JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

Tuesday, 1:30 p. m.

The Tennessee Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church convened for its twenty-fourth annual session on the Camp Ground at 1:30 p. m., Tuesday, July 14, 1953.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. M. L. Arnold. Rev. C. F. Smith, Vice-President, led in prayer. Roll was called, with 8 Elders, 6 Conference Preachers and 17 Delegates responding. (See Roll). Mrs. J. A. Cassady, Claude McCabe and Mrs. Audrey Morton were seated as alternate delegates.

It was voted that the first five seats and the space forward be made the Conference Bar.

The following were elected as a Nominating Committee: C. F. Smith, Chairman, Edward Schade, C. K. Crawley, D. P. Denton, N. C. Hoggle. The Committee was excused for work.

The hours of business were fixed as follows: Convene at 8 a. m., and close at 10:30 a. m., for the Religious Service. Re-convene at 1:30 p. m., and adjourn at 4:30 p. m. Meals to be served at 7 a. m., 12 noon and 5 p. m. Voted that an exception be made for Wednesday afternoon when Conference adjourn at 4 p. m., supper at 4:30 p. m., for the purpose of the Conference Body investigating the proposed site for a new Camp Ground.

The time for Special Orders of the Day was set as follows: Election of Officers, Wednesday, 9 a. m., Conference Sermon, Wednesday, 10:30 a. m., Educational Address, Wednesday, 3 p. m., General Address, Thursday, 10:30 a. m., Memorial Service, Thursday afternoon, first service following the opening of Conference, Home Missionary Address, Thursday, 3 p. m., Ordination Service, Friday, 10:30 a. m.

It was voted that the business meeting of the Camp Meeting Association be the first item of business on Thursday morning following devotions. Recessed to call of the Chair.

The Treasurer of the Missionary Board read his report, which was adopted. The Conference W.Y.P.S. President read his report. Adopted, with a rising vote of thanks. (See W.Y.P.S. Minutes)

Recessed thirty minutes for committee work.

Following recess, the Committee on Resolutions read its report. (See Resolutions). Adopted. The Auditing Committee gave its report, stating that the books of the Conference Treasurer and the Superannuated Pension Fund Treasurer had been audited and found in order. Report adopted.

The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave a partial report, which was adopted as given.

The Conference Treasurer read his report, which was adopted. (See Report 2). He then read a report on the Conference President's Parsonage. Adopted. Voted that the Conference Treasurer be authorized to liquidate the indebtedness of \$78.89 borrowed from the Conference Fund.

The W.M.S. Treasurer read her statistical report. Adopted. (See W.M.S. Minutes).

Adjourned. Benediction, Charles Haire.

Wednesday, 8 a. m.

Devotions by E. B. Carnes. Conference called to order. Roll was called. Mrs. Helen Workman was seated as alternate delegate for the Rockdale Church. Minutes read. Voted to have only one reading of Minutes daily. The Committee on Courtesy presented Dr. and Mrs. F. R. Birch, who gave words of greeting. Motion prevailed that they, and all others so introduced, be made honorary members of this Conference Body.

Rev. C. F. Smith read his statistical report. Voted that only designated items be read.

Dr. F. R. Birch, General Representative, was called to the Chair and the Conference President read his annual report, which was accepted with a rising vote of thanks. (See Report 1). Rev. Charles Haire read his statistical report.

Chair called for Orders of the Day. Jesse Cronnon was appointed Distributing Teller. Officials and Standing Committees were elected. (See page of Conference Officials). The President nominated and the Conference elected N. C. Hoggle, Ministerial, and Gene Turner, Layman, as his Advisory Board.

Committee on Courtesy presented President and Mrs. R. C. Mullinax of Central College, who gave words of greeting. Voted that they convey words of greeting to the South Carolina and North Georgia Conferences from this Conference Body.

The President nominated and the Conference elected Mrs. C. H. Cummings, Mrs. J. P. Green and Mrs. Helen Workman, as lay members on the committee on Itineracy and Orders. Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. Ed Galyon, pastor of the Clinton Pilgrim Holiness Church, who gave words of greeting.

Recessed until Orders of the Day.

Orders of the Day under Chairman of Religious Services. The Conference Sermon was preached by the Conference President, M. L. Arnold. He brought a helpful and heart-searching message on "Abandoned Purpose, Forfeited Power," using as his scripture, Judges 16: 16-20. Adjourned. Benediction, D. P. Denton.

Wednesday, 1:30 p. m.

