STANDING RULES

- No. 1 On Literature: Inasmuch as our denominational literature, because of its loyalty to the doctrines of our Church and because of its position on all questions of reform, is of such a nature as to promote and more fully establish our principles; and inasmuch as we consider it the duty and privilege of pastors and lay members of our denomination to extend its distribution: Therefore be it Resolved, That we as a Conference pledge ourselves to extend our literature as much as possible, that we use our best endeavor to place our lesson helps and papers in all our Sabbath Schools.
- No. 2 Board of Trustees Report for Final Action: Resolved, That all matters involving the expenditure of money to be appropriated from the Conference Treasuries, be referred to the Board of Trustees for their consideration and to be reported back by them to the Conference for final action.
- No. 3 General Conference Delegate: Resolved, That it is the sense of the Lockport Conference that no person should accept the position as delegate to the General Conference unless he expects to be present during the entire session. The President is requested to communicate this resolution to the delegates three weeks before the General Conference begins.
- No. 4 Evangelists' Report: Resolved, That it is the sense of this Conference that all Conference and General Evangelists be requested to report their work and financial receipts to each Annual Conference.
- No. 5 Closing Treasurer's Books: The Conference Treasurer is hereby authorized to close his books two weeks before the Annual Conference convenes, therefore all receipts and monies should be in his hands by that time if credit on Statistical Report is desired.
- No. 6 Temperance, Sabbath Observance, and Public Morals: Resolved, 1. That we are definitely committed to the prohibition of the liquor traffic rather than its regulation. 2. That we hereby affirm our belief and conviction that the Christian Sabbath was appointed as a day of rest and worship and should be so observed with resolute consistency. 3. That we believe that the highest and noblest conception of public morals is to be achieved through the regeneration of individuals rather than through the collective reformation of society. 4. That for the successful maintenance of the positions above indicated we are fully committed to the support of every valid effort for the preservation of our democratic rights of free speech, a free press, and free religion against all encroachments of dictatorial regimentation of thought and action whether in State or Church.

- No. 7 Reporting Sunday School Statistics. The pastors in reporting the Sunday School Statistics under item IV shall give actual number of officers, teachers and scholars on lines 2, 3, 4; on line 5 the total number of persons in the school, exclusive of the Cradle Roll and Home Department; on line 9 the sum of lines 5, 7 and 8.
- No. 8 Reading of Reports: Resolved, That in the reading of the Pastor's Statistical Report it is obligatory to read only items 3, 9 and 10.
- No. 9 Adjustment of Pastor's Salary: Resolved, That churches which enter into a financial agreement with the pastor shall when needful, make adjustment of this obligation at each quarterly meeting. A full settlement of the pastor's salary shall be made before the time of the Annual Conference. Any financial agreement on salary entered into by a church and pastor shall not be of force after the end of the Conference year for which it is made, unless it is renewed by the contracting parties.
- No. 10 Delegates' Credentials: It shall be the duty of the pastors to forward to the Conference Secretary not later than one week before the Annual Conference convenes the church (not missionary) delegates' credentials from his charge.
- No. 11 Budget Apportionment: The Budget Committee shall base their apportionment of the budget for Foreign Missions, Home Missions, Education and Hephzibah Orphanage on the rate per member recommended by the Book Committee. The Sunday School budget shall be determined by the number of persons in the Main School, at the rate of five cents a person for Connectional and one cent a person for Conference Sunday School work. The Conference budget shall be sum recommended by the Board of Trustees and approved by the Conference. The budget for Conference Entertainment shall be fifteen cents per member. Each charge may have the number of members under sixteen years of age, and any Elder or Elder's widow who cannot contribute to the budget, deducted from its membership list provided the pastor gives to the Budget Committee the number of such members before the close of the second day of Conference.
- No. 12 Budget Credit: Nothing but cash shall count on the Sunday School, Conference, or Conference Entertainment budgets. Money paid on L. S. U. pledges, or interest paid on Educational Notes and all money paid for current expenses of Houghton College shall count on the Educational budget. Cash and receipts acceptable to the Missionary Boards shall count on Orphanage, Home and Foreign Missionary budgets.
- No. 13 Date of Conference: The Annual Session of the Lockport Conference, Incorporated, shall convene the second Wednesday of June, on the Houghton Campgrounds.



