DAILY PROCEEDINGS

August 7. 1967 - 9:00 A.M.

David Gowan led the group in singing "I Know Whom I Have Believed." Rev. Herman A. Smith read from I Corinthians 3:5-9 and exhorted us to be laborers together with God. Though the Corinthian church had been following several men, Paul states that it was not men but "God who gives the increase." Rev. Smith then asked the group to kneel as he led in prayer.

Rev. Ira Gross, Conference Vice President, opened the 74th Session of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church by suggesting that all ministerial and lay delegates be seated within the bar and to present their credentials.

The Roll of delegates was read. There were thirteen ministerial and sixteen lay delegates present.

The Conference Agenda was presented by the chairman. A motion to adopt it, with changes, carried.

The Committee on Vacancies reported. Report adopted. (#1)

The Nominating Committee reported. Motion to adopt carried. (#2)

The Conference Secretary read a letter from the Conference President, Rev. C. Wesley Lovin. A motion to adopt his report carried. (#3)

The Vice-President's report was given. Rev. Gross requested Rev. Lorin Miller take the chair while the report was read. Report was adopted. (#4)

Rev. Raymond Gilbert, Rev. Clarence Titus, and Rev. Clifford Watt were introduced to the Conference by Gordon Bennett of the Courtesy Committee. The group gave a standing welcome to these men.

Each of these men greeted the Conference and all were asked to be seated within the bar, on motion which carried.

Rev. Clifford Watt requested that his delegate be recognized and seated in the bar. Joe Maples, his delegate, was seated.

The Auditing Committee reported. Report adopted. (#5)

Conference Treasurer's report was given. Motion to receive this report with a vote of thanks was supported. Discussion followed. The motion was carried. (#6)

Motion to eliminate the General Budget Fund and the Literature Fund by incorporating both into the Work Fund. Carried.

Camp Treasurer and Manager reported. The treasurer's report was received as part of the record. The Manager's report was adopted with a standing vote of thanks. (#7)

The Sunday School Treasurer's report was given by the Sunday School Secretary. Motion to receive carried. (#8)

The Resolutions Committee made a partial report. Discussion followed. (#9)

A motion to refer the report to the committee carried.

A motion to recess for 15 minutes and to hear above revised report after recess carried.

Chair recognized the chairman of the Resolutions committee, Rev. Miller, who gave a report. Motion to accept report lost. (#10)

Adjournment on motion carried.

August 7. 1968 - 3:30 P.M.

The meeting was called to order and led in prayer by Rev. Ira C. Gross.

Roll Call was made. Ministerial - 13, Lay - 16.

Camp Meeting Board made a report. Report adopted. (#11)

Camp Board offered a report as a matter of information prepared by the board to be presented to the body. Motion to receive the report as a matter of information. Motion to amend the motion to receive the report for information but not for publication carried. Motion as amended carried.

Motion to refer report to Camp Board for more study and to bring back further information and recommendations pertaining to camp operations. Carried.

Motion to hear pastors' reports, subject to the approval of the Character Committee report carried.

Rev. Clarence Titus was requested to give an oral report and testimony.

August 8. 1968 - 9:00 A.M.

David Gowan led in singing "Sunlight." Rev. Raymond Gilbert read from Matthew 5:14 and 16 and gave an object lesson using light bulbs to emphasize the truth that every one, despite size, shape, or color has a special place in God's work and must shine to his full capacity because our Power Source is never failing. He then asked Rev. Miller to come to the front and lead in prayer.

The roll call was given.

The minutes of the previous day's business were read and approved. The Courtesy Committee introduced Rev. James Chrispell, camp evangelist, who gave words of greeting.

Motion to seat Rev. Chrispell within the bar carried.

Chairman, Rev. Ira C. Gross, introduced Rev. B. H. Phaup, our denominational representative, to the group. A motion for Rev. Phaup to assume chairmanship carried.

Rev. Phaup brought words of greeting from headquarters and expressed his pleasure at being in Oregon.

Tellers were appointed and given ballots to distribute.

Motion, with support, that the first ballot for President be a nominating ballot carried.

Camp manager made a recommendation to the Conference and was referred to the camp board for evaluation and report back to this conference session. Carried.

Motion was made to post the Statistical Report for reading instead of reading it before the body. (#15)

Motion was made to set aside the orders of the day. Carried.

Motion to refer the revolving fund balance to the Board of Managers for study carried.

Motion to defer Comity Committee election to 1968 carried.

Camp Meeting Board gave a special report. Carried. (#18)

The Insurance Secretary gave an oral report. Adopted. The Ministerial Committee gave an oral report. Adopted.

Courtesy Committee was recognized.