Conference called to order. Roll called. General Orders were called, and the following pastors reported: N. C. Hoggle, W. L. Scarborough, D. P. Denton, Thomas Hampton, Edward Schade, C. K. Crawley, E. B. Carnes, Charles T. Hood (report given by his pastor, N. C. Hoggle).

Orders of the Day arrived and President R. C. Mullinax, of Central College, presented the educational interests. Pledges were taken amounting to \$165.00 for furnishing a room in the new wing at McDonald Hall.

Dr. F. R. Birch was called to the Chair, and General Orders resumed. The following pastors reported: A. L. Lowrance, M. L. Arnold.

Voted that the Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders be responsible for the arranging and holding of a Ministerial Institute during the year. It was voted that this Convention be held at the Crossville Church, the time to be announced before the close of this annual session.

It was voted that the Conference President and his Advisory Board be a constituted committee on Special Orders.

Adjourned by limitation of time.

Thursday, 8 a. m.

Devotions by Rev. J. T. DeArmond. Conference called to order. Roll called and Minutes read. Services were turned over to the Camp Meeting Association, when Camp Meeting interests were considered.

Time for Orders of the Day arrived. Dr. F. R. Birch brought the General Address, speaking on the subject. "A Strategy for the Remnant," basing his message on I Kings 19:18.

Thursday, 1:30 p. m.

Conference called to order. Roll called. Jim Morgan was seated as alternate delegate for Mascot Church. Motion carried that the time be extended for the Memorial Service. Rev. Charles Haire read his statistical report for the Mendota Mission. He also reported for his two Conference Preachers, Miss Grace Winebarger and Carl Cox.

The Memorial Service was conducted by Rev. J. A. Cassady. Mrs. A. C. Clemens sang, "The Day Without A Cloud." Rev. A. C. Clemens led in prayer. Rev. Charles Haire paid due reverence and respect to the life and memory of Rev. J. F. Biddle, and Rev. D. P. Denton to that of Mrs. Susie Allen and Mrs. Birdie Timmons, of Nashville.

Business was resumed. The Sunday School Board read its report. Adopted. (See Report 4). The Sunday School Banner for the fourth quarter was awarded to the Knoxville Second Church and the yearly banner to the Knoxville First Church.

The Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders read its report, which was adopted as a whole. (See Report 5). The Committee on Courtesy presented Rev. H. H. Barton and Mrs. M. E. Carnes. Each spoke words of greeting.

The Treasurer of the Superannuated Pension Fund read his report. Adopted. (See Report 3).

Orders of the Day arrived and Rev. George Hawthorne of the Home Missionary Department was introduced. Before speaking he rendered several numbers on the accordion. He brought a very challenging address on the need for new Churches, especially stressing the Card Call Plan.

Motion carried that the time be extended to hear the reading of the statistical report of Rev. J. T. DeArmond and Rev. L. C. Elbell. Adjourned.

Friday, 8 a. m.

Devotions by Rev. Vestal Broyles. Conference called to order. Roll called and Minutes read. The Committee on Itineracy and Elders Orders gave a report recommending the date of November 26 and 27 for the Ministerial Convention, with the authorization that they be allowed to change the dates, if necessary. Adopted.

The Committee on Pastoral Relations gave its first reading. The Statistical Committee read its report, which was adopted, with a rising vote of thanks. (See statistical report.)

The Apportionment Committee read its report. Adopted. (See Report 6). General Orders were called, and the following pastors reported: R. E. Rice, A. C. Clemens, J. A. Cassady. Rockdale Church (report read by Helen Workman, delegate).

The Committee on Courtesy introduced Mr. and Mrs. Billy Crawley and Mrs. M. Lou Shipley. A love-offering was taken for our Conference President, in appreciation of his work during the past year. Recessed until Orders of the Day.

Orders of the Day arrived and the Ordination Service was held. The Ordination Sermon was delivered by Rev. S. D. Herron. He based his message on Luke 4:43, 44, "Jesus said, 'I Must Preach.'" Following the Sermon, the following were ordained as Elders in the Wesleyan Methodist Church: E. B. Carnes, C. K. Crawley, Luther Elbell, Charles Haire. The service closed by singing "Seal Us. O Holy Spirit."

Friday, 1:30 p. m.

Conference called to order. Roll called. The Prohibition Comm.ttee read its report. Adopted. (See Report 7). The Committee on Religious Services read its report. Adopted. (See Report 8).

