STANDING RULES.

- I. The Standing Rules of Conference shall be printed in the Conference Minutes each year.
- II. All visiting members of our own, or other churches in harmony with our principles, shall be invited to honorary seats in the Conference.
- III. The Conference President shall receive twenty, dollars (\$20) per year for postage and stationery; also any needed traveling expense. At any time the President be required to travel the Conference, his duties and pay shall be defined by the Conference.
- IV. The Conference Secretary shall receive fifteen dollars (\$15) per year for his labor and incidental expenses.
- V. The Conference Treasurer shall receive ten dollars (\$10) per year for his services in caring for the funds.
- VI. In making his report, the Conference Treasurer is authorized to close his books one week before the Conference session. The Treasurer of the Ministers' Relief Association shall also close his books one week before the Conference session.
- VII. In our Camp Meeting work, after the expense of the Camp Meeting has been paid by the Camp Meeting Committee, or by the person whom they may designate, any unexpended balance be turned over to the Conference Treasurer.
- VIII. All monies disbursed by the Conference Treasurer during the interim of Conference shall be upon order of the President, except in case of payment to the President, when such order shall be issued by the Vice-President. It is understood, of course, that any payment ordered by the Conference direct may be paid by the Treasurer without an order as directed above.
- IX. No monies shall be loaned by the Conference Treasurer except by order of Conference or by consent of the President and his Advisory Board.
- X. Each elder shall make his engagement as pastor with the understanding that if he be elected Conference President he shall be released in his pastoral engagement.
- XI. Moved that the Standing Rule No. 11 be changed to read "The first Sunday in each month shall be known as Home Mission Sunday, and the Sunday School offerings shall be given to Home Missions, and should be sent to the Conference Treasurer."

XII. That in securing Evangelists for the Camp Meeting work, those of the Wesleyan Methodist Church be secured, if this can be done.

XIII. That the Camp Meeting Committee be composed of the Conference President as Chairman, and three ministers and three laymen, all to be elected by ballot after the Conference of 1923, the term of office to be three years, the time of one minister and one layman expiring each year.

XIV. Pastors shall state financial items in their statistical reports in even dollars, except in items affecting the budget, and so far as possible are requested to report all budget items in even dollars. When such rule is not followed the Statistical Secretaries are authorized to drop decimals except as provided above.

XV. That the offerings for Superannuated Ministers be taken within sixty days after Conference, and forwarded to the Treasurer of Superannuate Society.

DAILY PROCEEDINGS.

Tuesday Evening.

At 7:30 P. M., April 19, 1927, the Champlain Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Connection (or Church) of America met at Glens Falls, N. Y., for its eighty-sixth session. The President, Rev. A. J. Allen, opened the meeting. After two selections of song, prayer was offered by Rev. C. E. Hill and Rev. Royal Woodhead. Rev. E. D. Carpenter read the Scripture lesson, John 11:32-44. Mrs. Lillian Stevenson and Miss Florence Baxter sang a duet. The opening sermon, preached by Rev. Carpenter, was based upon John 11:39, 44. Benediction by Rev. Robinson.

Wednesday Morning.

REPORT OF CONFERENCE SUNDAY SCHOOL SECRETARY.

This year has been one of marked increase in part of the Sunday Schools of the Conference, and marked decrease in others. Only three (3) Schools report the same enrollment at end of year as at the beginning. During the first three (3) quarters of the year the totals showed an increase of 125. A few Schools showed a remarkable increase in the last quarter, and another few showed a depressing loss.

Finances, including Home Missions offerings as reported to me, were in excess of last year. The three largest Sunday School con-

tributors for Home Missions were: Horicon, \$104.38; Hague, \$88.20; Mooers, \$74.88.

Training courses were taken up by 27 different individuals in the Conference. There are three who have earned their diplomas, or finished earning them this year. At least four others have taken or will take the final examinations shortly.

