JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Opening.—The thirty-second session of the Oklahoma Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection, or Church, of America convened at the Tabernacle, Ninth and Broadway, Enid, Oklahoma, Wednesday, 8:30 a. m., August 21, 1935, with the President and Secretary present.

Glenn I. Boardman had charge of the devotional services. J. F. Insley led the singing. Iva E. Crofford and P. H. Hodge led in prayer. Brother Boardman then read the fifty-fourth chapter of Isaiah.

Conference came to order. Orders of the day were called. All joined in singing, "Blest Be the Tie That Binds." Iva E. Crofford led in prayer. Rev. John E. McGraw preached the Conference Sermon. The text was Psa. 133:1, "How good and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity."

Adjourned for committee work.

Thursday

Report No. 4

RESOLUTIONS

1. Realizing the great need of the supernatural; and knowing that the same can be had only as the result of much prayer and fasting: we therefore resolve, That each of us spend a certain amount of time each day in secret prayer. Also that we urge our people to pray earnestly and continually for a Connectional as well as a Conference revival.

2. Realizing the value of Church government (the Discipline) and the tendency of our laity to disconform to it; therefore to avoid reproach and criticism, be it resolved, That our pastors frequently preach from, and our laity study our Discipline, that we may better live and avoid breaking our vows in relation to our Church.

3. Be it resolved, That we as Wesleyan Methodists bring all our tithes into the store-house of God; that the windows of Heaven may be opened and a blessing poured out such as we have not room to receive. (Malachi 3:8.)

4. Be it further resolved, That our Pastors and all leading Church workers earnestly urge that each family, in their respective church, subscribe for the Wesleyan Methodist paper.

5. On account of the unchristian teachings, and the looseness in morals in our Country and State Schools, be it resolved, That all who possibly can do so will make special efforts, to use our Church Schools, that their children might be educated in the higher morals, and a clean and pure Christian teaching, which cannot be obtained elsewhere.

6. Whereas, owing to the limitations of the borders of this district of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, and the possibility of its expansion and for the restoration of lost souls, be it resolved, That our pastors be permitted and urged to hold and conduct at least one revival meeting during this conference year, the same to be held in a new territory where the conditions are favorable to the organization of a church, or class.

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7. Whereas, the Master has commanded us to go into all the world and preach His gospel to every creature and that nowhere can it be found that that commission has ever been changed or revoked, we believe the responsibility is still on the Church. We further believe that the ability of complying with that command, is proportionate to the strength of the Church and the size of her established work in the home field. The command was "First in Jerusalem" which is the home base, and afterward to the "uttermost parts of the earth."

Therefore, be it resolved, That the Oklahoma Conference, now in session, take the proper steps and provide ways and means that her borders shall be extended by raising of funds for Conference Evangelism and the organization of churches in unoccupied territory.

Be it further resolved, That a Church Extension Band be organized of all persons that are willing to pay one dollar per year as an annual membership fee, into the treasury of the Conference, and one additional dollar for each new church building, purchased or built during the year, not to exceed four.

And, be it further resolved, That the President of the Conference be the Church Extension Secretary of the Conference, and that as far as possible, he shall be authorized to hold meetings in new places with a view to the organization of new churches, and that he take up offerings throughout the Conference, as well as in the meetings that he shall hold, to assist in paying the expense, and for his remuneration. All money thus raised will be credited to Home Missions.

8. Finally be it resolved, That this Conference go on record as being unalterably opposed to the prevailing intemperance as Sabbath desecration, gambling, and other forms of moral delinquency such as modern dancing, theater going, bathing in public swimming-pools, card playing, and the wearing of immodest attire (1st Tim. 2: 9, 10). We also condemn the use of tobacco in all or any form, likewise all alcoholic drinks.

One convention to be held in each district during the year. Also one General Convention to be held at Carwile the first week in May.

3. Arrange with the Pastor for one missionary prayer service the last week in each month, at which service a missionary offering is taken, such service to be preceded by fasting one meal.

4. That we contribute at least six dollars for Home Missions, the same to be sent to our Conference Treasurer.

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5. Twelve meetings during the year in which prayer service is held and business transacted.
6. Red Letter Days.
 - (a) Harvest Day—Educational work.
 - (b) Easter—program, gifts and offerings for Home missions.
 - (c) World Day of Prayer—that we coöperate in observing the world day of prayer.
7. Use Study Book.
8. Read the Plan of Work and the Efficiency Standard once each quarter.
9. Pay dues ten cents a month.
10. Adopt a definite program for helping the sick, poor and needy in the community.
11. Go definitely against tobacco advertisements in the papers, and its uses, also alcoholic drinks.
12. Pay twenty-five cents per member for General Conference Delegate expenses. (Permanent unless otherwise voted.)
13. Contribute at least five dollars to Hephzibah Orphanage, the same to be sent to our Conference Treasurer, also fill a gift box after learning the needs.

8. A Delegate elected to the Annual Conference of W. H. & F. M. S.

9. Report Blanks properly filled out on time.

10. At annual meeting instruct Delegate the amount to pledge for the society at Conference.

11. Elect officers at last meeting of Conference year.

12. A Superintendent and fully organized Y. M. W. B.