General Orders called, and the following pastors reported: C. E. Harwell, W. G. Harwell, O. H. Crabb, Vestal Broyles, Henry Sellers (report read by N. C. Hoggle), Luther Lawson (report read by D. P. Denton), J. V. Smith (report read by D. P. Denton), J. C. Cochran (report given by A. L. Lowrance), E. L. Robinson (report given by D. P. Denton), Earl Seibers (report given by N. C. Hoggle), H. A. Harvey, Willa E. Harvey, Mrs. Frances Palmer, Mildred Thomas, Mrs. Lois McJunkins, Deaconess. Voted that the name of Jennie Wh.ttaker be removed from the Conference Roll.

The Pastoral Relations Committee were excused for Committee work. Rev. N. C. Hoggle was appointed Chairman pro tem.

It was voted that the next Annual Conference be held on the second Tuesday in July, 1954. Voted that Conference President and Conference Secretary edit and publish the Minutes. By motion, the President and his Adv.sory Board were authorized to take care of any unfinished business of the Conference. Recessed to call of the Chair.

Conference called to order by the President. Voted that an extension of time be granted. The Pastoral Relations Committee read its final report. Adopted (See Report 9).

The Committee on Thanks read its report. Adopted (See Report 10).

Voted that Minutes be approved w.thout reading. Upon motion, Conference adjourned sine die. Benediction, H. A. Harvey.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE

We, the Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report: Be it resolved, that these articles shall become the standing rules and law of this Conference:

- 1. Before a local building committee proceeds with a building plan or program that they be required to have all plans approved by the President and his Advisory Board and the Missionary Board; and further, that no financial obligations be assumed without the consent of the Conference Trustees.
- 2. That the Board of Conference Trustees be, and they are hereby empowered, to sign all papers necessary for the sale or transfer of Conference, Church or Parsonage property, providing the said sale or transfer is authorized by the President and his Advisory Board and shall not violate the spirit of paragraphs 386, 387 of our Book of Discipline.
- 3. The Board of Conference Trustees are hereby authorized to execute papers to secure funds for the liquidation of Conference, Church or Parsonage indebtedness, providing that the Churches set

forth in writing the amount and the purposes for which the loan is to be used; and that no funds so secured shall be used for any other purpose than that set forth in the notice to the trustees of the Conference.

- 4. When a deed for Conference, Church or Parsonage property is received and before it is recorded it shall be referred to the President and his Advisory Board who are hereby designated as a Deed Exam ning Committee whose duty shall be to examine the deed and see that there are such disciplinary clauses included as may be necessary to make the property secure to our Church. Said Committee shall have power to engage such legal advice as may be needed to insure the proper steps regarding the reception or transfer of the property. See paragraphs 388, 389 of present book of Disciline.
- 5. The President's salary shall remain at \$1650 per year, plus traveling expenses for Quarterly Meetings. Each Pastor is urged and expected to receive a love offering at the first and fourth Quarterly Conference for the President. The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to remit the President's salary semi-monthly. We further recommend that if the budget does not take care of the President's salary, the deficit be taken out of the Pioneer Fund.
- 6. We shall proclaim with voice and pen and holy living the gospel of full salvation, recognizing our dependence upon, and need of the indwelling power and presence of the Holy Spirit.
- 7. We shall continue to interpret the teachings of the Scriptures and the Special Rules of the Discipline in accord with the standards held by the early Method sts and the Wesleyans of the past generations. To this end we reaffirm our stand against the reception of any member as a full member who wears jewelry, including the wedding band or other unnecessary ornaments, and declare ourselves in favor of higher standards on dress, and other worldly manifestations on the person. Our ministers are asked to refrain from performing wedding ceremonies using the ring, and to be positive in their declarations regarding this entering wedge of worldliness. We further declare our opposition to such things as commercialized ball games, Sabbath desecration, theatres, television, and such like, and shall support our mnisters in their endeavors to counteract these menaces. We further urge our ministers to take an active stand in exposing the three "C's" of the world—Communism, Catholicism, and Compromise.
- 8. We urge all Conference Preachers and Elders to become members of the Women's Missionary Society, and that the pastors attend each meeting and encourage the women, this being one of the strong arms of the Church.
- 9. Each Church shall make a spec al effort in behalf of, and loyally support the Church Extension Card Plan.
- 10. EACH PASTOR, OR CHARGE, SHALL HAVE IN THE HANDS OF THE STATISTICAL SECRETARY NOT LESS THAN FIVE DAYS PEFORE THE ANNUAL CONFERENCE, ONE COPY OF HIS STATISTICAL REPORT IN FULL. This report shall be accompanied by a statement from the Conference Treasurer giving

the amounts paid on budget under item VIII in the pastor's statistical report, and the pastor's report must check with that of the Conference Treasurer.

