RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE INDIANA CONFERENCE

- 1. It is contrary to the spirit of the Discipline and our principles for our preachers to assist in any service with oath-bound societies.
- 2. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship should not be open to any evangelist or minister of any other church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments. Any waiving of the above resolution by a contract or lease of building must be obtained through the Board of Trustees of the Indiana Conference.
- 3. Whereas, We have a scholastic standard for our preachers, and whereas those saved, sanctified and called among our own numbers are compelled to meet these requirements before ordination: Be it resolved, That the Committee on Itineracy and Elder's Orders shall require all those desiring to unite with us from any other denomination of Annual Conference to present credits equivalent to our Conference Course of Study, regardless of their standing in the body of which they have been a member, and if they cannot do this they shall be required to meet the same conditions as our local preachers before ordination.
- 4. That any candidate for Elder's Orders or traveling under the direction of the Conference, who fails to attend the Institutes and the examinations of the Committee, without sufficient cause, shall be deemed unworthy of the trust and care of souls, and refused a place among us as a minister of the Gospel, and when they shall fail to attend the Institute for two successive years they shall be dropped from the roll.
- 5. The Committee on Elder's Orders is hereby to transfer all persons to the study list who may have been recommended to travel and may not have been given work.
- 6. Whereas, The Discipline requires that the Stewards must meet the Pastors and agree as to the amount necessary for their support; Be it resolved, That the circuits may at the same time enter into an agreement in writing with the Pastor as to the service he is to render to the church. In case the Pastor shall fail to render such services, unless providentially hindered or released by the circuit, said failure shall be considered a sufficient cause to make an adjustment of the amount originally agreed upon. Otherwise the contract shall be binding upon both parties the same as any other financial obligation entered into by contracting parties.
 - 7. The membership, so far as possible, shall pay all their contri-

butions for the Conference and Connectional interests to the Pastors, who shall receipt them for the same and see that it is paid to the proper authorities. Where money is paid direct to the Conference Treasurer by the membership, he shall send a duplicate receipt to the pastor of the charge where such persons are members.

- 8. All charges with a membership of twenty-five or more shall in addition to the regular stipulated salary, assume the responsibility of providing a suitable home in which the Pastor may live.
- 9. Be it resolved, That it shall be the duty of the Pastors to look after the insurance of our church and parsonage properties. All insurance shall provide for losses caused by fire and lightning, hail and tornado. A failure on the part of the Pastor shall be a censurable offense. If the church fails to insure their property upon reasonable effort of the Pastor to secure the same, then said failure shall be reported to the President of the Conference who shall then have the property insured. In such case all insurance monies received from losses by fire, lightning, hail and tornado shall be used in Church Extension work as the Conference Board of Trustees deems best.
- 10. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the Pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said Pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary; provided this shall not interfere with the previous arrangements between Pastors and charges. That where the Conference demands the services of any one, that it shall bear the moving expenses, if any expense shall thus be incurred.
- 11. Each Pastor shall file a duplicate statistical report with the Committee before the close of the second day of Conference, said report to be kept on file one year, and hereafter these reports shall not be read in open Conference. The official character of no Pastor shall be passed until he shall have submitted a satisfactory report, including statistics.
- 12. All unaccounted for members appearing in the statistics in the membership list shall be transferred to the discontinued list. All members in excess of the number reported shall be reported received. The roll of all the classes upon the charges shall be put in the hands of the Pastors and they shall have charge of the same and make all entries therein.
- 13. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the President shall receive \$35.00, the Secretary \$50.00, the Treasurer \$100.00, the Assistant Secretary \$25.00, and each member of the Statistical Committee \$25.00, each member of the Auditing Committee \$10.00, Assistant to the Treasurer \$10.00, the same to be apportioned pro-rata among the various funds of the Conference; each mem-

ber of the Camp Meeting Committee \$15.00, and the Treasurer of the Camp Meeting Association \$40.00.

- 14. It shall be a standing rule until revoked by this body that the President shall nominate his Advisory Board and the Conference shall elect his nominations.
- 15. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference that in the examination of character the Conference officials shall be called first.
- 16. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be elected as follows: One for three years, one for two years, and one for one year, and that the person elected for three years be chairman of the Committee, and that hereafter each member be elected for three years.
- 17. It shall be a standing rule of this Conference until revoked by vote that the Conference Sunday School Secretary receive \$50.00, and each of the other members of the Conference Sunday School Board receive \$25.00, the same to be paid out of the Conference Sunday School Treasury.
- 18. Be it resolved, That if any lay-member of the church shall be guilty of immorality, and later be brought to repentance; that they shall not be put into any position of public leadership in the church either by election or appointment, until after at least two consecutive years of exemplary Christian life.
- 19. The Pastor shall bring to each Quarterly Meeting a fully itemized report of his labors during the quarter. The report shall be itemized as follows: 1. Number of sermons preached. 2. Number of prayer meetings attended. 3. Number of other services held. 4. Amount of cash salary received. 5. Amount of gifts and donations. 6. Number of pastoral calls. 7. Number of members received in full relationship, in associate relationship. 8. Amount of budget raised.
- 20. Whereas, our people are being deceived by the erroneous teaching that Divine healing of the body through faith is in the Atonement the same as for sin, therefore:

