Journal of Daily Proceedings

First Sitting, Tuesday, July 15, 2:00 p. m.

The sixtieth session of the South Carolina Annual Conference of the Wesleyan Methodist Church of America convened in the tabernacle on the grounds of the Wesleyan Camp Meeting Association at Greer, South Carolina at 2:00 p. m., July 15, 1952. Rev. C. T. Bryant conducted devotions and brought an interesting message, using Ruth 2:14 as a text.

Conference was called to order by the President, Rev. V. A. Mitchell, who declared the conference bar to consist of the platform and the first six benches in the three middle tiers of seats.

The roll was called and 33 elders and 12 conference preachers responded to the roll call.

Standing Rule—A motion was made and prevailed by the necessary two-thirds majority to make the following a standing rule of the Conference:

If a church obligates itself to its pastor in a financial way and for some reason fails to meet its obligation by the end of the conference year, the Board of stewards of said church shall state in writing their reasons for not raising the amount pledged. The same shall be filed with the President of the Conference who shall deal with the situation as he sees fit.

Pension Plan—The committee elected at last conference session to study the Pension Plan in relation to this Conference and make recommendations gave the following report:

Report of Committee on Pension Plan

Fourteen elders of the Conference are now members of the Pension Plan, and three others are superannuates who are now receiving benefits. The committee distributed questionnaires to determine why more of our ministers have not joined the plan. Four of these 24 expressed intention of joining the plan soon. The other 20 gave a total of 27 reasons as to why they have not joined as yet. They are as follows: Lack of information concerning the plan, 6; Lack of funds for joining, 7; Benefits not available until ordination, 4; Other objections to plan, 6; Dissatisfaction as to method of figuring years of service for himself, 1; Procrastination, 1; Not been approached by committee, 1; Will join when it appears the Conference is in the plan permanently, 1.

The committee realizes that the plan is not perfect, and that it will need some adjustment and that some minor phases of it may never be approved by every minister of the denomination, also that it is a distinct advantage for the plan to be operated by the denomination rather than by the several conferences. We realize also that as many ministers as possible should receive benefit from the investment the conference is making. In order to enable as many ministers as possible to become members of the Pension Plan, we make the following recommendations:

- 1. That a committee be elected to continue the work this committee has begun.
- 2. That the committee endeavor to get answers from all ministers who have not returned the questionnaires.
- 3. That the committee endeavor to give information regarding the Plan to all our ministers.

- 4. That it be specifically called to the attention of the ministers that neither the entrance fee nor the back assessments must be paid by cash.
- 5. That the committee designate one of its members to solicit ministers to join the Pension Plan.
- 6. That the committee prepare proposed memorials to the General Conference, which shall be submitted to the Annual Conference, giving special attention to the case of benefits for unordained ministers and to other matters which the questionnaires indicate to be objectional.

Convention—A motion prevailed that the Committee on Fifth Sunday Holiness Convention and the Committee on Ministerial Institute be authorized to study the needs and interest of the Conference and to combine these two activities if they think it best.

Institute—The Committee on Ministerial Institute gave a verbal report.

Tithing—The Tithing Secretary of the Spartanburg District reported that he had visited thirteen churches in interest of tithing and had received offerings in the amount of \$29.76.

Church Extension—The Committee on Church extension for Greenville District reported through its treasurer, Rev. L. L. Jarrard, that the offerings received for the Sans Souci tent meeting amounted to \$241.65 and the expenditures were \$196.43. The balance of \$45.22 was turned over to Rev. E. L. Gunby, the pastor.

Sunday School Board—The Sunday School Secretary nominated and the Conference elected J. B. Hilson and Douglas Heffner as the other members of the Sunday School Board.

Pension Plan—A motion prevailed that the committee which gave the report on the Pension Plan be re-elected to continue the study as recommended in its report. The committee is V. A. Mitchel, R. C. Mullinax, J. A. Giles, Talmage Evatt, G. C. Summey.

Edit Minutes—The Conference voted to authorize the Secretary to edit the Conference minutes.

