Daily Proceedings

The Sixteenth Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Churches of Ohio convened at Harrison Chapel church August 14, 1923.

Rev. L. L. Folger preached the Conference sermon. We felt under the influence of the Spirit of God. His message was well given. He spoke in part of the outcome of sin—sin being the only cause of man's downfall, being man's worst enemy, and our only deliverance found in the blood of Jesus Christ.

Rev. W. C. Roberts led in prayer, and a special song was well rendered by Miss Myra Gray and Mrs. Jennie Miskimen.

Conference opened at 9:30 A. M., the first hour being spent in prayer, all present feeling the presence of the Divine One. At the close of the hour of prayer, the Conference was called to order by the Vice President, Rev. H. W. Thompson. The Conference President was unable to be present owing to the death of a little child, he having charge of the funeral.

Wednesday, August 15, 1923

Conference called to order by Conference President.

Was ordered that Friday 9 A. M. be the time for the election of Conference officers.

The Conference Treasurer's report was given, and the same was referred to the Auditing committee.

Thursday, August 16, 1923

Conference called to order by Conference President, Rev. A. W. Smith. 9 A. M.

Devotion by Rev. Charles Hill. Scripture lesson Mark 6.

Communication was received from Rev. A. D. and Della Osborn. Also from Rev. B. M. Gillen.

Conference ordered that it be a standing rule that the Conference President and the pastor of church where Conference is held compose the committee for religious services.

Ordered that J. W. Leedy, President of Marion College, be given Friday 2 P. M., to present the interest of our work there.

Rev. W. E. Ballinger, one member of a committee elected by the Dunkirk Camp, to speak to the Ohio Conference of their desire to sell the Dunkirk Camp to the Ohio Conference, their price being \$4,000. The Conference Trustees were to constitute a committee to communicate with the Dunkirk Camp.

Seeing the need of special earnest prayer, was ordered that a committee of three be appointed to formulate a plan to present to the Conference. Committee: Rev. Miss Monna Rogers, Rep. Samuel Vorhies, Rev. L. A. Smothers.

Thursday, August 16, 1923

Conference was called to order at 1:30 P. M. by the Conference President, Rev. A. W. Smith.

From 1:30 P. M. to 2 P. M. was given in honor of Rev. A. W. Smith, the Conference President.

Rev. J. M. Williams spoke of Rev. A. W. Smith as a citizen; Rev. Miss Monna Rogers, as a friend; Mr. H. P. Osborn, as a pastor; Rev. H. W. Thompson, as a conference president. A special song was rendered at the time, "Cast Thy Bread Upon the Waters." "Marching to Zion" was sung in conclusion, well directed by Rev. W. C. Roberts, at which time a purse of \$30 was given to Mr. and Mrs. Smith. Rev. Smith has been connected with the Ohio Conference twenty-five years. Rev. T. P. Baker of Indiana gave the closing prayer.

At 2 P. M., Rev. T. P. Baker presented the connectional interest. All who were present at the time were well pleased with the spirit in which the message was given. All left the church with the feeling that they had received much help.

respect was shown to the Rev. W. H. Mayle, having lost his wife during the past Conference. At the same time, the wife of Richey Smith, and H. R. Smith, the father, were remembered at the throne of grace, because of the death of Richey Smith.

Mary Green, our returned Missionary, was introduced to the Conference, also John Leedy, President of Marion College.

The order of the day was taken up.

The Cambridge Home was brought before the Conference by the first member of the Board that was to manage the Home last year. The Board, not knowing just what their power was, asked that a committee be appointed to formulate plans that might guide them in the management of this Home. A committee was elected: A. W. Smith, H. W. Thompson, Mrs. Anna K. Folger.

The Conference Treasurer was tendered \$15 and a vote of thanks by the Conference, for his work of the year.

Committee on Resolutions gave their report, which had to deal with the purchase, or selecting a site, for a camp meeting ground. The Dunkirk Camp Meeting Association having offered to sell their camp to the Ohio Conference, and as yet had not been investigated, the resolution was referred back to the committee that changes might be made that no conflict arise.

Rev. Charles Hill, being compelled to leave for home, was excused from the Conference.