Be it resolved, That we record our belief that the healing of the body is among the gifts of the Spirit according to 1 Cor. 12:7-11 hence not for all Christians at all times as it is not always the will of God to heal the body.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FINANCE AND APPROPRIATION

No. 3

Your Committee on Finance and Appropriation respectfully submit the following recommendations:

- 1. That the President shall have general oversight of all the work of the Conference and that he shall hold at least one quarterly meeting on each charge and the pastors shall arrange for the remaining quarterly meetings. He shall cooperate with the pastors in the raising of the budgets and the pastors are to report to him quarterly the amount of budget raised and where the pastors fail to report in doing this it shall require a vote of the Conference to pass his character. The president's salary is to be \$1,400.00 and expenses incident to his work.
- 2. That the office of Missionary Evangelist be continued as recommended by the President, his salary to be \$1,200.00 and his expenses not to exceed \$200.00.
- 3. That Conference Claims be 75 cents per member, the same to be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer quarterly except the Quarterly Meeting Apportionment should be paid the President when he holds the quarterly meeting. The President's salary shall be paid out of this fund.
- 4. That Conference Missions be 75 cents per member and the Missionary Evangelist's salary be paid out of this fund.
- 5. That the pastors and churches raise an amount equal to 25 cents per member for the Orphanage in the south. All money for this fund to be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer.

- 6. That all charges shall be apportioned 25 cents per member for College building fund.
- 7. Inasmuch as the stamp chart introduced by Brother West is proving a success, we recommend that our pastors urge the use of this plan in assisting in raising the Educational Budget.
- 8. We call attention to our Discipline, page 167 paragraph 343 and recommend that one Sunday each month be known as Home Missionary Sunday and the offering that day be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer monthly.
- 9. We recommend the Store House plan for the financing of our local church work and where placed in operation, we recommend the following percentage basis for distribution of funds: 60% for local church work; 12% for conference work; 8% for education; 16% home and foreign missions; 4% for miscellaneous. We further recommend that expense for tithing literature and postage be met by the Conference and that churches securing the services of the Store House Secretary meet his traveling expense.
- 10. We recommend that no budget shall be levied on new churches organized for the first year and only free will offerings the second.
- 11. We recommend the Treasurer's request that he be granted the privilege to close the books by the first day of August and that all Conference money be paid by this time.
- 12. We recommend the Apportionment to be as follows: Conference Claims, 75 cents; Conference Missions, 75 cents; Educational Budget, \$1.50; Home Missions, 50 cents; Foreign Missions, \$2.50; Orphanage, 25 cents; College Building Fund, 25 cents. Minutes same as last year.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

No. 5

We the Committee on Resolutions, beg to submit the following report:

The state of our country and the political situation should affect us as Christian people. We find ourselves in a peculiar situation because both of the major parties in their adopted platforms have yielded to the influences of the liquor traffic; one party declaring for repeal of the Eighteenth Amendment to the Constitution, the other a fifty-fifty proposition that would turn the progress of the cause of prohibition backward a great many years. We have been betrayed by our political leaders into the hands of the unrighteous.

Therefore be it resolved, That we pledge our support to such forces that stand squarely for the Eighteenth Amendment and the Wright Bone Dry Law. We as a Church have always stood for Christian citizenship and this is no time to retreat.

Inasmuch as the liquor interest and organized vice are resorting to every means to increase their profits, and in doing so have become a menace to society, we therefore urge our people to pray earnestly for our beloved nation, especially for her law-enforcement officers.

We also deplore the present breakdown in moral standards, particularly in sex relations, cigaret smoking, especially among women, nudeness of dress, letting down of womanly modesty and reserve in general. We beseech our people to avoid such behavior and dress as is the trend of the world and contrary to the Word of God. Inasmuch as certain influential social leaders are advocating the damnable prac-

tice of companionate marriage and birth control, we declare this to be not only unchristian, but if permitted by law would be a gross sin against society and amount to nothing less than legalized prostitution. We earnestly urge that our ministry keep informed on these matters and faithfully warn our people. We firmly believe the teaching of the Word of God and vital Christianity to be the only solution to prevalent moral problems.

Realizing the vital importance of early training, because it is the very foundation of life connections, we plead for spirituality in our church services, unwavering care with regard to family altar, Bible study, secret prayer as a safeguard to our children, and as a means of promoting the work of God in general.