Unfinished Business—The Conference voted to authorize the President and his Advisory Board to take care of any unfinished business after the adjournment of Conference.

Conference Sermon—D. G. Matheny was elected to preach the Conference Sermon in 1953. A. L. Vess was elected the alternate.

Standing Rules and Resolutions

- 1. That no member of the Conference shall have his character passed who fails to carry out all the rules and orders of this Conference, unless providentially hindered, except upon a three-fourths vote of the body.
- 2. That we affirm our faith in the soundness of the position taken by The Weseyan Methodist Church of America in denying any of its members membership in any secret society. Hence we as a Conference require that our pastors and churches shall not elect, or suffer to be elected, superintendents if they hold membership in secret societies.
- 3. That we earnestly urge all our Licentiates not receiving any appointments to pastoral or evangelistic work to preach at least once a month, and also to hold if possible a two-weeks' revival during the year.
- 4. That no person be licensed to preach who does not tithe his income; that all our licentiates be required to faithfully tithe their income; and that the license of no preacher be renewed, who fails to tithe.
- 5. That it is the sense of this Conference that our houses of worship shall not be opened to any evangelist or minister of any other Church to hold a series of meetings or to maintain a regular appointment for another congregation; provided, however, that usual denominational courtesies be extended to other ministers in occasional appointments.
- 6. We recommend that all charges and stations to which the pastor moves pay the moving and transportation expenses of said pastor, the same to be done in addition to his salary.
- 7. That the pastors be required to raise their Minute Money and send to the Conferene Treasurer within sixty days after they receive their Minutes.
- 8. That this Conference elect a Tithing Secretary, as provided for in our Discipline, whose duty it shall be to visit each charge at least once a year, if possible. Each church visited shall raise at least the traveling expenses of the Secretary at the time of his visitation.
- 9. That each local church or charge elect a Tithing Secretary, whose duty it shall be to thoroughly canvass the membership of the church or charge each quarter and labor most carefully to induce each member to strictly tithe his income and to place the same in the church treasury for the purpose of meeting all the claims of the church, both locally and generally. The Secretary shall report at each Quarterly Conference the percentage of the membership who are tithing in keeping with this plan, the percentage who are giving in other ways, and the percentage who are not giving at all. Each pastor and church shall co-operate with these Secretaries in every possible way in order to make the entire membership of this Conference strict tithers.

- 10. That we as a Conference put forth every possible effort through education, pulpit, preaching, voting, and other means to advance the cause of temperance and to secure legislation for abolishing the sale of beer, wine, and whiskey for beverages.
- 11. That the Trustees of the South Carolina Annual Conference, to gether with the President of the said Conference, be and they hereby are empowerd to execute all necessary papers, mortgage deeds, and papers of a like character, when necessary to secure loans to the South Carolina Annual Conference or to any church needing funds to liquidate Conference, church, or parsonage indebtedness, provided that the party or parties requesting such action shall set forth in writing the true nature and purpose for which the loan is requested (this writing is to become a part of the permanent records of the Trustees) and that the Trustees and President of said Conference are satisfied that the object for which said loan or loans is sought is both necessary and desirable. And the Trustees of said South Carolina Annual Conference are also heerby empowered to sign any or all deeds and papers for the transfer of real property that is now or hereafter may be held in trust by said trustees, where the sale of Conference, church, or parsonage or other real estate has been approved or authorize by the President of the Conference with the concurrence of his entire Advisory Board.
- 12. During the interim of Annual Conference the Missionary Board shall be duly authorized to draw on the funds for Conference Work, and Conference Missions, as it deems best for the interest of the Conference, and the Treasurer shall be authorized to make payments from these funds upon written order signed by the President and at least one half the other members of the Missionary Board, or signed by the President in behalf of the Missionary Board.
- 13. Any church which engages in a building or remodeling project or which purchases a parsonage, church building or a lot on which a church or parsonage is to be constructed, regardless of whether the property is to be owned by the local church or the Conference, is required to have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location.