JOURNAL OF DAILY PROCEEDINGS

The Lockport Annual Conference, Incorporated, of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America convened for its Eighty-second Annual Session on Houghton Campgrounds, at Houghton, New York, on June 9, 1943, at 7:00 p. m. War Time.

Opening.—The President, Rev. A. J. Taylor, called the Conference to order after which Rev. R. L. Kuhn led in singing. Rev. David Anderson led in prayer.

Roll Call.—The roll of Ministers was called and 17 were marked present.

Credentials.—The Committee on Credentials read its report which was adopted as amended.

Roll Call.—The roll of Delegates was called and 8 were marked present.

Bar of Conference.—The Bar of Conference was fixed as the first 6 rows of seats in the second and third tiers of seats.

Temporary Organization.—The Committee on Temporary Organization made its report which was adopted as amended. (See Report No. 1.)

Religious Services.—The Committee on Religious Services made its report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 2.)

Time of Meetings.—The time of opening and closing of the meetings of Conference was fixed as follows: Morning meetings opening at 9:00 a. m. War Time and closing at noon; the afternoon meetings opening at 1:30 p. m. and closing by vote of Conference.

Orders Made.—The Election of Conference Officials was made an Order of the Day for Friday morning following the devotional service.

Standing Rule Made.—The following was made Standing Rule No. 13: "Date of Conference: The Annual Session of the Lockport Conference, Incorporated, shall convene the second Wednesday of June on Houghton Campgrounds."

Committee Made.—A Committee for Conference Entertainment was made one of the Standing Committees.

Adjournment.—Adjournment by vote of the Conference.

Thursday Morning Meeting, June 10, 1943

Opening.—The Conference was called to order by the President. Rev. Erwin Enty led the singing. Rev. A. A. Hickok led the devotions.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Substitution.—The name of Mayme Coudriet was substituted for that of Victor Carlson on the Committee on Post Office Addresses.

Duplicate Voted.—Rev. Arthur W. Osgood was granted a duplicate of his ordination certificate.

Courtesies.—Rev. Ira George was introduced to the Conference.

President's Report.—The Vice-President, Rev. David Anderson, was called to the Chair. The President read his report. The part of the report concerning the work in Buffalo was referred to the Board of Trustees. The rest of the report was accepted as read. (See Report No. 3.)

Recess.—The President returned to the Chair. A recess was voted to the call of the Chair.

Adjournment.—At 11:50 the President called the Conference to order. Adjournment by limitation of time.

Thursday Afternoon Meeting, June 10, 1943

Opening.—The meeting was called to order and devotions were conducted by Rev. Gerald Wright.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Report.—The report of the Treasurer of the Board of Trustees was accepted as read. (See Report No. 4.)

Characters Passed.—The name of C. M. Dudley was called and his character was passed. The report of the McRae Brook was read by Lloyd Binkley. The name of J. R. Redstone was called and his character was passed. The Vice-President was called to the Chair and the name of A. J. Taylor was called and his character was passed. The names of David Anderson, Everett Elliott, Adrian Everts, M. A. Gibbs, A. A. Hickok and C. I. Armstrong were called and their characters were passed.

Excused.—Lloyd Binkley was excused from Conference.

Orders of the Day.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Rev. Walter Readett for the Communion service.

Characters Passed.—After the Communion service the names of Zelia Johnson, E. H. Johnson were called and their characters were passed. A communication from Anna L. Fillmore was read and her character was passed. The names of Robert Lytle and J. R. Pitt were called and their characters were passed.

Orders of the Day.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Dr. Paine for the Educational Address.

Report.—After the Educational Service the President took the Chair and the Ashwood report was read by Rev. F. C. Taylor.

Joined Conference.—The transfer of Rev. Frank C. Taylor was accepted by the Conference.

Characters Passed.—The names of Noah R. Shaffer, Mae K. Shaffer, Charles Sicard were called and their characters were passed.

Adjournment.-Adjourned by vote of the Conference.

Friday Morning Meeting, June 11, 1943

Opening.—The meeting was called to order and devotions were conducted by Rev. M. H. Vincent.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Orders Deferred.—The Orders of the Day was deferred till after the Board of Trustees report.

Name Added.—The name of Charles Sicard was added to the Committee on Pastoral Relations.

Recess.-A recess was voted for committee work.

