The baneful influence of the lewd and insinuating pictures by which cigaretts [sic] and some brands of tobacco are advertized, [sic] ministering to the basest of all human depravity, and especially the circulating of these among young boys: the awful licentiousness of

the age, and the low estimate put upon virtue in men and women, but especially among men: the corrupt methods of business in which deceit and falsehood are at a premium; the eager avericious [sic] and hard money getting spirit of the world, and many in the church; the great whirl of pleasure seeking and the awful forgetfulness of God are all features of the evil of the times which cause us to look with great concern for the future of our country.

Therefore resolve. That as ministers and members of the Rochester Conference, we will warn, reprove, entreat, and guide our people as much as in us doth lie, that our influence may be ever toward that which is good, and against that which is evil.
