of great national emergency defense, in this time of good jobs and good wages, we urge a stricter reverence for the Sabbath day, that since God worked six days and rested the seventh, as an example, and said, "Six days shalt thou labor and do all thy work," as a command, that we refrain from buying or doing any unnecessary work on the Sabbath.

Again we urge all our people to take a stand by word, vote and influence against the liquor traffic, that in every way possible as never before, we seek its desruction by refraining to buy or eat in places where it is sold, by opening our churches for temperance rallies with dynamic speakers and programs, that we use our pens as well as our voices in petitioning our senators and representatives relative to our convictions.

Again, we would like to ask this conference body to draw up a petition in official form properly signed by the officers of the conference requesting the passage of a National Prohibition Act for the duration of the war. A copy of the same to be sent to the President, Secretary of the Navy, Secretary of War, also to the members of the House of Representatives and the Senators from the State of Alabama.
