The 89th Annual Session of the Iowa Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America, convened at the Wesleyan Methodist Campgrounds, Charles City, Iowa, on Wednesday morning, August 12, A. D. 1942, at 9: 30 o'clock. The Conference was called to order by Conference President, Rev. Clarence Budensiek of Charles City, Iowa.

On motion it was voted that the Conference Treasurer be reimbursed by the Conference for his expenses, plus his regular fee.

On motion it was ordered that the former and present Conference Secretaries be paid the regular sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) each.

On motion it was carried that the Temperance Secretary be given her expense up to the sum of Ten Dollars (\$10.00).

On motion the Conference ordered the Postmaster be paid five cents (.05) per mile for his services.

On motion it was voted that the Prayer League Secretary be paid all expenses.

A motion carried that the Caretaker of Rooms be paid Five Dollars (\$5.00).

On prevailing motion the Conference President was granted Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), for house rent.

On motion it was carried that the Conference President be given two weeks vacation, with regular salary.

On motion it was voted that all pastors be given a two weeks vacation with pay, and one Sunday's absence from the pulpit.

On motion, which passed, it was recommended that the minimum cash salary for each Pastor be the sum of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00): also that the Conference President encourage each Charge, if possible, to raise this amount.

On motion Conference adjourned sine die.

- I. "Resolved, That the meetings open at 9:30 a. m."

"Resolved, (1) That the Conference President be required, authorized, and appointed to travel the Conference as President, having general supervision of the Spiritual interests and benevolences thereof, holding at least one service at each church during the year under such date as he may announce in advance; (2) That he shall raise funds to meet the demands of the Conference work, assisted by the Pastors and he shall receive contributions for missions, education, and Superannuated Ministers where there are no Pastors; (3) That he shall have general supervision of the church property, and shall inquire into the titles of the same to see that no property is loosely held, and shall look after the rental of Conference property and see that the rent is turned into the treasury, and he shall investigate the possibility and feasibility of the sale of property not in use, and report his findings to the next Annual Conference; (4) That he shall be authorized to grant letters to disbanded classes: (5) That he shall be required to write non-resident members of the Conference asking them in case they cannot send to write the Conference a letter of greeting and state the condition of their religious experience; (6) That he shall devote as much time as possible and as occasion may afford in evangelistic and other meetings in the Conference; (7) That he may engage such help from time to time as may be available and that he may consider properly qualified to assist in holding evangelistic and quarterly meetings; such help to be remunerated from the Church Extension Fund; (8) That he shall be paid from the Conference Budget the sum of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) and expenses of travel and correspondence per year for his services, the same to be paid monthly in advance."
- III. "Resolved, That the Missionary Board is hereby authorized to pay out all monies to be paid from the Church Extension Fund."
- IV. "Resolved, That all reports of Committees be made in writing, complete and ready for the printer, and handed to the Secretary at the earliest possible date after such report is made."
- V. "Resolved, (1) That the camp ground property be under the care of the Camp Meeting Committee; (2) That this committee shall have power to engage workers beyond the present year."
- VI. "Resolved, That all Sunday Schools under the pastoral oversight of Wesleyan Methodist Pastors may be included in their statistical report."

We thank God for the privilege of meeting here during these times of stress. We enjoy the freedom of speech, press and the privilege of upholding Jesus.

Be it resolved:

That we definitely encourage the attendance of our young people in our Christian schools. We pledge ourselves to be faithful in the attendance of and service to our own Church as we expect our pastors to be faithful. We further pledge our full coöperation to them. Reverence for the house of God and religious services is inseparable from spiritual life, therefore let us maintain such by example and precept, thereby proving our love to God.
