STANDING RULES

- 1. All Trustees of the Oklahoma Conference shall reside within the bounds of the Conference.
- 2. When a pastor provides his own place of residence, all rent from regular parsonage shall be paid to such pastor.
- 3. The treasurers of the various Conference Funds shall close their books on July 20th. No budget credit shall be given after that date. Money received after that time shall be applied on the next year's business.
- 4. The Conference Trustees shall be the Committee on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.
- 5. The Committee on Religious Services shall consist of the Conference President; W. M. S. President, W. Y. President, and the Conference President's Advisory Board,
- 6. We recommend that the following order of business be observed in our Annual Conference sessions:

Tuesday, 3:00 p. m.—Conference convenes Tuesday evening—Conference Sermon Wednesday, 1:30 p. m.—Election of officers Friday—Reports of Committees Saturday—W. Y. Business sessions

- 7. A Nominating Committee shall be elected composed of three elders, one of which shall be the Conference President as chairman, ex-officio, and the Delegate-elect from two churches designated by the annual conference; these churches to be designated in alphabetical order. This committee shall first examine the credentials of all delegates to the annual Conference, and secondly, nominate all session committees, not already provided for, and be prepared to report at the first meeting of Conference.
- 8. The Conference fiscal year shall end on June 30, and all statistical reports shall be based on mones received up to and including that date. When the receipts for the tinal budget payments by the various departments of the church are turned to the pastor, he shall fill out a statement of the amount of budget credit he wishes to receive for monies not sent to the Conference Treasurer, according to the receipts he has on hand. This, with the final budget payment, if any, should be sent to the Conference Treasurer as soon as possible after the close of the conference year. The Treasurer will then send each pastor a statement of total amount credited to his church for budget during the year.
- 9. Two copies of each written report shall be given to the secretary of the Conference. These shall be typewritte and oduble spaced. Size of paper, 8½ by 11 inches.
- 10. The Conference Treasurer shall be a member of the Finance Committee, and an honorary member of the conference body with a right to speak, but not to vote.
- 11. The annual conference shall elect a Spiritual Life Conference Committee composed of seven members. This committee shall plan for the coming together of Christian workers of the Oklahoma Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church. This Committee includes the Conference W. M. S. President, W. Y. President, and Conference President.
- 12. Conference shall convene anually on the Tuesday following the first Monday of August.

- 13. In case of a change of pastors, the out going pastor shall be paid a salary for the two Sundays of Conference and Camp.
- 14. The Conference Treasurer and the Conference Secretary shall be paid twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) annually for their services.
- 15. The Conference President and the Conference Presidents of W.M.S and the W.Y. shall serve as members of the Missionary Board, with five other members.
- 16. The treasurer of the various Conference funds are to bring their account books, receipts, check books, cancelled checks and the latest bank statement to conference and place these books in the hands of the Auditing Committee on the first day of the conference session.
- 17. The Conference body recommends that each pastor be given a two weeks vacation, exclusive of the Conference and Camp session. This vacation is to include two Sundays with pay.
- 18. All monies received for the Conference Enlargement Fund shall be used for new works only in the bounds of the Oklahoma Conference.
- 19. Each pastor shall send a complete Statistical Report to the Conference treasurer for his signature not later than July 20th and he in turn will send the completed Statistical Report to the Chairman of the Statistical Committee.
- 20. The chairman of the Statistical Committee, the chairman of Memorials Committee, the chairman of the Auditing Committee shall be elected a year ahead of Conference and their names included in the Minutes with the Standing Committees.
- 21. Each church shall be entitled to count in local Sunday School attendance the number of their members in attendance at Sunday School at the location of the Annual Conference. The responsibility of identification shall rest with the visiting members and the Sunday School secretary of the host church. This shall be applicable to the two Sundays of conference and camp.
- 22. The budget shall be figured on the full membership as reported in item III of the Statistical Report in the current Conference.
- 23. The Conference Secretary is authorized to prepare short form blanks of Pastor's Report on Conference floor each year.
- 24. The Religious Services Committee shall prepare a mimeographed agenda; and a copy to be sent to each Pastor prior to Conference, and a supply to be available at conference time for ministers and delegates. Said agenda to list time various committees are to report; name of one to bring devotions at each meeting, and dates and hours for special services.

tative of the Southern Christian Life Insurance Company.

REPORT-Committee on Nominations gave report. Motion to adopt the report was supported and on vote carried. (See report number one)

MOTION-R. J. Eling moved that Dr. Harold K. Sheets preside for the remainder of the conference session. Motion supported and carried.

