



McLeister, President of the General W. H. & F. M. S., spoke Thursday evening on Missions. Evangelistic services were held preceding and during the Conference by Rev. E. R. Dodd, who was much blessed in the Ministry of the word. Some of our young preachers helped in the singing. The Lord set His seal on the session in the closing service, several precious souls were helped in seeking the Lord. May the good work go on. (Note—On account of the expense of printing the Minutes

STANDING RESOLUTIONS

1. There shall be a Committee of Auditing and Finance in the Conference; this shall be a Standing Committee-

2. The Conference Treasurer shall have full right to refuse any pastor's statistical report which is not completely filled out.

3. All pastors are required to place their receipts and monies counting on the budget in the hands of the Conference Treas. 10 days before each Annual Conference.

4. The evening services of Conference shall be given up to evangelistic services except when of necessity ordered otherwise.

President's Official Report.

To the Members of the Canada Annual Conference:

Dear Brothers and Sisters,—Again we are assembled and this time at the most important period of the history of our church and of this country. Just a month or so and the Banner unfurled by Methodism, the great revival church of the last three cen-

turies, will be pulled down and the name "United Church" placed in its stead. The work of standing by the old Flag that has stood for everything fundamental to Christian life and experience, and has always had for its motto: "Holiness unto the Lord," is left to a few Free and Wesleyan Methodists, as far as name is concerned with some other Holiness bodies. How do we know but that God raised us up twenty-eight years ago to fill this breach? Shall we be true to our trust, stand by the old land marks and press the battle on? Do we each answer, "God helping me, I will!"

The revival efforts of the past year have been blessed of God, at every point where held, souls have been saved and believers sanctified. I have travelled the Conference in quarterly meetings as well as holding special meetings in Ottawa, Shawville, Waltham and Stark's Corners. From the field work I have received \$195.76

Early in the Conference year I sent Bro. Heslop his transfer to the Rochester Conference.

With the consent of the Advisory Board, Bro. Hamilton was released from Berwick and the work put in the hands of Bro. Harvey Robinson.

Bro. Harold Higginson who has gone to the Michigan Conference was given a letter of standing and Bro. J. E. B. Cowan was received. This brother has been accepted as Missionary to Africa and being a graduate of Asbury College, having obtained his A. B. degree and expecting his B D. soon, asks us to ordain him and send him out as a Canadian Missionary as he is a member of our Ottawa church where his mother lived until her translation a few months ago.

I would suggest the continuance of last year's program in reference to the Books on the Course of Study, the Home Mission work, the travelling president, and especially that we stand by the book in the propogation of the essential doctrines of Methodism, justification by faith and sanctification, the eradication of the sin principle by the Baptism of the Holy Spirit, with continued and frequent anointings for the work the Lord has for us to do

- 4. That at least one ministerial institute be held within the bounds of the Conference each year, arrangements for such Institute be made by Committee of Itinerancy and Orders, and that the committee of Auditing and Finance arrange for the expenses of said Institute.
- 5. That more attention be paid to the weaker points within the bounds of the Conference.