We deplore the brazen immorality of the modern movie, and whereas those at the head of the large corporations have acknowledged that they must use the sex appeal and illicit love to make it a profitable business, and whereas those that are connected with this business have repeatedly said if the church people of this country would withdraw their support they could no longer operate, we recommend that our ministry urge our members to read the annual conference minutes and especially to be informed of the Church Discipline pertaining to the above matters, and when deemed necessary, that parts of the Discipline be read in public meeting or a drill be conducted at the suitable times.

We recognize an increasing spirit of irreverent conduct throughout the land. A disrespect for the House of God, the Sabbath, the ministry and the Word of God.

May our beloved people avoid boisterous, irreverent conduct in the House of God and have reverence for the Lord's Day by refraining from attendance at family reunions and picnics on that day, and from making the Sabbath a week-end holiday, and to hold the ministry in high esteem for their work's sake.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

No. 9

We are very glad to report splendid interest in Sunday School work throughout the Conference, with a growing interest in teachers training work. A class of twelve having graduated at Fairmount, Indiana. The Commencement address was given August 12, 1932, by Conference Sunday School Secretary. The class was taught very capably by Mrs. Claude Rigsbee, who has since organized a class of ten, who are well on the way toward graduation.

In January 1932 Rev. Thomas Ballard of Fowler, Indiana completed the course with a general average of 94 % and was granted his diploma.

In June 1932 Rev. Virgil Vardaman of Logansport finished the course and was granted his diploma.

July 25, 1932 a certificate was granted to the Loyal Dorcas Sunday School Class of Fairmount Sunday School.

Six very enthusiastic conventions were held in the second and third weeks of May in various parts of the state with large crowds at each of the conventions and a number of seekers at the altar in the evening services.

We recommend that the conference districting remain the same as last year, to be sub-divided into eastern and western sections as follows:

Etna, Portland, South Salem, Summitville, Laketon, Warren charges, Bluffton, with Rev. C. G. Payne as District Superintendent.

PRESIDENT'S ANNUAL ADDRESS

Dear Co-Workers:

Another year has glided into eternity and we meet again in our Annual Conference to take an inventory of our work and plan to move forward toward the final goal of evangelizing the world.

The enemy is still at work and trying to defeat us which shows very clearly that the time has not yet come when we can safely lessen our activities or slacken our efforts to spread the gospel in every land. We still realize that the depression has us in its grip but may we not be so self-centered that we cannot think of those in far greater need than we? Even professed Christians surround themselves with luxuries while they forget the suffering heathen without God and without hope in the world.

As long as there are grateful hearts, there will be thank-offering boxes. The box may be of alabaster or it may be of pasteboard, but it brings to the Saviour's feet an offering, very precious in His sight. That was a wonderful thank-offering when Mary opened her thank-offering box of alabaster at Jesus' feet. The fragrance of it has lingered about the sweet story for twenty centuries. (John 12:1-9). It was Mary's best gift, and she lavished it with all the wealth of her loving gratitude on the One who had done most for her. Mary's gift was costly but it was the self-denying love expressed in the sacrifice that pleased the Master.

Last fall in our Convention, Brother Carter used the Parable of the Good Samaritan and it has meant so much more to me since that time.

Parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:30-37)

The figure of the good Samaritan has furnished to all centuries since the time of Christ, a working model of what religion should mean in daily life. It has helped the world to remember what Jesus did not wish men to forget—that religion is social and neighborly. Jesus presents a beautiful and convincing picture of what a neighborly spirit of love does. One of our greatest dangers today is that of living a life so sheltered and so busy that we do not see the man in need. We live in a pleasant community, belong to a good church and we rarely feel the pain of misery or anguish or poverty.

Whenever you find yourself asking "Who is my neighbor?" what you need is not information, but to discover the limit of your duty, but to be filled with the spirit of love that knows no limit. The world needs more neighbors. It can never have too many. We can well spare multitudes of men and women who are forever asking questions, mourning over social problems, searching for the boundary lines of responsibility and duty. But men and women who do things, kind things, neighborly things, re-

gardless of boundaries and claims we can never have enough of them. What does this "Go and do thou likewise" mean to us here and now. Each of us must answer for himself and having anwered, we must seek to meet the new necessity, as advisably, as kindly and as lovingly as did the Good Samaritan.

When we think of the turmoil we are in politically, I am made to wonder how long, oh, Lord, how long. I feel we must arouse ourselves to the great responsibility that is ours, yours and mine, whether we recognize it or not, it is upon us and we must remember we are our brother's keeper to a great extent.

And if the Eighteenth Amendment is repealed, it may be the ruin of your boy or girl, if not, some Mother's child. Are we interested only in our own household?

Let us pray and do our best to rid our land of all that will defile and destroy.