*Election.—After the recess the President called the Conference to order. He appointed Theodore Pagett, Rudolph Nelson, M. H. Vincent and Gordon Wolfe as tellers and proceeded with the election which resulted as follows:

Friday Afternoon Meeting, June 11, 1943

Opening.—The Conference was called to order and the devotions were conducted by Rev. Gordon Wolfe.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies presented Rev. Rufus Reisdorph, the Connectional Representative, to the Conference.

Excused.—A. A. Hickok was excused from Conference for the afternoon.

Election.—The Conference continued the election which resulted for Vice-President, J. R. Pitt received 27 votes of 41 votes cast.

To Preside.—Rev. Rufus Reisdorph was asked to preside for the re-

mainder of the Conference.

Resolution.—The following resolution was voted by the Conference: "We, the members of the Lockport Conference endorse the purpose for ministerial retirement being submitted to the coming General Conference and instruct our delegates to use their vote and support for legislation that will meet the need of retiring ministers."

Report.—The report of the Board of Trustees was accepted as amended. (See Report No. 5.)

Name Added.—The name of A. J. Taylor was added to the Committee of Pastoral Relations.

Rising Vote.—A rising vote of appreciation was extended to A. J. Taylor for his work as Conference President.

Excused.—Rudolph Nelson and Charles Simmons were excused from

Conference.

Names Called.—The names of Gordon Thurber, Gerald Wright and Erwin Enty were called and their characters were passed.

Connectional Address.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the Connectional Representative gave his address.

Adjournment.—After the Orders of the Day the Conference was adjourned by vote.

Names Called.—The names of Louise Kerr, R. L. Kuhn, Roma Lapham were called and their characters were passed.

Excused.—Roma Lapham was excused from Conference.

Courtesies.—The Committee on Courtesies presented Eldyn Simons to the Conference.

Names Called .- The names of Theodore Pagett, Gordon Wolfe, M. H.

Vincent, Mark Russell, H. J. Bullock were called and their characters were passed.

Report.—The Sunday-school Secretary made his report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 6.)

Standing Committees.—The Committee on Nomination of the Standing Committee was read and accepted. (See front of the minutes.)

Tent.—The matter of dividing the tent was referred to the Committee on Evangelism. The matter of tent insurance was referred to the Executive Committee of the Board of Trustees.

Sunday-school Hour.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Rev. Adrian Everts for the Sunday-school Hour.

Adjournment.—After the Orders of the Day Conference was adjourned by limitation of time.

Saturday Afternoon Meeting, June 12, 1943

Opening.—The Conference was called to order and the devotions were led by Rev. Robert Lytle.

Roll Call.—The roll was called and the minutes were approved as read.

Report.—The Auditing Committee made its report which was accepted.

First Reading.—The first reading of the Pastoral Relation Committee

report was given.

Itineracy and Orders.—The Committee on Itineracy and Orders gave its report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 7.)

Treasurer's Report.—The Treasurer read his report which was accepted as read. (See Report No. 8.)

Excused.-J. R. Pitt was excused from Conference.

Resigned.—The President, Rev. David Anderson, offered his resignation as President of the Conference which was accepted.

Election.—The Secretary appointed the following as tellers: H. M. Vincent, Robert Lytle, Everett Elliott, Theodore Pagett and the Conference proceeded to elect a President which resulted as follows: A. J. Taylor received 28 votes of 44 votes cast and was declared elected.

Resigned.—The resignation of David Anderson as delegate to General Conference was accepted. The resignation of Charles Sicard as alternate delegate to General Conference was accepted.

Election.—Rev. George N. Osgood was elected ministerial delegate to General Conference and Rev. M. A. Gibbs was elected alternate.

Memorial Service.—The time for the Orders of the Day having arrived the meeting was turned over to Rev. Charles Sicard for the Memorial Service.

Report.-The report of the Budget Apportionment Committee gave their report which was adopted as read. (See Report No. 11.)

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

To the Members and Friends of the Lockport Annual Conference, Greetings! In the good providence of God we are again permitted to meet in our annual assembly. May it please the Lord to make this session a time of gracious blessing, refreshing and uplift to His servants, and of salvation of souls. The task of entertaining this body here on the campground for the first time, has presented some extra problems, but we trust all will be cared for without too great inconvenience to any.

Dark and unprecedented days are upon us, and it behooves us to lift up our heads, for our "redemption draweth nigh." In spite of all the problems of the times, we believe this has been a good year generally throughout the Conference.