- 11. The Conference Treasurer's books shall close on June 30 of each year and no credit shall be given on the Budget for that fiscal year for money received after this date.
- 12. The Fresident's, Secretary's and Treasurer's correspondence expenses shall be pa'd from the Conference Fund by the Conference Treasurer.
- 13. Minutes of this Conference shall be published through arrangements made by the Missionary Board and delivered to the pastors in numbers equal to 50% of their Church membership.
- 14. Preachers and Delegates shall remain throughout the entire Conference session unless providentially hindered or excused by the Conference
- 15. All Elders received from other denominations shall be required to pass examination on our Book of Discipline, and must have passed a course of study which is equivalent to our course for ordination, and harmonize with our theological views. They shall give special attention to the requirements found in paragraphs 171 of our book of Discipline.
- 16. Cop es of these resolutions, together with the apportionments and the addresses of the President, Secretary and Treasurer, shall be in the hands of each pastor within two weeks of the close of the Annual Conference. The Conference Secretary be authorized to carry out this resolution.
- 17. Pastors shall mail all Delegate's credentials to the Conference Secretary not less than five (5) days before convening of Conference.
- 18. The Conference Budget shall be raised and remitted monthly to the Conference Treasurer.
- 19. All monies which are reported through the Conference Treasurer shall be sent to him either as cash or receipts and he shall give Conference Treasurer's receipt for each item, and no money shall be listed paid out by the Treasurer except by check, on order of the President, and he shall be required to present cancelled checks and vouchers for each bill paid.
- 20. Those wishing to take examinations in the Course of Study for credit during any year, shall write for questions before May 31 of that year, and shall have the answers in the hands of the proper instructor before June 30 for credit for that year. The Committee on Itineracy and Orders shall not be expected to send out questions or accept papers after these dates.
- 21. It shall be a standing rule that the Secretary shall be remunerated the sum of \$50.00 for each session of Conference. We recommend that the Conference Treasurer be given \$25.00 per year for services.
- 22. We recommend that when the Conference President labors as an evangelist in any of our Churches he be paid as other evaneglists are paid.

- 23. Each unorganized work which is being run under the direction of the Conference and served by a member of this body, shall be allowed to elect an honorary delegate who shall be permitted to sit with the Conference and speak on matters of business, but not allowed to vote.
- 24. The Conference President shall be required to hold Quarterly Business Meetings at all unorganized works that are under the Conference Missionary Board or with the Conference, and the pastors of these works shall receive an offering quarterly to be sent to the Conference Treasurer and used toward the President's salary. Treasurers of these unorganized works shall be members of some Wesleyan Methodist Church unless otherwise approved by the Conference Missionary Board.
- 25. In order to help maintain the spirit of brotherhood among our members and ministers, we ask that designations of titles, degrees and authority be omitted both in our public meetings and in the printed minutes, except in the first public introduction of each individual.

REPORT OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE TENNESSEE CONFERENCE WESLEYAN METHODIST CHURCH TO THE TWENTY-FOURTH ANNUAL SESSION, 1953

Brethren in Christ:

This has been a good year, not because of the great things accomplished, but because of the great help of the Lord in doing the tasks assigned us.

It has been possibly the busiest year of our life, yet God has given physical strength sufficient for our needs.

Byrds Chapel Church has remained in our hands throughout the year, which has taken some of our time from the Conference.

On August 5, 1952, we appointed Vestal Broyles pastor Mt. View. We assisted in conducting Youth Camp in August.

On September 11, 1952, we accepted the resignation of C. E. Irby as pastor Liberty Church.

By vote of the Board of Trustees and the Missionary Board, we superintended the building of the Conference President's parsonage laboring 832 hours without pay on this project together with some few days spent on camp property.

We held six week-end revivals, 52 quarterly conferences, 84 other services and preached 168 times. Attended 12 district rallies, 1 area convention and the Leader's conference at Miltonvale in May as your representative, and planned and promoted 1 conference convention.

On March 29th we appointed Ausbon Sparks assistant pastor at Byrds Chapel in order to be able to devote more time to the work

On April 22, 1953, C. E. Irby resigned as pastor Corinth, leaving the church and conference.

At the request of the Corinth church and with the consent of the Rockdale church, we appointed C. E. Harwell pastor at Corinth for the rest of the year.

On June 28th we were privileged to dedicate the Crossville church.

We have travelled 22,000 miles in the work of the conference, have received for our services: Salarv \$2,137.06—From Byrds Chapel \$171.54—From Quarterly conferences -208.47—Gifts and offerings from week-end revivals \$294.44—Parsonage rent \$240.00—Total \$3,190.51—Less expenses of travel etc. \$700.00. Net cash salary \$2,111.51.
