarterley meeting in each church and assist in an advisory capacity in as many others as time would allow. The Conference President shall schedule these meetings in agreement with the pastors.

4. Be privileged and expected to meet with local church boards and leaders

for consultation.

5. The general plan of promotion be by the conducting of consultation periods, visitation campaigns, Sunday School and Youth conventions, camps, monthly ministerial fellowships, teacher training, C.Y.C., and Operation Outreach."

Mr. Aarhus was asked to appear before the committee to elaborate on the written complaint presented to the committee. A tape recording was made of the committee meeting & is on file along with the written complaint. The complaint registered by Mr. Aarhus primarily grew out of proceedings incident to his surrendering his Ministerial Credentials in 1959. The hearing lasted for approximately 1 hour and a half. Mr Aarhus presented his complaint and Rev. Cline was given the opportunity to reply to the same.

The Rev. Mr. Cline did not perticipate in the decision of the committee. After careful consideration the other two members of the committee voted:"It is our conviction that the complaint is without foundation and that the reply of Rev. Mr. Cline answers the complaint made against him. We therefore pass his character without equivocation." Virgil A. Mitchell concurs in this action.

- 1. The chair shall appoint the Conference session committees.

#### ending Rules, Contd.

O. There shall be a nominating committee whose duties shall be to present nominions for all the regular session committees of the conference. This committee shall sist of the conference President as chairman, and three Elders elected annually the conference. The conference shall, each year, designate two churches whose legates shall also be a part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior the opening of each annual conference at a time and place designated by the present. It shall nominate session committees and may serve to nominate special comm-

es as the conference may request.

11. Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and a soline allowance. When these are paid they shall be reported in Item VII of the stor's Statistical report on separate lines.