Ordered that the charge known as Ridge Avenue church in Zanesville have its name changed to the Monroe St. Wesleyan Methodist church, to conform to the change of location.

Committee on Statistics submitted a partial report. Report adopted as read.

Sister Folger tenders her resignation as a member of the Missionary Board.

Motion to accept the resignation.

Vice President takes the chair. President debates the question.

Resignation of Sister Folger accepted.

Motion to elect H. W. Thompson to fill the vacancy just created.

Motion to adjourn to the call of the chair.

Benediction, Samuel Vorhies.

Call to order at 6:30.

Motion prevailed that Conference Record Book be purchased, looses-leaf book being preferred.

Committee on Resolutions on governing Cambridge Rescue Home. See Resolutions.

The question of whether or not the Tobacco Amendment be submitted to the churches to be voted upon, was submitted to the Conference body. The vote resulted in Yeas 17, Noes 3.

Place and time of Conference of 1924 left to President on advisory board.

Ordered that Secretary be paid fifteen dollars for services.

REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The Sunday School Board of the Ohio Conference, believing that we should co-operate fully with the work of the connection and do all in our power to forward the interests of God's kingdom through the medium of the Sunday School, which is in far too many instances the only source of religious instruction many children have; and

Realizing that we need to take more of an interest in and put forth more vigorous effort for the salvation of the members of our Sunday Schools and the reception of same into the church, do recommend the following:

I. That the Sunday Schools of the Conference shall set aside one Sunday of each month to be known as Home Mission Sunday, the collection for this day to be devoted to Home Mission work;

II. That the Sunday School Secretary for the Conference shall visit each Sabbath School at least once during the year;

III. That a convention be held in each of the three districts sometime during the year;

IV. That the Conference Sunday School Secretary be empowered to draw from the Conference Sunday School fund, after consultation with the Conference President, for the aid of weak or newly-organized Sunday Schools;

V. That each Sunday school shall designate some Sunday during the year as Decision Day, efforts being made prior to such time to impress upon the minds and hearts of the members of the Sunday School the vital need of regeneration and heart purity;

VI. That every Sunday School of the Ohio Conference shall use Wesleyan Methodist literature in every department;

VII. That each Sunday School shall earnestly endeavor to meet the requirements of the Efficiency Standards for Wesleyan Methodist Sunday Schools.

CAMBRIDGE HOME

1. That the Trustees of the Ohio Conference shall be the governing board of the Cambridge Rescue Home, one of whom shall be elected by them as Treasurer, who shall receive and disburse all funds received for the support of the Home. No funds shall be disbursed without the consent of this governing Board.

2. We recommend that a solicitor be appointed who shall solicit funds for the support of the Home and for all claims that may exist against the Home.

3. All funds so solicited shall be deposited in the bank to the credit of the Treasurer.

4. The Superintendent and Matron shall be amenable to the governing Board for the conduct of the Home. They shall not leave the Home without the consent of the Board and in case of their continued absence from the Home, a proper supply shall be substituted, with the sanction of the Board.

5. All improvements of the property and the purchase of all needed equipment shall be with the approval of the Board of Managers.

6. The Home shall meet all State requirements, and the cost of the same shall, at the approval of the Board of Managers, be paid by the Treasurer.

7. The Board of Managers of the Home shall elect a bank in the city of Cambridge as its depository. All funds solicited or received by them for the support of the Home shall be deposited in this bank and shall be paid out only on check and on the order of the Treasurer.

He, being physically unable to take examination in subjects required this year, was admonished to use diligence in pursuing course of study.

Brother E. D. Packer, having taken eight books in course of study and taking examination on same, was continued in the course of study.

Brother L. E. Ring, being unable to be at Conference on account of sickness, was recommended to pursue the Conference course of study, he having passed examination on Binney's Compendium during the year.

Sister Monna Rogers, having had two years Bible work and other study corresponding to our course in Homiletics, was continued in course of study.

Brother James Siders, having failed to meet the requirement of the Conference according to Discipline, was referred to his quarterly conference.

Brother Hugh Hughs recommended to be received in the Conference and pursue the Conference course of study.