Co-operation has been splendid. Every Sunday School reported every quarter during the year. One hundred per cent has been attained. Every report was not complete in every item, but the report was given. So every one deserves praise.

Every Sunday School paid their Sunday School Apportionment in full, and thus enabled the Connectional Budget to be paid. God's blessing seems to be on us. Let's pray and work so it will continue.

THE CUP. Last year's honors were close, shared by Forest-dale and Mooers. Mooers had the cup. This year it was again a tie. Forestdale will have the cup. The names of both Mooers and Forestdale will, therefore, be engraved on the cup for 1926 and 1927. In order to be able to better award the cup next year, there are a few small changes in the standard. Please note.

- 6. Workers Meetings, or Conference, at least quarterly. (Programs and results to be submitted to Conference Sunday School Board.)
 - 7. Wesleyan Methodist Sunday School Supplies used.
- 8. A Training Class for students. (Organized before Jan. 1, 1928, and to take at least one examination before Conference.)
- 9. At least one active, organized and recognized class. (Some activities of class to be submitted to Conference Sunday School Board.)

REPORT OF CAMP MEETING COMMITTEE.

The Camp Meeting of 1926 was, in the estimation of all who had the privilege of attending that feast of tabernacles, one of the best ever held in its history.

The preaching of the Gospel of our Lord, by Rev. A. B. Hotchkiss whom God has seen fit to promote to his heavenly home, was of the highest type, indeed. The Rev. E. F. McCarty, our Foreign Missionary Secretary, also rendered efficient services in Bible Readings and in preaching the Gospel.

The singing, led by Brother William Hotchkiss, and ably helped by the Stevensons, Miss Baxter and others, was certainly inspiring and helpful. A goodly number of souls bowed at the altar and were helped into the Kingdom of King Jesus. For all of this we sincerely thank God.

Rev. Jesse Whitecotton of Indiana has been secured as Evangelist for the Camp Meeting to be held at West Chazy, N. Y., July 6-17, 1927. The singing for the coming Camp Meeting is to be under the direction of Edith and Lillian Stevenson, Florence Baxter, Pearl Hill and others, as helpers.

The board has been raised from five dollars to six dollars (\$6) for the entire camp of ten days. The price of single meals will remain as last year, breakfast and supper at thirty-five cents (35c) each, and dinners at fifty cents (50c). Free board for pastors will be continued as in the past.

PLAN OF WORK FOR LOCAL SOCIETIES.

We recommend that the following definite plan of work and followed as nearly as possible:

- 1. That each Society take up a definite course of study—preferedly the one selected by the General Society—so that we may profit by the programs prepared for the Wesleyan Missionary. And that as equal time, at least be given to prayer for our mission work and workers.
- 2. That each Society make full proof of their missionary zeal and loyalty by being 100% subscribers to the Wesleyan Missionary and that they appoint a member whose office shall be to keep account of dates for renewals and to push outside the Society for new subscribers.
- 3. That we shall not forget to send annually \$6.00 to the Conference Society Treasurer to be forwarded to the General Treasurer to be used for the Southern Mission Work.
- 4. To remember that the Home and Foreign Missionary Society supports the Missionary work and is not to use funds for local church work. And that no money is to be paid out without a majority vote of the body.
- 5. That the matter of sending some amount annually to the Conference Society for the running expense be not overlooked. Otherwise your Treasurer will be out of pocket.
- 6. It is most important that careful attention be given the filling out of two statistical blanks which will be sent to each Society annually. One is to be filled out and given to the statistical committee at the beginning of Conference, the other to be retained and read by delegate to the Local Society. Receipts and disbursements must be made to balance before sending them to the Conference. Beloved, heed this, and thus love your neighbor of the Statistical Committee as yourself.
- 7. Also ALL money and receipts must be in the hands of the Treasurer one week before Conference convenes. This extension of time has been found to be essential in order for the Treasurer to complete her work and give due credit.