Any church which secures aid from the Conference must have its property deeded to the Conference Trustees, as is required by our Discipline; and any church which engages in a building or remodeling project must have the plans approved by the Conference Board on Church and Parsonage Building and Location, according to the requirements of our Discipline, if said church is to receive aid from the Conference for these building projects.

14. All pastors shall have their Statistical reports in the hands of the Statistical Committee by 8:00 a. m. Wednesday of Conference.

- 15. The salary of the outgoing pastor shall close on Sunday preceding the opening of Annual Conference and the church is required to include the week of Conference in the incoming pastor's salary.
- 16. In the ordination of ministers to Elder's Orders, it shall be the policy of this Conference to ordain only those ministers who have passed the course of study as required by our Discipline.
- 17. Each charge should give its pastor the privilege of being away from his church, or churches, for two meetings per year, and no pastor is to be away from his charge for more than two meetings per year without a vote of his church, or charge, giving permission.
- 18. All officers and committees shall take up their duties at the close of the sitting of conference in which they are elected.
- 19. Conference shall convene each year on the Tuesday nearest July 15.
- 20. The books of the Conference Treasurer shall close two weeks before Conference.
 - 21. The Conference Secretary shall be the Committee on Credentials.
- 22. Mr. Talmage Evatt, Treasurer of the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America, or his successor, is authorized to sign United States bonds held by the South Carolina Conference of The Wesleyan Methodist Church of America.
- 23. When a church engages in a building or remodeling project at least one-half of the estimated cost of the project must be on hand before said project is undertaken unless other satisfactory arrangements are made. If other arrangements are made the Board of Trustees must approve them before they are considered satisfactory.
- 24. A church which is not on a charge with other churches may keep only one record book for church and quarterly conference records and the Church Clerk serve as Quarterly Conference Clerk.
- 25. The President shall appoint an Auditing Committee in time for it to audit the books of the treasurers before Conference.
- 26. If a pastor desires to resign his work during the interim of Annual Conference, he shall give the President and his Advisory Board notice at least two weeks before the effective date of his resignation. However, if the President and his Advisory Board deem the cause for his desire to resign sufficient, they may accept the resignation immediately.
- 27. If a church obligates itself to its pastor in a financial way and for some reason fails to meet its obligation by the end of the conference year, the board of stewards of said church shall state in writing their reasons for not raising the amount pledged. The same shall be filed with the President of the Conference who shall deal with the situation as he sees fit.

Reports of Committees

Report No. 1

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With a sense of unworthiness and yet with a sense of great joy and deep gratitude we report to the sixtieth session of the South Carolina Conference. By the co-operation of the entire Conference and the help of Almighty God we can report that this has been a good year. The reports will reveal an all-time high in budget contribution. Several churches report gracious revivals that will reflect a gain in church membership for the Conference. Our great need is a genuine revival in every church. This should be our slogan for 1952-1953. This will bring increases financially, materially, numerically, spiritually, and make for better pastor-laymen relations, decrease church problems, relieve tensions, and settle old scores.

This has been a year of unrest throughout the United States. Some of the factors contributing to this unrest are: the uncertainty of the Korean truce talks, the designs of the forces of Communism against this country, the greed, graft, corruption, and petty politics in high governmental circles, the strife between capital and labor, and the crisis facing us in the political world. Some of this spirit of unrest has been felt by some of our churches and pastors. This has hindered our progress. While these tremendous situations face us, let us remember that our God is greater than our crisis, bigger than our problem, and sufficient for our need.

Conference Paper

The Conference paper, South Carolina Challenger, is proving its worth to our people. Ten issues have been printed to date. Miss Sallie Evatt, Editor, is doing a splendid job and Rev. J. C. Lackey, Business Manager, is working faithfully at his task. Th Publication Staff and the contributing editor are laboring hard to make this a good paper.

