A motion was carried that the President and Pastor of the Church where Conference convenes arrange the Conference program for religious services, and that one evening be given for missionary services and that the mission cause be given consideration in the morning services.

The final report of Committee on Itineracy and Orders was read and adopted.

The report of Delegate of the W. Y. P. S. of Bloomington District gave a report which was adopted.

The Conference voted John A. Giles to be Conference President of W. Y. P. S. and the Conference Committee as follows: Ruby Brunson, Edith Brown, Ada Baumgartel, Edith Bailey.

Ora M. Nanna was elected Sunday School Secretary. Adjourned by limitation.

RESOLUTIONS AND LAWS OF KENTUCKY CONFERENCE

- 1. We follow and accept the plan of the last General Conference regarding Sunday Schools and Home Missions, that is, we recommend and urge that the first Sunday of each month be known as Home Missionary Sunday, and that the offering of that day be forwarded to the Conference Treasurer monthly or at least quarterly. This shall not prohibit any Sunday School from giving to other arms of the work by offerings raised in addition to this offering, when they desire. We further recommend that the birthday offerings of each School be appropriated to either Home or Foreign Missions.
- 2. We, the members of the Kentucky Conference, agree that there shall be an offering taken at each preaching service, both Sunday morning and Sunday night, in all of our Churches, and that the Pastor be paid in full each month as nearly as possible. Also that each Pastor receive a fixed salary.
- 3. We recommend that our Churches should call members of our own Conference as their Pastors to supply the pulpits, before going outside the Conference, so long as we have preachers qualified for the same.
- 4. Our Stewards are required to meet their Pastors and reach an agreement as to pastoral support. And we insist on every Pastor receiving a respectable living so that he will not be financially embarrassed.
- 5. It shall be the duty of our Pastors to see that all our Churches and parsonages have sufficient insurance and report the same at the first quarterly meeting each year. Churches absolutely incapacitated to insure property should report the same to the Conference, and if no satisfactory adjustment can be made otherwise, the property will be insured by the Conference, and in the event such property should be destroyed, the Conference will collect the insurance.
- 6. We take a unanimous stand for loyalty to the Church and our Book of Discipline by supporting Paragraph 168, Sub. Paragraph B, which reads as follows: "All Pastors and Churches wishing to employ evangelists who are not members of any Wesleyan Methodist Conference, shall consult the President of the Annual Conference, who shall have authority, if his Advisory Board shall agree thereto, to refuse to permit such employment."

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON RESOLUTIONS

No. 2

We, your Committee on Resolutions, submit the following report:

A. We, as members of the Wesleyan Methodist Church, purpose, by the grace of God, to maintain a strict obedience to our Discipline and to biblical standards of faith and conduct; and we determine to earnestly contend for the faith once delivered to the saints, praying and striving for the work of love in our hearts. Accordingly let each individual abstain from all sinful amusements, such as the circus, horse racing, Sunday baseball, dancing, picture shows, fairs, theatrical performances, swimming at public bathing beaches and every form of gambling and all forms of Sabbath desecration.

- B. We recommend concerning Churches and Charges:
- 1. That no Church open its doors for other denominations to maintain a regular appointment as such will likely cause division among us.
- 2. That all Charges, as soon as possible, provide a suitable home for their Pastors, and that each Charge to which our Pastors move, pay transportation in advance.
- 3. That all our Churches make quarterly donations to their Pastors, which shall not be deducted from the Pastor's cash salary. For this, it is advisable to have a Donation Steward.
- 4. That each Wesleyan Methodist Church organize a Sabbath School for the salvation of its pupils; and that, if possible, Wesleyan Methodists teach in our schools.
- 5. That each Church have a Missionary Society and a Y. M. W. B. also a W. Y. P. S. organization to create interest in our Home and Foreign Missions.
- 6. That no Church receive members from other Churches, even by letter, having vows different from ours, unless the members who seek admission take our vows and conform to our Church and Sunday School standards, and also prove by examination their eligibility; further that those who seek admission without a letter of standing be received as associate members according to the requirements of our Book of Discipline. See Paragraph 73, Sub. Paragraph 2.
- 7. That no Church receive any one who does not conform to the Discipline with regard to the wearing of gold or jewelry, and who has fellowship with secret orders.
- 8. That no Church receive or retain members who sell, buy, grow, use, or help manufacture tobacco; and that no Church receive or retain any person who is engaged in the manufacture, the buying, the selling, or the use of alcoholic beverages.
- 9. Be it Resolved, That this Conference go onward as being opposed to all efforts made to repeal or in any way modify the Eighteenth Amendment and that we loyally support all officers of the law who are making an honest effort to enforce its legislation.
- 10. We, the members of the Kentucky Conference, put ourselves on record as being both evangelistic and progressive and urge our

people to push out into new fields and make use of every opportunity possible to organize new Churches and lead souls to Christ, and that each Church have not less than two revivals in the Conference year.

