Sister Sarah Smith from Philadelphia, Penn. an ordained Evangelist, who in her remarks warned against running from God when He calls for service, giving personal testimony of God's goodness and mercy when one

yields and forsakes their sinful ways to follow where He leads. Sister Smith's message was an inspiration to all.

THURSDAY - 4:00 P.M.: Speaker Rev. Liddic Reading from 1st Cor. 16: verses 8-9, "I will tarry at Ephesus until Pentecost, for a great door and effectual is opened unto me, and there are many adversaires. Brothe Liddick spoke of the progress and the retirement of three high Officials of The General Connection - Rev. Roy Nicholson, Rev. F. R. Birch, Rev. F. R. Eddy. To the 66th Annual Session of the South Ohio Conference, Christian greetings and a hearty thank you for sending me as your representative to the 30th Quardienial Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

The experience was a blessing in many ways to me, and feel I know more of Wesleyan Methodism and the ways our Annual Conferences and local churches are governed by having had this wonderful opportunity. Christian fellowship exhibited during debate, and differences of opinion, the wonderful exhibition of humility shown by our beloved late Oliver Wilson when the merger of the Pilgrim holiness with us failed by one vote. Requesting the whole assembly to rise and sing "Rock Of Ages" with tears streaming down his flushed face. derful messages given by our President, Dr. Roy Nicholson, especially the one Sunday Morning on the 17th chapter of St. John, As Josus prayed to His Father God that we may be as they were stressing the word as, as, as longing for us to be Godly. We met Missionaries from all parts of our world, heard directly of the progress as well as the needs of World's Missions. Dr. Nicholson was elected President Emeritis by unanimous vote as he resigned from active duty as President to General Conference, accepted ing with deep humility, after trying vainly to decline this honor. Dr. and Mrs. Nicholson celebrated their 35th Wedding Anniversary Friday. Gifts and flowers from Convention members were given them. The spiritual portion in hymns, prayer and prea-

ching were all messages long to be remembered. The main Tabernacle was about 350 ft. by 75' seating more than 3,000 people and was filled most every session. Instead of electing a President to succeed Dr. Nicholson, three General Superintendents were elected, Rev. Phaup. - Chairman, with Rev. Riesdorph and Rev. Sheets - Co-Chairman Rev. George E. Failing elected to office of Editor of Wesleyan Methodist Weekly. Dr. O. G. Wilson had received the highest -vote for General Superintendent, but was called to his final reward two days later, as he was about to be installed to Office. Remarks by President quote, "We were about to install him. God chose to crown him for faithfulness instead for he was steadfast until the end. " Three of our faithful Officers retiring from active duties, who had given a life time of consecrated service to God and office were Dr. Nicholson. Dr. Eddy and Dr. Birch though each will officiate in other capacities. One of the things I think may be of interest to each individual is the Burial Society of the W. M. Church, anyone 6 months to 60 years of age may enroll. Payment at death \$300,00, entrance fee \$1.00 to \$75.00 depending on age, then only 20% assessment to each member after the decease of a member. Met Dr. King and Elder Yukey of Jamica, both apparently strong in faith and Wesleyan Mothodism, heading a new work there. All fazes of the work were well prosented in printed form. Brocheues complete in debail I have and will be glad to lock up and answer anything that is of importance to any of you. The Card Call

Plan was stressed and its importance to the small mission churches in need of help in enlarging or building new churches.