Holy Land Tour

I shall ever be indebted to the people of the Conference for their efforts, prayers, good wishes, and financial help in making possible our visit to the Holy Land. \$509.21, which is about 40% of the cost, was contributed by individuals and churches for this 16,000 mile trip. Words are inadequate to tell what the trip meant to me. I have tried to share the benefit of the trip through the columns of the Challenger, in the pulpit, and in the showing of the slides.

Improvements

Easley (Alice) Church added 4 new Sunday School Rooms, built a vestibule, erected a tower, sheet rocked and celetexed the interior of the church, installed rest rooms, at a cost of \$8,000.00. Greenwood completed a 6 room parsonage valued at \$14,000.00 which is the nicest in the Conference. Greenville, First; Pelzer; Laurens and Greenville Woodside Ave. hope to begin a building program soon. The Greer Church is moving toward completion of their church which when finished will be one of the nicest in the Conference. The Central Second Church brick-veneered their building and made other improvements at a cost of approximately \$4,500.00. Whitmire has completed 3 new Sunday school rooms and purchased a dwelling adjacent to the church. Converse Mission has purchased a well located house at a cost of \$2,500.00 and are now using it as a place of worship. For an account of other improvements you are referred to the columns of the Challenger.

Extension Program

As per the recommendation of the 1950-1951 Missionary Board and the approval of the Conference, the North Charleston church was brick-veneered, a vestibule erected, the auditorium celetexed overhead, new windows installed, new floor laid throughout the building, and convenient living quarters arranged for the pastor at a cost of \$9,000.00. We supplied the work until December at which time Rev. C. M. Elrod consented to supply the work until mid-March. Since March 23, 1952 Rev. L. W. Barbee has been serving as pastor. The work is taking on new life; and interest, attendance, finances, and the spiritual condition of the church are improving.

In April we received the deed to a church building known as the Smoky Mt. Tabernacle located near Cheorkee, North Carolina in Jackson County valued at more than \$3,500.00. Rev. J. L. Reagon built this Tabernacle and carried on services here for some time. He is now a member of a sister Holiness Church but desires to see a Wesleyan Methodist Church organized. Through the contact of Rev. H. M. Moody I was privileged to conduct a revival meeting in this building in the spring of 1950. Our contacts with the people and Brother Reagon since then have been most pleasant. The tabernacle is now a preaching point attached to the Tuckasegee Church. Two people have presented their names as prospective members of the contemplated church.

The churches of the Greenville District under the direction of the Committee on Church extension, Revs. J. A. Giles, W. R. French, and Mr. J. O. Smith, sponsored a tent meeting in the Sans Souci section of Greenville. A class with nine members was organized with others to be received. Revs. J. A. Giles, W. R. French did the preaching in the three

weeks meeting and Mr. Charles Ellenburg of the Easley First Church directed the singing. By the donations of the various churches and offerings received in the services the meeting was sponsored without cost to the conference. The Brethren served without remuneration and Brother Ellenburg would not accept money for his traveling expenses. Rev. T. C. Bryant worked hard to make this effort a success. To these brethren we express our heart-felt thanks. The two Greenville churches are to be commended and highly congratulated for their co-operation, help, attitude, and sympathy given in this work. I believe this method of church extension is the proper one. The Columbia District W.Y.P.S. under the leadership of its chairman, Rev. W. C. Young, is anticipating an extension effort in the "H" Plant Area this fall.

I attended Greer Camp Meeting, harvest day and commencement exercises of Central college, 2 district W.Y.P.S. rallies, 3 district ministers' meetings, 3 district W.M.S. meetings, the conference youth camp, the southern area ministers' convention, the conference ministers' convention, the N.H.A. Convention of Columbus, Ohio, and numerous committee meetings of various kinds. I held, or caused to be held, two quarterly meetings on each charge one of which was the fourth. I consulted with stewards of local churches and in some cases raises in pastor salary were realized. Without regard to energy, inconvenience, peronal interest, or time, I have done what little I could do for all the churches and preachers in general and for the churches and preachers needing my assistance in particular.