I have been as busy in carrying out the special duties assigned me as President at the last annual session, as my duties on a city pastorate, and the restrictions of travel because of the gas and rubber shortage, would permit. The pastoral care of a church alone is task enough if faithfully done, for the average man. I trust the day may not be far distant when we, as a Conference, shall see our way clear to relieve the President of pastoral work, and appoint him to full time travel in Conference supervision and Church Extension work.

I have not been away from home as many Sundays as in previous years, but have held more mid-week Quarterly Conferences. The places visited were: Ellicott, Allegany, East Aurora, McRae Brook, three times; Rich Valley, Levant, Wellsville, Cadwells Corners, Ransomville, Chestnut Ridge, Ashwood and Olean.

Official Acts are as follows:

1. May 26, 1942, appointed Bert Hall of the Allegheny Conference paster of the Oakland Wesleyan Methodist Chapel for the year.

2. June 14, 1942, organized the group at McRae Brook, Pa. into a Wesleyan Methodist Church with twelve members.

3. July 16, 1942, granted a letter of transfer to the Rochester Annual Conference to Rev. Arthur W. Osgood.

4. July 22, 1942, Mrs. Ethel Fuller, having left the work as pastor of the Chestnut Ridge Church, I appointed Rev. Gordon Thurber as their pastor for the remainder of the Conference year.

5. July 28, 1942, Ashwood Church having been left "in the hands of the President" last year, I appointed Rev. F. C. Taylor of the Champlain Conference as their pastor at their request.

6. August 20, 1942, granted letter of transfer to Rev. G. I. Norman to the Ohio Conference.

7. October 31, 1942, received Rev. H. Erwin Enty by letter of transfer from the Allegheny Conference.

8. November 4, 1942, in company with the Vice-President, Rev. David

Anderson, who is also a member of my Advisory Board; and the pastor at East Aurora, Rev. J. R. Pitt, we went to Buffalo to investigate a prospect for a location in opening a work there. We found a vacant church on the corner of Glenwood and Storz Avenues. The building was in good condition and available to us at \$300 a year rental. It was later secured.

- 9. November 4, 1942, appointed Lloyd Binkley pastor of the McRae Brook Church.
- 10. December 8, 1942, I appointed Rev. C. J. White of Buffalo, in charge of services at the church at 414 Glenwood Ave., under the direction of our Conference. Wesleyan services were begun at this location about January 1st, and still continue. We hope to organize there soon.
- 11. March 23, 1943, appointed Rev. Adrian Everts committee to apportion the General Conference Delegate's expense to the charges.
- 12. May 14, 1943, appointed the Committee on Temporary Organization as follows: Rev. C. I. Armstrong, Chairman; Rev. Robert Lytle and Rev. Everett Elliott. Appointed Dr. S. W. Paine, Mr. Charles Simmons and Mr. Rudolph Nelson as lay members of the Committee on Itineracy and Orders.
- 13. May 26, 1943, granted a letter of transfer to the Ohio Conference to Rev. Olga Marie Norman.

- 2. That we continue the support of our Home Mission work in its various needs. Collect and prepare clothing, also small gifts for the missionary and their home as are suitable to send. Remember that at least \$6.00 be sent for Home Missions and \$5.00 for Hephzibah Orphanage. This is to be in cash.
- 3. We urge all presidents to keep well informed concerning our mission stations, both home and foreign. Use maps, personal letters and our periodicals. Present this often to your society that they, too, may be well acquainted with the work and workers and thus become more interested. Pray often for all these missionaries and their helpers and write letters to them.
- 4. That we aim and plan to make each meeting spiritual, by divine help that new strength may be gained in our meeting together.
- 5. That we engage returned missionaries as speakers for special and regular meetings whenever possible.
- 6. As far as possible observe Harvest Day, World's Day of Prayer, and April self-denial month.

STANDING RULES

- 1. The number of delegates each local society may send to the Lockport Conference W. Y. P. S. business meeting is limited as follows: One delegate for each ten active members, or majority fraction thereof, the number of delegates from one society not to exceed five or be less than one.
- 2. It is recommended that each local society pay into the Conference W. Y. P. MINUTES

By appointment of the President Marion Birch was made reporter to the W. Y. P. S. Journal.

Cordial invitations to the next Conference W. Y. P. S. Convention were extended from East Leon and Higgins.

It was voted that the decision as to the time and place of the next convention be left in the hands of the Executive Committee.

A motion was made and carried to adjourn.