REPORT-Conference President, D. O. Dorr, gave his report. Motion made and supported to receive this report and refer the financial portion to the Auditing Committee. (See report number two.)

MOTION—D. O. Dorr moved that the Annual Conference re-instate C. Russell Bremer as an Elder in the Wesleyan Methodist Church and a member of the Oklahoma Conference. Motion seconded by Walter Rice and carried.

We recommend that local societies inquire into the needs of the home mission stations and orphanages before sending used clothing, and that no monetary value be placed on same; that such boxes of new merchandise be reported as to monetary value and that the sending society evaluate the same, the voucner evaluation signed by the missionary be forwarded to Conference Women's Missionary Society Treasurer for proper receipting.

5. We recommend and urge each local society to respond to the Card

Call Plan and thus assist in the extension program of the Church.

6. We recommend that each local society plan during the year to bring provisions of cash o fering to the annual conference.

II. Foreign Work

We recommend:

1. That we co-operate with the Foreign Missionary Department in the support of its entire foreign missionary program.

2. That we forward Sunday School cnarts, cards and flannelgraph

materials to our Missionary Home.

3. That each society present and support the "Millions For Lost Million" project.

III. Medical Missions

We recommend:

1. That our local societies make bandages* and that these be forwarded promptly to the Missionary Home to await outgoing missionaries, the number of pounds to be reported with no value attached. 2. That each local society contribute \$3.00 or more annually to the

Medical Student Fund, not to apply on budget.
*Bandages should be 2", 3" or 4" in width, sewn together in 10 yard lengths with flat seams, and rolled firmly into rolls, not to exceed 3" in diameter. Bound squares of blankets are needed in infant care.

IV. Educational

We recommend:

1. The cooperation of our local societies in the promotion of the Honorary Enrollment Plan for the Colleges. The monies for this project should be channeled through the Local Conference and General W. M. S. Treasurers.

2. The observance of Educational Harvest Day with program and contributions and supplies and cash; all cash to apply on educational budget excepting that applying on special projects presented by college presidents.

V. Literature

We recommend:

1. The use of the combination treasurer's blank for the remitting of

money by the Local Conference and General Conference Treasurers.

2. That a concerted effort be made to increase the subscription list of the WESLEYAN MISSIONARY by faithfully securing renewals and new subscriptions to include every home in the church and Sunday School, with January being observed as campaign month.

3. That we promote the Mission Study and Reading Course; the use of the Study Book designated each year with Program Calendars and other helps.

VI. Devotional

We recommend:

1. That we carefully observe the monthly prayer requests in the Wesleyan Missionary magazine and other special requests as presented.

2. The observance of the Monthly Fast and Prayer Day.

3. That April be designated Self-Denial Month.

4. The promotion of a Prayer Partner Circle in every society making use of new prayer partner reminders, and that reports be sent to the General Conference Prayer Partner Secretary before January 1st.

5. That stress be placed upon personal evangelism including children,

adolescents, the aged, and with special emphasis upon the Jew.

VII. Area Work

- 1. We urge the provisions for one Area convention during the Quadrennium.
- 2. We recommend that all home and foreign appeals for special needs be made to the General Executive Board of our Women's Missionary Society and that they in turn channel these needs to the Area Chairman who will present them to the conference presidents in their areas.

We further recommend that the Conference W. M. S. President direct

Christmas gifts according to suggestion from Area Chairmen.

VIII. Conference Work

We recommend:

- 1. That at least one workshop for the Y. M. W. B. and Children's Workers be held annually in each conference.
- 2. That each conference be divided into districts for convention; the same to be supervised by a district chairman under the direction of the Conference W. M. S. President.
- 3. We recommend the continuance of the "MILE OF DIMES" project, monies from such to be allocated for mission field equipment.

4. That each society contribute a poster and curios for display at conference.

5. That each society bring a cash offering for the visiting missionary at conference.

STANDARDS OF EFFICIENCY

(A) Local Society

We recommend:

1. That the efficiency Standard be read in the society the first monthly meeting after Conterence (5% credit) and that arrangements be made with the pastor for one missionary prayer meeting each month (the third Wednesday), the same to be preceded by fasting, and at which time an offering is taken. (5% credit).

2. That minimum of 10 meetings be held during the year at which time prayer requests are presented and remembered and businss trans-

acted (5% credit) at which time an offering is taken for missions.

