STANDING RULES

I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.

II. All visiting members of our own, or other Churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.

III. The Conference President shall receive twenty dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.

IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.

V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive twenty-five dollars (\$25) per year for his services in caring for the funds.

VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Superannuated Ministers' Relief Association also shall close his books one week before the Conference session.

VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpected balance shall be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.

VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.

IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference, or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.

WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH

X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.

XI. The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer.

XII. In securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church shall be secured, if this can be done.

XIII. The Camp Meeting Committee shall be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers, and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the Budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed, the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals, except as provided above.

XV. The offerings for Superannuated Ministers shall be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

XVI. That the Preachers in reading their reports at Conference read only items in the aggregate.

XVII. That the Committee on Credentials secure the necessary credentials as provided by our Discipline, from each delegate, with the post office of the same.

DAILY JOURNAL OF PROCEEDINGS

The ninety-fifth annual session of the Champlain Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. A. J. Allen, Tuesday June 30th, 1936, at 7:30 p. m. The song service was in charge of Rev. C. L. Hill.

A prayer service followed in which much of the presence of the Lord was felt. Meeting was adjourned to meet at 8:30 Wednesday a. m.

Wednesday Morning Meeting

Devotions were in charge of Rev. H. R. LaVere, at 8:30. Conference was called to order promptly at 8:45 by the President, A. J. Allen.

First item of business was the roll call, after which the Committee on Credentials made a partial report, which was accepted. Motion was carried that as other names were presented to the roll of Delegates they be added without a vote of Conference. Roll of Delegates was called.

The bar of Conference was fixed to include the first five seats from the front, including the first seat, in the center row.

Committee on Character was elected as follows: Elder, W. F. Lewis; Layman, W. G. Olney. The President presented an outline for the Orders of the Day—See Report. Conference fixed the time for opening and closing of Conference as follows: opening of morning session, 8:30; closing by vote. Afternoon, opening, 1:30, closing by vote.

Committee on Pastoral Relations were elected as follows: Elders—C. L. Hill, S. H. Miller, L. C. Mattoon; Laymen—W. G. Olney, Harry Hall, Fred Shippee.

Conference now took a recess to give place for a meeting of the Superannuate Society. See Report.

Adjourned by vote. Benediction by S. H. Miller.

Wednesday Afternoon

Devotions were in charge of S. H. Miller.

Business—Roll was called after which the minutes of the morning meeting were read and approved. The President gave his Annual Report. See Report.

Rev. W. L. Thompson, our Connectional Representative, was introduced to Conference, and made appropriate remarks. Rev. Harold Douglass, of the Rochester Conference, was introduced to Conference. A letter of transfer was granted to Rev. R. J. Grayson, to the Allegheny Conference.

Conference voted to accept an invitation given by C. R. Stopp to hold the Ministerial Institute at Norfolk. Time—Oct. 6, 7, 8.

Conference recessed for 5 minutes, after which an Order of the Day was taken up, that of hearing the Conference sermon, by Rev. C. L. Hill. Singing was in charge of C. R. Stopp. Prayer by Charles Dayton.

Brother Hill brought a very helpful message from the Revelation, "John's letter to the seven churches of Asia."

Conference adjourned by vote. Benediction by Rev. E. D. Carpenter.

Wednesday Evening

Song service was in charge of Rev. C. R. Stopp. Prayer was offered by Rev. Jesse Whitecotton, after which Rev. W. L. Thompson brought a very inspiring and helpful message.

Thursday Morning

At 8:30 devotions were led by Rev. O. M. Finch. Business at 8:45.

Roll was called and minutes of former meeting read and approved.

The following names were called and passed: Rev. A. J. Allen, Rev. Floyd Banker, Rev. E. D. Carpenter, Rev. Duane Chadwick, Rev. J. J. Davison, Rev. Charles Dayton, Rev. O. M. Finch, Rev. R. J. Grayson, Rev. C. L. Hill, Rev. G. D. Jock.

Moved and carried that the matter of the Stony Creek charge be referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations. A partial report of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders was given and accepted.

Conference took a recess of five minutes, which brought us up to an Order of the Day, that of hearing the Connectional Report, by Rev. W. L. Thompson.