Rev. George K. Millen, Superintendent and fraternal delegate of the E. U. B. Church was presented. He presented the problem of the ministers of the E. U. B. Church in holding retirement credit while withdrawing from the merging bodies. He requested some kind of sanctuary for ministers during this period of change.

A resolution was presented to grant sanctuary, under direction of the General Board of Managers, to the ministers of the E. U. B. Church in Oregon. Adopted. (#19)

Adjourned by motion and prayer by Rev. Hiller.

Report 3 - CONFERENCE PRESIDENT

To the Members of the Oregon Conference:

It has been a privilege to serve you as president this past year. Other duties have kept me from spending as much time within the bounds of the conference as I would like. However, I was able to visit each church once. In addition to this, we were privileged to meet with the Board of Managers, the Camp Board, attend the Ministerial Convention, have part in the mortgage burning service at Seattle, and assist in the Salem Missionary Convention. Each of these occasions was an inspiration to my own heart.

It has been our desire to keep in touch with the conference by correspondence. For the most part, there has been response from this method of contact.

The reports of most of the churches will reflect growth which should give us a gain in the conference in every area. For this we praise the Lord.

One meeting was held which involved our Board of Managers and the Pilgrim Holiness Church Conference Council. It was a "get acquainted" meeting and I felt that all who attended became better informed about the progress and plans, or lack of them, in each group.

Report 7 - CAMP MANAGER'S REPORT

After due consideration and authorization of the Camp Board, two major improvement projects have been undertaken on the campgrounds this past year.

The first was the restoration and upgrading of the well and water system. Several factors, both locally and in the surrounding area, had combined to create a totally inadequate water supply for this year's camp operations. Corrective steps included cleaning of well and some increased depth, 34 feet added casing (perforated), a new submersible 3 hp pump, and a new 315 gallon pressure tank. Also involved, was the removing and replacement of the pump house. Total cost was approximately \$1200.

The second major project was additional clearing of wooded area to increase the park size. This has given a new dimension and appearance to our camp site even though there remains considerable hand work to be done in this additional cleared area. Total cost for this work was approximately \$402.

Lesser improvement projects included painting of tabernacle furniture by Brother and Sister Vreugdenhil (\$44); replacement of eight doors on buildings (\$136); some additional furniture in dining hall, dorm and workers rooms (\$151.50); and some general upgrading of dorm rooms and furniture by local Wils societies.

Items needing immediate attention this fall include roof repair and repair of heating system in caretaker's house; and the painting of community buildings.

A prime concern which must be considered by the conference on some sub-ordinate board, in the very near future, is how the camp meeting and conference objectives can best be realized in the most feasible manner. Factors to be studied should include fixed costs of overhead, capital investments and improvements, manpower resources, usages, adequate methods and personnel for routine maintenance other than additional heavy work loads on a few pastors or laymen.

STANDING RULES - Report 13

I. Property

A. Deeds:

- Custody: The clerk of each local society is to place the deed of the local church property in the hands of the Conference President who is custodian of the deed and who is empowered to rent a safety deposit space for the preservation of deeds and other valuables. (The conference shall pay for rent of space.)
- Ownership: All property that is held by the conference shall be deeded to the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, Inc. (Not to the Trustees of the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.)
- 3. Examination: The President and his Advisory Board are designated a deed examining committee. Deed for all conference properties are to be submitted to them for examination before recording to insure that such property is secure to the conference.

B. Legal Documents:

- Authorization for acquisition and disposition of property; the Annual Conference in session, or in the interim, the duly elected Conference Board of Trustees shall be empowered in handling Conference properties, acquisitions, dispositions and loans.
- 2. Authorized Agents: The President and Secretary of the Annual Conference, upon proper authorization by the Conference Board of Trustees of the Oregon Annual Conference in session, shall be empowered to sign notes, mortgages, and other instruments of acquisitions or conveyances of property of and for the Oregon Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.

II. Annual Conference Sessions

- A. Date: The annual conference and camp meeting shall be held the fourth full week in July of each year.
- B. Records and Statistics:
 - Fiscal year: The local church fiscal year shall end June 30. Pastors shall report membership as of this date. All conference treasurer's books shall be closed July 10. The pastoral service year shall end with the closing of Camp Meeting.
 - 2. Church's Statistical Report: Near the end of the fiscal year, the Conference Secretary shall forward one copy of each church's statistical blank to the Conference Treasurer, who after closing his books will fill in Item IX (Distributed for Budget) and forward the same to each respective pastor.
 - Pastoral Calls: Pastors are required to report number of calls at time of reading their reports.
 - 4. Reading Statistical Reports: The following items of the Church's Statistical Report shall be read each year on the conference floor: Pastor's calls; Wesleyan Methodist,

Wesleyan Missionary, and Wesleyan Youth subscriptions; present membership; gain or loss; average Sunday School attendance; number of church buildings; value and insurance; Item VII complete; total contributed for church; Item IX complete; total benevolences; and contributed totals.