September 5, 1951, I granted a letter of transfer to Rev. F. L. Elrod as an Elder to the South Georgia Conference.

November 1, 1951, We received the transfer of Rev. J. M. Merrill a superannuated Elder from the South Georgia Conference. We appointed him to the Superannuated relation in the South Carolina Conference.

November 5, 1951, We received and accepted the resignation of Rev. J. C. Byars as pastor of the Mt. View Church

December 6, 1951, We appointed Rev. F. B. Williams pastor of the Mt. View church.

January 6, 1952, We received and later accepted the resignation of Rev. C. V. Marchbanks as pastor of the Oakway Church.

January 7, 1952, We appointed Rev. L. W. Barbee pastor of the North Charleston and Community churches to become effective March 23rd upon the recommendation of the Missionary Board.

February 19, 1952, We voted to place the name of Rev. P. C. Lusk on the list of available pastors.

March 2, 1952, At the request of the Committee on Pulpit Supply of the Oakway church we appointed Rev. Clarence Jordan pastor of the said church.

March 8, 1952, We received and accepted the resignation of Rev. C. W. Little as pastor of the Easley (Glenwood) Church.

March 30, 1952, We appointed Rev. G. H. Cary pastor of the Easley (Glenwood) Church.

April 28, 1952, I received letters of transfer from the Kentucky Conference of Rev. and Mrs. K. W. McGuyer as an Elder and Conference Preacher respectively.

April 29, 1952, I received a letter of transfer of Rev. Walter Johnson as a Conference Preacher from the Florida Conference.

May 1, 1952, We gave the Buck Creek church permission to sell to Rev. L. F. Lance the lot known as the Buck Creek School lot. The proceeds from such sale to be used in improving the Buck Creek parsonage.

May 15, 1952, We gave the Easley (Glenwood) Church permission to use the name of Rev. W. S. Allred of the North Carolina Conference as pastor.

May 22, 1952, We voted to place the name of Rev. W. D. James, one of our own men but now of the Indiana Conference, on the available list of pastors.

May 27, 1952, I received a letter of transfer of Brother Ted Bartlett as an Evangelistic Singer from the Lockport Conference.

May 26, 1952, I received the transfer of Rev. R. M. Morgan as an Elder from the North Georgia Conference.

July 12, 1952, I appointed Revs. L. D. Wilcox and E. L. Gunby as a Committee to audit the books of the conference treasurer.

July 12, 1952, Rev. C. W. Little voluntarily surrendered his credentials as an Elder in the Wesleyan Methodist Church.

July 15, 1952, I granted letters of transfer to Rev. and Mrs. K. W. McGuyer as an Elder and Conference Preacher respectively to the Kentucky Conference.

Recommendations

MISSIONARY BOARD, 1952-1953

The Missionary Board submits the following report:

We recommend:

- 1. That the \$273.06 in Evangelistic Offerings be combined with President's Salary.
- 2. That the conference president receive \$70.00 per week salary, parsonage rent, telephone expense, and six cents per mile traveling expense. He is to choose his own mode of travel.
- 3. That he be given the privilege of holding two meetings outside the conference, and retain offerings from two meetings.
- 4. That he hold one quarterly meeting on each charge and visit the charges at other times as often as he is able.
- 5. That he advise with the stewards of local churches for the purpose of encouraging and devising plans for better payment of pastors.
- 6. That the Statistical Committee be paid \$10.00 each, from Conference Work.
- 7. That the Secretary's salary and Treasurer's Salary be \$125.00 each, to be taken from Conference Work.
- 8. That the president be authorized to draw on funds for Conference Work for the purpose of printing blanks and other such items.
- 9. That when a church invites the Sunday School Secretary for a service, an offering be received for him.