Conference adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by Rev. G. D. Jock.

Friday Morning Meeting

Devotions were conducted by Rev. Florence Shippee at 8:30.

Business—At 8:45 Conference was called to order by the President. Roll was called, and minutes of former meeting read and approved.

The Conference Treasurer gave his report, which was accepted. See Report. Time for an Order of the Day having come, Conference proceeded to elect Officers for the coming year.

The President appointed A. O. Northrup, W. F. Lewis, C. L. Hill, and Reginald Hewett as tellers.

The first ballot was cast for President, and Rev. A. J. Allen was elected. Vice-President, Rev. G. D. Jock; Secretary, Rev. L. C. Mattoon; Treasurer, Rev. H. R. LaVere; Sunday School Secretary, Rev. Charles Dayton; Tithing Secretary, Dennis Osgood.

Time was fixed for the next meeting of the Annual Conference for July 6th, 1937, at 7:30 a. m. on camp ground at West Chazy, N. Y.

Time fixed for the Y. M. W. B., W. Y. P. S., and Sunday School Convention was August 25, 26 and 27.

The following names were called and passed: Rev. A. O. Northrup, Rev. H. R. LaVere, Rev. W. F. Lewis, Rev. L. C. Mattoon.

Rev. A. O. Northrup requested a loan from the Conference for the Morley Church. This was referred to the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

Adjourned by limitation of time. Benediction by R. Hewett.

Saturday Morning Meeting

Devotions by Rev. W. F. Lewis.

Business—Roll was called and minutes of last meeting read and approved. The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its report. See Report. Report was considered Item by Item.

Item I on stationing of pastors was adopted. Item II referring to the Stony Creek Charge was adopted. Item III, request of A. O. Northrup for a loan of money was adopted. Item IV was also adopted. The report of the Committee on Pastoral Relations was then adopted as a whole. See Report.

The Camp Meeting Committee reported to Conference on the matter of entertaining young people from the charges of the Conference, which report follows, viz.

We, the Camp Meeting Committee to which was referred the matter of entertaining young people, recommend: That Conference entertain not to exceed four young people, or the equivalent of four young people from each charge in the Conference, ranging in years from 13 to 20 years.

Free lodging is to be given, and board at the rate of 21 meals for \$2.00. Voted by the Committee. Report was accepted.

Motion was made and carried that Rev. W. F. Lewis be a committee to arrange in regard to young people who may desire to attend camp in 1937. Pastors are to notify Rev. Lewis, who and how many desire to attend from each charge, and whether young men or women, by June 1st, 1937.

Conference recessed to give place for an Order of the Day which was the young people's meeting.

Sunday Morning Meeting

This was an ordination service in which one young man was set apart to the office and work of an Elder in the Church, Rev. Reginald Hewett. Rev. Jesse Whitecotton brought the message of the morning, after which, by the impressive service of ordination, Rev. Reginald Hewett was ordained an Elder.

Sunday Afternoon Service

At 1:30 a ring meeting was held outside the Tabernacle in which a goodly number took part in singing and praising God.

At 2:30 the preaching service was called in the Tabernacle. Rev. W. D. Correll brought the message. In the evening service the Rev. W. L. Thompson brought the message, which brought to a close a good day in the service of the Lord.

Monday Morning Meeting

Devotions were in charge of Rev. Dennis Osgood.

Business—Roll was called and minutes read and approved.

Rev. S. H. Miller, having been nominated as Chairman of the Southern District of the Conference, was elected by Conference, as Chairman of the Southern District, for the holding of all day Holiness meetings. Rev. O. M. Finch was elected Chairman for the Northern District, for the same purpose.

Committee on Resolutions gave its report. Report was adopted. See Report.

Moved and carried that the Committee on Credentials secure from each Delegate elected to Conference, as prescribed by Discipline with name of Delegate and post office address of same. The above order was voted a standing rule of Conference.

Motion was made and carried that the Camp Meeting Advertising carry in it the prices of meals and rooms.

Moved and carried that the Caretaker of the camp ground have charge of renting of rooms, also getting of rooms ready for rent.

Conference voted to accept the invitation from Glens Falls, to hold the Y. M. W. B., W. Y. P. S. and Sunday School Convention with that church.