C. Delegates:

- Election: Each church shall elect its delegates to the annual conference at the third quarterly business meeting.
- The pastor of each charge shall send credentials for each delegate-elect from his church immediately following their election to the Conference President and Secretary who shall be the credentials committee.

D. Committees:

- 1. Nominating: There shall be a Nominating Committee whose duties shall be to present nominations for all regular session committees of the conference. This committee shall consist of the Conference President as chairman and three elders elected annually by the conference. The conference shall also designate two churches whose delegates shall also be part of this committee. Said committee shall meet prior to the opening of each annual conference at a time and place designated by the President. It shall nominate session committees and special committees as the conference may request.
- 2. Standing Committees: The Apportionment (2 members); Religious Services (2 members and conference president); Auditing (2 members); Statistical (2 members); and Resolutions (2 members) shall be standing committees. These committees will function prior to and during the conference session following their election, whether their members are seated in the conference bar as delegates or not. When a committee member is unable to attend the session or act on his particular committee, he shall notify the Committee on Vacancies that they shall designate a replacement.

placement.
The standing committees shall do as much work as feasible prior to the convening of conference. The above named committees are to be elected from the floor during the election of conference officers.

E. Conference Bar:

 The bar of conference shall consist of the first four rows of seats in the tabernacle and platform.

F. Conference Agenda:

 The conference president shall prepare a tentative agenda for each conference session to be presented early the first sitting of conference for approval and revision.

III. Officers and Standing Committees

A. Officers:

1. President: The conference President's report shall include

a statement of all official acts, church business meetings held, consultations, and a financial statement listing gifts received, and reimbursements for travel and office expense.

- Treasurers: No treasurer is permited to pay out funds without proper authorization.
- Compensation: The conference secretary and conference treasurer shall each be paid \$10.00 annually.

B. Committees:

- Camp Meeting Board: The camp meeting board shall consist
 of seven members to include the conference president,
 W.M.S. president, W.Y. president, and camp meeting treasurer and three other members elected from the conference
 floor.
- The newly elected Camp Meeting Board shall have the privilege of nominating the Camp Manager and Camp Treasurer for election by the Conference.
- 3. The C.C.E. & E. Committee shall be designated by the Board of Managers. It shall be composed of the Conference President, W.H.S. President, W.Y. President, Conference Secretary and Treasurer and at least three elected members.

IV. Churches and Pastors

A. Pastor's Compensation:

- 1. Moving: Each local church is responsible for paying the moving expense of the pastor whom they have called.
- Utilities and travel: Churches shall give consideration to the payment of pastor's utilities and travel allowance.
- 3. Mospitalization Insurance: Whereas it seems advisable for our churches and conference to provide some type of hospitalization insurance for the church's economy and pastor's well being, we recommend that all our pastors be included in the Kansas Conference, with Brotherhood Mutual Insurance Company, Fort Wayne, Indiana. Be it further recommended that each church pay at least one-half of the pastor's premium.
- 4. Industrial Accident Insurance: The conference and every church shall provide Industrial Accident Insurance for all employees in compliance with the laws of each respective state.

B. Churches:

- Annual reports: The church's statistical report shall be forwarded to the statistical committee at least 10 days prior to conference.
- Communion: It is recommended that unleavened bread be used in communion service.

Ministers

Course of Study: All who are taking the Course of Study shall acquaint themselves with the requirements thereof and the conference officials and pastors shall keep these regulations in mind when counseling their young people who plan this important preparation for service.

VI. Publications

- Standing Rules: The standing rules of the conference are to be included in each annual journal.
- Conference Minutes: It shall be the duty of the conference В. president and the secretary to arrange for the printing of the conference minutes and reports.
- Conference Paper: The publication of a Conference Paper shall be placed in the hands of a committee consisting of the conference president and two persons elected by the conference. This committee shall select an editor and publisher and arrange for the financing of said paper.

Report 14 - CONFERENCE ADMINSTRATION

Your committee recommends the following: That conference responsibilities and remuneration of a pastor who may be elected as conference president be established as follows:

Conference Responsibilities:

- He shall perform the regular work devolving upon the presiden-
- в. He shall conduct two quarterly meetings and one Sunday preaching service in each church.
- He shall promote conference extension.
- II. Remuneration:
 - His salary shall be \$65.00 per month.
 - В. Travel Expense:
- (a) public transportation at cost;(b) when traveling by car, he shall be paid .07 per mile.
 - C. Official Expense and Pulpit Supply:
 - (a) Official expenses shall be paid (up to #110 per month);
 - (b) Secretarial help shall be paid (up to 60 per month);
 - (c) Pulpit Supply, when absent from his own pastorate on official business. (Maximum:
 - \$100 per year.)