- 3. The formation of one or more Prayer Partner Circles in each society with a Prayer Partner Secretary, who shall report the names of same to Conference Prayer Partner Secretary within 60 days after the sitting of Annual Conference.
- 4. That the President, Secretary, Treasurer, and the equivalent of 75% of the active membership be subscribers to THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY.
- 5. That a Solicitor be elected for THE WESLEYAN MISSIONARY gaining not less than two subscriptions a year.
- 6. That delegate be elected to the Annual Conference Women's Missionary Society, and that she be instructed by local society regarding the

amount to be pledged by that society at the Annual Conference session (5% credit) and that the President attend he Annual Conference session. (5% credit).

- 7. That the dues \$1.00 per member be sent directly to the Conference Treasurer, 50c of which shall be divided by her as specified, equally between Home and Foreign, and applied on budget, (5% credit), and that all monies, and vouchers be sent to the Conference Treasurer at least quarterly. (5% credit).
- 8. That we secure every woman in the church as a member of the Society, or achieve a 10% gain in the total membership.

9. That each local society pay annually an amount equal to 25c pas active member to be used as a General Administrative Fund, not to apply on budget.

10. That the local Y. M. W. B. Superintendent be seated in the Annual session and be granted the privilege of speaking, and provisions be made by her society for such representation. (Ten per cent credit shall be given for each of the above items, and all societies making a grade of 80 per cent shall be placed on the Honor Roll.)

Y. M. W. B.

Let us emphasize the work of the Y.M.W.B. and take great care in training our youth by interesting them in mission study. We recommend that each band adopt the Standard of Efficiency.

1. Twelve band services in which prayer, God's Word and personal

service were stressed. (10%)

2. One public service during the year (10%).

3. Band funds remitted quarterly (10%).

4. The use of mite boxes, envelopes, membership cards or some other systematic method for gathering in dues and offerings (10%).

5. The Superintendent of the Band be a reader of THE WESLEYAN

MISSIONARY (10%).

- 6. An increase in membership (5%).
- 7. An increase in funds raised (5%).
- 8. An offering for Home Missions (10%). 9. An offering for Education (10%).

10. One cent per member sent to the Conference Y.M.W.B. Superintendent as desk fund (10%).

11. The annual report sent in on time (10%). (That is at the time the

Conference Superintendent designates.)

FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the Finance Committee, recommend that each local society observe the following financial program for the year's work:

1. That the total Missionary Budget be as follows:

A. General Budget

*1. Home Missions-50c per member.

*2. Foreign Missions-75c per member.

- *3. Education-One-fourth of the local church educational budget.
- *4. Orphanage-\$5.00 or more per society annually.

5. M.W.C. Expansion Fund-40c per member. 6. W.M.S. Administrative Fund-25c per member.

7. Medical student fund-\$3.00 or more per society annually.

B. Conference Budget

*1. Conference Extension-50c per member.

2. Conference Dishwashing Fund-15c per member.

3. Conference Desk Fund-10c per member.

4. Cash Offerings, or provisions (both, if possible) for Conference Dining Hall.

2. Other Recommendations:

- 1. That each society pay 25c per member for a fund from which to pay the expense of the Conference President and Official Del egate to the Annual Missionary Workshop.
- That an offering be taken during the year for each of the following: Wesleyan Commission for Service Men, and Jewish Work, and Harvest Home, not to apply on budget.
- That the dues, \$1.00 per member, be sent to the Conference Treasurer, 50c of which will be divided by her equally between Home and Foreign Missions, and applied on budget.
- 4. That we contribute liberally to the following Special Appeals that are made through our Missionary Magazine: Honorary Enrollments, White Christmas Gift, and Self-Denial Offering.
- 5. That each local society respond to the Card Call Plan, and thus assist in the extension program of the Church.
- 6. That the local societies inquire into the needs of the Home Missions stations and orphanages before sending used clothing, and that no monetary value be placed on same; that such boxes of new merchandise be reported as to monetary value and that the sending society evaluate the same, the voucher evaluation signed by the missionary be forwarded to the Conference Women's Missionary Society Treasurer for proper receipting.
- 7. That the local treasurer use the combination treasurer's blank for the remitting of money and vouchers to the Conference Treasurer. (These blanks may be obtained from the Conference Treasurer.)
- 8. Since the Local Treasurer cannot include any item on her annual report that does not appear on the receipts from the Conference Treasurer, and since the total of the cash and vouchers received by the Conference Treasurer should tally with the total disbursements in the local treasurer's book, we recommend that all cash received by the local society treasurer be sent to the Conference Treasurer, with the exception of cash for incidental expenses, cash used in Local Church Work, or special cash gifts that need immediate attention by the Local Treasurer, and a statement, or the original voucher covering these items be sent to the Conference Treasurer at least quarterly, or oftener as the Local Treasurer see fit.