- C. We recommend concerning Pastors:
- 1. That in addition to Disciplinary provisions for Quarterly Conference Preachers, the candidate must have a Discipline, pay one dollar a year to the Minute Fund, take the Wesleyan Methodist, Wesleyan Missionary, tithe his income and pay one half of his tithe into the Church where he holds his membership.
- 2. That all Annual Conference Preachers and Elders come up to the above standard and that no one have a license renewed who fails to come up to these standards.
- 3. That every Pastor must be a member of the W. H. & F. M. S. and Y. M. W. B., and that he is to encourage and work in harmony with them.
- 4. That no Pastor should hold more than two revival meetings of not more than three Sundays each off his charge during the year, and that only by consent of a two-thirds vote of his membership.
- 5. That each Pastor, by the help of his Advisory Board make a revision of his Church roll of membership each year before the time of voting for any Church official for the ensuing year.
- 6. That each Pastor attempt to get the Wesleyan Methodist and Wesleyan Missionary into the homes of the members of his Church.

REPORT OF THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

No. 3

We, the Committee on Finance and Appropriations, submit the following report:

- 1. We recommend that all charges paying less than \$700.00 salary a year seek earnestly to raise the salary of their Pastor to that amount as soon as possible.
- 2. In order to support our Foreign Missionary work it is necessary that \$2.25 per member be raised throughout our Conference.
- 3. We also recommend that this Conference pay the budget of 50 cents per member for Home Missions.
 - 4. That 25 cents per member be raised for the Orphanage.
 - 5. That each member pay \$1.50 per year for Education.
- 6. We recommend that each member of the Church pay \$1.00 per year for missionary work within the Conference territory.
- 7. We recommend the Storehouse Plan as the general financial plan of the Church. The difficult financial problems of the Church will never be solved properly until every member of the Church becomes a tither.

Tithe is a tenth, that part we owe to God, and should be put into the Church treasury. It is like interest, in that the rate is fixed. We do not give the landlord rent but pay it. It is a debt we owe to God, and must or should be paid, and no one should be complimented or puffed up over paying their honest debts. Where the Storehouse Plan has been adopted every demand has been met and the treasury is full to overflowing. If God ever required a tithe it is now. Jesus changed man's center of gravity, instead of being served it is serving.

The Church does not go begging when the tithes are brought in. But in many places it has become a begging institution, because the tithes have been withheld.

God's plan is the Storehouse Plan which is workable in every age and country. Tithing is a means of grace, we gain spiritually and the Church gains financially.

8. We recommend that all Pastors put forth a special effort to have raised the Quarterly Conference expenses by the close of each Quarterly Conference session; as this matter is of no little importance.

I. Home Work

Each Local Society pay one dollar per year for the support of the following Home work: 1. Blue Ridge Mountain Work, 2. Indian Reservation, 3. Mexican Work, 4. Zion's Hill Mission, 5. Industrial Work of the Alabama School, 6. Support of the Superintendent of the Alabama Mission School. Also five dollars for the support of Hephzibah Orphanage to apply on budget.

II. Foreign Work

Watch the Wesleyan Methodist and the Wesleyan Missionary for request of supplies, and each Society do their best to comply with same, also be diligent in making bandages of which Society is credited at fifty cents per pound but this does not apply on budget.

III. Local Society

- 1. We recommend that the first missionary meeting after the Annual Conference minutes are received be set apart as a time in which our women study such plans and instructions as are desired by our Annual Conference.
- 2. We recommend that we coöperate, observing the World Day of Prayer.

 - 4. We urge the dues be paid as early as convenient.

 - 11. An increase in membership during the year.
 - 12. Increase in offerings during the year.
- 13. Give place and time to prayer. Study God's Word and the value of souls.