Committee on Statistics gave its report, which was accepted. See Report. Moved and carried that the Conference, through the President and Secretary, back a note given by the Heuvelton Church for an amount not to exceed \$1000.00.

Moved and carried that Rev. E. D. Carpenter shall preach the Conference sermon, Wednesday afternoon, July 7th, 1937. Rev. O. M. Finch, alternate.

Motion was made that the President, in consultation with pastor of the Macomb Charge, secure some one, if possible, to take over the Macomb work. Motion was carried.

Following names were called and passed: Rev. S. H. Miller, Rev. J. F. Wright, Rev. Dennis Osgood, Rev. Mary Robinson, Rev. J. F. Wright.

Conference Secretary was instructed to write Conference greetings to Rev. J. F. Wright, also Rev. Mary Robinson.

The names of Rev. C. R. Stopp, Rev. F. C. Taylor, Rev. Florence Shippee, Rev. H. H. Chapman, Rev. Nathan Capen, Rev. Reginald Hewett were called and passed. An extension of time was voted, in order to finish Conference business. The name of Rev. F. H. Wright, and Rev. C. C. Murray were called and passed. Moved and supported that Conference adjourn to the call of the Chair. Prayer and Benediction, by the President, Rev. A. J. Allen. Thus was brought to a close a very gracious, and harmonious session of Conference. With great faith and expectation, we look forward to the coming year, and pray that it may be the very best of all years.

Report No. 3

PLAN OF WORK

We recommend:

1. That each Local Society shall have some Missionary Study or Program at each meeting, to enlighten our minds, broaden our vision and inspire our hearts to pray definitely for our work and workers on each of our mission fields. Aids to this are study book, Missionary Magazine, or correspondence with our missionaries.
2. That each Local Society shall have at least one public meeting during the year in which missionary needs shall be emphasized.
3. The observance of special days such as Harvest Day—for Educational Work; Easter Program for Home Missions; Wesleyan Missionary Day with program to secure Missionary Magazine subscriptions; and co-operate in observing the World Day of Prayer for the outpouring of the Spirit of God upon us all and a Connection-wide revival.

4. That each Local Society elect a Solicitor for the Wesleyan Missionary to keep account of needed renewals and gain as many new subscribers as possible.

5. That the President be a subscriber to the Wesleyan Methodist and Wesleyan Missionary, also Secretary and Treasurer and 50% of the membership subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary.

6. That all use Thank Offering Boxes in the Local Societies.

7. That each Local Society continue the sending of \$6.00 for Southern Mountain Work, also \$5.00 for Hephzibah Orphanage, annually to the Conference Treasurer to be forwarded to the General Treasurer. This all applies on Budget.

8. That each Local Society sending money for any branch of the work see that the Pastor receives duplicate receipt so that proper credit may be given on the Budget.

9. That \$.25 per member dues be sent to the Conference Treasurer, half of which is to be retained in the Conference for expense and the other to be forwarded to the General Treasurer.

10. That we continue the sending of supplies to the Foreign Missionary fields, such as bandages, religious pictures, calendars or Sunday School cards. Also the sending of clothing, comforts and gifts to our Home Missionary fields.

11. That all goods sent to our Mission fields be sent to those in charge of said work. That proper credit be given for such goods in our annual report to Conference, but not in the column with cash receipts and disbursements.

12. That we continue to send clothing or cash as directed by our Orphanage Committee, Mrs. Rose Miller, for the care of the boys and girls at our Orphanage at Macon, Georgia, direct to Brother Jones, and not to Sister Miller. However be sure to send her a statement of what is sent.

13. That we make a special effort this year to send blankets, comforts, sheets, pillow cases and pillows for the Camp Ground. Also fruit and vegetables to help in entertainment at the Dining Hall. Tithing our canning will aid in this.

14. That if possible we shall have at least one Missionary Convention during the year in the different districts, or, if possible the Conference as a whole, with a missionary as speaker.

15. That each Delegate report to the Local Society at the first meeting after Conference the proceedings at Conference and read her report, and give any needed information concerning the work.

16. That the Plan of Work and also Standing Rules be read and emphasized quarterly in our Local Society meetings.