- 10. That the Missionary Board be privileged to formulate plans for Church Extension Work for the following year.
- 11. That when it becomes necessary for the conference to aid new churches financially, the amount of aid shall be determined by the Missionary Board and such aid may be discontinued at the discretion of said Board. We further recommend that as long as a church receives aid from the conference it shall consult the Missionary Board before calling a pastor.
- 12. That the pastor of any church securing aid from the conference, shall secure permission from the Board before he can conduct more than two revivals away from his church during the year.
- 13. That a pastor who is serving a church receiving aid from the conference, who desires to move or live away from said church or change his relations to charge in any way, must first consult the Board.
- 14. That Rev. L. W. Barbee be continued on the work at North Charleston with a salary of \$55.00 per week and parsonage.
- 15. That Rev. E. L. Gunby be assigned to the San Souci Church in Greenville, salary to be \$55.00 per week and living quarters.
- 16. In order that a constructive program of Church Extension be launched, that one person from each district be designated as district solicitor to solicit funds from churches, friends, and business firms in ways of cash, pledges, annuities, and bequest, to be used in Church Extension of the conference. That the selection of these men and terms of service be left to the Missionary Board.
- 17. That Miss Gertrude Farmer be paid \$45.00 per month from Mountain Missions for her services at Buck Creek, also that Rev. H. M. Moody receive \$15.00 per month for services rendered to Smoky Mountain Mission.
- 18. That Rev. W. C. Young be designated as sales manager for the Conference History Book.

Rev. A. J. Argo, returned missionary to Africa, brought a most stirring message on Medical Missions. The Jubilee Offering in cash and pledges was received to be sent to Mrs. Shea on the new hospital in Africa. The offering amounted to \$936.00.

Thursday, July 17, 1952, 9:00 a. m.

The Woman's Missionary Society convened at 9:00 o'clock Thursday a. m. with Mrs. Hilson presiding. Mrs. Andrew Padgett led in singing, "Let the Lower Lights Be Burning." Mrs. Hilson introduced Dr. R. S. Nicholson to the body. He then read a Scripture Portion taken from Acts 16 and brought a most challenging message pointing out three great forces at work against Christianity; namely, Catholicism, Communism and Nationalism.

The roll was called with 20 presidents and 22 delegates answering. The minutes were read and approved.

The motion prevailed to turn the support and supervision of the Mountain Mission Work over to the Conference.

A recommendation was made for the societies to take the support of the Argo and Cowart children. The motion prevailed.

Rev. and Mrs. George Davis, Hephzibah Orphanage, were introduced and spoke about the needs of the Home.

The Y.M.W.B. Superintendent gave her report. Report adopted. (See Report.)

Pledges were taken in the amount of \$495.00 for the support of the missionary children.

Dr. Mullinax was introduced and spoke briefly.

A request was made for dish towels for the dining hall.

Information was given concerning the Reading Course and Prayer Partner duties,

The minutes were adopted.

Standing Rules and Recommendations

- 1. We emphasize the need of much prayer and intercession in these evil days, and that fasting and self-denial be observed as well.
- 2. The W.M.S. dues of one dollar (\$1.00) per member are to be divided as follows: Foreign Missions, \$.25; Home Missions, \$.25; General Fund, \$.25 and Unspecified Fund, \$.25.
- 3. The Y.M.W.B. dues are fifty-five cents (55¢) for our Conference. The fifty-two cents (52¢) is to be used for foreign missions, one cent (1¢) desk expense and two cents (2¢) for General Conference travel expense of the Y.M.W.B. Superintendent.
- 4. The annual report blanks must be in the hands of the Conference Statistician by July 1st of each conference year.
- 5. Each local society should pay annually an amount equal to twenty-five cents (25¢) per active member to be used as a general administrative fund, not to apply on budget.
- 6. We urge each local society to have an alert Magazine Solicitor, an active Mission Study group and a large Prayer Partner Circle.
- 7. It shall be the duty of each District Superintendent to supervise the interests of the societies in her district. This may be done by visitation, correspondence, the holding of conventions and rallies, the organizing of societies and bands where none exists and giving help which she deems needful. Each society or district is to bear her expenses on said visits.
- 8. We urge the use of the Standard of Efficiency so that each society may work to be placed on the Honor Roll.
